**OHIO WESLEYAN AND WITTENBERG BATTLE FOR FIRST;
BISHOPS REMAIN UNBEATEN AT 6-0 OVERALL**

October 14, 2001

CLEVELAND -- The Ohio Wesleyan (3-0, 6-0) Battling Bishops have rolled through the 2001 campaign without a loss, marching past three conference opponents (and six overall) on their trek toward their first North Coast crown since 1989. That year Ohio Wesleyan compiled a 5-1 league record and shared the crown with Kenyon.

Next week, the Bishops pack their bags for what could be the deciding game of their season when they head to Springfield to face defending champion Wittenberg (4-0, 6-1). The two teams have had a fierce rivalry which dates back to 1894, with the Tigers holding a one-game advantage in the all-time series, 36-35-6. Wittenberg, however, holds an 9-3 edge since the two have competed as NCAC teams beginning in 1989. Both teams are coming off NCAC wins. The Bishops topped Denison, 55-24; the Tigers upended Wooster, 47-13.

Moving from familiar foes to relatively unfamiliar ones, the two newest North Coast teams will face off for only the second time ever as Hiram (1-2, 3-2) travels to Wabash (3-1, 4-2). The Little Giants, currently tied for third with Allegheny, have won three in a row, including last week's 41-7 win over Earlham, while Hiram won, 24-17, over Oberlin.

The Yeomen (0-2, 0-5) host Kenyon (0-3, 0-5) this week as both teams are taking aim at their first victory of the season. That series, which dates back to 1892, is also close, as the Lords own a slim one-game advantage in the all-time series, 33-32-6, but hold a 14-2 advantage since 1984.

Earlham (1-2, 2-4) travels to Granville to take on Denison (1-3, 1-5) in the fourth NCAC matchup this week. Wooster, which is coming off a loss to Wittenberg, takes a break from conference play this week when it travels to Ursinus. Allegheny is idle after defeating Kenyon last week.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Allegheny sophomore **Bubba Smith (Doylestown, OH/Chippewa)** and Hiram senior **Reuben Turner (Bedford Hts., OH/Bedford)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances last week in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Smith, a 6-0, 165-pound quarterback, completed 25-of-39 (.641) passes for 365 yards and six touchdowns against Kenyon. The yardage is a Gator record, as are the TD strikes, which also tie the conference mark. Smith leads the NCAC in passing efficiency with a rating of 152.2.

Turner, a 6-0, 265-pound defensive lineman, piled up three tackles for losses totaling 21 yards and two sacks (20 yards) while making five solo tackles and three assisted tackles for a total six and one-half tackles in the Terriers 24-17 win over Oberlin. He also recovered his first fumble of the season.

GRID NOTEBOOK: Allegheny sophomore wide receiver **Jon Turner (DFranklin, PA/Franklin)** snagged 10 balls for 177 yards and four touchdowns, tying a Gator and NCAC record in the win over Kenyon ... Denison has dropped two straight games, but both have been to teams ranked in the top 25 in Division III. Heading into this weekend's action, the AFCA Div. III Coaches' Poll tabbed Wittenberg 16th, up four spots from the previous week, and Ohio Wesleyan 25th, the Bishops first ranking of the year ... Hiram senior running back **Kris Giebel (Streetsboro, OH/Streetsboro)** rushed for a Terrier record 222 yards on 40 carries against Oberlin. He scored three touchdowns. Senior defensive back **Joe Cleghorn (Canfield, OH/Canfield)** intercepted three Yeoman passes, breaking up four others on the day ... Kenyon senior defensive back **Kris Cheney (Coshocton, OH/River View)** made nine unassisted tackles and assisted on 10 others to total 14 stops against Allegheny ... Oberlin freshman wide receiver **Zach Lewis (Avon Lake, OH/Avon Lake)** shattered the Yeoman record with his 86-yard touchdown reception against Hiram. The old record, set in 1969, was 76 yards ... The Ohio Wesleyan defense recorded a Bishop record 13 sacks against Denison and held the Big Red to -66 yards rushing. Senior defensive tackle **Steve Schoenberger (West Carrollton, OH/East Carrollton)** recorded two and one-half sacks, four total tackles for a loss and three solo stops and one assist to pace the defensive effort ... Wabash junior quarterback **Jake Knott (Lafayette, IN/Jefferson)** completed 21-32 passing for 302 yards and two TDs. He also had four carries for 20 yards and two TDs. Knott is 350 yards of total offense away from setting the Little Giants' career record held by **Chris Ings** (1992-96). Knott currently sits at 7,287 yards of total offense ... Last week Wittenberg picked up its 26th straight NCAC victory. The last loss was Nov. 4, 1997 at Wooster, the site of yesterday's win.

