NCAC Spring Sports Update

**ALLEGHENY AND WITTENBERG UNBEATEN IN BASEBALL;
NCAC TRACK AND FIELD TEAMS COMPETE AT ALL-OHIO**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT

The leaders in the Eastern and Western divisions face similar scenarios as the teams hurtle toward the North Coast Athletic Conference Tournament. Both Allegheny (6-0, 19-5) in the East, and Wittenberg (5-0, 17-7-1) in the West, sit high atop their respective standings as the undefeated leader. In the Saturday and Sunday three-game conference series, they each face opponents who have proven they can win games. The Gators host fourth-place Kenyon (3-3, 11-10), while the Tigers host third-place Denison (6-3, 14-14). While they must take this week's opponents seriously, each faces a much stiffer challenge next week - the final week of the regular season.

During the final week of regular-season play before the tournament, Allegheny and Wittenberg must hold off strong challengers in their respective divisions in order to retain their position in the standings. The Gators will travel to second-place Wooster (4-1, 24-6), while the Tigers visit second-place Ohio Wesleyan (5-1, 27-9). Home field advantage in the first round of the tournament belongs to the respective winners of each division, who will host their divisional runners up in a best-of-three series (i.e. West #1 vs. West #2 and East #1 vs. East #2) on May 5-6. The two winners of the first round will advance to the tournament finals, to be held at Thurmon Munson Memorial Stadium May 10-11 in Canton.

Notes: The second ABCA/*Collegiate Baseball* Div. III national poll (Apr. 9) ranks Allegheny fourth. Ohio Wesleyan is tied for seventh with Cortland State (NY) and Wooster is 20th. The poll lists Allegheny, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster among the top five schools in the Midwest region, with the Gators first, the Bishops second and the Scots in sole possession of fourth ... Ohio Wesleyan needs three more overall wins to reach the 30-win plateau for the ninth time in 10 seasons. The Bishops have passed the 20-win mark for the 17th straight year ... Allegheny outfielder **Ben Couch (Uniontown, OH/Green)** broke the Gator record for career hits with 186 after going 4-for-10 in three games last week. The senior scored three runs, hit three RBI and stole two bases ... Denison freshman shortstop **Alex Nikolich (Prospect, KY/Kentucky Country Day)** hit .571 (8-for-14) with nine RBI, two doubles, a grand slam and a stolen base last week ... Earlham sophomore third baseman **Adam Fowler (Dayton, OH/Carroll)** blasted two home runs, including a grand slam, in the fifth inning of the Quakers' opening game against Wittenberg. Fowler's homers highlighted a 5-for-9, six-RBI performance at the plate in last week's series. He is hitting at a .341 clip for the season (14-for-41) ... Hiram senior pitcher **Brian Frasco (Hubbard, OH/Ursuline)** pitched the Terriers to a 16-0 shutout of Oberlin last week. He fanned 13 batters and allowed only three hits ... Ohio Wesleyan junior outfielder **Shaun Rice (Dublin, OH/Columbus Watterson)** went 8-for-14 last week with two doubles, two homers and seven RBI. He was a perfect 4-for-4 from the plate in the Bishops' 9-0 shutout of Thomas More, picking up two of his six runs scored on the week ... Wittenberg head coach **Jay Lewis** has guided his Tigers to 104 wins (104-78-3) - he broke the 100-win barrier with a win over Ohio Northern last week. Wittenberg, on a six-game winning streak, is one victory short of last year's season total. The Tigers' last won more than six straight games in March 1998 ... Wooster junior **Matt Englander (Solon, OH/Solon)** improved to 8-0 in nine appearances with a pair of wins last week. Scot junior first baseman **Dan Penberthy (Moon Township, PA/Moon)** lead Wooster to four wins last week, batting 10-for-19 with two homers, eight runs scored and four RBI.

