NCAC Spring Sports Update

**WOOSTER WINS FIRST WOMEN'S LACROSSE TITLE;
ALLEGHENY WOMEN REPEAT AS TRACK CHAMPS**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT

Ohio Wesleyan (10-2, 32-9) and Wooster (11-1, 36-3) have advanced to the NCAC Tournament Championship, which will be held on Thursday and Friday at Thurman Munson Stadium in Canton, Ohio. The first game is scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m., with the second game to begin at 12:00 p.m. on Friday. The third game, if necessary, will begin no more than 30 minutes after the conclusion of game two. The Bishops and Scots will meet for the first time this season.

In the first round of the tournament, Wooster took two straight games from Wittenberg (10-2, 21-16), 9-2 and 13-7, to advance to the finals. The Scots and Tigers faced off four times this season, with Wooster sweeping all four contests. Ohio Wesleyan advanced after taking two of three games from Allegheny (8-3, 25-9), last week. The Bishops opened the three-game series with a 7-3, 10-inning victory over the Gators. Allegheny rallied for a 7-1 win in the second game, but Ohio Wesleyan picked up the win in game three, 4-1.

Ohio Wesleyan senior first baseman **Drew Caravella (Columbus, OH/Hilliard Davidson)** went 6-for-13 in four games last week. His solo home run in the first game against Allegheny broke open what had been a 0-0 game. He followed with a walk-off grand slam in the 10th inning. In the second game against the Gators, Caravella drove in OWU's only run in the 3-1 loss. For the week, he totalled two doubles, two homers and seven RBI... Wooster senior **Matt Englander (Solon, OH/Solon)** threw his fifth complete game of the season in leading the Scots to the opening win against Wittenberg in the first round of the NCAC Tournament. He scattered eight hits, and allowed two runs, one of which was earned. Englander, who struck out nine batters, took over the league lead in earned run average from teammate **Josh Frank (Wooster, OH/Northwestern)**.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Wooster senior outfielder **Jared Treadway (Bay Village, OH/Bay)** went 9-for-18 (.500) in the leadoff spot, helping Wooster to a 4-0 week. He totalled two or more hits in every game, including three doubles, scored five runs, drove in six others and stole six bases. In the first round of the NCAC tournament, Treadway batted 5-for-10 (.500) with two doubles, two runs, three RBI and three steals. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Ohio Wesleyan righthander **Tyler Mott (Grove City, OH/Grove City)** threw a complete-game five-hitter in the deciding game of the Bishops' NCAC first round series against Allegheny. He did not allow a hit after the fourth inning. Mott struck out eight Gator batters and walked two, allowing only one earned run in the game. The win advanced Ohio Wesleyan into the championship round of the league tournament.

GOLF REPORT

North Coast champion Ohio Wesleyan will be joined by Allegheny in the 23-team field at the NCAA Division III Championships, which began May 13 and will run through the 16th. The 72-hole event is at Firethorn Golf Club, Lincoln, Nebraska and will be hosted by Nebraska Wesleyan. Allegheny is making its 26th consecutive NCAA appearance, extending the nation's second-longest streak. The Gators, who won the Division III title in 1983, finished eighth in last spring's event, while the Bishops finished 14th.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

With a 19-4 win over Wooster (1-4, 6-6), the Denison Big Red (5-0, 12-2) have earned their seventh North Coast Athletic Conference title. Denison entered last week with only a share of the title in hand. If the results against the Scots had turned out differently, the Big Red would have shared the crown with Ohio Wesleyan (4-1, 9-5). The Bishops, winners of 12 NCAC championships, finish the 2002 season in second place. Ohio Wesleyan and Denison have a stranglehold on the men's lacrosse championship; the two schools own every title since 1985. Kenyon, the only other school to earn a championship shared the honor with the Bishops and Big Red in 2000.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ohio Wesleyan senior attackman **John Galvin (Port Washington, NY/Kent, CT)** notched eight goals and five assists to lead the Bishops in an 8-5 non-conference win over Wittenberg.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Wooster (6-1, 12-5) captured its first North Coast championship with a 7-4 win over Denison (7-0, 9-7) in the finals of the NCAC Tournament at Oberlin on May 4. The Fighting Scots defeated Ohio Wesleyan (4-3, 11-8), 14-7, and the Big Red beat Kenyon (3-4, 7-6), 22-6, in the semifinals to earn their trips to the Tournament Championship. As conference champions, Wooster received an automatic bid into the 16-team NCAA Division III Championships. The Scots will travel to Cabrini (14-4) for a first round game on Wednesday. The winner of the contest will advance to the regionals on Saturday and Sunday to face St. Mary's (MD) (18-0). The semifinals and championship game will be held Saturday and Sunday, May 18-19 at Rowan University in Glassboro, NJ.