**WOOSTER LOOKS TO GRAB FIRST FIELD HOCKEY TITLE SINCE 1986;
WOMEN'S SOCCER ENTERS LAST WEEK OF REGULAR SEASON**

October 14, 2001

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

CROSS COUNTRY REPORT

The 18th NCAC Men's and Women's Cross Country Championships will be hosted by Wabash on Saturday, October 27. Kenyon and Denison will be defending their titles from last year. The Lords were crowned men's champs while the Big Red claimed the women's title. In preseason polls of the NCAC Cross Country Coaches, the Kenyon men, currently ranked 11th in Div. III, were picked to repeat as champions, while the Denison women were predicted to finish in second behind Allegheny. To win teams must fend off some stiff competition from a number of squads. Wooster was picked to finish second in the men's race, followed closely by Wabash and Denison. On the women's side, Kenyon was tabbed third, followed by Wooster and Oberlin. Most North Coast cross country teams will take the next week off to prepare for the Championship.

Wabash took the team title, and senior **Jared Smit (Lafayette, IN/Central Catholic)** took individual honors at the Manchester Invitational last Saturday. Wabash finished first in the seven-team event, scoring 40 points. Manchester was second with 79, Denison and Wittenberg were third and fourth, respectively, with 80 and 93 points. Earlham was the fourth NCAC team in the race, finishing fifth with 109 points. Smit took first place out of 101 runners, touring the course in 26:33 for his first individual victory of the season. In the women's race, Denison earned the team title (51), followed closely by Wittenberg (61) in second and Earlham (64) in third. The Quaker women placed six runners in the top 25, including freshman **Josie Caton (Goshen, IN/Goshen)** who finished sixth with a time of 20:12.

Notes: The Allegheny women placed second (48 pts.) at the Rochester Invitational, while the men placed fourth ... Hiram competed at the Duquesne Invitational. The men finished 10th, while the women placed sixth. Senior **Don Beesing (Stow, OH/Stow)** was the top Div. III finisher, 11th overall, in the five-mile men's race. Junior **Jenny Wilke (Sandusky, OH/Sandusky)** set a Hiram record with her time of 19:07 in the women's 5K. The fastest Div. III runner, she finished sixth overall ... The Kenyon men won the eight-team Ohio Bobcat Invitational (40 pts). Junior **Matt Cabrera (Longmont, CO/Skyview, WA)** was the Lords top finisher with a third-place time of 26:32.93 ... The Oberlin men and women both placed second at the Ohio Northern Quad.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY: Wabash senior **Jared Smit (Lafayette, IN/Central Catholic)** won the Manchester Invitational last Saturday. His time of 26:33 placed him across the finish line ahead of 101 other runners. Wabash won team title at the seven-team event.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY: Hiram junior **Jenny Wilke (Sandusky, OH/Sandusky)** was the fastest Division III woman to cross the finish line at the Duquesne Invitational last Saturday. Her time of 19:07 helped earn her a sixth-place finish overall in a field of 95 and set a Terrier record.

