**UNDEFEATED WABASH AND WOOSTER TO CLASH IN CRAWFORDSVILLE;
KENYON WINS FIRST GAME OF SEASON**

October 27, 2002

CLEVELAND – This week's matchup between Wabash (5-0, 7-0) and Wooster (4-0, 7-0) could be titled "The Clash of the Unbeatens". One of the most entertaining championship races in recent North Coast Conference history will reach its peak when the league's only undefeated teams meet in Crawfordsville this Saturday. The outcome of this one match will go a long way toward determining the 2002 NCAC Champion. Should the Little Giants win, they would be one win away from their first league title since they started playing NCAC football in 2000. Should the Fighting Scots win, they would have two games between them and their first title in five years. Wooster finished as co-champions with Wittenberg and Allegheny in 1997. A Wooster win on Saturday opens the door for a repeat three-way tie at the top of the standings. The Scots host Wittenberg (3-1, 6-1) on the last Saturday of the season. Should Wooster beat Denison on Nov. 9, and lose to Wittenberg on Nov. 16, Wabash, Wooster and Wittenberg would all finish the season with identical 6-1 records.

This week will surely be a battle as the Fighting Scots boast the NCAC's top rushing offense, while the Little Giants claim the league's best rushing defense. Wooster averages 275.4 yards per game on the ground, mainly because of sophomore standout tailback **Tony Sutton (Akron, OH/Archbishop Hoban)**. In last week's 49-20 win over Earlham, he rushed for 224 yards and four touchdowns on 31 carries. It was his fourth 200-yard game in the last five weeks. Sutton leads the NCAC in rushing with 1,569 yards - 169.1 yards per game. Wabash has held opponents to a measly 71.7 average yards per game thus far this season. The Little Giants defense is led by senior linebacker **Nate Boulais (Indianapolis, IN/Ben Davis)** who has made 67 tackles this season. Boulais is sixth in the NCAC in tackles with 9.6 per game. Last week the Little Giants topped Oberlin 51-6. Leading the defensive effort was freshman defensive lineman **Josh Foster (Indianapolis, IN/Ben Davis)**, who recorded 12 tackles (six solo), two tackles for a loss and one sack.

Third-place Wittenberg hosts Allegheny (2-2,3-4) this week. The Tigers defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 58-17, last week, while the Gators defeated Denison, 50-16. Allegheny is part of a three-way tie for fourth with Oberlin (2-2, 2-5) and Earlham (2-2, 2-5). The Yeomen and Quakers meet in Richmond this week. Kenyon (1-4, 1-7) picked up its first win of the season last week, a 22-10 win over Hiram. This week the Lords travel to Ohio Wesleyan (1-2, 3-3). The Terriers (0-4,0-7) host Denison (1-3, 1-6) on Saturday.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Allegheny junior **Bubba Smith (Doylestown, OH/Chippewa)** and Kenyon freshman **Jeff Legree (Roseville, MI/University Liggett)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances last week in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Smith, a 6-0, 185-pound quarterback, recorded four touchdowns in the Gators' win over Denison. He completed 17 of 28 passes for 258 yards and three touchdowns. He also rushed for 90 yards, reaching the endzone once.

Legree, a 6-0, 175-pound defensive back, led the Lords past Hiram, 22-10, with two tackles, four pass defenses and two interceptions, returned for a combined 40 yards. The victory was the first for Kenyon this season.

GRID NOTEBOOK

The North Coast is one of only two conferences with three teams ranked in the AFCA Division III Coaches Poll. The current edition of the poll (Oct. 22), released each Tuesday during the season, has Wabash in the #10 spot, followed by Wittenberg in 12th and Wooster as 23rd. The other conference with three ranked teams is the American Southwest ... Denison senior wide receiver **Ryan Hite (Findlay, OH)** caught five passes for 38 yards and one touchdown against Allegheny, setting the Big Red record for touchdown receptions with 20 ... Earlham's **Darrien Story (Kokomo, IN/Kokomo)** recorded 152 yards and three touchdowns on 14 carries against Wooster ... Hiram freshman running back **Tim Anderson (Akron, OH/Central Hower)** gained 205 yards rushing on 32 tries against Kenyon. It was his second 200-yard game this season ... Kenyon sophomore **Calvin Hatfield (Falmouth, ME/Cheverus)**, a linebacker playing as a tailback, ran for 220 yards and two touchdowns on 46 tries against Hiram. The 220 yards was the fifth-highest total in Kenyon history, while the 46 attempts set a school mark ... Oberlin freshman **Vance Murphy (Pataskala, OH/Watkins Memorial)** recorded 12 tackles against Wabash. He also had one sack ... Ohio Wesleyan sophomore halfback **Eric Indiciani (Delaware, OH/Olentangy)** led the Bishops against Wittenberg with 77 yards on eight carries as the Bishops held a 184-91 edge in yardage on the ground ... Last week's win over Oberlin was the 14th consecutive victory for Wabash dating back to last season. It was the 11th consecutive NCAC win ... Wittenberg senior QB **Greg Cornett (Franklin, Ohio/Franklin)** recorded 16 completions in 19 attempts, 262 yards and a career-high tying four touchdowns against OWU. He is on pace to break Tiger records for completions, attempts and passing yards in a season.

