### **NCAC Spring Sports Update**

**FOUR NCAC BASEBALL TEAMS REMAIN UNDEFEATED IN LEAGUE PLAY;  
DENISON AND WITTENBERG SHARE WOMEN'S LACROSSE LEAD**

**CLEVELAND** -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

#### **BASEBALL REPORT**

Three out of five East Division teams remain undefeated after two weeks of divisional play. Wooster (3-0, 20-1), the leader in wins with three, looks to double their win total when they travel to Oberlin (0-2, 6-9) for a three-game series on Saturday and Sunday. Allegheny (2-0, 10-3) and Kenyon (2-0, 9-7) are also both undefeated in the East. Only one of the two will remain so after they meet in Gambier on Wednesday for a makeup doubleheader. The Lords finish out the week by hosting Hiram (0-5, 2-15) for three games this weekend. Allegheny faces Frostburg and Pitt-Bradford in non-conference play.

Wittenberg (1-0, 11-10) continues to be the only team in the West without a loss. The Tigers have played and won one conference contest thus far this season - they did not have a divisional matchup scheduled last week, and were forced to postpone their first series, against Wabash, due to weather conditions. Wittenberg resumes Eastern division play this week at Earlham (0-3, 3-17) on Saturday and Sunday. The Tigers also travel to Kenyon for non-divisional action on Wednesday. Third-place Denison (4-2, 15-7) travels to fourth-place Wabash (0-4, 12-17) this weekend to round out divisional play for this week. The Big Red will face non-divisional foe, Oberlin, at Thurman Munson Stadium in Canton on Wednesday.

**Notes:** The second ABCA poll (Apr. 8) lists Wooster third, up 10 spots from the last counting. Ohio Wesleyan is down seven notches to 11th and Allegheny fell to 28th in Division III. The Scots topped the Midwest Region poll, followed by the Bishops in third and the Gators in fifth ... Hiram sophomore short stop **Joe Koussa (Avon Lake, OH/St. Ignatius)** is in the midst of a seven-game hitting streak, batting 12-for-28 (.429) with six runs, three RBI and three doubles. He has now hit safely in 13 of 15 games ... Kenyon senior **Carl Weber (Northfield, MA/Mt. Hermon)** picked up win against Oberlin last week. In seven innings, he allowed six hits, two runs, two earned runs and three walks and struck out eight. Freshman **Nick Sussman (Chevy Chase, MD/Bullis)** was 4-for-6 in two games, with five assists, three putouts, zero errors, a triple and an RBI ... Sophomore pitcher **Tyler Mott (Grove City, OH/Grove City)** led Ohio Wesleyan to two West division wins last week. He had 26 outs of a one-hit shutout going into the ninth inning against Denison before giving up a pair of doubles. He ended up allowing only three hits and one earned run. For the week, he allowed one walk, four earned runs and 13 hits. He fanned nine batters in his 16 innings on the mound ... Wabash senior first baseman **Bryson Renbarger (Converse, IN/Eastern)** connected two out of three (.667) times in the Little Giants 4-3 loss to LaGrange, which was called after seven innings due to darkness ... Wooster senior lefty **Josh Frank (Wooster, OH/Northwestern)** went 2-0 last week, allowing one run, nine hits and one walk. He struck out 10 batters. Senior outfielder **Bill Daugherty (West Leechburg, PA/Leechburg Area)** was 8-for-18 with three doubles, two homers, nine runs scored and nine RBI to lead the Scots to six wins last week.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Ohio Wesleyan senior outfielder **Shaun Rice (Dublin, OH/Columbus Watterson)** went 11-for-19 (.579) to lead the Bishops to five wins last week - with four in conference play. He combined for two home runs, two doubles and seven runs batted in for the week. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Denison sophomore righthander **Cam Cowden (Zionsville, IN/Zionsville)** improved to 6-0 on the year with two wins last week. In 10 innings of work, he allowed seven hits, three runs (none earned) and one walk. He pitched an 8-0 shutout against Capital in the first game of a doubleheader.