FIELD HOCKEY: Earlham senior goalkeeper **Shannon Shehan (Centerville, IN/Centerville)** averaged 21.5 saves in two overtime conference victories last week while giving up just two goals. She made 19 stops in a 2-1 overtime win over Kenyon then followed that with 24 saves in a 2-1 overtime decision over Ohio Wesleyan.

MEN'S SOCCER: Kenyon senior midfielder **Kulu Moyo (Bulawayo, Zimbabwe/Mzilikazi)** scored one goal and assisted on another in the Lords' 3-2 overtime win over Hiram. He also assisted on the gamewinner in Kenyon's 1-0 OT win over Earlham. Moyo now has seven points in the Lords' last four games.

WOMEN'S SOCCER: Wittenberg freshman **Rachel Ridgeway (Montclair, NJ/The Taft School)** scored the game winner in a 2-1 overtime victory against Allegheny. Her third goal of the season helped keep the Tigers in contention for a slot in the upcoming NCAC tournament.

VOLLEYBALL: Wittenberg freshman **Monica McDonald (Newark, OH/Catholic)** smashed 68 kills in 16 games for an average of 4.25 per game to lead the Tigers last week. She leads the NCAC in kills per game with an average of 4.31 per game this season.

FIELD HOCKEY REPORT

Wooster (8-1, 11-2) enters the week alone in first place and can wrap up its first NCAC title since 1986 if the squad can knock off three conference opponents this week. Tuesday, the Scots travel to fourth-place Ohio Wesleyan (4-6, 6-8), return home to host sixth-place Earlham (3-6, 4-8) on Thursday, then wrap up the conference season on Saturday at fifth-place Denison (3-5, 3-10). Second-place Wittenberg (7-2, 9-2), the defending co-champion and winner of a share of four of the past five NCAC crowns, needs to win all of its remaining matches and hope Wooster slips. The Tigers' lone scheduled contest this week is Wednesday at seventh-place Kenyon (2-6, 4-8). Oberlin (5-6, 6-6), alone in third place after winning two of three in conference play last week, travels to Kenyon on Monday in their only action this week. Earlham, coming off a pair of 2-1 overtime NCAC victories, hosts the Big Red on Tuesday. Filling out the slate is a matchup between the Bishops and the Ladies on Saturday.

Notes: Earlham Sophomore **Rebecca Aldred (Glen Mills, PA/West Nottingham Academy)** scored two game-winning goals in two NCAC overtime victories last week. She moved into third in the conference scoring race with a 1.45 points per game ... Oberlin goalkeeper **Pam Walker (North Vancouver, BC/Collingwood)** had an outstanding week, with 43 saves in three games, including 21 in a 1-0 loss to Wooster ... Wittenberg freshman **Amy Burlingame (Dennis, MA/Dennis-Yarmouth)** scored twice and added an assist as the Tigers defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 3-1 ... Wooster senior **Emily White (Princeton, WV/Western Reserve Academy, OH)** scored twice and added an assist in two NCAC victories. She scored the game winner in overtime against Oberlin and assisted on the winner against Kenyon. The Scots have won four consecutive one-goal games and are taking aim on their first conference title since 1986, their third overall.

MEN'S SOCCER REPORT

Entering the second last week of the season, the NCAC race heats up as all 10 teams see conference action. Denison (5-0/15 points) continues to lead the way. The Big Red host Earlham (1-4-1/5 pts.) on Tuesday and travel to fourth-place Allegheny (4-2-0/10 pts.) on Saturday hoping to keep a strong hold on first place. The team in first place at the end of the regular season will host the NCAC men's soccer tournament. Kenyon (5-0-1/14 pts), Ohio Wesleyan (4-1-0/13 pts.) and the Gators are in the coveted next three positions -- the top four participate in the tournament. The Lords host the Bishops on Tuesday and return home to face Wooster (1-4-0/4 pts.) on Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan hosts Wabash (2-3-1/8 pts.) on Sunday. Allegheny hosts Hiram (1-4-1/5 pts.) on Wednesday. Oberlin (0-6-0/0 pts.) travels to Wooster on Wednesday and to Earlham on Saturday. Wittenberg (3-2-0/8 pts.) and Wabash, both still in the hunt for a tourney slot, meet up in Crawfordsville on Wednesday. The Tigers close out their week when they host Hiram on Saturday.

