NCAC Spring Sports Update

**OBERLIN TO HOST WOMEN'S TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS;
FINAL WEEK OF BASEBALL, SOFTBALL REGULAR SEASONS**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT

Heading toward the last weekend of regular season play, only two teams remain undefeated in league play, one from each division. They each face a similar schedule this week. In the East, Wooster (7-0, 26-2) has won seven conference games. The Scots host third-place Kenyon (3-6, 10-13) on Tuesday in a makeup game from last week. Wooster then travels to second-place Allegheny (7-1, 18-4) on Saturday and Sunday in a three-game series which will determine the East's number one seed. In the West, Wittenberg (6-0, 17-11) has picked up six divisional wins. The Tigers host third-place Denison (5-6, 18-13) in a makeup game from last week and faces Wabash in a doubleheader makeup on Thursday. Wittenberg then hosts second-place Ohio Wesleyan (8-1, 25-6) this weekend. The three-game series will help determine the West's number one seed. Please check school websites for makeup dates and times for any makeup games still to be played from earlier this season.

Home field advantage in the first round of the North Coast tournament, scheduled for May 4-5, belongs to the respective winners of each division, who will host the second place team from the opposite division in a best-of-three series (i.e. West #1 vs. East #2 and East #1 vs. West #2). The two winners of the first round will advance to the tournament finals, to be held at Thurmon Munson Memorial Stadium May 9-10 in Canton. The two teams that advance to the finals will determine first and second place in the NCAC standings. Places 5-10 are determined by division standings – the third-place teams in each division tie for fifth, the fourth-place teams tie for seventh and the fifth-place teams tie for ninth. Ties will not be broken.

The third ABCA poll (Apr. 22) ranks Wooster first in Division III, up three spots from the last counting. Ohio Wesleyan moved up one spot into 12th. Allegheny received votes in the poll. The Scots topped the Mideast Region poll, followed by the Bishops in third and the Gators in sixth ... The Allegheny senior **Bob Spithaler (Evans City, PA/Seneca Valley)** paced the Gators to a 4-1 week. He batted .444 (8-18) with 12 runs, a double and five homers. He also added 14 RBIs. In a 21-4 rout of Penn State Behrend, Spithaler was 5-for-6 with five runs, 10 RBIs, a double and four home runs - all Allegheny single-game records ... **Adam Mandel (St. Louis, MO/MICDS)** of Denison has extended his hitting streak to a season-high of 14 games. He has hit safely in 22 of his last 23 games. Last week, Mandel was 8-for-16 in four games with four runs, an RBI, a double, a triple and a stolen base ... Junior designated hitter/pitcher **Dominic Yazbeck (Youngstown, OH/Chaney)** was a power on both offense and defense for the Terriers. He hit .455 (5-11) in three games, scoring two runs, and recording a homer, two runs batted in and two doubles. He also picked up a win against Kenyon, striking out nine batters in 4.2 innings of work ... Kenyon junior pitcher **Josh Pike (Orleans, MA/St. Mark's)** threw five scoreless innings against Hiram. He gave up two hits, three walks and struck out three to earn the win. Classmate **Jesse Gregory (Gainesville, FL/Eastside)** hit his seventh home run of the season in a loss to the Terriers, tying the Kenyon record ... Wabash junior catcher/outfielder **Jake Knott (Lafayette, IN/Jefferson)** was 2-for-4 in an 8-7 come-from-behind win over the University of the South. He tied the game with an RBI double in the bottom of the ninth with no outs, then scored the game-winning run with one out on a double by senior **Bryson Renbarger (Converse, IN/Eastern)** ... Wittenberg senior **Scott Hirsch (Cincinnati, OH/Colerain)** hit safely in all four of the Tigers' games last week. He went 8-for-15 (.533) with three runs and two RBI. Hirsch leads Wittenberg with a .465 batting average, 47 hits, 15 doubles and 71 total bases ... Wooster senior **John Werner (Pittsburgh, PA/Northgate)** pitched 13 innings of shutout ball last week to extend his consecutive scoreless streak to 22.0 innings, which sets a Scot mark. Against Oberlin last week, he struck out a career-best 13 batters in a complete game 5-0 shutout. After last week, he moved into second-place on Wooster's career strikeout list; he has now fanned 221 batters - 48 shy of the all-time Scot mark.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ohio Wesleyan senior first baseman **Drew Caravella (Columbus, OH/Hilliard Davidson)** became the NCAC's all-time home run leader after hitting three dingers last week. He passes former teammate **Jason Bogenrife** for the honor. Caravella also set the OWU career record for runs scored (184), breaking the mark held by **Scott Walberry**. For the week, he was 15-for-24 with seven runs, 16 RBI, three homers and five doubles. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Oberlin sophomore **Troy DeWitt (San Diego, CA/The Bishops School)** threw a two-hit shutout against Allegheny last week. In seven innings he struck out four batters, while allowing no runs and no walks.

