NCAC Football Report

**FOUR CONFERENCE GAMES ON TAP;
THREE TEAMS IN RACE FOR FIRST PLACE**

**For Immediate Release
October 1, 2000**

CLEVELAND -- Three teams remain undefeated in NCAC play and all three will put those records on the line in conference action on Saturday. Wittenberg, Wooster and Earlham, all 2-0 in North Coast play, look to keep their perfect conference marks intact and maintain at least a share of the conference lead.

Wooster (2-0, 4-0) hosts Wabash (1-1, 2-2) as the Scots' first-year head coach Mike Schmitz looks to keep his head-coaching mark perfect. He is the first Wooster coach since 1926 to win his first four games at the helm. The Little Giants are coming off of their first-ever NCAC win, a 34-0 shutout of Oberlin.

The Tigers (2-0, 5-0) host their first home conference game of the season when they take on Denison (1-1, 1-3). Wittenberg is coming off of a 35-21 victory at Allegheny, thanks to two late touchdowns that broke open a 21-21 game. They look to extend a 17-game conference and 26-game overall regular season winning streak. The Big Red knocked off Kenyon, 17-14, last week. Earlham (2-0, 4-1), which has won four of its first five games for the first time since 1992, travels to Ohio Wesleyan (0-1, 2-2). The Bishops lost a heartbreaker to Wooster, 21-14, last week, despite being inside the Scot 20 with less than a minute remaining. The Quakers knocked off Hiram, 29-14, and are 2-0 in conference action for the first time since joining the NCAC in 1989.

Allegheny (1-1, 2-3) travels to Hiram (1-1, 1-4) this week in the only other conference action. Both teams are coming off of NCAC losses and look to stay in the hunt for the NCAC title. Kenyon (0-3, 0-4) takes a break from conference action when the take on Case Western Reserve in Cleveland. Oberlin (0-2, 0-5) is idle.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Wittenberg senior **Casey Donaldson (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern)** and Wooster senior **Seth Duerr (Bolivar, OH/Tuscarawas Valley)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances last week in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Donaldson, a 6-2, 195-pound tailback, rushed for a 158 yards, 132 of which came in the second half, in Wittenberg's 35-21 win over Allegheny. In the process, he broke the NCAC's career rushing mark, and tied the NCAC scoring and touchdown records with his fourth-quarter TD.

Duerr, a 5-9, 220-pound middle linebacker, tied a career-best with 16 total tackles, 14 of which were solo. He also forced a fumble in the waning moments as Wooster held on to clinch a 21-14 victory over Ohio Wesleyan. With the Bishops at 4th and 1 on the Scot 19, he knocked the ball away to seal the win.

GRID NOTEBOOK: All three of Allegheny's losses this season have come to top-10 opponents - Wittenberg (7), Mount Union (2) and Washington & Jefferson (10) ... The Gators snagged two interceptions off of the Tigers' senior quarterback **Anthony Crane**, his first interceptions given up this season ... Denison sophomore quarterback **Greg Neuendorf (Sylvania, OH/Southview)** completed 29 of 47 passes for 306 yards and two scores, leading the Big Red to its first conference victory of the year ... Junior linebacker **Robert Gunn (South Bend, IN/LaSalle)** made 21 tackles, including 14 solos in the Quaker victory over Hiram ... Terrier sophomore linebacker **Jeremiah Cleveland (Cleveland, OH/Glenville)** recorded 15 stops, including eight solo in the same game ... Little Giant **B.J. Hammer (Carmel, IN/Carmel)**, a senior defensive end, recorded six tackles, including two sacks for -18 yards, and had one hurry as Wabash shut out Oberlin ... Wooster tailback **Scott Jones (Uhrichsville, OH/Tuscarawas Central Catholic)** ran for 57 yards on 17 carries and scored what turned out to be the game-winning TD midway through the fourth quarter ... Wittenberg senior **Casey Donaldson (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern)** set or tied three NCAC marks last week. He broke **Chris Spriggs'** (Denison 1983-86) career mark of 4248 yards. Donaldson tied **Stanley Drayton** (Allegheny, 1989-92) with his 56th touchdown and 336th point ... The latest AFCA Div. III Coaches' poll (Sept. 26) ranks **Wittenberg** seventh. **Wooster** and **Allegheny** also received votes.