PLAYER/PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Wittenberg freshman **Kurt Hartfelder (Columbus, OH/Upper Arlington)** went the distance in the Tigers' 11-3 win over Mt. Saint Joseph, giving up six hits, two earned runs and three walks. He picked up his second victory of the week in a 20-11 win over Earlham. Hartfelder entered with the game tied 11-11 and pitched two scoreless innings to earn the win. Tiger junior catcher/outfielder **Jeff Beulow (Oakland, MI/Rochester)** went 10-16 (.625) with two dingers, 11 RBI and seven runs scored last week. He is hitting .346 on the season with four homers and 29 RBI.

GOLF REPORT

In the final weekend of competition before the NCAC Championship, Wooster’s Parlor Restaurant/Bank One Invitational will feature six of the eight conference golf squads. It will be held Friday and Saturday at the Wooster Country Club. North Coast schools expected to participate are Denison, Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan, Wabash, Wittenberg and the host Scots. Hiram will compete at the John Carroll Invitational on Sunday and Monday. Allegheny hosts the Griffin Classic on Saturday and Sunday. The North Coast Athletic Conference Championship, to be hosted by Hiram, is set for Friday and Saturday, April 27-28, at Sugarbush Golf Course.

Notes: The first spring MasterCard Collegiate Golf Rankings from the Collegiate Golf Foundation place Allegheny 15th and Ohio Wesleyan 17th among the top 25 programs in NCAA Div. III ... Last week, Allegheny placed fourth of eight teams with a 34-over par score of 314 at Slippery Rock’s Raymond Invitational then was fifth of 10 teams with a 302 (18 over par) at Indiana of Pennsylvania’s Golf Invitational. Senior **Nathan Smith (Brookville, PA/Brookville)** leads the Gators with a 73.8 stroke average, and has placed in the top 10 five times this season, winning twice ... Denison, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster competed in the 15-team Denison Spring Invitational. The Bishops (602) were the top NCAC team after they finished in second place behind the champions, Otterbein (585), and were followed closely by the host Big Red in third (608). The Tigers (627) tied for ninth and the Scots (638) were 13th. Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Chad Poling (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** tied for the runner-up spot with a two-round score of 147. Teammate **Jay Tilton (Cincinnati, OH/Winton Woods)** tied for seventh (150). Other top-20 individuals from North Coast schools were **Jeremy Meade (Wayland, MA/Wayland)** of Ohio Wesleyan, **Matt Elliott (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** of Wooster, and **Adam Knowlton (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)** of Wittenberg who tied for 11th (151), and three Denison golfers – **Nick Rutan, Mike Smith (Commerce Twp, MI/Brother Rice)** and **Adam Klein (Brecksville, OH/Brecksville-Broadview Hts.)** – who tied for 18th (152) in the field of 85 golfers ... Wabash placed 10th of 20 teams at the Illinois Wesleyan Invitational with a two-round 646. Junior **Joe Mills (Lafayette, IN/Central Catholic)** fired back-to-back 78s to lead the Little Giants with a two-day score of 156. Hiram and Kenyon did not compete last week.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Ohio Wesleyan (3-0, 4-4) can move one step closer to its 12th North Coast crown with a win over sixth-place Oberlin (0-4, 1-7) Wednesday. Wittenberg enters this week tied for third after defeating Wooster (1-2, 2-7) and losing to Kenyon (3-1, 7-2) last week. The Lords, alone in second place, have a Tuesday night match at home against third-place Denison (2-1, 7-3) remaining on their schedule. The Big Red completes its NCAC slate with a home match-up with Wooster on Saturday.

