**NCAC Football Report**

**FIVE CONFERENCE GAMES SLATED FOR SATURDAY;  
FIVE TEAMS PUT PERFECT NCAC MARKS ON THE LINE**

**CLEVELAND** – Every North Coast Athletic Conference team will see conference action this week with five games on tap. Four of the teams who share the early lead in the NCAC race face one another and three of those teams put overall unbeaten marks on the line as well.

Wabash (2-0, 4-0) travels to Wittenberg (1-0, 4-0) for an early-season showdown. This is the third game between the schools since the Little Giants joined the conference. The Tigers have taken both previous meetings since then, including a 14-3 decision last season in Springfield, which happens to be the last time Wabash lost a game. Oberlin (1-0, 1-3) and Wooster (1-0, 4-0) also aim to protect their share of the NCAC lead. The Yeomen are coming off a non-conference loss to Frostburg State, while the Scots are hoping to keep their positive trend going after a 37-14 decision over Ohio Wesleyan (0-1, 2-2). Earlham (1-0, 1-3), the fifth team to start the NCAC season with a victory, hosts the Bishops this week.

Wittenberg, which held on to its fourth-place national ranking last week, and Wabash, who also received votes in the poll, are meeting for the fifth time overall and the Tigers have won every previous meeting, dating to 1964. Two of the NCAC's most potent offensive stars face off in this contest, with Little Giant senior quarterback **Jake Knott (Lafayette, IN/Jefferson)** and Wittenberg senior tailback **Daniel Grove (Uhrichsville, OH/Claymont)** leading their respective squads. Knott, last season's NCAC Offensive Player of the Year, currently leads the conference in passing yards per game (246.2) and total offense (252.0 ypg), while Grove not only leads the conference but also leads NCAA Division III in touchdowns with 13. Grove also leads the NCAC in points per game (19.5).

Two teams looking for their first wins of the year face off this week. Kenyon (0-2, 0-5) travels to nearby Denison (0-1, 0-4) in a meeting of two squads who are trying to turn their seasons around after a rough start. Hiram (0-1, 0-4) is also looking for its first victory of the 2002 campaign when they visit Allegheny (0-1, 1-3). The Terriers were idle last week, while the Gators lost to Wabash, 24-14, in their opener a week ago.

**PLAYERS OF THE WEKK**

CLEVELAND -- Wooster sophomore **Tony Sutton (Akron, OH/Archbishop Hoban)** and Wabash junior **Stu Johnson (West Lafayette, IN/Harrison)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances last week in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

**Sutton**, a 5-9, 185-pound running back, rushed for an NCAC-record 313 yards on 36 carries to lead Wooster past Ohio Wesleyan, 37-14. Sutton smashed former Scot Brian Grandison's school and NCAC standard (292) that had stood since 1991. He also tied NCAC marks for touchdowns (5) and points (30).

**Johnson**, a 6-1, 202-pound safety, recorded four tackles to lead the Little Giant defense in a key NCAC victory over Allegheny last week. His pass break-up on third and 10 with the Gators driving in the fourth quarter, down just 17-14, proved to be the deciding play in Wabash's 24-14 victory.

Allegheny's **Jon Turner (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)** moved into fourth place on the school's all-time list (87) after he nabbed seven passes for 78 yards .. Denison's **Josh Jirgens (Lakewood, OH/Trinity West)** scored their only touchdown last week on a 36-yard reception. Linebacker **Patrick Rule (Chagrin Falls, OH/Gilmour Academy)** led the Big Red with 8 tackles and a sack .. Senior **Darrian Story (Kokomo, IN/Kokomo)** ran for three touchdowns in Earlham's 49-19 victory over Kenyon. Kenyon's **Calvin Hatfield (Falmouth, ME/Cheverus)** rushed for 92 yards and two TDs of his own on the other end of the field. Lord linebacker **Dave Contrada (Toledo, OH/Sylvania Northview)** contributed five stops, three for a loss, a pass deflection and an interception .. Ohio Wesleyan's **Jason Osborne (Oak Harbor, OH/Oak Harbor)** rushed 20 times for 107 yards .. **Jake Knott (Lafayette, IN/Jefferson)** became Wabash's all-time leader in total offense (9,847) and **Ryan Short (Indianapolis, IN/Perry Meridian)** became the school's all-time leader in TD receptions in the same game (34). Junior **Chris Morris (Zionsville, IN/Zionsville)** rushed for 100 yards for the fourth straight game (131) .. Senior **Daniel Grove (Uhrichville, OH/Claymont)** moved into second place on Wittenberg's all-time scoring list with a three-TD performance. Freshman **Jered Glover (Middletown, OH/Middletown)** caught seven passes for 114 yards. Senior linebacker **Dustin Goldsburly (Columbus, OH/Ready)** recorded 10 stops .. Wooster senior linebacker **Tim Cline (Gambier, OH/Mt. Vernon)** led with 14 total, stops, seven solo.