GOLF REPORT

In the final weekend of competition before the NCAC Championship, Ohio Wesleyan's Strimer Invitational will feature seven of the nine conference golf squads. It will be held Friday and Saturday at the Oakhaven Golf Course. North Coast schools expected to participate are Denison, Hiram, Oberlin, Wabash, Wittenberg, Wooster and the host Bishops. Allegheny will compete at the Rochester Invitational. Kenyon is idle. The North Coast Athletic Conference Championship, to be hosted by Kenyon at Apple Valley Golf Course, is set for Friday and Saturday, May 3-4.

Last week, Wooster hosted the Parlor Restaurant/Bank One Invitational. Ohio Wesleyan, the top NCAC team, was edged out of first place by one stroke. The Bishops finished second (610) behind Otterbein (611). OWU was followed by Denison (613) in third and the host Scots (622) in fifth and Wooster in seventh. Wittenberg (eighth-629), Wabash (12th-668) and Kenyon (14th-700) and Oberlin (15th-736) round out North Coast squads in the 15-team tournament. The Big Red turned in the best team round of 306 on the second day of competition to gain 10 strokes and to improve from fifth place to third place - only three strokes from first. Ohio Wesleyan also made up ground the second day. Trailing by nine strokes after the first round, the Bishops closed the gap to one shot but Otterbein held on. Wooster's **Matt Elliott (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** used the home course to his advantage, firing a 76-71=147 to finish as the individual runner up, three strokes behind the individual medalist from Otterbein. Sophomore **Chad Poling (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** of Ohio Wesleyan and freshman **Andy Bonar (Lancaster, OH/Lancaster)** tied for third place, along with **David Allen** of DePauw, among individuals with a 148.

Allegheny also hosted a tournament last weekend and the Gators won their own Griffin Motors Classic. The Gators took three of the top five spots as freshman **Ben Rathfon (Leeper, PA/North Clarion County)** was the medalist with a two-round 146. Senior **Dave Whitaker (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair)** tied for second after carding a 149 and sophomore **Patrick Keating (Williamsville, NY/Canisius)** tied for third (153). Hiram finished fourth in the six-team event, led by freshman **Jack Byham (Meadville, PA/Meadville Area)** who returned home for a sixth-place finish (154). The win was the third of the season for Rathfon. He leads all Gators this season in wins and in scoring average (75.8). Whitaker has the second highest scoring average (76.0) and leads the team in top-10 finishes, with eight.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Five games remain to complete the 2002 North Coast schedule and four of those contests take place in the coming week. Denison (3-0, 9-2) stands alone in first place, and its only action this week is a home match with third-place Kenyon (2-1, 8-2) Friday night in the Lords' final conference game as well. Second-place Ohio Wesleyan (3-1, 7-4) wraps up its conference schedule when the Bishops host fifth-place Wittenberg (1-2, 4-8) on Wednesday. The Lords host fourth-place Wooster (1-1, 5-3) that day as well. The Tigers host the Scots on Saturday to finish up their 2002 NCAC season. The last contest of 2002 is Tuesday, April 30, when Denison travels to Wooster. Oberlin (0-5, 0-11) has already completed the conference portion of its schedule.