NCAC Fall Sports Update

**CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS HOSYED BY WITTENBERG;
WOOSTER TO HOST NCAC MEN'S SOCCER TOURNAMENT**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

CROSS COUNTRY REPORT

The 19th North Coast Athletic Conference Men's and Women's Cross Country Championships will be held on Saturday. The meets will be run at John Bryan State Park in Yellow Springs, Ohio, and hosted by Wittenberg. The men's race begins at 11 a.m. while the women step off at noon.

Kenyon is the defending champion on both the men's and women's side. The NCAC cross country coaches conducted a pre-championship poll last week. Allegheny was picked to win the women's race with 79 points and seven first-place votes. Denison (67 points), Oberlin (66 and one first-place vote), and Kenyon (58 and one first-place vote) were voted places two through four. The Gators have won nine NCAC crowns in women's cross country, but last took the title in 1994.

Allegheny was picked in the poll to win the men's race as well. The Gators picked up 97 points and seven first-place votes. Defending champion Kenyon was second with 93 points and the remaining three first-place votes. Denison (74) and Wooster (67) were selected third and fourth, respectively. The Lords have won the last three NCAC titles. Allegheny has won two NCAC titles in men's cross country, most recently in 1997.

Polls: In the NCAA Division III Men's Cross Country Poll (Oct. 23), Allegheny returned to the rankings in 23rd. In the Division III Women's Poll, Allegheny moved up a notch to 18th.

FIELD HOCKEY REPORT

Defending NCAC champion Wooster (9-3, 23-4) enters the inaugural conference tournament in third place. Oberlin (7-5, 10-5) has claimed the fourth and final spot in the four-team season-ending event. The Fighting Scots and the Yeowomen will open the tournament at either Wittenberg or Wooster. Who will play at which site? That remains to be seen. The tournament semifinals are scheduled to be played at the sites of the top two seeds, with the number one seed hosting the fourth seed and the second seed hosting the third seed.

Currently Wittenberg (9-2, 14-3) and Denison (9-2, 14-4) are tied for first place. Each team has one game left on their schedule. The Tigers host Ohio Wesleyan on Tuesday, while the Big Red travel to Kenyon on Wednesday to make up a game postponed earlier this season due to weather. If Wittenberg or Denison win, while the other loses, the winning team would be crowned the NCAC regular season champion and would earn the top seed in the tournament, the losing team shall be the second seed. Should both teams win, either in regulation or in overtime, they will share the NCAC championship. The tie will be broken only for tournament seeding purposes.

Notes: In the STX/NFHCA Division III National Coaches Poll (Oct. 22), Wittenberg dropped four places to 17th ... Kenyon sophomore forward **Maggie Rosen (Bexley, OH/Bexley)** scored the gamewinner in double overtime to give the Ladies a 3-2 win over Transylvania last week ... Oberlin freshman goalkeeper **Siv Tang (Malden, MA/Malden)** recorded three shutouts last week, a 1-0 double OT win over DePauw, a 2-0 win over Hanover and a 1-0 win over Earlham. She totalled 10 saves in the three games. Senior **Chaney Stewman (Gibsonia, PA/Vincentian)** was responsible for all of the Yeowomen's goals against both Hanover and Earlham ... Wittenberg senior goalkeeper **Jen Meyer (Solon, OH/Hathaway Brown)** was credited with 15 saves in the Tigers' 2-0 loss to Juniata. She made 17 more in a 2-1 win over 12th-ranked Lebanon Valley. She added four more in Wittenberg's 1-0 loss to Wooster ... Wooster sophomore goalie **Beth Skelton (Arlington, VA/Washington-Lee)** recorded a pair of 1-0 shutouts last week. She had one save against DePauw and five against Wittenberg.

