NCAC Football Report
THREE TEAMS BATTLE FOR FIRST;
NCAC TEAMS EARN LAST-MINUTE WINS

CLEVELAND -- Three teams stand undefeated in NCAC play and all three will put those records on the line in conference action on Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Earlham, all 1-0 in North Coast play, look to keep their perfect conference marks intact and maintain at least a share of the conference lead.

Ohio Wesleyan (1-0, 4-0) travels to Earlham (1-0, 2-2) as the Bishops look to extend their perfect overall record to five games. Ohio Wesleyan certainly has momentum, coming off last week's 36-30 win over Wooster. Behind the arm of Bishop senior quarterback **Mike Jonesco (Oberlin, OH/Elyria Catholic)**, who tossed a school record four touchdown passes (tie), the Bishops compiled a 34-30 lead with 31 seconds left on the clock, one of three lead changes in the fourth quarter alone. Jonesco then threw a pass for a two-point conversion to bring the score to 36-30. Wooster rallied and nearly stole the win, however OWU's **Shaun Ramos (Cumberland, RI/St. Raphael Academy)** saved the game when he tackled Scot sophomore receiver **Dan Steck (Brunswick, OH/Brunswick)** at the one yard line, after Steck hauled in a tipped Hail Mary pass on the final play of the contest. Earlham is also on a roll, winners of two straight games, including last week's 27-10 defeat of Hiram (0-1, 2-1).

Wittenberg (2-0, 4-1), the third team to start its league schedule with a victory, travels to Denison in a meeting of two high-powered offenses. The Tigers are coming off of a 21-17 win over Allegheny, and have won two straight NCAC games to extend their 24-game NCAC winning streak. The victory came off a **Michael Aljancic (Louisville, OH/Louisville)** touchdown with 16 seconds left in the fourth as the Tigers rallied from a 10-point deficit in the final six minutes of the game to preserve their long string of conference wins. Wittenberg's run through the conference may be stopped this week, however as its opponent has also shown it can win big games. Denison knocked off Kenyon, 52-50, in triple overtime last week. Facing a 24-9 deficit after three quarters of play, Big Red junior quarterback **Greg Neuendorf (Sylvania, OH/Sylvania Southview)** orchestrated three TDs in the fourth to move the game into OT. He then ran in the winning touchdown and completed a pass for a two-point conversion to secure the win.

Looking to double its run of wins, Wabash (1-1, 2-2), rolls out the welcome mat for Wooster (1-1, 1-2) on Saturday. The Little Giants defeated Oberlin, 56-26, last week. Hiram (0-1, 2-1) travels to Allegheny (1-1, 1-3) in this week's final conference game. Both teams are coming off of NCAC losses and look to stay in the hunt for the NCAC title. Kenyon (0-2, 0-3) takes a break from conference action when the Lords host Case Western Reserve in Gambier. Oberlin (0-1, 0-4) is idle.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Wittenberg senior **Mike Aljancic (Louisville, OH/Louisville)** and Denison junior **Dele Kadri (Somerville, NJ/Seton Hall Prep)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances last week in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Aljancic, a 6-0, 175-pound wide receiver, hauled in 11 passes for 130 yards and two touchdowns against Allegheny, including the gamewinner with 16 seconds left in the fourth quarter. Nine of his catches came in the second half, seven in the fourth quarter. Aljancic is fourth in the NCAC with 7.2 receptions per game.

Kadri, a 5-9, 172-pound defensive back, returned a punt 69 yards for a touchdown to tie Kenyon, 24-24 in the fourth quarter. He then intercepted a Lord pass in the end zone to stop Kenyon from winning the game in the first OT. Kadri totalled seven punt returns for 100 yards and a touchdown, one kick return of 35 yards, an interception, five pass breakups and four tackles in the 52-53 triple-overtime win over Kenyon.