#### **GOLF REPORT**

Denison, Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster will all compete at the Big Red Spring Classic Invitational at Granville Golf Course on Saturday and Sunday. Last year the top NCAC finisher at the event was Ohio Wesleyan, followed by Denison in third. Wabash will head to the Illinois Wesleyan Invitational on Friday and Saturday, while Allegheny will compete at the District II Championships in Hershey, Pa. on Sunday and Monday.

Ohio Wesleyan junior **Jeremy Meade (Wayland, MA/Wayland)** and sophomore **Chad Poling (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** led the Bishops to a first-place finish at the Kenyon Cup last week. The tournament was held at Apple Valley Golf Course in Mt. Vernon,

the site of the NCAC Championship on May 3-4. Ohio Wesleyan won team honors by 11 strokes, carding a 604 to Allegheny's 615. Denison finished in fourth place (630), followed by Wittenberg (631) in fifth and Wooster (638) in sixth. Wabash rounded out the top 10 with a 673, followed by Kenyon (676) in 12th, Hiram (704) in 13th and Oberlin (715) 14th.

Meade and Poling tied for medalist honors at 149. Wooster junior **Matt Elliott (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** carded a 77-73=150 to finish third. Allegheny senior **Dave Whitaker (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair)** finished fourth (75-76=151). Teammate **Ben Rathfon (Leeper, PA/North Clarion County)**, a freshman, and Denison's **Fred Waddell** tied for fifth place. Rathfon leads the Gators with a 76.1 average over 11 rounds. He has five top-10 finishes and two wins this season. Whitaker averages 76.4 over 11 rounds with five top-10 finishes and one win. Wittenberg's highest finisher at Kenyon, freshman **Andy Bonar (Lancaster, OH/Lancaster)** finished with a 76-79=155.

**Poll:** The Golf Coaches Association of America poll (4/4/02) ranks Ohio Wesleyan 17th, up one spot, followed by Allegheny in 20th, down one spot. Denison received votes, but did not crack the Top 25. In a separate fan poll, the Bishops were tied for 11th, while the Gators were tabbed 16th.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT**

Four conference contests are on tap this week. On Tuesday, Oberlin (0-3, 0-7) visits NCAC co-leader Denison (2-0, 6-0) and the other co-leader Wooster (1-0, 3-2) travels to Ohio Wesleyan (1-1, 3-4). Wittenberg (1-1, 3-3) travels to Kenyon (1-1, 4-2) on Wednesday then to Wooster on Saturday.

Denison and Wooster share first place in the conference race. Only two NCAC matches were contested last week: The Bishops defeated Kenyon and Wooster overpowered Oberlin. Denison senior attack **Ryan Berger (Devon, PAConestoga)** scored three goals and added two assists as the Big Red defeated Greensboro College last week. Teammate **Jon Staunton (Charlottesville, VA/St. Anne's Belfield School)** contributed four goals and an assist. In Kenyon's 14-10 defeat of Ohio Wesleyan, Ohio Wesleyan's **John Schlegel (Chevy Chase, MD/Gonzaga)** scored four goals and had an assist. **Mike MacMaster (Hingham, MA/Hingham)** totaled nine points in leading Wooster to a 1-1 week. He had three goals and two assists in a win over Oberlin, then tallied three goals and one assist in a loss to Wheeling Jesuit. MacMaster is the NCAC's leading scorer with 5.40 points per game this season.

**Poll:** In the latest USILA national poll (April 8, 2002), Denison is ranked ninth and Ohio Wesleyan is 15th.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Kenyon junior **Justin Martinich (Bay Shore, NY/Bay Shore)** scored four goals and assisted on another to become the Lords' all-time leading scorer with 212 points. He led the Kenyon to its first NCAC win of the season

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT**

For the second straight week, every North Coast Athletic Conference squad has at least one conference contest. Beginning Tuesday, NCAC co-leader Denison (1-0, 2-6) travels to Kenyon (0-1, 3-2). The next day, co-leader Wittenberg (2-0, 4-3) takes on Earlham (0-2, 0-3) in Richmond. Thursday's matchup features Oberlin (0-2, 1-5) at co-leader Wooster (1-0, 3-4). On Saturday, the Tigers, Ladies and Allegheny (1-1, 2-4) will entertain the Big Red, the Quakers and the Bishops, respectively.

