**UNRULY SPRING WEATHER DISRUPTS NCAC BASEBALL/SOFTBALL SCHEDULES;
TWO WEEKS REMAIN ON WOMEN'S TENNIS SCHEDULE**

April 15, 2002

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT

The weather continues to be the main story of the 2002 North Coast baseball season. Three out of four NCAC divisional series were postponed due to weather last week - only Denison (5-4, 18-9) and Wabash (2-5, 14-19) were able to take the field. The Big Red opened the series with a 9-3 win, but the Little Giants recovered to sweep games two and three by scores of 3-2 and 7-6, respectively. Please check school websites for makeup dates and times for the Wittenberg at Earlham, Wooster at Oberlin and Hiram at Kenyon series, in addition to makeup games still to be played from earlier this season.

This week's regular schedule features three teams without a conference loss. In the East, Allegheny (4-0, 14-3) and Wooster (3-0, 21-1) share first place. The Gators host fourth-place Oberlin (0-2, 6-11) on Saturday and Sunday, while the Scots welcome third-place Kenyon (2-2, 9-9). In the West, the Wittenberg Tigers (1-0, 12-10) winners of their lone NCAC game, host the third-place Big Red. This week's second game in the West division pits fifth-place Earlham (0-3, 3-18) against second-place Ohio Wesleyan (5-1, 21-4) in Delaware. Hiram (0-5, 4-15) and Wabash (2-5, 14-19) do not have league games scheduled for this weekend.

With 21 overall wins thus far, Ohio Wesleyan has won at least 20 games for the 18th consecutive year. Should the Bishops win nine more times this year, they will have reached 30-win plateau for the 10th time in 11 seasons. A big part of the Bishops success is due to the outstanding season of first baseman **Drew Caravella (Columbus, OH/Hilliard Davidson)**. The senior, who leads the NCAC in batting (47-79, .595), hits (47), runs batted in (49) and total bases (81), set two OWU career marks this week. He now owns the record for doubles with 54 and hits with 257, passing former Bishop **Scott Tedder (1985-89)** ... Allegheny senior outfielder **Jarrod Essey (Charleroi, PA/Charleroi)** hit .429 with four runs, four RBI, a double and a triple to lead the Gators to four wins in four tries last week ... Sophomore center fielder **Adam Mandel (St. Louis, MO/MICDS)** is running up a 10-game hitting streak. He was 11-20 in five games last week with six runs, two doubles, an RBI and two stolen bases. He has hit at least twice in four of the five games last week and has improved his batting average from .344 to .381 - good for second among all Denison hitters ... Kenyon senior pitcher **Carl Weber (Northfield, MA/Mt. Hermon)** pitched seven innings against Allegheny, allowing just two earned runs. The Lords, however fell to the Gators ... **Bryson Renbarger (Converse, IN/Eastern)** led Wabash to a 3-2 week, including two wins over West division opponent, Denison. He hit .538 (7-13) for the week, including a solo homer, a double, two RBIs and three runs scored. Renbarger finished with a slugging percentage of .846 for the week. He played three games at first and caught the second game of the doubleheader against Denison, preserving a 3-2 win over the Big Red by throwing out a baserunner attempting to steal second in the top of the seventh inning ... Wooster senior **Matt Englander (Solon, OH/Solon)** went the first 7.1 innings against NAIA opponent Ohio Dominican, allowing three earned runs on eight hits and zero walks, while striking out five batters. He did not allow a run over the first six innings. Outfielder **Tim Daugherty (West Leechburg, PA/Leechburg Area)** was 2-for-5 with two RBI, including the game-winner in the bottom of the ninth against the Panthers.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Wittenberg junior **Ryan Born (Marion, OH/Pleasant)** was 5-for-6 (.833) in the Tigers 14-10 win over Dayton last week. He scored four runs, tallied five RBI and two homers in the win. He is batting .391 this season with 21 RBI and has just one error at first base this season (166 putouts, six assists). **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Hiram sophomore pitcher **Nick Strozewski (Elma, NY/Iroquois Central)** led the Terriers to a 13-3 win over Washington & Jefferson last week. In six innings of work, he allowed one hit and one earned run. He walked three batters and struck out six.

GOLF REPORT

Wooster's Parlor Restaurant/Bank One Invitational, to be held Friday and Saturday at the Wooster Country Club, will feature six of the nine conference golf squads. North Coast schools expected to participate are Denison, Kenyon, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan, Wabash, Wittenberg and the host Scots. Ohio Wesleyan was the top NCAC finisher at last spring's event, finishing fourth. Allegheny hosts the Griffin Classic on Saturday and Sunday. Hiram will compete at the Walsh Tournament today and tomorrow.