**WITTENBERG LOOKS TO EXTEND UNBEATEN FIELD HOCKEY RECORD;
OHIO WESLEYAN MEN'S SOCCER ROLLS TO PERFECT 11-0 RECORD**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

CROSS COUNTRY REPORT

Denison won both the men's and women's races at its own invitational last weekend. Ohio Wesleyan placed second in both races, while Kenyon was third. Denison's **Chris Lightle (Tipp City, OH/Tippecanoe)** won the men's race in 28:02, while **Anna Bloom (Chicago, IL/Laboratory Schools)** of Kenyon placed first among the women. Earlham senior **Shannan Rieder (Cincinnati, OH/Mount Notre Dame)** won the Earlham Invitational. Her winning time of 19:13 beat her closest competitor by 14 seconds. Sophomore **Andy Graham (Mogadore, OH/Mogadore)** paced the Quaker men with a seventh-place finish. Hiram's **Don Beesing (Stow, OH/Stow)** led the Terriers to an eighth-place finish among 10 teams at the Duquesne Invitational. His time of 27:58 placed him 28th in a field of 104. The top individual for the Hiram women was **Jenny Wilke (Sandusky, OH/Sandusky)** with a personal-best time of 19:58, good for 29th place. Wittenberg's men placed 30th of 42 teams and the women were 32nd of 46 teams, both at the Loyola (Chicago) Lakefront Invitational. At the Walsh Invitational, Wooster's **Brendan Callahan (South Glastonbury, CT/Glastonbury)** won the men's race as the Scots took first place in the four-team meet. It was his third win in four meets this season and his time of 16:35 set a course record. The Scot women were paced by **Sandy Tecklenburg (Cincinnati, OH/Anderson)**, who placed second in 20:18.

RANKINGS: In the most recent cross country coaches' poll (Sept. 26), Denison's women ranked 18th. On the men's side, Kenyon received votes.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY: Earlham sophomore **Andy Graham (Mogadore, OH/Mogadore)** placed seventh in a field of 157 runners at the Earlham Invitational. He paced the Quakers with a clocking of 27:43 in the five-mile race.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY: Kenyon freshman **Anna Bloom (Chicago, IL/University of Chicago Laboratory Schools)** won a three-way meet with Denison and Ohio Wesleyan. She posted a time of 19:41 over the five-kilometer course, defeating a field of 34 runners.

FIELD HOCKEY: Wittenberg sophomore **Emily Duh (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley)** scored four goals and nine points as the Tigers picked up two conference victories. She scored three goals in a win over Wooster, and added a goal and an assist in a victory over Earlham.

MEN'S SOCCER: Wabash senior **Ben Robinson (Indianapolis, IN/North Central)** scored the first two goals of his Little Giant career, and added an assist. He had a hand in all of Wabash's goals last week, with a goal and an assist in a 2-1 victory over Rose-Hulman and scored the lone goal in a 3-1 loss to Oberlin.

WOMEN'S SOCCER: Earlham sophomore **Shoshana Erickson (Henderson, NV/Las Vegas Academy)** scored four goals and added an assist as the Quakers went 1-1 last week.

VOLLEYBALL: Wittenberg sophomore **Brittany Baume (Springfield, OH/Southeastern)** had 93 kills, 33 digs, four service aces and six blocks in four matches as the Tigers placed second in their own invitational.

FIELD HOCKEY REPORT

Wittenberg (6-0, 8-1) hopes to solidify its hold on first place as it hosts third-place Ohio Wesleyan (3-2, 3-5) on Wednesday and second-place Denison (5-1, 5-5) on Saturday in perhaps the Tigers' most challenging week of the season. Earlier this season, Wittenberg defeated Denison, 2-1. It will be the first meeting between the Tigers and the Bishops. Denison, which won twice in NCAC play last week, also plays Oberlin (3-5, 3-6) during this week. In addition to the Tigers, Ohio Wesleyan will travel to Kenyon (2-4, 3-5). Wooster (3-3, 4-5) travels to Kenyon and hosts Earlham (0-7, 2-9).