MEN'S SOCCER REPORT

Six games remain in the regular season schedule. Each team in the NCAC, except Allegheny and Ohio Wesleyan, has one match left. The Gators and Battling Bishops have two. All of the remaining games have bearing on the North Coast tournament, which will be hosted by Wooster on Friday Nov. 2 and Saturday, Nov. 3.

First-place Wooster (6-0-2, 20 pts, 14-0-3) and second-place Allegheny (6-1-0, 18 pts, 11-4-0) are both guaranteed a tournament berth. Should the Gators win both of their contests this week, they will earn the top seed in the tournament. If Wooster wins their match this week, and Allegheny loses or ties one of their contests, the Scots would enter the tourney as the top seed. Allegheny and Ohio Wesleyan (4-2-1, 14-2-1, 13 pts) will play on Wednesday at Oberlin to make up a game postponed due to weather earlier this season. The Gators second match of the week is at Earlham (4-3-1, 7-6-3, 13 pts) on Saturday. Wooster travels to Oberlin (2-6-0, 8-9-1, 6 pts) on Saturday.

Denison (4-2-2, 8-5-2), Earlham, Ohio Wesleyan and Wittenberg (4-4-0, 6-10-1, 12 pts) all have a chance at the final two tournament berths. The Big Red host Wabash (3-5-0, 8-8-0, 9 pts) on Saturday. The Bishops host Kenyon (3-5-0, 9 pts, 6-12-0) on Friday. The Tigers travel to Hiram (0-8-0, 0 pts, 1-14-1) on Saturday.

Notes: In the NSCAA/adidas NCAA Division III poll (Oct. 21), Wooster moved into fifth place, up one spot from last week. Ohio Wesleyan re-entered the poll in the 25th spot. In the Great Lakes Region, Wooster is ranked first, Ohio Wesleyan follows in fourth and Allegheny is sixth ... Kenyon junior midfielder **Andrew Sheridan (Cleveland Hts., OH/Hawken)** scored his team-leading sixth goal of the season in the Lords' 2-1 loss to Wooster ... Ohio Wesleyan junior midfielder **Paul Smith (Dublin, OH/Columbus Watterson)** scored two crucial goals for the Bishops last week. He provided the gamewinners in the Bishops 4-0 wins over Hiram and Earlham. Smith is the Bishops' leading scorer with an average of 1.24 points per game on eight goals and five assists over 17 games ... Wabash freshman forward **Chase Lamm (Brownsburg, IN/Brownsburg)** scored his team-leading ninth goal of the season by scoring two goals against Hiram. He also added an assist on the last goal of the game, giving him a team-leading 25 points. Lamm scored the first goal in the win over the Terriers, then added an insurance goal in the 72nd minute ... Wittenberg senior **Brian Armstrong (Delaware, OH/Dublin Coffman)** continues to spark the Tiger offense and keep the team's faint postseason hopes alive. He had one goal against Kenyon and the gamewinning tally against Oberlin. He leads the team with 10 goals and five assists.

WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT

One game remains on the NCAC regular season schedule, and it will be played on Monday. A rescheduled contest between Allegheny (5-1-1, 16 pts, 13-3-2) and Denison (5-1-1, 16 pts, 13-3-1) involves two teams that are currently tied for third. The outcome of that match will determine the second through fourth seeds in the upcoming NCAC tournament. Ohio Wesleyan (8-0-0/24 points) has already clinched the top spot and home-field advantage for one of the semifinal matchups. Entering the week, Wooster (5-1-2, 17 pts, 12-1-5) is second.

If one team emerges victorious in the Allegheny-Denison contest, that team will earn the second seed and the losing team will claim the fourth seed. Should the Gators and Big Red tie, the Scots would claim the second seed and a home match in the semifinals. Denison would be third and the Gators fourth.