Notes: Wittenberg sophomore **Taggart Suddes (Ostrander, OH/Dublin Coffman)** converted a penalty kick in overtime to lead the Tigers past Ohio Wesleyan. The Wittenberg win snapped the Bishop's 23-game NCAC winning streak. Ohio Wesleyan's last conference loss was a 1-0 overtime defeat at Wittenberg in 1998 ... The latest NSCAA Great Lakes Regional Coaches' Poll ranks Ohio Wesleyan seventh.

WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT

The regular season draws to a close this week and the race is on for the first seed and the right to host the NCAC tournament. Entering the final week, Ohio Wesleyan (6-0-0 NCAC/18 points) holds a slight edge over second-place Denison (6-1-0/17 pts.). The Bishops travel to Kenyon (2-3-1/7 pts.) on Wednesday, then host third-place Allegheny (4-2-0/13 pts.), last year's top seed and tourney host, on Saturday. The Big Red have one contest remaining, a home matchup with Earlham (1-5-0/3 pts.) on Wednesday. The Gators and Wittenberg (3-3-2/10 pts.) hold the third and fourth and final spots in the tournament entering the week. In addition to playing at Ohio Wesleyan Saturday, Allegheny visits Hiram (1-5-0/3 pts.) on Wednesday. Wooster (2-3-1/7 pts.) and Kenyon (2-3-1/7 pts.) are hoping to slip in to the tournament field as they enter the week tied for fifth place. The Scots visit Oberlin (1-4-1/3 pts.) on Wednesday, and travel to Kenyon on Saturday. The schedule wraps up with Wittenberg at Hiram and Oberlin at Earlham, both on Saturday.

Notes: Hiram senior goalkeeper **Laura Warner (Akron, OH/St. Vincent St. Mary)** had 18 saves in two conference losses last week ... **Amy Work (Westerville, OH/South)** of Ohio Wesleyan scored once and helped set up the game-winning goal against Denison, then scored late in the Bishops' win over Wooster ... The NSCAA/adidas national rankings (Oct. 8) have Ohio Wesleyan listed third and Denison 14th. In the Great Lakes region, OWU is the top team, followed by Denison (third), Allegheny (7th) and Wooster (9th).

VOLLEYBALL REPORT

The regular season is quickly drawing to a close as every squad sees action at least twice this week. First-place Wittenberg (6-0, 17-7) can wrap up the first seed for the NCAC tournament this week if they are able to knock off Kenyon (0-4, 0-15) and Oberlin (1-5, 1-21) in a tri-match at Springfield Saturday. Denison (4-1, 12-11) enters the week in second place and will wrap up the regular season with a visit to Kenyon on Wednesday then a trip to Hiram take on Ohio Wesleyan (3-3, 10-17) and the Terriers (3-2, 14-10) on Saturday. Third-place Wooster (4-2, 13-9) faces Allegheny (3-2, 11-9) and Earlham (0-5, 2-24) in Richmond, Indiana, on Saturday. Mid-week, Hiram and Kenyon will host Allegheny and Denison, respectively.

Notes: Wittenberg finished fourth of five teams in the first Wittenberg National Invitational. The top-ranked team in Division III, Wisconsin-Whitewater, won the tournament, followed by number-five Juniata in second. Second-ranked Mt. St. Joseph placed third ... Wooster senior **Jen Petkovsek (Amherst, OH/Steele)** accumulated 39 kills, 79 digs and 12 blocks in 15 games as the Scots went 2-2 ... The latest AVCA Coaches' Poll ranks Wittenberg eleventh. The Tigers are second in the Great Lakes Region, according to the latest (Oct. 9) NCAA Regional ranking.