Allegheny freshman **Liz Gellar (Sewickely, PA/Quaker Valley)** is having a fine freshman campaign. Last week she tallied eight goals to go with three assists in three games. In an 11-10 NCAC victory over Earlham, she tied her season best with four goals and her five total points was her best effort in 2002. Gellar ranks third in the NCAC with 3.17 points per game. Senior **Jamie Fox (Locust Valley, NY/Friends Academy)** scored five goals to lead Denison over Oberlin. Earlham senior **Shannon Shehan (Centerville, IN/Centerville)** scored six goals in that contest, and leads the NCAC with 3.67 goals per game this season (11 in three games). Oberlin freshman goalkeeper **Sarah Pilzer (Tacoma Park, MD)** made 15 saves against Denison and 13 saves against Wittenberg. She leads the NCAC with a .631 saves percentage through six matches. Wittenberg's victory over Allegheny was Tiger head coach **Nancy Beck's** 100th career win. The winningest coach in school history, she is now 100-137 overall since taking over the program in 1987. Wooster senior goalkeeper **Kim Christensen (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** totaled 33 saves in the Scots' three contests last week.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Wittenberg junior defender **Cara Romanowski (Collegeville, PA/Perkiomen Valley)** led the Tigers in scoring as the Tigers won two overtime NCAC games last week. She scored eight goals with three assists and had 15 ground balls and caused five turnovers as the Tigers won their first two conference games of the season.

**SOFTBALL REPORT**

The opening week of the North Coast schedule saw four teams win their first two-game conference series. Allegheny (2-0, 10-8), Kenyon (2-0, 10-8) and defending NCAC champions Denison (2-0, 11-7) have all staked an early claim on top spot in the 2002 standings race. Hiram (3-1, 8-7), who won their conference opening doubleheader against Oberlin, also split games with Ohio Wesleyan (1-1, 6-7) last week to round out the list of teams with a winning record. The view from the top may change a bit after this week's busy league schedule. Six of the league's eight teams will play in two conference series this week. On Tuesday, the Gators visit Wooster (0-2, 7-10), the Big Red travel to the Ladies and the Bishops visit Wittenberg (0-2, 7-13). On Saturday, all eight teams take the field. Kenyon, Denison, Oberlin and Wooster host Allegheny, Hiram, Wittenberg and Ohio Wesleyan, respectively.

**Emily Thornton (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** fired the first no-hitter in Ohio Wesleyan softball history to spark the Bishops to a win over Hiram in the opener of an NCAC doubleheader last week. The junior righthander struck out eight, walked two and hit a Terrier batter in the game. Allegheny senior short stop **Erika Downs (Aliquippa, PA/Hopewell)** batted .550 (11-for-20) in six games last week leading the Gators to a 3-3 week. She added four runs, three RBI and four doubles. In conference play, two wins over Wittenberg, she was 3-4 (.750) with two doubles, two runs batted in and a run. Teammate **Tracie Gaydos (Sarver, PA/Freeport)** went 1-1 on the mound, with a 0.00 ERA. The sophomore threw 14.2 innings, allowing six hits and one unearned run and striking out six. Kenyon junior short stop **Carrie Robertson (Newton, MA/Newton North)** was 7-for-12 (.583) in four games last week, including two wins over Oberlin. She totalled three doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, five runs and one stolen base. Wittenberg junior **Beth Walters (Columbus, OH/Desales)** continues to be the major force behind the Tiger offense. She had an RBI double and her third homer of the season last week. She leads Wittenberg in eight offensive categories, including batting average (.383), hits (23), slugging percentage (.650) and on-base percentage (.457). Wooster's **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** was 1-1 last week, combining for 16 innings pitched and allowing four earned runs on 14 hits and 11 walks. She struck out 11.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Hiram freshman catcher **Jamie Hanson (Leslie, MI/Leslie)** batted .611 (11-for-18) in six games last week, leading the Terriers to a 3-3 week. In two wins over Oberlin, Hanson was a perfect 5-for-5 with five runs, three RBI and a double. Hiram also picked up one win over Ohio Wesleyan in the second game of a doubleheader. For the week, Hanson totalled eight runs, four RBI, five doubles, a triple and three stolen bases.

**PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Denison senior pitcher/first baseman **Courtney Zollars (Westerville, OH/Westerville South)** helped the Big Red to two of their four wins last week. Against Cedarville, Zollars worked seven innings, allowing three hits and walking one. She struck out nine batters. In nine innings against Wooster, she set a Denison record for strikeouts with 20, fanning the first nine batters and 16 of the first 17. She allowed one hit in the game - the only runner allowed on base. Zollars lowered her season ERA by more than one run after the two games this week (2.28).

**MEN'S TENNIS REPORT**

Eight of the 10 NCAC squads will return to divisional conference action this week. Beginning Tuesday, Wittenberg (0-0, 6-0) will play its first West division match of the season when they travel to Denison (2-0, 6-9). The next day, East division co-leader Oberlin (1-0, 6-8) takes on Wooster (0-0, 5-8) in the Scots' divisional opener. Thursday, the Tigers visit Ohio Wesleyan (0-1, 4-8). On the weekend, Allegheny (1-0, 7-7), Denison, and Wittenberg will host Wooster, Wabash (1-0, 10-3) and Earlham (0-2, 9-5), respectively. Hiram (0-2, 2-7) and Kenyon (0-0, 7-3) do not have divisional matches scheduled for the coming week.

**Jon Vadnal (Hudson, OH/Hudson)** was the only singles player to go undefeated for Allegheny last week. At third singles, he won 6-4, 6-4 over an opponent from Indiana of Pa., and won in three over Wittenberg's **Eric Cusick (Lima, OH/Lima Senior)**. Earlham's top singles player **Adam Turner (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** won two matches in singles last week, dropping just two games. He also won twice in doubles with partner **Justin Carrier (Voorheesville, NY/Bouton)**. Kenyon defeated 12th-ranked DePauw last week, but lost to ninth-ranked Kalamazoo in the finals of the GLCA tournament. Wittenberg has three players ranked first in the conference standings, according to overall winning percentage - **Casey Claggett (Steamboat Springs, CO/Steamboat Springs)**, who is 14-2 at first singles, **Mike Herzog (Springfield, OH/Northwestern)**, who is 10-3 at fourth singles and **Rob Postma (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)**, who is 7-1 at number six. The Tigers also have the top-ranked third doubles team in Cusick and **Ben Hodgkiss-Lilly (Cleveland Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)**, who are 9-3 overall.

**WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT**

Eight of the nine conference squads will see NCAC play this week. Today, Kenyon (0-0, 10-3) visits Ohio Wesleyan (3-3, 7-3) in the Ladies' conference opener. Tuesday, Wittenberg (1-1, 5-7) travels to first-place Denison (3-0, 10-3). Wednesday, Wooster (0-2, 1-9) looks for its first NCAC victory when the Scots host co-leader Oberlin (2-0, 13-4). On the weekend, Allegheny (1-2, 7-5) hosts the Scots, and Earlham (1-1, 8-2) and the Yeowomen will travel to the Tigers' home court to take on one another.

When Earlham head coach **John Ross** led the Quakers to a 7-0 defeat of Thomas More last week, it was the 100th victory of his head coaching career. Allegheny sophomore **Judy Spencer (Pittsburgh, PA/Baldwin)** and junior **Laura Lehrian (Erie PA/McDowell)** each went 2-0 in singles play last week. Lehrian lost just three games in four sets. Denison sophomore **Lauren Gerlach (Hudson, OH/Hudson)** won three of four matches last week at first singles, and with partner **Ali Hughes (Wauwatosa, WI/Divine Savior Holy Angels)**, won all four of her first doubles matches. Earlham's eight victories this season are a single-season school record, besting the mark of seven, set last season. Quaker sophomore **Kim Patton (Milan, IN/Milan)** improved to 7-1 on the year with two wins over the weekend at fifth singles. She is the top-ranked player in the NCAC at the flight. Hiram's number-one doubles combination of **Ann Haley (Tiffin, OH/Calvert)** and **Laura Ross (Euclid, OH/Euclid)** won all three of its matches last week. Three Oberlin singles players are ranked first in the NCAC in overall winning percentage. **Alaina Fotiu-Wojtowicz (Okemos, MI/Okemos)** is 14-3 at first singles (2-0 NCAC), **Jessica Hauser (Elmhurst, IL/York Community)** is 15-1 (1-0 NCAC) at fourth singles and **Barbara Burkholder (Las Cruces, NM/Las Cruces)** is 7-2 (0-0) at sixth singles.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT**