**UNDEFEATED WITTENBERG FIELD HOCKEY CONTINUES TO ROLL;  
THREE TEAMS STAND ATOP MEN'S SOCCER RACE**

**October 6, 2002**

**CLEVELAND** -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

### **CROSS COUNTRY REPORT**

All of the Ohio-based teams will compete at the All-Ohio Championships on Friday, an event that is hosted annually by Ohio Wesleyan. Allegheny will run at the Carnegie Mellon Invitational on Saturday and Wabash competes at the Manchester Invitational. Earlham is idle.

Last week, the Allegheny men won the 29-team Dickinson Long/Short Course Invitational, outdistancing runner-up Widener 54 points to 106. Half of the runners on each team ran four kilometers, the other half ran eight kilometers. Senior **Dan Princic (Carrollton, OH/Carrollton)** won the 4K part of the race in 1:45.08, while **Devon Halley (Cranberry Twp., PA/Seneca Valley)** was 11<sup>th</sup> in the 8K portion. On the women's side, the Gators were second of 31 teams, led by **Leah Shouey (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)** who was third in the 4K portion (15:38.99) and **Nicole Morandi (Tewksbury, MA/Tewksbury Memorial)** who wound up sixth in the 6K that the women ran (23:44.29) ... The Earlham women placed second of seven teams while the men were third of five at their own invitational. **Emily Cleveland (Oak Ridge, TN/Oak Ridge)** was the Quakers top woman runner in sixth place (20:25), while **Andy Graham (Hiram, OH/Mogadore)** was the hosts' top male finisher in second (27:14) ... Denison won both the men's and women's races at the Earlham Invitational. **Kim Murley (Dalton, PA/Tunkhannock Area)** finished third (20:07) to lead the Big Red women, while **Brock Babcock (Platte City, MO/Platte County)** won the men's race (26:26) .. Wabash placed 20<sup>th</sup> of 22 teams in the Gold Division race at the Notre Dame Invitational. Senior **Mark Sherer (Valparaiso, IN/Valparaiso)** was the Little Giants' top finisher in 39<sup>th</sup> place of 181 .. Wittenberg was 33<sup>rd</sup> of 41 teams (26<sup>th</sup> of 37 NCAA III teams) in the men's race at the Loyola Lakefront Invitational. The women were 19<sup>th</sup> of 44 teams at the same event .. Kenyon, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster did not compete last week.

**Polls:** In the NCAA Division III Men's Cross Country Poll (Oct. 1), Allegheny was ranked 24th. In the women's poll, the Gators remain 14th, and Denison stays at 25.

### **FIELD HOCKEY REPORT**

Six NCAC games are on the slate for the coming week. Undefeated Wittenberg (7-0, 11-0) continues to roll after knocking off Earlham and Wooster in a pair of one-goal games last week. The Tigers, ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the nation in Division III, also claim the nation's leading scorer in senior **Emily Duh (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley)**, who has 34 points in 11 contests (3.09 ppg). Duh is also second in the nation in goals (14). Wittenberg's only action this week is a showdown with second-place Denison (3-1, 8-3), whose only loss in conference play was a 4-0 decision at the hands of the Tigers on Sept. 10.