GRID NOTEBOOK: It was the week of the quarterback in the NCAC. Denison's **Greg Neuendorf (Sylvania, OH/Sylvania Southview)** broke his own NCAC and Denison record for total offense when he racked up 512 yards against Kenyon. The junior finished the day with 436 yards passing (32-of-64 with four touchdowns) and 76 yards rushing (17 carries, one TD). He leads the NCAC with 1,582 yards of total offense, averaging 395.5 per game. Earlham sophomore **Jeremiah King (Riverview, FL/East Bay)** completed 15 of 28 passes for 111 yards and rushed for an additional 14 yards in the Quakers' 27-10 win over Hiram. Kenyon senior **Tony Miga (Mentor, OH/Mentor)** threw for 300 yards and five touchdowns against Denison (57-28-1) ... Ohio Wesleyan senior **Mike Jonesco (Oberlin, OH/Elyria Catholic)** tied an OWU record with his four TD passes. He was 11-for-29 and 189 yards against Wooster ... Kenyon senior **Andy Pillay (Potomac, MD/Landon)** played football the old fashioned way last week, lining up on both sides of the ball against Denison. As a receiver he caught 17 passes for 203 yards and four touchdowns. His 17 catches are a Lords game record - they also tie the NCAC mark. As a defensive safety he made six tackles and had one interception for 37 yards and two pass defenses ... Hiram junior linebacker **Jeremiah Cleveland (Cleveland, OH/Glenville)** recorded 15 tackles against Earlham, including four solo ... Oberlin set school records with 405 yards passing and 530 yards of total offense against Wabash. Junior wide receiver **Rick Valenzuela (Manteca, CA/Modesto)** broke the school's single-game mark for yards receiving with 239. He caught nine passes and had a season-high three touchdowns ... Wabash sophomore running back **Chris Morris (Zionsville, IN/Zionsville)** ground out 161 yards and three touchdowns, both career highs, against Oberlin.

**OHIO WESLEYAN TO HOST ALL-OHIO CROSS COUNTRY MEET;
THREE VOLLEYBALL LEADERS FACE OFF ON SATURDAY**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

CROSS COUNTRY REPORT

Most of the North Coast cross country teams were off last weekend to rest up for this week's All-Ohio meet, hosted by Ohio Wesleyan. On Friday, October 5, Denison, Hiram, Kenyon, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster will all travel to Delaware to compete against all of the college cross country teams in the state. Kenyon's men and Denison's women are the defending champions. Allegheny will travel to Lehigh for the Paul Short Invitational, while Wabash will compete in the Notre Dame Invitational. Earlham is idle.

Notes: In their own invitational, the Quaker women placed fifth while the men were sixth in the 11-team fields. Senior **Beth Smith (East Berlin, PA/Hershey)** was the top individual for Earlham's women in 12th place. She was clocked at 20:18. Leading the Quaker men was junior **Zach Warren (Charleston, WV/Catholic)**, who placed ninth in 27:42. Wooster competed at the Co-ed Walsh Invitational. Wooster won the combined race, while the Scots were second in both the separated men's and women's results. Junior **Brendan Callahan (South Glastonbury, CT/Glastonbury)** won the race in 16:23. Freshman **Tiffany White (Kent, OH/Roosevelt)** was the Scots' top woman in second place (21:04) ... The NCAA Division III Men's Cross Country poll (Sept. 29) has Kenyon ranked 14th. On the women's side, Allegheny is tied for 25th.

FIELD HOCKEY REPORT

This week, conference leader Wittenberg (5-0, 7-0) puts its perfect mark on the line at Earlham (1-3, 2-5) on Wednesday and at home against second-place Wooster (4-1, 6-2). The Scots also travel to Oberlin (2-3, 3-3) on Tuesday to make up a postponed contest. Third-place Denison (3-2, 3-7) visits seventh-place Kenyon (0-4, 0-6) on Tuesday and fifth-place Ohio Wesleyan (2-4, 4-6) on Saturday. Rounding out this week's slate, the Quakers host the Yeowomen on Saturday.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY: Earlham junior **Zach Warren (Charleston, WV/ Catholic)** finished ninth of 92 runners at the Earlham Invitational. His time of 27:42 paced the Quakers to a sixth-place finish at the 11-team event.

WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY: Wooster freshman **Tiffany White (Kent, OH/Kent Roosevelt)** was the second woman to cross the finish line at the four-team Co-Ed Walsh Invitational. Her time of 21:04 helped earn the Scot women a second-place finish in the Women's Division. Overall, Wooster won the meet with 82 points.

