NCAC Spring Sports Update

**BASEBALL GETS UNDER WAY WITH FOUR SERIES THIS WEEKEND;
DENISON BEGINS WOMEN'S LACROSSE TITLE DEFENSE**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT

The NCAC baseball season gets under way this weekend with four series scheduled. In the East division, Kenyon (7-5) will host Allegheny (8-3) while Wooster (11-1) entertains Hiram (2-10). In the West, Ohio Wesleyan (14-1) will travel to Denison (9-5) and Wittenberg (8-7) will head to Wabash (12-12). Earlham (3-11) and Oberlin (4-3), who each play non-NCAC opponents this week, begin conference play in two weeks, April 6-7. The Quakers will visit Denison; the Yeomen will host Kenyon.

Poll: The American Baseball Association preseason poll ranked Allegheny 13, Wooster 14 and Ohio Wesleyan 15 (out of 30). The first ABCA regular season poll will be released March 26. In their preseason poll, NCAC Coaches picked both the Scots and the Bishops to finish the season in first place, followed by Allegheny, Wittenberg and Denison in places three through five.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Allegheny senior first baseman **Bob Spithaler (Evans City, PA/Seneca Valley)** hit 12-for-29 (.414) with 14 runs scored, three doubles, two homeruns, and 12 RBI as the Gators went 7-2 in nine games last week.
PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Denison sophomore lefthander **Adam Chonko (Columbia Station, OH/Benedictine)** pitched a perfect game against Lake Erie. He faced the minimum 15 batters, registering six strikeouts and allowing only two balls hit in the air. Chonko also threw 2/3 inning of scoreless relief in a 5-4, nine inning loss to Baldwin-Wallace.

GOLF REPORT

Four North Coast teams - Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster - will compete at the Muskingum Invitational at Eaglesticks Golf Course on Friday and Saturday. The Bishops won last spring's 11-team event. Also next week, Wabash travels to the Centre Invitational, while Hiram will play in the Lakeland Community College Tournament. Wooster opened the 2002 campaign with at the Palm Beach Atlantic Tradition Invitational last week. Junior **Jon Pintado (Joplin, MO/Thomas Jefferson)** and **Joe Punturi (Elizabeth, PA/Elizabeth Forward)** paced the Scots after shooting a 152 (75-77) and a 153 (79-74), respectively. Junior **Matt Elliott (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** leads Wooster overall this season with a 77.9 average and a top round of 68.

Poll: The Golf Coaches Association of America poll (3/21/02) ranks Ohio Wesleyan 18th, followed by Allegheny in 19th. Wooster received votes, but did not crack the Top 25. In a separate fan poll, the Bishops ranked third.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Two conference contests are on tap this week. Ohio Wesleyan (0-0, 2-3) visits Denison (1-0, 4-0) on Saturday and Kenyon (1-0, 4-1) travels to Wooster (0-0, 1-1) on Thursday. Every North Coast Athletic Conference men's lacrosse title has been won or shared by either the Bishops or the Big Red. The Lords snuck in for a share of the crown in 2000 as the only other school to claim a share of a crown.

Denison and Kenyon share the early lead in the conference race: Each have won their conference openers. Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster, the only teams not to see conference action yet this season, both play their openers this week. Wittenberg junior **Dan Patterson (St. Louis, MO/DeSmet Jesuit)** led the Tigers to their first win of the season with three goals and three assists in Wittenberg's win over Oberlin. Three different goaltenders shared the shutout. Kenyon's **Dave Neiman (Glencoe, IL/New Trier)** is the top goalkeeper with a saves percentage of .636 through five matches.

Poll: In the latest USILA national poll, Denison is ranked sixth and Ohio Wesleyan is 11th.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Wooster sophomore **Mike MacMaster (Hingham, MA/Hingham)** tallied 11 points on five goals and six assists in the Scots' victory over Marietta. He fell one point short of the school record for points in a game. MacMaster is the early NCAC scoring leader with 5.50 points per game.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

The North Coast Athletic Conference schedule opens this week with three contests on tap. Three-time defending champion Denison (0-0, 1-2) begins its conference campaign on Tuesday at Kenyon (0-0, 3-0). Also Tuesday, last year's runner-up Wooster (0-0, 0-2) opens at Allegheny (0-0, 0-2). Earlham (0-0, 0-1) will visit Ohio Wesleyan (0-0, 3-2) on Thursday. The Big Red has won 14 of the previous 17 NCAC titles. Oberlin (0-0, 0-0) claimed the three that Denison did not - their last was in 1998.

