- The Monon Bell Game, which pits DePauw and Wabash against each other, is historically the last game of the regular season for both schools. The game will once again be a conference matchup bringing even more significance to one of the most fierce rivalries in college athletics. DePauw and Wabash have played one another 116 times, and Wabash holds a 54-53-9 advantage. The Little Giants won the Bell last fall, but the two teams have split the past six meetings. The game has been televised nationally by HDNet each of the last four years and five times since 2003.
