WABASH EARNS FIRST NORTH COAST CHAMPIONSHIP; WITTENBERG AND WOOSTER TO PLAY FOR SECOND

November 10, 2002

CLEVELAND – Wabash won its first North Coast Athletic Conference Championship in school history, in any sport, last week with its 54-7 victory over Hiram. The Little Giants won a school-record 16th consecutive victory and won its 13th consecutive NCAC game. Wabash finished the conference season 7-0, the second time in school history that a Wabash team has run the table in conference play. Wabash is 9-0 overall with one regular season game remaining - their traditional season-ending Monon Bell game with DePauw.

The Little Giants' victory two weeks ago also clinched the team its first berth into the NCAA Tournament since the 1977 Wabash team played in the Stagg Bowl. Wittenberg and Wooster may also be under consideration for an at-large berth into the Division III Tournament. Playoff matchups will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 17.

Allegheny leads all North Coast teams with eight conference championships. Wittenberg has compiled seven titles since joining the NCAC in 1989. Denison has two; Wabash joins Case Western Reserve, Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster with one championship to their name.

The NCAC standings are riddled with ties - which can all be broken this week. Wittenberg (5-1, 8-1) travels to Wooster (5-1, 8-1) on Saturday. The two teams, both coming off league wins last week, currently share second place. There is a three-way tangle at fourth place, with Ohio Wesleyan (3-3, 5-4), Allegheny (3-3, 4-5) and Earlham (3-3, 3-6) all jockeying for position. The Gators and Bishops will face off in Delaware, while the Quakers host Hiram (0-6, 0-9). Last week, Allegheny defeated Earlham, 28-7, and Ohio Wesleyan edged Oberlin, 14-13.

The Yeomen (2-4, 2-7) are tied for seventh with Denison (2-4, 2-7). Those two teams close out their season against each other in Oberlin.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Allegheny sophomore **Jamie Sye (Titusville, PA/Titusville)** and Ohio Wesleyan junior **Travis Little (Wheelersburg, OH/Wheelersburg)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances last week in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Sye, a 6-0, 205-pound tailback, scored a touchdown and averaged 12.3 yards per carry to lead the Gators past Earlham, 28-7. He carried the ball 12 times for 148 yards, with his longest effort picking up 93 yards.

Little, a 6-4, 200-pound defensive end, led the Battling Bishop defense with eight tackles, including two and one-half for a loss. He recorded one sack and one pass breakup. He made a stop on fourth and ten to end Oberlin's last offensive drive and seal the 14-13 win for OWU.

GRID NOTEBOOK:

The North Coast is one of six conferences with two teams ranked in the AFCA Division III Coaches Poll. The current edition of the poll (Nov. 5) lists Wabash ninth, up one spot from last week. Wittenberg follows in the 12th spot. Wooster, which dropped out of the poll, received votes this week ... The 2002 NCAC Championship is the fifth football conference championship for Wabash in school history. The Little Giants won Indiana Collegiate Athletic Conference titles in 1991 and 1992 and tied for the ICAC title in 1994. Wabash won the 1998 Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference football title, going 7-0 in conference play. Wabash closes out their season in the 109th Monon Bell Classic at home on Saturday. DePauw leads the series 50-49-9. Wabash has the Bell after last year's 27-20 win. The game is sold out ... Last week proved to be a difficult one for league kicking units. Against Oberlin, OWU blocked a Yeomen field goal attempt to preserve a scoreless tie in the first quarter; blocked a Yeomen extra point in the third quarter for what ended up as the difference in the score; and blocked an Oberlin punt to set up a touchdown that put the Bishops on the scoreboard. Hiram freshman linebacker **Michael Erkkila (Perry, OH/Perry)** blocked a Wabash field goal attempt and a PAT, becoming the first Terrier since **Jermain Tolbert** (vs. John Carroll on 11/8/97) to block two kicks in a game. He tied the school record for blocked kicks in a single game. As a team, Hiram blocked three Little Giant kicks. Earlham senior defensive tackle **Carl Rhinehart (Muncie, IN/Central)** blocked an Allegheny punt that teammate **Chad Berndt (Granger, IN/Mishawaka)**, a senior defensive back, picked up and ran 33 yards for the Quakers' only touchdown of the game.

WITTENBERG FIELD HOCKEY AND VOLLEYBALL EARN NCAC TITLES**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

CROSS COUNTRY REPORT

The NCAA will stage eight regional qualifying events on Saturday to narrow the men's and women's championship fields to 24 teams. The regionals are open to all Division III schools. Teams from Ohio, Indiana and Michigan will compete in the Great Lakes Regional at Ohio Northern in Ada, Ohio, while squads from Delaware, Maryland Pennsylvania and West Virginia will participate in the Mideast Regional at Salisbury in Salisbury, Maryland. The NCAA Championships will be held on November 23 at St. Olaf.