Last week, Wabash finished 19th out of 26 teams at the Illinois Wesleyan Invitational. Sophomore **Caleb Selby (Crawfordsville, IN/Southmont)** tied for 33rd, shooting a 156 (77-79). The Little Giants will play the final round of the Giant-Engineer Match Play Classic on Tuesday at the Trophy Club in Frankfort, IN. The Little Giants have a 4-1 lead after the first round ... Allegheny won the Bob Raymond Invitational on April 9. Senior **Dave Whitaker (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair)** earned medalist honors with a 75 (+3). The next day, the Gators finished ninth of 12 at the IUP Invitational. Freshman **Ben Rathfon (Leeper, PA/North Clarion County)** shot Allegheny's low round (75, +4) ... Ohio Wesleyan avenged last spring's second-place finish at the Denison Spring Invitational by winning this year's event. Junior **Jay Tilton (Cincinnati/Windon Woods)** led the Bishops to a first-place finish on Saturday. Sunday's second round was rained out. Ohio Wesleyan won team honors by three strokes, carding a 293 to DePauw's 296. Wooster finished in third place at 302, followed by Denison (306) in sixth. Wittenberg shot a 316 for 11th place, while Kenyon (340) finished 18th. Tilton finished in third place among individuals with a 71. Wooster freshman **Joe Punturi (Elizabeth, PA/Elizabeth Forward)** shot a 72 to finish in a tie for fourth place, leading the Scots to their best finish of the 2002 season.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Two North Coast Athletic Conference games are on tap for the coming week. Tuesday, Wittenberg (1-2, 4-5) visits first-place Denison (3-0, 7-1) in a match that was rescheduled from earlier this season. Ohio Wesleyan (2-1, 5-4), which is tied for second, takes on sixth-place Oberlin (0-4, 0-9) on Wednesday.

In the latest USILA national poll (April 15, 2002), Ohio Wesleyan is ranked 13th, while Denison stands 15th ... Denison stands alone in first place with two games remaining on its conference schedule. Kenyon (2-1, 6-2) and the Bishops are breathing down their necks. Wooster (1-1, 4-3) is not out of the race in fourth place. In action last week, Kenyon junior **Justin Martinich (Bay Shore, NY/Bay Shore)** recorded 10 assists in two games. He is now the school's all-time leader in assists with 106, and ranks fifth on the NCAC's all-time list. Ohio Wesleyan senior **Matt Coughlin (Denver, CO/Regis Jesuit)** scored seven goals and added eight assists as the Bishops won twice last week, including a non-conference victory over previously undefeated Denison ... Wooster sophomore **Steve Burton (Shelby Twp, MI/Bishop Foley)** combined for six points on three goals and three assists during the Scots' 1-1 week. He led all scorers in Wooster's non-conference victory over Wittenberg, with three goals and two assists, including the tying goal with 11 seconds left in regulation.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ohio Wesleyan senior **Matt Coughlin (Denver, CO/Regis Jesuit)** scored seven goals and added eight assists as the Bishops won twice last week, including a non-conference victory over previously undefeated Denison. He scored four goals and had three assists in an NCAC victory over Wooster, and followed that with three goals and five assists versus Denison.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Seven conference games are scheduled for the coming week. Beginning Wednesday, co-leader Wooster (2-0, 5-4) visits sixth-place Kenyon (1-2, 5-3) and fifth-place Ohio Wesleyan (2-2, 5-6) travels to seventh-place (tie) Oberlin (0-3, 2-6). On Saturday, every NCAC team will be in action. Co-leader and defending champion Denison (3-0, 4-6) hosts the Bishops; Third-place Wittenberg (3-1, 5-4) hosts the Scots; Fourth-place Allegheny (2-1, 4-4) plays host to the Ladies; And seventh-place (tie) Earlham (0-3, 0-4) entertains the Yeowomen. The Scots travel to the Gators' home field for a makeup contest on Sunday to round out the schedule.

Allegheny senior midfielder **Devin McCue (Chicago, IL/Loyola Academy)** led the Gators to a 2-0 week with four goals and an assist. She notched two goals against NCAC foe Ohio Wesleyan, including the game-winner in overtime ... Denison senior attack **Jamie Fox (Locust Valley, NY/Friends Academy)** scored nine goals in two conference victories last week. She hit the net six times against Kenyon and added three more against Wittenberg ... Senior **Shannon Shehan (Centerville, IN/Centerville)** scored four goals in the Quakers' loss to Kenyon. She has 15 of Earlham's 31 goals so far this season. Freshman goalkeeper **Samantha Trueblood (Muncie, IN/Southside)** made 22 saves against the Ladies. For Kenyon, junior **Melissa Blum (Chevy Chase, MD/St. Andrew's)** scored five goals against the Quakers ... Oberlin sophomore **Maggie Douglas (Columbia, MD)** scored five goals and freshman goalkeeper **Sarah Pilzer (Takoma Park, MD)** made 24 saves in their team's victory over St. Vincent ... Junior midfielder **Beth Hemminger (Annapolis, MD/Annapolis Senior)** totaled 15 points on five goals and 10 assists in Wooster's 2-0 week. She became the school's all-time leader in assists (84), which ranks second all-time in the NCAC.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT continued

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Denison senior attack **Jamie Fox (Locust Valley, NY/Friends Academy)** scored nine goals in two conference victories last week. She hit the net six times against Kenyon, including two crucial answering goals in the second half, and added three more against Wittenberg.