Wittenberg (0-0, 2-3) senior **Erin Jacobsen (Fairport, NY/Penfield)** scored five goals in the Tigers' win over Puget Sound. Denison sophomore **Stephanie Pratzner (Columbus, OH/Upper Arlington)** recorded three goals and two assists in the Big Red's victory over NCAA Div. II opponent Indiana of Pennsylvania.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ohio Wesleyan's **Amanda McDermott (Wayne, PA/Episcopal Academy)** scored nine goals and added two assists as the Bishops won two of three last week.

SOFTBALL REPORT

The fifth NCAC season gets underway in two weeks, on April 6. Denison (7-5) is the defending champion; Wittenberg (7-8-1) won the previous title. Allegheny (7-5) won the first two campaigns. This season will be the second one in which the bid to the NCAA Division III tournament will be determined by a season-ending conference tournament. Denison won the inaugural NCAC Tournament last season.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Denison second baseman **Tami Henderson (Bolton, Ontario/Robert F. Hall)** went 4-for-7 (.571) with four runs batted in two Big Red wins last week. She also scored a run, and added a double, a stolen base and a walk. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Wooster sophomore **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** went 2-1 and recorded a save in four appearances last week. She pitched 21 innings, allowing just six runs (one earned) on 14 hits and 15 walks, while striking out 20. The highlight of the week was a shutout against Virginia Intermont, when she gave up one hit and struck out eight batters in a complete game.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

The only NCAC match scheduled this week is an East Division matchup between Hiram and Allegheny on Wednesday. Denison (2-0, 3-6), which has won at least a share of all but two of the previous 17 NCAC championships, is off to a 2-0 start in the West Division. Wabash (1-0, 9-3) won its conference opener as well earlier this month. Oberlin (1-0, 1-0) is the early leader in the East.

Kenyon (0-0, 4-2) placed second at Wabash's Kerry Seward Invitational, followed by Wittenberg in third and Wabash in fourth at the eight-team invitational. The Lords claimed three flight championships. **Mike Herrick (Amherst, OH/Elyria Catholic)** took number-two singles, **Keenan Hughes (Wauwatosa, WI/Marquette)** won the number-three singles and **Brian Taubman (Shaker Hts., OH/Shaker Hts.)** and **Scott Schoenberger (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** combined to take third doubles. Wittenberg's **Ben Hodgkiss-Lilly (Cleveland Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)** was runner up at fifth singles.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Four conference matches are scheduled for the coming week, three of them involve Allegheny (0-0, 0-0). The Gators travel to Hiram (0-1, 1-4) on Tuesday, Denison (1-0, 5-3) Friday and Ohio Wesleyan (1-1, 5-1) on Saturday. The Bishops also take on Wooster (0-0, 1-4) this week, traveling to take on the Scots Tuesday. Kenyon (0-0, 5-2) is the defending champion. The Ladies have taken 15 of 17 North Coast titles. Denison (1994) and Allegheny (1984) are the only other schools to have claimed championships in women's tennis.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Denison and Oberlin (1-0, 1-0) each won their conference openers and share the early lead. Kenyon senior **Brooke Roeper (Chagrin Falls, OH/Chagrin)** has the top record at both number-one singles (5-1 overall) and first doubles (7-0), where she competes with **Katy Tucker (Louisville, KY/Ballard)**.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