Notes: In the NSCAA/adidas NCAA Division III Poll (Oct. 21), Ohio Wesleyan ranks first, Denison is tied for 16th and Wooster debuted at 22nd. In the Great Lakes Region, Ohio Wesleyan is first, Denison is third, Wooster moved up to fourth and Allegheny moved to fifth ... Allegheny junior **Joan Anderson (Holt, MI/Holt)** played 165 scoreless minutes in goal as the Gators had two scoreless ties last week. She made 13 saves in those contests ... Hiram senior midfielder **Jen Vivier (Northfield, MA/Greenfield)** tied the Terriers' single-season mark for goals and points with her eighth goal of the season last week. It gave her 17 points on the year. She finished her career as Hiram's all-time leading goal-scorer (18) and second in points (37) ... Kenyon sophomore **Heather Preston (Berea, OH)** scored her eighth and ninth goals of the year last week, which is tops on the Ladies squad ... Oberlin senior **Courtney Stackhouse (Woodbridge, VA/Bishop Ireton)** scored four goals and added an assist in a defeat of Hiram ... Ohio Wesleyan finished the conference regular season with a perfect 8-0 mark and didn't allow a goal in conference play. Last week, the Bishops allowed just one shot in a pair of NCAC victories. OWU has posted 11 straight shutouts and has a 38-game winning streak, a Division III record.

VOLLEYBALL REPORT

The final match of the conference regular season, Denison at Wooster, will be played on Tuesday. That match will have no bearing on the seedings for the upcoming NCAC tournament. The NCAC tournament quarterfinals begin on Nov. 5, a week from Tuesday, on the campuses of the top four teams.

Wittenberg (8-0, 26-7) has clinched the top seed in the NCAC tournament for the fifth straight season. They will host eighth-place Earlham (1-7, 3-28) in the quarterfinals. Denison (6-1, 19-8) clinched the second seed and will host seventh-seeded Kenyon (3-5, 14-20). Allegheny (5-3, 11-18) wins a tiebreaker for the third spot and the Gators will host number-six seed Ohio Wesleyan (3-5, 4-27). The fourth quarterfinal will feature fifth-seeded Wooster (4-3, 19-13) at number-four seed Hiram (5-3, 16-11).

Notes: In the AVCA Division III Coaches Top 25 Poll (Oct. 23), Wittenberg moves up a spot to 15th ... Denison senior setter **Reagann Goodwin (Gahanna, OH/St. Michael Academy)** averaged 10.6 assists in 13 games as the Big Red won four matches last week. She also had 18 kills (1.38 per game), 24 digs (1.85 pg) and four service aces. She was named to the Kenyon Invitational's all-tournament team ... Earlham freshman **Ajia Coleman (Maple Hts., OH/Maple Hts.)** recorded 33 kills to lead the Quakers to two victories. Junior **Anita Tevis-Long (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** had a double-double with 12 kills and 12 digs in the win over Tri-State. Senior **Teresa Batteiger (Bargersville, IN/Indianapolis Lutheran)** led the defense with 45 digs in the two wins ... Hiram junior **Charity Norman (Port Washington, OH/Indian Valley)** became the Terriers'

career leader in assists. She enters the week with 2,453 in her career. Hiram (16-11) is one victory shy of tying the school record for wins in a season, and is on pace to break the school mark for winning percentage in a season (.593) ... Kenyon senior **Cori Arnold (West Lafayette, OH/Ridgewood)** had 26 kills, four service aces, 12 blocks and 32 digs during the Kenyon Invitational. She has already set the Ladies' single-season mark for kills with 454 ... Wittenberg went 2-2 at the Wisconsin-Whitewater Invitational. All six of the participating teams ranked in the top 18 in Division III ... Wooster senior **Erin Donnell (Dayton, OH/Carroll)** totaled 46 kills and 30 digs in 12 games as the Scots went 2-1 last week.

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SWIMMING REPORT

The North Coast Athletic Conference swim season got underway with the NCAC Relay meet, hosted jointly by Kenyon and Denison. Kenyon won both the men's (160 points) and women's (156 points) meets, while Denison was runner-up in both, with 128 points in the men's meet and 130 in the women's. Wooster (114) was third in the women's meet, followed by Wittenberg (86) in fourth and Allegheny (78) in fifth. Ohio Wesleyan (72) took sixth and Hiram (42) and Oberlin (42) shared seventh place.

Wabash (88) took third in the men's meet, followed by Wittenberg (76) in fourth and Hiram (74) in fifth. Ohio Wesleyan (60), Oberlin (58), Allegheny (48) and Wooster (44) claimed places sixth through nine, respectively.

Denison won both men's diving events and the women's three-meter competition. Allegheny took first in the women's one-meter diving.

The Ladies won seven of the eight swim relays, while the Lords won all eight swimming relays. Kenyon senior **Beth Galloway (Orchard Park, NY/Orchard Park)** led off the winning 200-yard medley, 200-yard backstroke, 500-yard freestyle and 200-yard freestyle relays. Leading the Lords was senior **Marc Courtney-Brooks (Columbus, OH/St. Charles Prep)** who as part of six winning relays.