SOFTBALL REPORT

Snow and rain have been the scourge of the 2002 NCAC softball season. Three out of seven league doubleheaders were postponed due to weather last week - only Denison (6-0, 15-9) and Hiram (3-3, 10-11) were able to take the field over the weekend. The Big Red swept the Terriers, 1-0 and 9-1 to remain undefeated in conference play - the only team to win - and play - all of the league games they have had scheduled. Please check school websites for makeup dates and times of postponed doubleheaders.

This week's regular schedule forces Denison to put their spotless conference record on the line, twice. On Wednesday, the first-place Big Red travels to Ohio Wesleyan (2-2, 7-10-1). The game will help break up a five-team pile-up for second place. In addition to the Bishops, Hiram, Kenyon, Allegheny and Wooster all sit at .500 in conference play. Of the five, OWU, Allegheny and Kenyon face teams outside the tie in a mid-week game. The Gators (2-2, 10-10) host eighth-place Oberlin (0-4, 3-10), while the Ladies (2-2, 10-10-1) travel to seventh-place Wittenberg (1-3, 8-14-1). Wooster (2-2, 9-10) and Hiram (3-3, 10-11) face off at Hiram. On Saturday, Denison, Wittenberg, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster travel to Allegheny, Hiram, Kenyon and Oberlin, respectively.

Akron, Ohio is turning out to be a hot spot of pitching talent. Two NCAC pitchers from the Rubber City excelled for their teams last week. Wooster sophomore **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** pitched all 10 innings of the Scots' 3-2 win over Allegheny last week. Just one of the two runs she allowed was earned and she allowed four hits while walking three batters and fanning six. Barone is now 5-3 on the season. Terrier senior pitcher **Mandi Weiclaw (Akron, OH/Archbishop Hoban)** appeared in all six of Hiram's contests last week. She was 2-1 in her three starts. Weiclaw threw 26 innings, fanning 13 batters. She allowed 15 runs, only eight of which were earned. Barone (68) and Weiclaw (41) rank second and fourth, respectively, in strikeouts amongst all NCAC pitchers. Barone leads the conference with a 1.06 earned run average ... Denison junior catcher **Lindsay Fischer (Gahanna, OH/Gahanna)** paced the Big Red, who won four of six games last week, with four runs, and RBI, a double and two stolen bases on 7-for-11 hitting (.636). She scored one run with no at bats in the first game of a doubleheader against Kenyon and went 4-for-6 with an RBI, a run and a stolen base in the second game. Denison won both games. Fischer was 2-for-2 with two runs and a double against Hiram ... Kenyon senior first baseman **Kris Rainey (Cleveland Hts., OH/Beaumont)** went a combined 4-for-6 in a doubleheader against Denison. She scored one run ... Wittenberg freshman **Christy Cartaya (Mason, OH/Mt. Notre Dame)** threw a complete-game two-hitter against Ohio Wesleyan. The Tigers won the second game of the twinbill, 3-1. Cartaya gave up just one unearned run and picked up her team-best fourth win of the season.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Oberlin freshman catcher **Julia Daher (Grosse Pointe, MI/Grosse Pointe)** led the Yeowomen to two wins over Lake Erie last week, their second and third victories of the season. She was 4-for-5 (.800) with eight runs batted in, six runs scored and two doubles. She was walked three times and recorded 12 putouts and two assists. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Ohio Wesleyan junior **Emily Thornton (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** hurled a complete-game, 10-inning one-hitter against Wittenberg. She nursed a no-hitter into the sixth inning before allowing a hit - ending an OWU record streak of 13 hitless innings. The Bishops won the game 7-1, scoring a record seven runs in the 10th inning. For the week, Thornton totalled 11.1 innings of work and allowed one hit and one unearned run. She walked five hitters and struck out seven.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

It will be another busy week on the conference schedule with five divisional matches on tap. The week starts Thursday with an East division matchup between Oberlin (1-1, 6-10) and Kenyon (0-0, 7-3) in the Lords' conference opener. Saturday, the Yeomen visit Allegheny (1-1, 7-8) and Hiram (0-2, 3-7) hosts Kenyon. The Lords move on to the Gators' home court on Sunday. In the only West division match scheduled, Denison (3-0, 7-9) entertains Wabash (1-1, 11-4)