FIELD HOCKEY REPORT

Wittenberg picked up its second NCAC title of the year. After earning the 2002 North Coast Championship at the conclusion of the regular season, the Tigers swept through the inaugural NCAC Field Hockey Tournament. In the semifinals, Wittenberg held off fourth-seeded Oberlin, 4-0. The Tigers then went on to defeat tournament runner-up Wooster, 6-2 in the final. The Fighting Scots, seeded third in the four-team event, had advanced to the final courtesy of a 2-1 win over second-seeded Denison in their semifinal matchup. As North Coast Tournament Champions, Wittenberg has earned the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Div. III playoffs. First-round games are scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 13. Complete matchups and site information will be released Monday.

The champion Tigers placed four players on the all-tournament team, and produced the tournament most valuable player senior forward **Emily Duh (Hellertown, PA/saucon Valley)**. Seniors **Heather House (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)**, **Jen Meyer (Solon, OH/Hathaway Brown)** and **Rebecca Russ (Louisville, KY/Sacred Heart Academy)** and sophomore **Blair Ufer (Ann Arbor, MI/Pioneer)** round out the Tiger honorees. Runner-up Wooster had three individuals honored, juniors **Katie McCoy (Lancaster, PA/Manheim Township)** and **Julia Tryder (Lincoln, MA/Lincoln-Sudbury)** and freshman **Lindsay Tingley (Rockville, MD/Walter Johnson)**. Denison and Oberlin both placed two athletes on the all-tournament team. Sophomore **Karen Lancaster (Hurst, TX/L.D. Bell)** and freshman **Rebecca Tavares (South Burlington, VT/South Burlington)** represented the Big Red, while seniors **Briana Quinn (Franklin, NJ/Pope John XXIII)** and **Chaney Stewman (Gibsonia, Pa/Vincentian)** represented the Yeowomen.

MEN'S SOCCER REPORT

Ohio Wesleyan claimed its record fifth consecutive NCAC Championship, its 13th overall. The Bishops, seeded fourth, capped their 2002 campaign with an almost perfect run through the NCAC Men's Soccer Tournament. In the semifinals, Ohio Wesleyan tied top-seeded Wooster, 1-1, then advanced after converting three penalty kicks to the Fighting Scots' one. The Bishops then went on to defeat tournament runner-up Allegheny, 1-0 in the final. The Gators had advanced to the final after defeating Denison, 2-0, in their semifinal matchup. As North Coast Champions, the Bishops have earned the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Div. III playoffs. First-round games are scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 13. Allegheny and Wooster may also be considered for at-large tournament berths due to their successful seasons. Complete matchups and site information will be released Monday.

The champion Bishops placed four players on the all-tournament team, including tournament most valuable player senior back **Chris Vorenkamp (Brutus, MI/Petoskey)**. A quartet of juniors round out the Bishop honorees: **Joe astine (Westerville, OH/Westerville South)**, **Jeff Krigbaum (Canal Winchester, OH/Canal Winchester)**, **Adam Roberts (Worthington, OH/Wellington)** and **Paul Smith (Dublin, OH/Columbus Watterson)**. Runner-up Allegheny had a trio seniors honored: **Justin DeLeon (Centerville, OH/Archbishop Kettering Alter)**, **Adam Fletcher (LaVale, MD/Fort Hill)** and **Kyle Henry (Chicago, IL/Apex)**. Denison and Wooster both placed two athletes on the all-tournament team. Sophomores **Jared Slater (Dublin, OH/Worthington Kilbourne)** and **Steve Worthy (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair)** represented the Big Red, while senior **Andrew Lewellen (Ann Arbor, MI/Ann Arbor Pioneer)** and junior **Jon Kruse (Savannah, OH/Crestview)** represented the host Fighting Scots.

WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT

Defending NCAA Division III Champion Ohio Wesleyan claimed their fourth straight NCAC Championship, their seventh overall. The Bishops capped their undefeated 2002 regular season with a perfect run through the NCAC Women's Soccer Tournament. In the semifinals, Ohio Wesleyan defeated Denison, 4-1. While no NCAC opponent managed to score on the Bishops during the regular season, Denison was able to put one in the back of the net in the semifinals. The Bishops then used a 4-0 score to beat tournament runner-up Wooster in the final. The Fighting Scots had advanced past Allegheny on penalty kicks 3-2, after tying the Gators, 1-1, in their semifinal game. As North Coast Champions, the Bishops have earned the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Division III playoffs. Due to their strong seasons Allegheny, Denison and Wooster may also be under consideration for a berth into the playoffs. First-round games are scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 13. Complete matchups and site information will be released Monday.