Hiram junior **Emma Brown (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** picked up right where she left off during the indoor season, winning the high jump and the long jump as the Terriers opened their outdoor season at the Muskingum Invitational on March 23. Brown placed first in the high jump with height of 5' 1 3/4" and then took first in the long jump with a leap of 16' 3/4". She also placed fifth in the 100 meter hurdles (17.39) and sixth in the 200 meter dash (29.58). Sophomore **Julie Hajny (Piney Fork, OH/Buckeye Local)** also had a solid showing, finishing third in the 1500 meter run (5:20.66) and seventh in the 800 meter run (2:39.81). The women's team finished sixth of seven schools. For the men, who finished sixth of eight teams, senior distance runner **Don Beesing (Stow, OH/Stow)** was first in 1500 meters with a time of 4:12.29 and the third in the 800 meter run with a time of 2:04.16. Sophomore **Scott Cothren (Fredericktown, OH/Fredericktown)** tied for second in the high jump with a height of 6', and was third in the 110 meter hurdles (18.4), third in the 400 meter hurdles (58.72), and seventh in the long jump (17' 10 1/4").

Ohio Wesleyan senior **Craig Neeley (Columbus, OH/Bexley)** led the Bishops at the non-scoring Wake Forest Invitational on March 23. He won the high jump by clearing 6' 9" and won the triple jump with an effort of 44' 4". His height in the high jump topped the provisional qualifying standard for the NCAA Div. III championships. Senior **Jeff Van Horn (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** placed second in the javelin and 14th in the shot put while junior **Dan Bowens (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** finished fourth in the 800-meter run. Senior **Katie Holder (New Philadelphia, OH/New Philadelphia)** stood out for the Bishop women, placing sixth in the 3000-meter steeplechase.

The Wooster teams completed their spring break trip to Tallahassee, Fla., on March 22 with a handful of impressive results at the Florida State Relays. This year's meet fielded 47 college and club teams, many of which were NCAA Div. I schools, and was divided into two groups for each event - a gold championship and garnet championship (Florida State's school colors). Most of Wooster's individuals competed at the garnet level, but some posted strong showings in the gold tier, most notably **Brendan Callahan (Glastonbury, CT/South Glastonbury)**. The junior distance runner set a Scot record with a fourth-place finish overall in the 5000 meters (14:50.24). That time also meets the NCAA provisional qualifying standard. Senior **Marty Coppola (Medina, OH/Medina)** ran a 9:39.63 in the 3000-meter steeplechase, finishing fourth in the gold tier. Wooster's only female competitor in a gold championship was freshman **Heather Reed (Wadsworth, OH/Highland)**, who placed 29th in the 100-meter hurdles (17.94).

Wittenberg competed at the UNC-Wilmington Seahawk Relays on March 16-17 and at the Defiance Dick Small Invitational on March 23. Sophomore **Kristen Mumper (Cincinnati, Ohio/Purcell Marian)**, who set the school record in the indoor triple jump, set the outdoor record in her first attempt this year en route to a second place finish (36' 8 1/4") in North Carolina. She was also second in the long jump (17' 3 1/2"), setting a personal record at the same meet. Mumper won the triple jump at Defiance (34' 1 1/2") and took third in the long jump (16' 3 1/2").

RUNNERS OF THE WEEK: Wittenberg sophomore **Kelli Zilli (Dayton, OH/Kettering Alter)** finished second in the 800 meters at the UNC-Wilmington Seahawk Relays on March 16-17 with a time of 2:21.94 Hiram senior **Don Beesing (Stow, OH/Stow)** was first in 1500 meters with a time of 4:12.29 and the third in the 800 meter run with a time of 2:04.16 at the Muskingum Invitational on March 23.

FIELD ATHLETES OF THE WEEK: Wittenberg sophomore **Kristen Mumper (Cincinnati, Ohio/Purcell Marian)** set the Tiger triple jump record in her first attempt this year en route to a second place finish (36' 8 1/4") at the UNC-Wilmington Seahawk Relays on March 16-17. She was also second in the long jump (17' 3 1/2"), setting a personal record at the same meet. Mumper won the triple jump the Defiance Dick Small Invitational on March 23 (34' 1 1/2") and took third in the long jump (16' 3 1/2"). Wittenberg senior **Chris Silliman (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** earned back-to-back second place finishes in the discus. At the UNC-Wilmington Seahawk Relays on March 16-17 he threw the discus 145' 2", and last weekend, at the Defiance Dick Small Invitational, he tossed it 137' 8".
