NCAC Spring Sports Update

**DENISON TO HOST WOMEN'S TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS;
HIRAM TO HOST GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS AT SUGARBUSH**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT

In their last three-game conference series of the regular season, the leaders in the East and West divisions must hold off the team one step below them in the standings. Ohio Wesleyan (8-1, 31-9) will meet their Western division opponent at home, entertaining Wittenberg (6-1, 19-8) on Saturday and Sunday, while Allegheny (9-0, 22-5), the NCAC's only undefeated team, packs its bags for a trip to Wooster (7-1, 29-6) in the East. Third-place Hiram (4-4, 15-12) hosts fourth-place Kenyon (3-6, 11-14) in the final series in the East division, while the West finishes with fourth-place Wabash (1-7, 8-20) hosting fifth-place Earlham (0-9, 7-22). Denison (7-4, 15-15) and Oberlin (0-12, 2-26) completed league play last week.

Home field advantage in the first round of the North Coast tournament, scheduled for May 5-6, belongs to the respective winners of each division, who will host their divisional runners up in a best-of-three series (i.e. West #1 vs. West #2 and East #1 vs. East #2). The two winners of the first round will advance to the tournament finals, to be held at Thurmon Munson Memorial Stadium May 10-11 in Canton. Saturday and Sunday, May 5-6, will also feature "crossover" series between the teams in places three through five in each division in order to determine final league standings (i.e. the West's third-place team will face the East's third-place team in a three-game series to determine fifth and sixth place overall in the conference. The two fourth-place teams will meet for seventh and eighth place, and the two fifth-place teams will face off for ninth and 10th place.).

Notes: Allegheny sophomore pitcher **Josh Sharpless (Freedom, PA/Freedom)** threw his first career no-hitter in an 8-0 win over Kenyon (the first game of a doubleheader. The Gators also won the nightcap, 21-4). Sharpless struck out five batters, and walked none. His effort lowered his ERA to 1.00 ... Earlham rallied from an 11-2 deficit with four runs in the sixth inning and nine more runs in the seventh to upset Franklin 15-11 in non conference action. Sophomore first baseman **Sean O'Reilly (Indianapolis, IN/Bishop Chatard)** sparked the Quaker offense with a three-run home run. Freshman pitcher **Adam Osborne (Richmond, IN/Northeastern)** tossed three and 1/3 innings of scoreless relief to pick up his first collegiate victory. He limited Franklin to two hits and was aided by a pair of double plays turned by the Quaker infield ... Ohio Wesleyan tied an NCAC record for runs in an inning with 16 in the fifth inning of the first game of its series with Earlham. The Bishops won 21-1. Ohio Wesleyan swept the Quakers, winning game two, 15-2, and game three, 17-2. Junior first baseman **Drew Caravella (Columbus, OH/Hilliard Davidson)** was 9-for-13 (.692) in the three games with nine runs, 11 RBI, three doubles and two home runs, including a first-inning grand slam in game three of the series ... Ohio Wesleyan has won 30 or more games for the ninth time in 10 seasons ... Wabash sophomore catcher **Jake Knott (Lafayette, IN/Jefferson)** went 8-for-14 (.571) in four non-conference games last week, hitting four doubles, one home run and eight RBI ... A pair of Wittenberg pitchers earned their first career saves last week. Sophomore **Brian Robinson (Columbus, OH/Centennial)** pitched 1.2 scoreless innings in a 6-5 win over Denison while fellow sophomore **Jay Nunn (Urbana, OH/Urbana)** threw three scoreless innings in a 9-7 win over Kenyon ... Wooster junior **John Werner (Pittsburgh, PA/Northgate)** improved to 9-0 on the season with a pair of wins last week. He went the first seven innings in the Scots' 8-4 win over Akron and pitched the fifth and sixth innings in a 15-5 win over Oberlin. He totalled 10 strikeouts for the week ... Wooster is on a 14-game winning streak. The Scots are one win away from reaching the 30-win plateau for the eighth season in a row and the 16th time in 25 seasons.

PLAYER/PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Wooster junior **Jared Treadway (Bay Village, OH/Bay)** led Wooster to a 5-0 week by batting .733 (11-for-15). He totalled four homers and six steals, while scoring 11 runs and driving in 12 others. Ohio Wesleyan junior pitcher **Matt Farmwald (Plain City, OH/Jonathan Alder)** worked 15 innings in two wins last week to improve his record to 10-0 for the season. He earned a five-hit complete game win over Heidelberg (3-1) and also earned a 15-2 win over Earlham. He allowed only two earned runs and struck out eight batters.