SWIMMING AND DIVING REPORT

Several NCAC schools competed in dual meets last week, highlighted by a matchup between long-time rivals Kenyon and Denison at the Mike Gregory Natatorium in Granville. The Lords and Ladies prevailed in the annual grudge match between the two national powers. Kenyon won the men's meet, 122-109, and took the women's by a 137-106 score. **Elliott Rushton (Delta, BC/South Delta Secondary)** won the 500 (4:47.00) and 1000 (9:48.39) freestyles to lead the Lords. Denison junior **Jade Sobek (Billings, MT/Billings)** won the 100 freestyle (48.83) and **Alex Murry (Columbia, TN)** took the 200 breaststroke (2:16.25) for the Big Red. On the women's side, **Rachel Smith (Charles City, IA/Charles City)** won the 200 (1:56.22) and 500 (5:14.21) freestyles for Kenyon. Denison's **Jill Boo (Ramsey, MN/Anoka)** won the 200 butterfly (2:10.72), and freshman **Lauren Clark (Corvallis, OR/Crescent Valley)** took both the 200 individual medley (2:10.91) and 200 breaststroke (2:26.99) ... Kenyon also knocked off Wittenberg in dual meets last week. **Christopher Kliner (Los Angeles, CA/Harvard-Westlake)** won the 1000 free (11:03.19) and the 200 backstroke (2:10.09) to lead the Lords over the Tigers. The Lords won 146-105, while the Ladies took a 154-143 decision. **Danielle Korman (Niskayuna, NY/Niskayuna)** led the Ladies with victories in the 200 fly (2:18.33) and 100 fly (1:01.98) ... Hiram defeated Ohio Northern in men's swimming, 138-99, but lost the women's meet, 151.5-84.5. Sophomore **Zach Huggins (Ashtabula, OH/St. John & St. Paul)** won the 200 IM (2:20.32) and the 100 free (55.62) and was a member of the 200 medley relay team that broke the 34-year-old Alumni Pool mark by more than three seconds. Freshman **Scott Wolfe (Barberton, OH/Western Reserve Academy)** won both the 100 fly (1:03.13) and the 400 free (4:31.31). Seniors **Mario Halbert (Cleveland, OH/John Hay)** and **Shannon Szczepinski (Mantua, OH/Crestwood)** won both the one- and three-meter diving events for the men and women, respectively ... Oberlin's men defeated Baldwin-Wallace, 135-102 but lost the women's competition, 135-82. The Yeomen won eight events. Oberlin also defeated Ohio Wesleyan in men's swimming last week, 112-95. The women's meet was won by the Bishops, 106-91. Ohio Wesleyan senior **Joe Cellar (Powell, OH/Olentangy)** and freshman **Alan Rill (Dublin, OH/Hilliard Davidson)** won two events each. Cellar took the 50 (22.49) and 100 (50.17) freestyles, while Rill claimed both diving events. Cellar won the same two events to lead the Bishops past Wilmington, 76-24, but fell short of Wittenberg, 61-42, in a double-dual meet. Six different women won events for Ohio Wesleyan in the Oberlin meet. Sophomore **Ashley Brant (Meriden, CT/Platt)** won the 100 freestyle (55.96) as the Bishop women defeated Wilmington, 74-21, and lost to Wittenberg, 83-28. The Tigers swept both double duals, defeating Wilmington, 76-18 on the men's side and taking a 92-19 decision in the women's ... Wabash defeated Transylvania, 150-128 for their second dual-meet victory of the young season. Junior **Brett Findley (Bargersville, IN/Franklin Community)** came from behind in the final 100 meters to win the 500-meter freestyle (5:08.32) to lead the Little Giants. The meet, though, was not decided until Wabash finished first and third in the final event, the 200-yard freestyle relay.