FIELD HOCKEY: Wittenberg junior **Emily Duh (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley)** led the Tigers to a pair of shutout victories, both in conference play last week. She assisted on the only goal of the game against Denison, then assisted on the first two of Wittenberg's scores in a 4-0 defeat of Kenyon.

MEN'S SOCCER: Ohio Wesleyan junior **Bret Dunlap (West Chester, OH/Iakota West)** propelled the Bishops to a 2-0 week. The forward hit the back of the net twice to push Ohio Wesleyan past Ohio Northern, 2-0. He followed with a one-goal effort against NCAC opponent, Oberlin. The Bishops won, 3-0.

WOMEN'S SOCCER: Earlham forward **Rita Lawson (Cincinnati, OH/Oak Hills)** made the first three goals of her collegiate career count. She scored twice in a 4-3 victory over Wittenberg, including the game-winner in overtime. She then scored the tying goal that sent the Quakers' game with Hiram to overtime, before the team fell, 2-1, in the second overtime session. Her offensive burst boosted her to the top of Earlham's scoring list with six points in nine games.

VOLLEYBALL: Hiram senior **Stephanie Schnetz (Stow, OH/Stow-Monroe Falls)** led the Terriers to a 2-0 week, including their first NCAC victory of the 2001 campaign. She recorded 20 digs and 15 kills as Hiram swept matches with Oberlin and Ursuline.

Notes: Wittenberg has shut out all but one of its seven opponents this season. The Tigers are ranked second in the NCAA III defensively. Wittenberg's 7-0 start is its best since 1997, and it is one of eight undefeated teams remaining in Division III. Senior goalkeeper **Georgina Klinzing (Gasport, NY/Royalton-Hartland)** ranks third in the nation in both saves percentage (94.1) and goals against average (0.33) ... Kenyon sophomore goalkeeper **Tamar Chalker (Meriden, NH/Deerfield)** made 30 saves in two NCAC losses last week, including 17 against Wittenberg ... Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Lindsay Groves (Columbus, OH/Worthington Kilbourne)** scored the first goal of her collegiate career when it counted most – in overtime. Her score lifted the Bishops to a 2-1 victory over Oberlin.

MEN'S SOCCER REPORT

League-leading Denison (3-0-0, NCAC) looks to extend its winning ways in conference play when the Big Red hosts Hiram (0-1-1) on Saturday. Denison is coming off two conference wins, a 5-2 defeat of Oberlin and a 1-0 decision over Wooster. The rest of the NCAC will also take the field Saturday, as all 10 teams will see conference action. Third-place Kenyon (1-0-1) squares off against fifth-place Allegheny (1-1-0) in Meadville, while second-place Ohio Wesleyan (2-0-0) travels to Earlham (0-0-1) and Oberlin (0-2-0) and Wittenberg (0-2-0) meet in Springfield. The final game of the week pits Wooster (1-1-0) against Wabash (0-1-1) in Crawfordsville. Two games will be contested early in the week. On Wednesday, the Little Giants face in-state rival Earlham and Oberlin hosts Kenyon.

Notes: Hiram senior midfielder **Richie Behling (Cecil, PA/Canon-McMillan)** recorded two goals in the Terriers 4-1 win over Marietta ... Kenyon junior forward **Tyler Perfect (Durham, NC/Jordan)** scored two goals in the Lords 3-0 win over Wittenberg. Kenyon also tied Capital, 1-1, in double overtime last week, the fifth time the Lords left the pitch with a tie score ... Wabash junior forward **Carlos Aguirre (Indianapolis, IN/Ben Davis)** elevated the Little Giants into a 1-1 tie with Hanover. After two overtime sessions, the score remained the same. The goal was his fifth of the season and his second in as many games. He has five points in his last four games to lead Wabash ... Wooster split a pair of games last week, a 6-1 win over Muskingum in which all six Scot goals were scored in the second half and a 1-0 loss to Denison. Despite a loss to the Big Red, Wooster is off to its best start since 1990, when it went 14-5-1 overall and played in the NCAA Division III Tournament ... The latest NSCAA Great Lakes Regional Coaches Poll ranks Ohio Wesleyan seventh and Wooster eighth.

WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT

Denison (4-0-0, NCAC), the early leader through September, is in first place with 11 points. The Big Red faces third-place Wittenberg on Wednesday in Springfield, and returns home to host seventh place (tie) Hiram (1-1-0). Also undefeated this season in NCAC play is Ohio Wesleyan (3-0-0), which enters the week in second with nine points. The Bishops' lone NCAC contest will be Saturday when fourth-place (tie) Earlham (1-2-0) visits Delaware. Also tied for fourth are Wooster (1-2-0) and Allegheny (1-1-0). The Scots host Hiram on Wednesday and the Gators play host to seventh-place (tie) Kenyon (0-2-1) on Saturday. Rounding out the schedule is a matchup between the Tigers and Oberlin (0-2-1) in Oberlin on Saturday.

Notes: Allegheny junior midfielder **Jane Och (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair)** led the Gator attack in two victories last week with two goals and an assist. She leads Allegheny with 12 points in nine games this season ... Senior forward **Megan Trau (Cincinnati, OH/Lakota East)** of Denison scored three goals in last week's action, including the game-winner against Wooster ... Hiram junior midfielder/stopper **Jan Vivier (Greenfield, Ma/Greenfield)** scored in the 111th minute to lift the Terriers to a 2-1 overtime defeat of Earlham. It was Hiram's school-record fifth win of the season. Goalkeeper **Maureen Collins (Washington, DC/Georgetown Day)** made 18 saves in a 1-0 loss to Wittenberg ... Ohio Wesleyan, ranked fifth in NCAA Division III, has one of the stingiest defenses around. It has allowed five goals in 10 games and just one in three NCAC contests. Bishop senior **Katy Sturtz (Worthington, OH/Watterson)** scored four times last week to up her career goal total to 101. She is the eighth player in Division III to notch 100 goals ... In the NSCAA/adidas Great Lakes Region rankings (Sept. 24), Ohio Wesleyan is listed first, Denison third, Wooster seventh and Allegheny ninth. In the NSCAA/adidas national rankings for Div. III, OWU stands fifth and Denison is 17th.

VOLLEYBALL REPORT

All nine squads see action in conference play this week. The three teams that share the early lead, Allegheny (2-0, 9-6), Denison (2-0, 9-9) and Wittenberg (3-0, 10-3), face one another in a tri-match at Allegheny on Saturday. Three squads nipping at their heels – Oberlin (1-2, 1-16), Ohio Wesleyan (1-1, 8-15) and Wooster (1-1, 9-6) – take on their counterparts at Oberlin the same day. Earlham (0-3, 2-17), Hiram (1-2, 11-8) and Kenyon (0-2, 0-9) seek NCAC victories in a tri-match at Kenyon. Wednesday night, Earlham will travel to Ohio Wesleyan.

Notes: Ohio Wesleyan's eighth-year head coach **Cynthia Holliday** won the 300th match of her career last week, when the Bishops knocked off Washington & Jefferson. She is the 33rd NCAA Division III coach to reach that plateau. She is 300-271 in her career, 156-110 at OWU ... Allegheny won the St. Lawrence Invitational with victories over the hosts, Rochester and St. John Fisher ... Wittenberg finished in a three-way tie for first at their own invitational with a 3-1 mark. Freshman outside hitter **Monica McDonald (Newark, OH/Catholic)** and junior outside hitter **Teresa Murphy (Blacklick, OH/Newark Catholic)** were named to the all-tournament team ... Denison junior middle hitter **Becky Turk (Middleburg Hts., OH/Midpark)** had 31 kills and a hitting percentage of .470 as the Big Red went 2-1 in non-conference action ... Hiram sophomore **Charity Newman (Port Washington, OH/Indian Valley)** set up 53 assists in a pair of Terriers' straight-set victories ... Kenyon's freshman setter **Maria Villegas (Marion, OH/Catholic)** recorded 64 assists in the Ladies' five-game loss to Capital, the third-highest single-match total in the program's history ... In the AVCA Div. III Coaches poll (Sept. 26), Wittenberg is ranked 13th. In the NCAA III Regional poll, the Tigers are second in Great Lakes Region.