GOLF REPORT

The North Coast Athletic Conference Golf Championships are set for Friday and Saturday, April 27-28 at Sugarbush Golf Course in Garrettsville, Ohio. Hiram College is host to the 17th annual championship. Ohio Wesleyan is the defending champion and has won seven titles overall. Allegheny has taken seven crowns as well, while Wittenberg and Wooster have each won once.

In the final tuneup before the championships, Wooster hosted the Parlor Restaurant/Bank One Invitational. The Bishops were the top NCAC team when they finished in fourth place, followed by Denison in sixth and Wooster in seventh. Wittenberg (eighth-place tie), Wabash (13th) and Kenyon (14th) round out North Coast squads in the 15-team tournament that was won by Otterbein. Ohio Wesleyan's **Jay Tilton (Cincinnati, OH/Winton Woods)** and **Chad Poling (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** tied for seventh place individually with two-round scores of 154.

Allegheny also hosted a tournament last weekend and the Gators won their own Griffin Motors/AC Golf Classic. The Gators took the top three spots as **Dave Whitaker (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair)** was the medalist with a two-round 143. **Nathan Smith (Brookville, PA/Brookville)** finished second after carding a 146 and **Joseph Zumpella (Struthers, OH/Struthers)** was third (147). Also last week, Ohio Wesleyan placed ninth of 10 teams at the CER/Cleveland State Collegiate Invitational. In a field made up entirely of NCAA Division I teams, the Bishops' top finisher was Tilton in a tie for 16th place with a three-round score of 235.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Four games remain on the conference schedule. Ohio Wesleyan (4-0) will play its final NCAC game on Tuesday and the Bishops have the opportunity to clinch the conference crown for themselves if they are able to topple the Tigers of Wittenberg (1-2). Depending on the outcome of that contest, Kenyon (3-1) may be able to secure at least a share of title with a victory over Denison (2-1) on Saturday. Also on Saturday, Wittenberg plays its final contest at Wooster (1-2). The final NCAC contest of the 2001 campaign will be a May 2 matchup between Wooster and Denison. Oberlin (0-5) has already completed its schedule.

Ohio Wesleyan clinched at least a share of the NCAC title with a victory over Oberlin last week. It is the Bishops' 12th title in 17 seasons. Senior **Jason Fogelson (Bridgewater, CT/Canterbury School)** leads the Bishops and the NCAC in scoring with 66 points (6.00 points per game), 38 goals (3.45 per game) and 28 assists (2.55). OWU netminder **Corey Ayers (Chattanooga, TN/McCallie School)** has a conference-best .663 saves percentage.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ohio Wesleyan senior **Jason Fogelson (Bridgewater, CT/Canterbury School)** tallied 15 goals and 12 assists to lead the Bishops to three wins last week. Ohio Wesleyan is guaranteed at least a share of its 12th league championship in the past 17 seasons.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Entering the final week of the regular season, defending champion Denison (5-0) needs victories over sixth-place Oberlin (2-3) and eighth-place Earlham (0-5) to secure its 14th NCAC title in 17 seasons and third in a row. Wooster (4-1), however, is right on their heels and the Scots have home contests with third-place Kenyon (3-2) and fifth-place Wittenberg (3-3) on tap. Seven of eight teams have at least one conference contest in the final stretch - only fourth-place Ohio Wesleyan (4-3) has completed its NCAC schedule.

The top six teams advance to next week's NCAC tournament. The top two seeds have byes in the quarterfinal round, and the third and fourth seeds host the sixth and fifth seeds, respectively, on their home fields on Tuesday, May 1. The semifinals will be hosted by Kenyon on Friday, May 4 with the championship following on Saturday at the same site.

Wittenberg senior **Kati Robbins (Collegeville, PA/Methacton)** leads the NCAC in scoring (5.92 ppg) and assists (2.75 apg) and ranks eighth in NCAA Division III in points per game.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Denison senior attacker **Laura Peace (Lutherville, MD/St. Paul's)** found the back of the net 10 times to lead the Big Red to two wins last week. She leads the Big Red in scoring and tops all conference goal scorers with 3.60 goals per game.