NCAC squads competed at meets from North Carolina to Manchester, Indiana, last week. Allegheny was at the Duke Invitational. Top individuals for the Gators were **Jeremy Scott (Norfolk, NE/Norfolk)**, **Nicole Morandi (Tewksbury, MA/Tewksbury)** and **Chelsea Benson (Mt. Jewett, PA/Kane Area)**. Scott cleared 16 feet, 6 3/4 inches in the men's pole vault, which met the automatic qualifying standard for the NCAA Championships. Morandi met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard in the women's 5,000 meters with at 14th place finish (17:37.17). Benson set a school mark in the women's 3,000-meter steeplechase (11:45.26) and also met the NCAA standard. She placed 11th in the event. Denison's teams were at the Wilmington Invitational. The women placed second of 15 teams, while the men were eighth of 18. **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** won both the 100 meters (12.40) and 200 meters (25.91). Other individual winners for the Big Red were **Amanda Wieland (Wexford, PA/North Allegheny)**, who took the women's pole vault (10 feet even) and **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** who won the discus (42.70 meters/140 feet, 1 inch). Both of Hiram's squads placed eighth of eight teams at the Case Western Reserve Invitational. Junior **Emma Brown (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** was second in the women's high jump (5-2), long jump (school-record 16-6) and 100-meter hurdles (16.00). Kenyon competed at Otterbein's Bud Yoest Invitational. Both the Lords and the Ladies placed fifth. Individual winners for Kenyon were **Cary Snyder (Charlotte, NC/Northern Valley, NJ)** in the men's 1500 meters (school record 3:59.83) and **Michael Baird (Temple, TX/Temple)** in the men's 5000 meters. Baird set a meet record with a time of 15:04.28. Right behind him in second and third place were teammates **Ben Hildebrand (Fairport, NY/The Harley School)** and **Andrew Sisson (Granville, OH/Granville)**. Part of Ohio Wesleyan's squad competed at Ohio University. Senior **Craig Neeley (Columbus, OH/Bexley)** won the high jump with a height of 6 feet, 8 inches, and also placed seventh in long jump. The Bishops were eighth of nine. OWU also placed sixth of six at Otterbein. The Ohio Wesleyan women placed ninth of nine at Ohio U. and sixth of six at Otterbein. Wabash placed fifth of seven teams at the Manchester Invitational. Senior **Darren Green (Dallas, TX/South Texas HS for Health Professions)** led the way with a first-place finish in the 200 meters (22.89) and a runner-up finish in the 100 (11.34). Junior **Caleb Ishman (Gary, IN/Emerson Visual and Performing Arts)** won the hammer (151-6). Both Wooster squads finished fourth of six teams at Otterbein. Individual winners for the Scots were senior **Justina Williams (Los Angeles, CA/El Camino Real)** who claimed a victory in the women's long jump (17-9 1/4) and freshman **Tiffany White (Kent, OH/Roosevelt)** won took the women's steeplechase (12:26.10).

**RUNNERS OF THE WEEK:** Wooster senior **Nahum Kisner (Houston, TX/St. Stephens Episcopal)** and Allegheny junior **Nicole Morandi (Tewksbury, MA/Tewksbury)** were named NCAC Track Athletes of the Week. Kisner placed second in the 100 meters (11.19) and was third in the 200 meters (22.77) at Otterbein's Bud Yoest Invitational. Morandi met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard in the 5000 meters (17:37.17) with her 14<sup>th</sup> place finish at the Duke Invitational.

**FIELD ATHLETES OF THE WEEK:** Allegheny senior **Jeremy Scott (Norfolk, NE/Norfolk)** and Wooster senior **Justina Williams (Los Angeles, CA/El Camino Real)** were named NCAC Field Athletes of the Week. Scott won the pole vault at the Duke Invitational when he cleared 16 feet, 6 3/4 inches. He met the NCAA automatic qualifying standard. Williams won the long jump at the Bud Yoest Invitational with a meet-record distance of 17 feet, 9 1/4 inches.