VOLLEYBALL REPORT

Top-seeded Wittenberg successfully defended its North Coast Championship and earned an automatic bid to the NCAA III Championship with a 30-25, 30-13, 30-19 decision over Denison in the NCAC Volleyball Tournament Championship match. The Tigers claimed their sixth straight NCAC crown and ninth overall by sweeping past Earlham, Hiram and the Big Red without dropping a set. Tournament most valuable player, sophomore outside hitter, **Monica McDonald (Newark, OH/Catholic)**, was dominant at the net, recording 17 kills in the championship final to show the way for the Tigers. Joining her on the all-tournament team were two teammates, senior **Tiffany Keller (Masilon, OH/Tuslaw)** and sophomore **Sarah Yuskewich (Columbus, OH/Watsonson)**. The Big Red placed two seniors on the all-tournament team: **Regann Goodwinn (Gahanna, OH/St. Michael's Academy)** and **Danielle d'Orazio (Saddle River, NJ/Immaculate Heart)**. Allegheny senior **Vicki Kajder (Trafford, PA/Penn-Trafford)** and Hiram junior **Charity Norman (Port Washington, OH/Indian Valley)** rounded out the squad.

Wittenberg, ranked third in the nation by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (Nov. 6), will learn their opponent in the NCAA tournament Sunday night. Complete matchups and site information will be released Monday. The Tigers have made seven NCAA Tournament appearances in the past nine seasons.

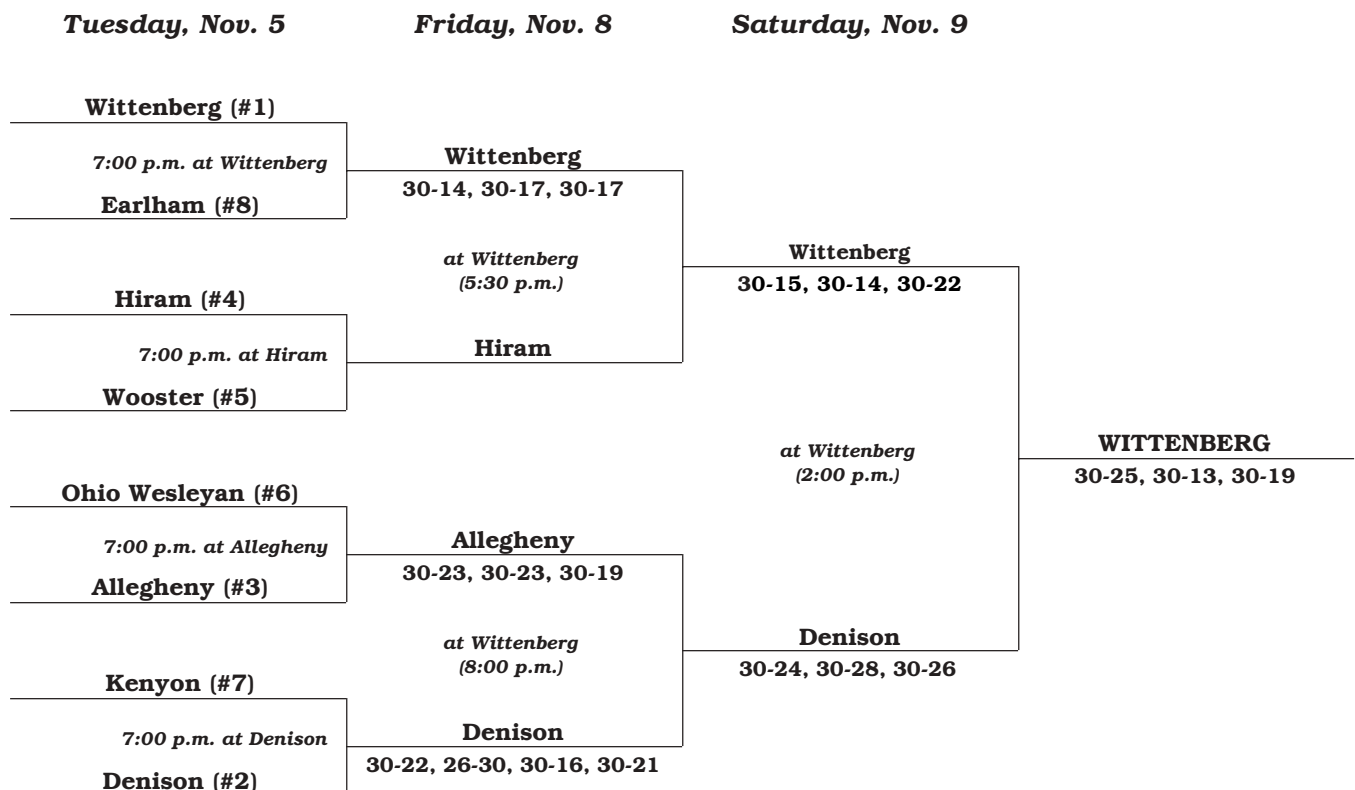
WOMEN'S SOCCER