SOFTBALL REPORT

Eight doubleheaders dot the final week of the 2001 schedule as all eight North Coast teams take the field against two opponents. Frontrunners Denison (9-1, 23-5) and Wittenberg (7-1, 17-9) kick things off on when they meet in Springfield on Wednesday. Also on Wednesday, Allegheny (3-7, 9-20), Wooster (6-4, 13-14), and Oberlin (0-10, 0-15) host Hiram (3-7, 8-20), Kenyon (4-4, 16-14) and Ohio Wesleyan (4-2, 8-11), respectively. On Saturday, Allegheny travels to Ohio Wesleyan, Denison goes to Oberlin, Hiram heads to Kenyon and Wittenberg drives to Wooster.

The top four teams, according to the regular season standings, will participate in the inaugural NCAC Softball Tournament, scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, May 4-5 at the site of the highest seed.

Notes: Allegheny senior outfielder **Lauren Hornish (Pittsburgh, PA/North Hills)** went 9-for-21 (.429) in six games last week. She had seven RBI, five runs, two doubles and a home run ... Denison junior pitcher **Courtney Zollars (Westerville, OH/Westerville South)** struck out the first 10 Gator batters in the Big Red's 14-1 win over Allegheny. The Big Red were ranked 13th by the American Fastpitch Coaches Association, heading into this week ... Kenyon sophomore shortstop **Carrie Robertson (Newton, MA/North)** banged out a homer in each of the Ladies losses to Capital, increasing her league-leading total to six ... Wittenberg freshman pitcher **Carmen Montgomery (Springfield, OH/Southeastern)** was three-for-three in complete games last week, allowing nine earned runs in 29 innings of work. She struck out 10 batters and is currently 15-2 on the season ... With 13 wins, Wooster has doubled its win total from last season.

PLAYER/PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Ohio Wesleyan senior center fielder **Leslie Welsh (Pataskala, OH/Watkins Memorial)** doubled in the go-ahead run and scored what proved to be the game-winning run as the Bishops handed Denison its first NCAC loss of the season (2-1). In the two-game series, which the Bishops and the Big Red split, she went 2-for-6 (.333), totalling two doubles a run and an RBI. Wooster freshman pitcher **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** went 4-0 last week, combining to pitch 23 of a possible 26 innings and only giving up 12 hits while striking out 35 of a possible 69 batters.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

The regular season has just three matches remaining on the schedule, all in the East Division. In the West, Denison (4-0) has secured the top spot after defeating second-place Wittenberg (3-1), 5-2 last week. Wabash (2-2) finished third, while Ohio Wesleyan was fourth (1-3) and Earlham (0-4) placed fifth. The top four teams in each division advance to the NCAC Tournament May 4-5, at Oberlin.

The race is still on in the East, where Wooster (2-0) and Kenyon (2-0) each still have two divisional matches to play. The Scots and the Lords were to face off last week but the match was postponed to May 1st due to rain. Wooster will host Hiram (0-3) on Wednesday. Also on Wednesday, Kenyon hosts third-place Allegheny (2-1). Oberlin (1-3) has completed its divisional schedule.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

The North Coast Athletic Conference Championships will be held Friday and Saturday, April 27-28 at Denison. Kenyon (0-2) is the only undefeated team in the conference, and the Ladies have one conference match remaining, at fifth-place Wittenberg (4-2) on Tuesday. Allegheny (4-1) and Oberlin (4-1) are tied for second place, although the Yeowomen defeated the Gators last week, 6-3.

Oberlin junior **Sarah Jesse (Casco, MI/Port Huron Northern)** has had an outstanding season. She ranks second in the Atlantic Region, and her two losses this season have both come to higher ranked players. She is 16-2 overall, and 5-0 in the NCAC at number-one singles. Jesse combines with sophomore **Alaina Fotiu-Wojtowicz (Okemos, MI/Okemos)** at first doubles and they are 13-5 overall and 4-1 in the conference at that flight.

The last remaining regular-season dual matches also scheduled for Tuesday are fourth-place Denison (3-1) at Oberlin and sixth-place (tie) Earlham (1-2) at ninth-place Hiram (0-5). Ohio Wesleyan (2-4), tied for sixth with the Quakers, and Wooster (1-5), alone in eighth, have completed the NCAC regular season.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

This coming Saturday and Sunday, the first part of the NCAC Championships will take place with the Combined Events Championship. Wittenberg hosts the championships which features the heptathlon for women and the decathlon for men; this is the fourth time the events have been included in the conference meet. Points will carry over to the NCAC Championships, scheduled for Friday and Saturday, May 4-5 at Ohio Wesleyan University.