Notes: The USILA Men’s Division III Rankings put Ohio Wesleyan eighth and Denison ninth. Kenyon sophomore Justin Martinich (Bay Shore, NY/Bay Shore) scored four goals to lead the Lords to a 13-12 victory over Wittenberg. Jason Fogelson (Bridgewater, CT/Canterbury School) of Ohio Wesleyan, the NCAC’s leader in points and assists per game, scored nine goals and added seven assists as the Bishops took over first place in the conference standings. Wittenberg’s Mario Cassani (Chesterfield, MO/Desmet) scored five goals and six assists as the Tigers split a pair of games. He leads the conference with 3.0 goals per game.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Denison goalkeeper **Peter Royer (Avon, CT/Westminster)** led the Big Red to two victories last week. He allowed just eight goals and 36 shots, and tallied 16 saves in a key regional non-conference game with Ohio Wesleyan, 11 of them in the second half.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Wooster (4-0, 7-3) and Denison (3-0, 4-4) remain unbeaten in NCAC play and share the conference lead. The Big Red put their perfect mark to the test when they take on third-place Ohio Wesleyan (3-2, 7-5) on Tuesday. Wooster, absent from conference play this week, resumes league action on April 24 when it hosts Kenyon. Four games fill out the remainder of this week’s schedule. On Wednesday, Allegheny (0-3, 1-4) travels to Oberlin (1-3, 2-6) while Earlham (0-3, 0-4) hosts the Ladies (2-2, 3-4). The Gators play host to Wittenberg (2-2, 5-4) on Saturday and entertain the Quakers on Sunday to complete this week’s slate of games.

Notes: The NCAA Division III Lacrosse Committee ranked three North Coast schools in the top five of the West Region. Denison stands first, Wooster is second and Kenyon is fourth. The poll covers games through April 8 ... Kenyon junior **Gwen Ockenlander (Jenkintown, PA/Jenkintown)** scored two goals and assisted on a third in the Lords 6-5 loss to Ohio Wesleyan ... Bishop freshman **Alexa Laub (Buffalo, NY/Nichols)** netted a career-high five goals and an assist in Ohio Wesleyan’s 13-1 win over Whittier.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT (continued)

The attacker also scored the winning goal for the Bishops in their win over Kenyon ... Denison senior **Sage Leonard (Wallingford, PA/Strath Haven)** tallied five goals in the Big Red's two wins last week. She is returning to action after spending the 2000 season abroad in Australia. Leonard has notched 10 goals and four assists on the season.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Wooster sophomore **Megan Kennedy (Annapolis, MD/Broadneck Senior)** tallied three goals and one assist in each of the Scots two wins last week. Wooster defeated Oberlin and Earlham, 17-3 and 17-0, respectively.

SOFTBALL REPORT

Defending North Coast champion Wittenberg (4-0, 14-8) picked up wins in both games of its doubleheader against Oberlin (0-6, 0-11) to extend its perfect conference record to 4-0. The Tigers, however, are not alone atop the NCAC standings. Denison (6-0, 20-4), last year's league runners up, also have an unblemished record in conference play after earning double wins against Kenyon (4-2, 16-10) and Hiram (2-4, 8-20) last week. Both teams look to strengthen their claim on first place with doubleheaders this week. Wittenberg travels to Kenyon on Wednesday and hosts Hiram on Saturday. The Big Red host Ohio Wesleyan (3-1, 7-10) Wednesday and Allegheny (1-5, 6-17) on Saturday. This week's schedule also matches Oberlin against Allegheny and Hiram against Wooster on Wednesday and Kenyon against Ohio Wesleyan and Oberlin against Wooster on Saturday.

Notes: Denison is ranked 24th in the latest poll (Apr. 4) by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association ... Big Red junior pitcher **Courtney Zollars (Westerville, OH/Westerville South)** struck out 13 batters and did not allow any runs or walks in 12 innings of work last week ... Ohio Wesleyan sophomore first baseman **Nichole Rubeck (Raymond, OH/North Union)** tied school records with three hits and three RBI in the Battling Bishops' 9-4 extra-inning loss to Wooster. In the opener against the Scots, she went 2-for-4 (.500) with one RBI ... Wittenberg senior **Carisa Clagg (Springfield, OH/Northwestern)** went 5-for-7 with a double, two triples, five RBI and three stolen bases in two wins over Oberlin. She scored four runs and played errorless first base. Clagg leads the Tigers with a .500 batting average.