Allegheny freshman **Jon Vadnal (Hudson, OH/Hudson)** earned the Gators' only point against Wooster with a win at third singles ... Earlham senior **Justin Carrier (Voorheesville, NY/Bouton)** got the Quaker's only victory against Wittenberg, winning in three games at second singles ... Hiram junior **Jason Seith (Jefferson, OH/Jefferson)** and sophomore **Nick Swetye (Salem, OH/Salem)** won singles matches in straight sets against Notre Dame College, Seith at second singles, Swetye at third. Both players won doubles matches as well ... The 18th North Coast Athletic Conference Men's Tennis Championship will be hosted by Ohio Wesleyan on May 3-4, 2002. Denison has won the last five crowns in a row, and claimed at least a share of 11 of the previous 17 titles.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Seven conference matches are scheduled for the coming week. Co-leader Kenyon (1-0, 13-4) and eighth-place (tie) Wooster (0-4, 2-11) will be the busiest teams. The Ladies host co-leader Denison (4-0, 11-3) on Tuesday, travel to the Scots' home court Wednesday, then on to co-leader Oberlin (3-0, 15-6) Thursday. Sunday, fourth-place (tie) Allegheny (2-2, 9-5) hosts Kenyon, wrapping up the defending champions' schedule, and entertains the Yeowomen on Saturday. The Scots also host eighth-place (tie) Hiram (0-2, 2-7) Thursday and travel to fourth-place (tie) Wittenberg (2-2, 6-8) Saturday. Both Ohio Wesleyan (3-4, 8-4) and Earlham (1-2, 8-3) have completed their conference schedules.

At last week's Midwest regional, Kenyon placed third and qualified for the NCAA III Tournament for the 16th straight season. Oberlin placed 11th in the 12-team event, and won a match at the regional for the first time in school history. Kenyon's number-one singles player **Brooke Roeper (Chagrin Falls, OH/Chagrin Falls)** went undefeated in both singles and doubles at the tournament ... The 18th North Coast Athletic Conference Women's Tennis Championships will be hosted by Oberlin on April 26-27, 2002. Kenyon has won the last seven titles in a row and 15 of the 17 contested to date. Only Denison in 1994 and Allegheny in 1984 have interrupted the Ladies' dominance.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

Allegheny junior **Jeremy Scott (Norfolk, NE/Norfolk)** placed fifth in the pole vault at the University of Tennessee's Sea Ray Relays. Competing against elite competition, he cleared 16-11, a school record. The rest of the Gators competed at the Western Pennsylvania Championship at Geneva. Junior **Nicole Morandi (Tewksbury, MA/Tewksbury)** won the 10,000 meters (40:27.7) ... Denison swiped three first-place finishes on the women's side of the Marv Frye Invitational at Ohio Wesleyan. The top places were taken by **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** in the 200 meters (25.68), **Allison Nickel (Cincinnati, OH/Anderson)** in the 800 meters (2:25.12) and **Lindsey Ross (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** in the 1500 meters (4:53.67). The team finished sixth of nine teams. The men's team placed 10th of 10 teams. Both of Kenyon's teams placed eighth at the Marv Frye invite. Senior **Cary Snyder (Charlotte, NC/Northern Valley, NJ)** won the 5,000 meters (15:32.25). Host Ohio Wesleyan was third in the men's competition and seventh in the women's. Senior **Craig Neeley (Columbus, OH/Bexley)** won the high jump (6-5), and junior **Dan Bowens (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** took the 800 meters (1:55.94). Earlham's women were 16th of 19 teams and the men were 18th of 20 teams at the Indiana Little State meet. Freshman **Tashi Johnson (Bloomington, IN/South)** broke the Earlham mark in the 100 meters with a 12.79 clocking, to finish fourth. Wabash took sixth place. Six Little Giants had top-five performances.

RUNNERS OF THE WEEK: Denison junior **Lindsay Ross (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** won the 1500 meters at the Marv Frye Invitational with a time of 4:53.7. Wabash junior **Mark Sherer (Valparaiso, IN/Valparaiso)** finished fourth in the 1500 meters (3:59.71) and ninth in the 5,000 meters (15:39.95) at the Indiana Little State Meet.

FIELD ATHLETES OF THE WEEK: Wooster senior **Kerri Horst (West Salem, OH/Northwestern)** won the javelin at the Oberlin Invitational with a throw of 117 feet, 10 inches. Wabash junior **Pete DeYoung (Evansville, IN/Bosse)** placed third in the high jump (6 feet, 6 inches) and sixth in the triple jump (42 feet, 3 1/4 inches) at the Indiana Little State Meet.