At last week's All-Ohio Championships, Ohio Wesleyan was the top NCAC finisher on the men's side in third place. Also in the top 10 were Wittenberg, which placed eighth, and Kenyon and Wooster who tied for 10th. Rounding out the list of NCAC schools competing were Denison in 13th, Oberlin in 16th and Hiram in 17th. Ohio Wesleyan junior **Craig Neeley (Columbus, OH/Bexley)** won all three jumps and met the NCAA automatic qualifying standard in the long and high jumps. He ranks first in Division III in the high jump, fourth in the long jump and sixth in the triple jump.

Other individual event winners were **Michael Baird (Temple, TX/Temple)** of Kenyon in the 3000 steeplechase (9:44.04); **Clemon Choice (Dayton, OH/Belmont)** of Ohio Wesleyan who took the 100 meters (11.36); and Wooster's **Brendan Callahan (South Glastonbury, CT/Glastonbury)**, who won the 5000 meters (15:36.48).

Denison was the top NCAC team in the women's competition in second place. Also in the top 10 were Ohio Wesleyan in sixth, Oberlin in seventh, Wooster in eighth, and Wittenberg, 10th. Hiram (14th) and Kenyon (16th) round out NCAC finishers. Denison freshman **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** was a double champion as she won both the 100- (12.71) and 200- (26.13) meter dashes. Big Red senior **Jill Westerfeld (Wyoming, OH/Wyoming)** set a meet record in the 400-meter dash (57.08), and in the process improved her NCAA provisional qualifying time for the third time. Ohio Wesleyan's **Stephanie Moss (Aurora, OH/Crestwood)** set a meet record as well, in her speciality, the 800 meters (2:14.97), and met the provisional qualifying standard. Also meeting an NCAA standard was Oberlin freshman **Shannon Houlihan (Gorham, ME/Gorham)** as she won the triple jump (37-7 1/4) and set a school record in the event. Wooster senior **Justina Williams (Moreno Valley, CA/El Camino Real)** made her mark after she won the long jump (18-4 1/2) and placed second in the triple jump. Williams has met the provisional standard for the national meet in both events. **Abi Gerstle (Kettering, OH/Fairmont)** of Wittenberg, who won the 3000 steeplechase (11:43.91) in stadium-record time, rounded out the list of winners from NCAC schools.

In other meets, Allegheny competed in the non-scoring Slippery Rock Open. Sophomore **Jeremy Scott (Norfolk, NE/Norfolk)** broke his own school mark in the pole vault for the second time this season when he cleared 16 feet, 6 inches. Three individuals won events and two of them set school records to lead the Gator women: Sophomore **Jen Surace (Bethel Park, PA/Bethel Park)** took the pole vault (school-record 10 feet, 7 inches); freshman **Chelsea Benson (Mt. Jewett, PA/Kane Area)** placed first in the steeplechase (school-record 11:59.00); and sophomore **Deserae Pegg (Danville, PA/Danville)** took the 5000 meters (18:57.00). Wabash also competed in a non-scoring meet, the Woodland Mortgage Relays on the IUPUI track in Indianapolis. Sophomore **Peter DeYoung (Evansville, IN/Bosse)** was the top individual finisher when he was runner-up in the high jump (6-7 1/2). Earlham won both the men's and women's competition at its own invitational. In all, 12 individuals won events for the Quakers, six each for the men and women.

RUNNERS OF THE WEEK: Wabash senior sprinter **Darren Green (Dallas, TX/South Texas HS for Health Professions)** ran 10.98 in the 100 meters at the Woodland Mortgage Relays on the IUPUI track in Indianapolis. It was best clocking in the NCAC this season. Wittenberg sophomore **Abi Gerstle (Kettering, OH/Fairmont)** won the 3000-meter steeplechase at the All-Ohio meet in a school-record time of 11:43.91.

FIELD ATHLETES OF THE WEEK: Earlham senior **Chuck Tabeling (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** has the top effort in both the shot put and the discus this season. At the Earlham Invitational, he won the shot with a put of 47 feet, 5 1/2 inches, and in the discus, a heave of 142 feet, 6 1/2 inches was good for second place. Wooster senior **Justina Williams (Moreno Valley, CA/El Camino Real)** won the long jump (18-4 1/2) and placed second in the triple jump (37-3 3/4). Both efforts met NCAA provisional qualifying standards.