PLAYER/PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Hiram senior catcher **Carrie McCaughtry (Toledo, OH/Central Catholic)** went 5-for-8 (.625) for the week. She led the Terriers to two wins over Oberlin, going 5-for-5 (1.000) and recording two RBI, three triples and four runs against the Yeowomen. Wooster freshman **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** went 2-0 on the week, including a no-hitter at Allegheny. Against the Gators she sent down the side - in order - in four of seven innings, giving up four walks and throwing eight strikes. Overall, Barone pitched 15 innings, allowed three earned runs and struck out 22 batters.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

The conference regular season heats up this week with seven divisional matches on tap in the coming seven days, and those matches involve all 10 teams. The top two teams in the West, Denison (3-0) and Wittenberg (2-0) face off on Wednesday in Springfield. Earlham (0-3) and Ohio Wesleyan (0-3), both looking for their first NCAC victory, meet Thursday in Delaware. Also Thursday, Kenyon (0-0) plays its first conference match, on the road at Oberlin (1-1). Saturday features Allegheny (1-1) at Oberlin, two teams that enter the week tied for second in the East, Hiram (0-2) at Kenyon (0-0), and Wittenberg at Wabash (2-1). On Sunday, Wooster travels to Kenyon.

Last week, Denison extended its mark to 3-0 in the West with a victory over Wabash, while Wittenberg won both of its opening matches to tie for the lead in the division. Wooster staked its claim on first in the East by winning its first two divisional matches of the season.

Notes: Three Wittenberg singles players have the best records at their respective flights – **Bryan Heft (Gahanna, OH/Lincoln)** at first singles (15-3 overall /2-0 NCAC), **Duby Lakos (Lynchburg, VA/Heritage)** at the fourth flight (11-3/2-0) and **Ben Hodgkiss-Lilly (Cleveland Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)** at number six (11-2/2-0) ... Wabash has the top marks at one singles flight and two of the three doubles positions. **Scott Paramoure (Bath, PA/New Brownfels-Logansport)** continues to maintain the top mark at third singles (14-3/2-0) and holds the top record at first doubles with partner **Mike Lynch (Evansville, IN/North)**. **Daniel Altman (Monticello, IN/Twin Lakes)** and **Klint Schwenk (Jasper, IN/Jasper)** are the top number-three doubles combination with a 9-3/0-1 mark.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Allegheny (4-0, 19-2) and Oberlin (3-0, 10-7) each won in conference play last week and share the NCAC lead. Oberlin junior **Sarah Jesse (Casco, MI/Port Huron Northern)** has the best overall record among number-one singles players with a 14-2 mark, including a 3-0 record in NCAC play. She also continues to share the NCAC's best number-one doubles record with sophomore **Alaina Fotiu-Wojtowicz (Okemos, MI/Okemos)**. The duo is 12-4 overall, 3-0 in conference matches. The Gators have the best record at four singles flights and two of the three doubles flights. The second doubles combination of sophomores **Carrie Perkis (Rochester, NY/Greece-Athena)** and **Laura Lehrman (Erie, PA/McDowell)** is 10-3 overall, 2-2 in the NCAC. Perkis is 15-1/4-0 at third singles and Lehrman is 14-1/3-1 in number-four singles. Earlham's **Brandis Morehead (Parkersburg, WV/Parkersburg)** and Allegheny's **Judy Spencer (Pittsburgh, PA/Baldwin)** remain unbeaten at second and fifth singles, respectively. Morehead is 6-0/1-0 while Spencer is 14-0/4-0.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

This coming Saturday, the All-Ohio Championships will feature all of the men's and women's track squads from the NCAC that are based in Ohio – Denison, Hiram, Kenyon, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster. Ohio Wesleyan hosts the event annually on the George Gauthier Track. Allegheny will compete in the Slippery Rock Invitational, while Wabash runs at the Butler Invitational, to be held at IUPUI in Indianapolis. Earlham will host its own invitational.