Oberlin senior goalkeeper **Dave Smolev (Glencoe, IL/New Trier)** recorded the 1000th save of his collegiate career in last week's contest with Ohio Wesleyan. For the game, Smolev made 26 saves and had eight ground balls. He has 231 saves this season and ranks second in the NCAC with a .616 saves percentage. Four times this season he has recorded 30 or more saves in a game.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Wooster junior attacker **Colin Hartnett (Canandaigua, NY/Canandaigua Academy)** scored eight goals – one shy of the school record for a single game – and dished out an assist in leading Wooster to a 28-1 drubbing of Washington & Jefferson.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

The regular season wraps up this week and it will be a busy one as eight matches are lined up. Wooster (5-0, 8-4) and Denison (4-0, 5-6) are tied for first place entering the final week of the regular season. The Scots host the Big Red on Wednesday in a contest that may well decide the top seed in the upcoming NCAC tournament. Wooster also hosts Earlham (0-5, 0-6) on Saturday. Denison hosts the Quakers on Tuesday, and fifth-place (tie) Allegheny (2-3, 5-7) on Saturday. Wittenberg (3-2, 6-5) enters the week alone in third place with two games to play. The Tigers travel to fifth-place (tie) Kenyon (2-3, 5-4) on Wednesday then visit fourth-place Ohio Wesleyan (3-3, 7-7) on Sunday. In addition to hosting the Big Red, the Gators visit seventh-place Oberlin (1-4, 3-7) on Tuesday. The Yeowomen host the Ladies on Saturday in the final conference contest for both squads.

The top six teams from the regular-season standings qualify for the NCAC's single-elimination tournament. The top two seeds receive byes into the semifinals. The tournament begins on Tuesday, April 30, with quarterfinals at campus sites (higher seeds) and culminates on Friday, May 3 and Saturday, May 4 with semifinals and finals at Oberlin. This is the final season in which the top six teams qualify. Beginning in 2003, only the top four teams will qualify for the conference tournament.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT continued

Allegheny freshman attacker **Liz Geller (Sewickley, PA/Quaker Valley)** had 10 goals and six assists for 16 points in four games last week. She notched five goals and an assist in a 9-6 defeat of Fredonia St., and scored three goals and three assists to lead the Gators in a 14-8 loss to St. Vincent ... Denison senior attack **Bridget Curley (Summit, NJ/Summit)** netted six goals and recorded an assist in a 19-10 Big Red victory over Ohio Wesleyan. She scored the first three goals of the contest. Classmate **Jamie Fox (Locust Valley, NY/Friends Academy)** also had six goals and an assist in that contest, and scored the fourth and fifth goals of the game ... Junior attacker **Melissa Blum (Chevy Chase, MD/St. Andrew's)** of Kenyon scored four times in a loss to Wooster then added another five in a defeat of Allegheny ... Freshman midfielder **Anna Ialeggio (Randolph, VT)** scored three of Oberlin's eight goals in a 8-5 decision over Earlham ... Freshman attacker **Courtland Smith (Easton, MD/Canterbury, CT)** of Ohio Wesleyan scored nine goals and added an assist as the Bishops won two of three games last week ... Wittenberg junior **Cara Romanowski (Collegeville, PA/Perkiomen Valley)** scored seven goals and two assists in two games last weekend.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Wooster junior midfielder **Beth Hemminger (Annapolis, MD/Senior)** totaled 17 points on seven goals and 10 assists in leading Wooster to three NCAC wins last week. She had a goal and four assists at Kenyon, one goal and two assists versus Wittenberg and led all scorers with a five-goal, four-assist effort at Allegheny.

SOFTBALL REPORT

Eight doubleheaders dot the final week of the 2002 schedule as all eight North Coast teams take the field against two opponents. First-place Denison (8-2, 17-11) kicks things off on Tuesday, when they host fourth-place Wittenberg (5-4, 12-15). Allegheny (7-3, 16-12) and Wooster (7-3, 14-11) enter the week tied for second place. The Gators travel to fifth-place Hiram (5-5, 12-14) on Tuesday, while the Scots head to sixth-place Kenyon (4-5, 12-13). Ohio Wesleyan (3-7, 8-15) hosts Oberlin (0-10, 3-16) to round out the midweek doubleheaders. On Saturday, the Big Red host the Yeowomen, Allegheny welcomes the Bishops and the Hiram and Wittenberg entertain Kenyon and Wooster, respectively. Please check school websites for makeup dates and times of postponed doubleheaders.