Senior goalkeeper **Kim Christensen (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** led a trio of Fighting Scots selected to the All-Tournament team. Joining Christensen are juniors **Jess Bacon (Rocky River, OH/Rocky River)**, a defender, and **Beth Hemminger (Annapolis, MD/Annapolis Senior)**, an attacker (for complete team go to: <http://www.northcoast.org/wl/wlchampionships.html>).

SOFTBALL REPORT

2002 North Coast Champion Denison (12-2, 26-12) rolled through the NCAC Tournament with only a single loss to earn a bid into this week's NCAA Tournament. The Big Red were awarded the fifth seed in the region and travel to Muskingum (37-6) for the first round Friday through Monday, May 10-13. Denison opens the six-team, double-elimination tournament on Friday against the fourth seed, Bethany (WV) (28-8). The winner advances to play 2001 NCAA Champion Muskingum, also on Friday. The winner of the first round tournament advances as the number four seed to the Finals, hosted by the University of Wisconsin, Eau Claire, May 16-20 at Carson Park in Eau Claire, WI.

Top-ranked Denison swept the NCAC regular season and tournament titles for the second straight year. The Big Red claimed their Tournament title with a 6-4 win over Allegheny (10-4, 22-5) in game seven of the two-day, double-elimination event. Denison opened the NCAC tournament with a 2-1 win over Kenyon (7-6, 15-16-1). The Big Red then defeated Wooster, 4-1, in game three to advance to the finals. The Gators, who began the tournament with a 5-3 loss to Wooster (10-4, 20-16), defeated the Scots, 4-2, in game five to earn a place in the championship game. Allegheny took game six from the Big Red, outlasting Denison 4-3 in nine innings. Denison, however returned to its winning form in the deciding game, topping the Gators. Big Red senior pitcher **Courtney Zollars (Westerville, OH/Westerville South)** was voted the Most Valuable Player of the tournament for the second straight year. Denison teammates joining Zollars on the All-Tournament team are senior outfielder **Kelly Robbins (Franklin, OH/Franklin)**, and juniors **Katie Speakman (Columbus, OH/Grandview Hts.)**, a first baseman and **Shannon Ryan (Port Clinton, OH/Port Clinton)**, a third baseman (for complete team go to: <http://www.northcoast.org/so/sochampionships.html>).

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Kenyon (4-0, 17-3) swept three opponents 12-1 on the way to its sixth team title at the NCAC Championships held at Ohio Wesleyan (see attached bracket). The Lords, the top seed in the East, capped their championship run with a 4-1 triumph over last year's champ, Denison, in the finals. The Big Red (4-0, 11-12) were the top seed in the West. Kenyon claims its first title in seven years; the Lords last won the NCAC title in 1995. Denison has claimed 11 league championships, including five straight from 1997-2001. Kenyon marched through its first two matches, 8-0, topping Earlham (1-3, 12-8) and Wittenberg (3-1, 14-4) to reach the final. Denison defeated Oberlin (1-3, 6-16) and Wooster (3-1, 13-10) before falling to the Lords. Wittenberg captured third with a 4-1 win over Wooster in the consolation final.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

North Coast champion Denison (15-3) will be joined by Kenyon (18-6) in the 26-team field at the single-elimination NCAA Division III Championships, which begin with first and second round matches at regional sites. The Big Red and Lords will travel to Washington University in St. Louis for first and second round action in the Central Region. On Friday, Kenyon will face the host Bears (20-3) while Denison will face St. Mary's (IN) (17-6). The winners will meet on Saturday. The quarterfinal, semifinal and final rounds will be played at Sweet Briar College, in Sweet Briar, Va., May 17-22.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

The Allegheny women successfully defended their team title at the NCAC Championships, held at Ohio Wesleyan on May 3-4. The Gators captured five first and eight other top-three finishes to total 180 points and outdistanced Denison (124.5), Oberlin (114) and Wooster (108.5) in the women's field. The North Coast championship is the ninth for the Gators. The Wittenberg men edged defending champion Ohio Wesleyan in the men's field. The Tigers won five events, and had 10 other top-three finishes (169 points) on the way to its fourth NCAC men's crown. The Bishops (126), placed second, followed by Allegheny (113) and Wooster (93).

The NCAA Division III Championships will take place Thursday and Friday, May 23 through 25 at Macalester. A total of 334 athletes will compete in the championships. Athletes qualify by reaching the automatic and provisional standards established for each event. The spots remaining in the field after the automatic qualifiers are entered will be filled from the descending-order list of provisional qualifiers May 20.