Ohio Wesleyan junior **Liz Kamke (Ponte Vedra Beach, FL/Ottawa Hills)** scored the game-winning goal in overtime to lift the Bishops to a 3-2 victory over Oberlin. Sophomore goalkeeper **Danielle Cranin (Freehold, NJ/Freehold Borough)** of Earlham made 22 saves in a 2-0 loss to Wittenberg.

MEN'S SOCCER REPORT

Every school but Hiram will see conference action in the coming week. Ohio Wesleyan (3-0, 11-0) travels to both Wittenberg (1-1, 6-3-1) and Wooster (1-2, 5-3-2) hoping to keep hold if its lead in the NCAC race. The Bishops defeated Kenyon (0-3, 1-8) and Denison (2-1, 7-3) last week. Three teams are tied for second place, including Earlham (2-0-1, 3-4-1) and Hiram (2-1-1, 6-4-1), who played to a 2-2 tie last week. Allegheny (2-1-1, 5-5-1) is also tied for second. The Gators travel to face Earlham on Saturday in both schools' only NCAC action this week. Kenyon and Denison will play in Granville on Tuesday, then Kenyon will return home to host Oberlin (1-2-1, 4-6-1) on Saturday. Wabash's (0-3, 2-7) only action will be on the road against Wittenberg.

Oberlin senior **Sam Hopkins (Portland, OR/Lincoln)** scored two goals and added an assist in three games last week. Junior **Ryan Miller (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** of Ohio Wesleyan scored a goal in a victory over Kenyon and added a goal and two assists in a win against Denison.

National Poll: In the NSCAA poll for Sept. 25, 2000, Ohio Wesleyan ranks third in the nation in Division III. The Bishops are the top-ranked team in the Great Lakes Region. Denison and Wooster are tied for 10th in the region.

WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT

Eight of nine squads will see NCAC play this week. NCAC co-leader Kenyon (3-1, 6-5) is the only team with the week off from conference action. The other co-leader, Allegheny (3-1, 9-2) travels to Earlham (1-3, 5-4-1). Third-place Denison (2-0, 7-0-1), which has the best record by winning percentage but is third based on points, hosts Wittenberg (1-1, 7-2) on Wednesday and travels to Hiram (0-3, 4-8) on Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan (1-1, 6-3-1) travels to Wittenberg. Oberlin (1-2, 4-6) hosts Hiram and travels to Wooster in the coming week.

Ohio Wesleyan junior **Erin Croasmun (Ventura, CA/St. Bonaventure)** scored a goal with 32 seconds left in regulation to tie Wheaton, the second-ranked team in Division III. She also recorded the game-winning goal against Hiram last week. **Kryss Jones (Orange, CA/Poway)**, a sophomore back for Allegheny, scored two goals and added an assist in two NCAC wins. Kenyon sophomore forward **Melissa Blum (Chevy Chase, MD/St. Andrews Episcopal)** scored two of the Ladies' three goals last week. Senior **Natalie Estep (Fairborn, OH/Fairborn)** and freshman **Jill Rekers (Springboro, OH/Springboro)** each scored three goals for Wittenberg.

National Poll: The NSCAA poll as of Sept. 25, 2000 ranks Denison 10th. Allegheny also received votes. The Big Red stand second in the Great Lakes Region while the Gators are fourth, Ohio Wesleyan fifth, Wooster seventh and Wittenberg is 10th.

VOLLEYBALL REPORT

Co-leader Ohio Wesleyan (2-0, 10-12) plays at Earlham (2-1, 10-8) on Wednesday then travels to Oberlin (0-3, 6-11) with Denison (2-1, 10-7) on the weekend. Wittenberg (3-0, 15-6), the other co-leader, will take on Kenyon (1-2, 9-13) and Allegheny (1-1, 7-10). Earlham and Wooster (1-3, 9-8) will play at Hiram (1-2, 5-14). The Bishops and the Tigers will face off the following week, on Wednesday, Oct. 11.

Wittenberg placed second in its own invitational, which featured five of the top 20 teams in Division III: Mount St. Joseph (8), Ithaca (10), Ohio Northern (13) Mount Union (14) and Wittenberg (20). Junior **Holli Camelio (Rochester, NY/Nazareth Academy)** registered 41 kills, 53 assists and 19 digs as Wooster won three of four matches.