The Big Red also plays at Oberlin on Wednesday. Both of Denison's scheduled NCAC contests last week were postponed due to the weather, although the squad was able to get in a 2-1 decision over Division II Slippery Rock early in the week. **Jenny Lacy (Phoenix, MD/Notre Dame Prep)** scored her third game-winning goal of the season in that contest. She is the Big Red's leading scorer. Third-place Wooster (5-2, 8-3), the defending conference champions, host both sixth-place Kenyon (1-5, 3-5) and fourth-place Oberlin (4-2, 5-3). The Lords' only action last week was a 1-0 penalty-strokes loss to DePauw on Saturday. The Yeowomen lost to the Scots, 2-1, last Tuesday, then defeated the Quakers, 2-0, later in the week. Earlham (2-6, 4-7) fell twice last week and stands in fifth place. Goalkeeper **Catherine Chow (West Hartford, CT/Hall)** who is third in the conference in saves percentage (.885), recorded 28 saves and allowed only three goals in the two games. They play at Ohio Wesleyan on Tuesday and host Kenyon on Saturday. The Bishops' only scheduled contest was rained out last week. Wittenberg goalkeeper **Jen Meyer's (Solon, OH/Hathaway Brown)** .925 saves percentage leads the NCAC and ranks in the top five in Division III.

**Polls:** in the STX/NFHCA Division III National Coaches Poll (Oct. 1), Wittenberg ranks 12<sup>th</sup>. In the NCAA Great Lakes Regional poll (Sept. 29), the Tigers are first, Denison is second and Wooster is third.

**MEN'S SOCCER REPORT**

The race for the NCAC title is as tight as could be with three teams with 3-0-1 conference marks, good for 10 points each in the standings. Wooster (11-0-2) and Earlham (5-3-3), two of the teams involved in the first-place tie, will meet in Richmond on Saturday. The same day, Denison (7-4-1), the third team involved in the tie, plays Kenyon (0-2-0/3-9-0).

The Lords and Hiram (0-2-0/1-8-1) meet on Tuesday on the Terriers' home field and both teams are looking for their first NCAC victories of 2002. Also looking to get in the win column for the first time this year are Wabash (0-3-0/5-6-0) and Wittenberg (0-3-0/2-9-1). The Little Giants host the Quakers on Wednesday, then fourth-place Allegheny (2-1-0/7-4-0) on Saturday. The Tigers' only contest this week is a home game with fifth-place Ohio Wesleyan (1-1-1/11-1-1) Saturday. The Bishops, four-time defending NCAC champions, host sixth-place Oberlin (1-1-0/7-4-1) on Tuesday. The final match of the week features Hiram at Oberlin.

**Notes:** Allegheny sophomore **Josh Johnson (Murraysville, PA/Franklin Area)** tallied a goal and an assist in the Gators' victory over Kenyon .. Denison goalkeeper **Nick Saper (Evanston, IL/Evanston Township)** got the victory in the Big Red's 2-1 victory over Wittenberg. **Jared Slater (Dublin, OH/Worthington Kilbourne)** scored the game-winning goal in that contest .. Earlham forward **Mike Mele (Greensburg, PA/Sewickley Academy)** scored three times in a pair of NCAC wins last week. The Quakers enter the week with a four-game winning streak. **Jason Seamon (Wooster, OH/Wooster)**, who ranks second in the conference in scoring (1.89 ppg), hit the back of the net twice in a 4-1 win over Hiram .. Ohio Wesleyan junior **Paul Smith (Dublin, OH/Columbus Watterson)** scored the game-winning goal against Ohio Northern and had the Bishops' score in a 1-1 overtime tie with Wooster .. Wittenberg has lost six games by one goal this season and is 1-6 overall in one-goal matches .. Wooster freshman **Brian Conaway (Twinsburg, OH/Chamberlain)** had an assist on the only goal of the game against Hiram, a 1-0 victory for the Scots, and scored the tying goal with 4:03 remaining in an overtime tie with Ohio Wesleyan.

**Poll:** In the NSCAA/adidas NCAA Division III poll (Sept. 30), Wooster ranks 11<sup>th</sup> while Ohio Wesleyan is 17<sup>th</sup>. In the Great Lakes Region, Wooster stands second, Ohio Wesleyan third and Denison is 10<sup>th</sup>.

**WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT**

The women's soccer race is almost as tight as the men's with two teams – Ohio Wesleyan (12-0-0) and Kenyon (6-5-1) - tied for first place with 3-0-0 marks and nine points each. A third, Denison (2-0-1/10-2-1) is two points off the pace while a fourth, Allegheny (2-1-0/10-3-0) is three points back.