The top four teams, according to the regular season standings, will compete in the NCAC Softball Tournament, scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, May 3-4 at the site of the highest seed. The frontrunners to host, heading into this final week of play are Denison, Allegheny and Wooster.

Denison senior **Courtney Zollars (Westerville, OH/Westerville South)** continues to strike out opposing batters on a somewhat regular basis. In two games last week, she fanned 14, bringing her total this season to an NCAC-leading 128 strikeouts over 98.1 innings. Last season, she finished second in the league with 170 over 140.1 innings. Leading the conference in 2001 was Wooster's **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** with 212 strikeouts over 182.1 innings. Barone trails Zollars this spring, fanning 98 batters in 91 innings of work ... With four games left on the schedule Hiram (5-5 NCAC) has surpassed last season's conference win total. The Terriers have matched their overall number of wins from last season (4-11). The team has also set the school's single-season stolen base record with 73. The previous record of 68 was set in 1989. Senior pitcher **Mandi Weiclaw (Akron, OH/Archbishop Hoban)** became Hiram's single-season victory record holder with her ninth win of the season, a 6-1 win in the second game of a doubleheader last week. For the week, Weiclaw was 2-2 in five games - going the distance four times ... Kenyon senior pitcher **Denise Darlage (Powell, OH/Olentangy)** was 1-1 last week, leading the Ladies past Wittenberg, 5-4, and falling 1-0, to Ohio Wesleyan. She threw 13 innings, giving up just one earned run. Her two game totals include 12 hits allowed, five runs, three walks and five strikeouts ... **Emily Thornton (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** continues to shine for the Bishops. The junior struck out 19 batters in 19 innings over three games last week. She has pitched two one-hit games for Ohio Wesleyan this season, along with a no-hitter ... Wittenberg sophomore pitcher/utility player **Carmen Montgomery (Springfield, OH/Southeastern)** picked up two pitching victories for the Tigers last week (over Kenyon and Oberlin). She also was strong at the plate, turning in a 7-for-15 performance with three RBI and two runs ... Wooster freshman **Nicole Fedell (Allison Park, PA/Hampton)** went 2-0 in two appearances last week. She totalled 15 innings, giving up one earned run on 11 hits and four walks, while striking out 10 batters.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Wooster senior outfielder **Kerri Horst (West Salem, OH/Northwestern)** went 4-for-10 (.400) in five games last week. She scored four runs, and recorded three runs batted in, two steals, two sacrifice bunts and a home run. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Allegheny sophomore righthander **Tracie Gaydos (Sarver, PA/Freepport)** posted a 2-0 record with a 0.00 ERA in four appearances last week. She pitched two complete-game shutouts in as many starts. For the week she allowed nine hits in 22.2 innings and four runs, all unearned; she struck out 11 batters.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Four matches remain on the 2002 North Coast Athletic Conference schedule, two in each division. In the West, Earlham (0-3, 10-6) and Ohio Wesleyan (0-2, 4-9) will break their tie for fourth place and likely decide who gets a spot in the upcoming NCAC tournament on Wednesday. The Bishops then travel to third-place Wabash (1-2, 11-6) for a match on Saturday. Denison (4-0, 9-10) sewed up the top spot in the West by virtue of a 4-3 victory over second-place Wittenberg (3-1, 12-2) last week. Both squads have completed the NCAC portion of their schedules. In the East, Kenyon (3-0, 10-3) and Wooster (2-0, 10-8) enter the week tied for first place and the teams square off on Tuesday, April 30. This week, the Scots visit fifth-place Hiram (0-3, 3-8) on Thursday. Allegheny (2-2, 8-9) and Oberlin (1-3, 6-12) have both completed their NCAC schedules and stand third and fourth, respectively. The top four teams from each division qualify for the 18th North Coast Athletic Conference Men's Tennis Championship will be hosted by Ohio Wesleyan on May 3-4. Denison has won the last five crowns in a row, and claimed at least a share of 11 of the previous 17 titles.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