Last week, Earlham and Wabash competed in the Indiana Little State Meet, hosted by DePauw. The Quaker women placed 14th in the 18-team meet, while the Little Giants were seventh and the Quaker men were 15th among 19 squads. Wabash sophomores **Darren Green (Dallas, TX/South Texas HS for Health Professions)** and **Peter DeYoung (Evansville, IN/Bosse)**, and Earlham senior **Chuck Tabela (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** each placed in two events. Green was second in the 200 and fifth in the 400. DeYoung took fifth in the triple jump with a career-best leap of 43-0 1/4, and was third in the high jump. Tabela was fifth in the shot put and seventh in the discus. On the women's side, freshman **Carmen Batts-Porter (Indianapolis, IN/Cardinal Ritter)** broke her own school mark in the shot put (38-2 1/2), which gave her 10th place.

At the Marv Frye Invitational, hosted by Ohio Wesleyan, three Denison women met the NCAA Division III provisional qualifying standard in their respective events: Freshman **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** met the standard and placed second in the discus with a throw of 136-5; freshman **Melanie Cluss (Uniontown, PA/Laurel Highlands)** qualified as she took fourth in the 100 hurdles (15.15); and senior **Jill Westerfeld (Wyoming, OH/Wyoming)** won the 400 meters (57.25) and improved her qualifying time. As a team, Denison placed third, Ohio Wesleyan was sixth and Kenyon ninth in the 12-team meet.

The Bishops won the 10-team men's meet behind the efforts of **Craig Neeley (Columbus, OH/Bexley)** and **Jason Martin (Columbus, OH/Westerville North)**, who claimed four individual victories between them. Neeley took the long jump (22-8 1/4) and high jump (6-7). His performance in the high jump met the NCAA provisional standard. Martin claimed the 100- (11.00) and 200- (22.05) meter dashes. Kenyon placed sixth, and the Big Red placed eighth.

Oberlin hosted a non-scoring meet which featured NCAC teams from Hiram and Wooster. Scot senior **Katie Walker (Euclid, OH/Euclid)** won or tied for first in three events and set a school record in one. She broke the Wooster mark in the discus (130-7), took the javelin (82-11) and shared first place in the shot put (33-5 1/2) with teammate, **Nickie Artes (Baltimore, MD/Baltimore School)**. Oberlin's **Jabari Spruill (Charleston, SC/Porter-Gaud)** was a double winner with victories in the long (20-6) and triple (41-1 1/2) jumps, as the Yeomen won six events. **Elizabeth Chandler (Bloomfield, MI/Lasher)** and **Shannon Houlihan (Gorham, ME/Gorham)** each won twice for the Oberlin women. Chandler took the 200 (26.3) and triple jump (34-2 1/4), while Houlihan won the 100 hurdles (16.01) and long jump (15-11). In all, the Yeowomen won nine events. Hiram's men placed first in three and the Wooster teams each won seven events.

Wittenberg hosted a quad meet in which the Tiger women won and the Tiger men placed second. The men's squad won three events and women took six.

RUNNERS OF THE WEEK: Ohio Wesleyan senior **Stephanie Moss (Aurora, OH/Crestwood)** won the 800 meters in 2:20.96 at the Marv Frye Invitational, hosted by Ohio Wesleyan. She also finished second in the 1500 (4:50.07). Bishops senior **Jason Martin (Columbus, OH/Westerville North)** won both the 100 meters (11.0) and the 200 meters (22.05) at the same event.

FIELD ATHLETES OF THE WEEK: Denison freshman **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** met the NCAA standard and placed second in the discus with a throw of 136-5 at the Marv Frye Invitational. Kenyon senior **Adam Bange (Cincinnati, OH/St. Xavier)** won the javelin at same event with a toss of 186-8 - six inches short of the NCAA Provisional Standard.