The schedule this week features the Gators, Wittenberg (1-2-0/4-9-0) and Wooster (1-1-1/-1-3) as the hosts to Hiram (0-3-0/3-9-1), Earlham (1-3-0/2-9-0) and the Ladies, respectively, on Wednesday. Then on Saturday, the Ladies host the Gators, the Big Red host long-time rival Ohio Wesleyan, the Quakers entertain the Scots and the Oberlin (0-3-0/4-7-0) travels to Wittenberg.

Last week, Kenyon won twice, 1-0 over Oberlin and 2-0 over Wittenberg. Earlham won for the first time in conference play, a 1-0 overtime decision over Hiram. Ohio Wesleyan handed the Gators their first NCAC loss of 2002 by a 3-0 count. Denison was undefeated for the week, beating Oberlin, 1-0 and settling for a scoreless overtime tie with Wooster.

**Notes:** Allegheny's **Teresa Lettrich (Allison Park, PA/Shadyside Academy)** scored the game-winner in the Gators' non-conference, 1-0 victory over Penn State-Behrend .. Denison goalkeeper **Jess Leahy (Worthington, OH/Kilbourne)** was in goal for both of the Big Red's shutouts last week. She ranks third in the NCAC with a 0.55 goals-against average and has played every minute of every match for Denison this season .. Earlham forward **Angelique Owanga (Atlanta, GA/Northfield Mt. Hermon, MA)** scored two goals in Hiram's first victory of 2002, a 3-1 decision over Anderson .. Kenyon senior goalkeeper **Maureen Collins (Washington, DC/Georgetown)** posted her second and third straight shutouts last week to lower her goals-against average to an even 1.00 .. Oberlin goalkeeper **Alison Palmer (Charleston, SC/School for Arts)** faced 22 shots in a pair of 1-0 losses last week, made 17 saves and allowed just two goals .. **Alica Grambeau (Harbor Springs, MI/Harbor Springs)** of Ohio Wesleyan scored the winning goal in a 3-0 decision over Mt. St. Joseph and the winning goal in a 3-0 decision over Allegheny .. Senior goalkeeper **Nicole Roman (Akron, OH/Archbishop Hoban)** made six saves in a 0-0 overtime tie with Denison.

**Poll:** In the NSCAA/adidas NCAA Division III rankings, Ohio Wesleyan is ranked first and Denison stands 16<sup>th</sup>. In the Great Lakes Region, Ohio Wesleyan is on top, Denison is third, Wooster is fifth and Allegheny is sixth.

**VOLLEYBALL REPORT**

Wittenberg (5-0, 18-4) and Denison (4-0, 11-6) remain undefeated in NCAC play after the second tri-match weekend of the season. The Tigers, who host the Wittenberg National Invitational this weekend, defeated Oberlin (0-5, 1-23) and Wooster (3-2, 15-10) in straight sets last week. Wittenberg visits Ohio Wesleyan (1-4, 2-19) on Wednesday. The Big Red defeated Allegheny (2-3, 7-14) and OWU last week to maintain their share of the conference lead.

The Bishops picked up their first NCAC victory of 2002 when they knocked of Earlham (1-5, 1-20) in three games, then fell to the Gators. Hiram (5-1, 12-7) continues to be this season's surprise team and is firmly in third place in the conference standings. The Terriers defeated Earlham and Kenyon (2-3, 10-14) last week, and will host a four-team invitational next weekend. The Scots, who also defeated Oberlin (0-5, 1-23), are fourth. The Yeowomen, who lost twice in NCAC play last week, will host Allegheny on Wednesday in the only other NCAC match scheduled for the week.

**Notes:** **Vicki Kajder (Trafford, PA/Penn-Trafford)** averaged 10.92 assists per game as Allegheny won two of three matches last week, for a total of 131. She led the Gators with 17 kills and 59 assists in her team's five-set victory over Ohio Wesleyan. Kajder stands third in the conference in kills per game ..Earlham's **Teresa Batteiger (Bargersville, IN/Indianapolis Lutheran)** had 25 digs in two matches last week. She ranks fifth in the NCAC in that category .. Kenyon senior **Lauren Camp (Westerville, OH/Olentangy)** had 40 kills and 43 digs. She holds the Ladies' career mark in digs and enters the week with 1,533 ..Wooster freshman **Tiffany Rice (Canton, OH/McKinley)** totaled 30 kills against just four attack errors, and 16 digs and six total blocks in Wooster's 2-1 week.