The 18th annual North Coast Athletic Conference Women's Tennis Championship will be held at Oberlin on Friday and Saturday. Two remaining regular season NCAC contests are slated for Tuesday. First-place Denison (5-0, 11-3) hosts second-place Oberlin (3-1, 15-7) and third-place Kenyon (2-1, 14-5) hosts fourth-place Wittenberg (3-2, 8-9). Denison defeated Kenyon last week for the first time since 1994. Freshman **Meredith Sulser (Dublin, OH/Coffman)** won her second-singles match and combined at third-doubles with sophomore **Sara Mandzak (Franklin, OH/Lebanon)** to win in that slot as well. Mandzak also won at sixth singles. Kenyon is the defending NCAC champion and has won 15 of the previous 17 conference titles, the last seven in a row.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

The first part of the NCAC Championships will take place with the Combined Events Championship on Saturday and Sunday. Wooster hosts the championships which features the heptathlon for women and the decathlon for men; this is the fifth time the events have been included in the conference meet. Points will carry over to the NCAC Championships, scheduled for Friday and Saturday, May 3-4 at Ohio Wesleyan University.

At last week's All-Ohio Championships, Wittenberg was the top NCAC finisher on the men's side in fifth place. Also in the top 10 were Kenyon, which placed eighth, and Wooster, which placed ninth. Rounding out the list of NCAC schools competing were Hiram in 14th and Ohio Wesleyan and Denison, tied at 16th. Wittenberg was paced by **Skip Ivery (Columbus, OH/Groveport Madison)** who won the 110-meter hurdles in an NCAA provisional qualifying time of 14.83. Other individual winners were **Brendan Callahan (Glastonbury, CT/So. Glastonbury)** and **Nii Djan Tackie (Accra, Ghana/St. Thomas Aquinas)** of Wooster and **Michael Baird (Temple, TX/Temple)** and **Cary Snyder (Charlotte, NC/Northern Valley, NJ)** of Kenyon. Callahan took home the 10,000 meters title in record time (31:24.63 - a meet record, as well as a Wooster record. Djan Tackie won the triple jump with a mark of 44' 10.5" - more than two inches farther than the runner-up. Baird won the 3,000-meter steeplechase in a Kenyon record time of 9:16.15, which provisionally qualifies him for the NCAA championship. Denison was the top NCAC team in the women's competition in sixth place with **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** provisionally qualifying for the NCAA championships with a first in the 200-meters (25.42). Also in the top 10 were Oberlin in seventh and Wooster in 10th. Wittenberg (11th), Kenyon (12th), Ohio Wesleyan (14th) and Hiram (15th) round out NCAC finishers. Denison had one other first-place finisher - **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)**. She automatically qualified for the NCAA Championships in the discus (44' 10.5"). Other individual winners were Kenyon's **Katherine Kapo (Charleston, WV/Charleston Catholic)** and Wooster's **Kerri Horst (West Salem, OH/Northwestern)**. Kapo won the 3,000-meter steeplechase in a meet record time of 11:22.75. She also established new Selby Stadium and Kenyon marks, while meeting the NCAA provisional qualifying distance. CO-RUNNERS OF THE WEEK: Kenyon senior **Katherine Kapo (Charleston, WV/Charleston Catholic)** won the 3,000-meter steeplechase in an All-Ohio meet record time of 11:22.75. She also established new Selby Stadium and Kenyon marks, while meeting the NCAA provisional qualifying distance. Denison freshman **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** provisionally qualified for the NCAA championships with a first in the 200-meters (25.42) and second in the 100-meters (12.37) at the All-Ohio meet. Kenyon junior **Michael Baird (Temple, TX/Temple)** won the 3,000-meter steeplechase in a Kenyon record time of 9:16.15, which provisionally qualifies him for the NCAA championship. Wittenberg sophomore **Skip Ivery (Columbus, OH/Groveport Madison)** who won the 110-meter hurdles in an NCAA provisional qualifying time of 14.83. Both athletes competed at the all-Ohio meet.

FIELD ATHLETES OF THE WEEK: Denison freshman **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** won the discus at the All-Ohio meet, automatically qualifying for the NCAA Championships (147' 11"). Wooster freshman **Nii Djan Tackie (Accra, Ghana/St. Thomas Aquinas)** won the triple jump at the All-Ohio meet with a mark of 44' 10.5" - more than two inches farther than the runner-up.
