WOOSTER ROLLS TO 10-0;

February 2, 2003

THREE WEEKS REMAIN IN REGULAR SEASON

CLEVELAND -- Three weeks of the North Coast schedule remain; A playoff spot is at stake each and every time two teams tipoff. The action starts Wednesday, with a full slate of five games. First-place Wooster (10-0, 18-1), winner of eight straight NCAC contests and nine overall, travels to Allegheny (5-5, 9-10). The Gators, who are coming off a 66-63 win over second-place Wittenberg, are currently tied with Earlham for fifth place. The Quakers (5-5, 10-9) host third-place Wabash (7-3, 13-5). Allegheny and Earlham would like to elevate themselves into the fourth-place standing, as the top four teams at the end of the regular season get to host a tournament quarterfinal contest. Currently, Ohio Wesleyan (6-4, 10-9) sits in fourth. The Bishops will travel to Wittenberg to open the week. Like the Tigers, Ohio Wesleyan is also looking to rebound from a loss; The Bishops dropped an 81-79 loss to Hiram last week. The Fighting Scots seem to have the top seed in the season-ending league tournament locked up. But as last week's results show, anything can happen.

The Terriers (4-6, 6-13) are tied with Denison (4-6, 6-12) for seventh. The two teams will meet in Hiram on Wednesday. On January 15, the Big Red edged Hiram, 75-74 in Granville. Both teams look to earn a tournament berth, and a win would solidify their prospects. Oberlin (0-10, 1-18) heads to Kenyon (1-9, 1-17) in Wednesday's final game.

Five games are slated for Saturday. Allegheny is at Kenyon and Earlham is at Denison. Oberlin, Hiram and Wabash entertain Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster, respectively. Scores, stats and standings will be updated on Thursday at www.northcoast.org.

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's winter sports action.

Swimming & Diving Report:

ALLEGHENY lost both ends of a meet with Clarion. **Andrew Reilly (Meadville, PA/Meadville)** and **Robert Clark (Corpus Christi, TX/Richard King)** led the men in their 141-79 loss. Reilly finished second in the 100 free (52.13) and was third in the 200 free (1:56.30). Clark won the 500 free (5:39.79) and was third in the 1000 free. The Gator women lost, 143-91. **Amy Clements (Sterling Hts., MI/Henry Ford)** and **Carolyn Roncolato (Meadville, PA/Meadville)** finished first and second in the 500 free with times of 5:38.69 and 5:42.53, respectively.

DENISON'S men and women defeated Ashland in the teams' final dual meets of the season. In a 124-66 decision, the women were led by **Lauren Clark (Cravallis, OR/Crescent Valley)** who won two events – the 200 individual medley and the 500 free – and was part of the winning 200 medley relay. **Sara Peck (Palo Alto, CA/Henry Gunn)** and **Chrissy Havach (Cleveland Hts., OH/Beaumont)** were also members of that winning 200 medley relay and took individual honors in the 100 free and the 50 free (25.10), respectively. **Ben Douglass (Marietta, OH/Marietta)**, and **Jade Sobek (Billings, MT/Billings)** each won two individual events and were part of winning relay teams. Douglass took the 200 breaststroke and 200 IM and was part of the victorious 200 medley relay, while Sobek finished first in the 50 and 100 freestyles and swam a leg of the winning 400 free relay.

HIRAM'S men defeated Washington and Jefferson, 62-50, but lost to Westminster, 68-40, in a double dual meet. Senior **Mario Halbert (Cleveland, OH/John Hay)** won both diving events against W&J. The women lost to both schools, dropping a 85-28 decision to W&J and losing 78-27 to Westminster. Freshman **Beth Groselle (Hiram, OH/Crestwood)** set a school record in the 100 backstroke (1:07.49) and an Alumni Memorial Pool record in the 100 breast (1:15.54).

KENYON and **WOOSTER** faced off in a dual meet last weekend. Kenyon won the men's meet, 125-90. Freshman **Travis Brennon (Chino Valley, AZ/Chino Valley)** won the 1000 free (10:19.95) and the 200 breast (2:11.10) for the Lords. Teammate **Gabriel Rodrigues (Sao Paulo, Brazil/Craig)** swept the backstroke events, recording a 57.06 clocking in the 100 back and a time of 2:02.75 in the 200 back. Freshman **Joe Silvestri (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** won the 500 free (5:16.78) and classmate **Todd Koenig (Perrysburgh, OH/St. Francis de Sales)** won the one-meter diving (190.2 points) for the Scots. Kenyon took the women's meet as well, winning 189-98. Double winners for the Ladies were freshman **Rachel Smith (Charles City, IA/Charles City)**, who won the 1000 free (10:40.59) and the 500 free (5:13.01), **Ashley Rowatt (Louisville, KY/duPont)** in the 200 fly (2:11.49) and 200 IM (2:15.67) and **Jennie Miller (Duxbury, MA/Duxbury)** in both backstroke events, with times of 1:02.42 in the 100 back and 2:13.58 in the 200. Wooster junior **Kayla Heising (Wauseon, OH/Wauseon)** won the 50 free with a pool record and NCAA qualifying time of 23.79.

WITTENBERG freshman **Becca Searcy (Shelbyville, KY/Shelby County Bloomington)** met an NCAA "B" cut for the fourth time this season when she qualified in the 500 free. She set the mark in the Tigers' 168-132 loss to Case Western Reserve.

Indoor Track & Field Report:

Two **ALLEGHENY** seniors competed at the Penn State National Open. **Dan Princic (Carrolton, OH/Carrolton)** set a school record in the 5000 meters (14:46.11) with his ninth-place finish in the Division I field. **Jeremy Scott (Norfolk, VA/Norfolk)** won the pole vault at the meet. He cleared 18 feet, 3/4 inches to win by 10 inches. At the NCAC Relays, junior **Ryan Barnes (Erie, PA/Cathedral)** set a school record in the 55 meter hurdles (8.05) to lead the Gators to victory in that event. The Gator women eclipsed the school record in the distance medley relay by almost three seconds, finishing second with a time of 12:35.38 at the NCAC Relays. Allegheny had individuals finish first in three of the four jumping events – the pole vault (**Jennifer Surace - Bethel Park, PA/Bethel Park**), high jump (**Lindsey Hayes - Little Silver, NJ/Red Bank Reg.**) and long jump (**Amanda Grilli - Washington, PA/Trinity**).

EARLHAM junior **Carmen Batts-Porter (Indianapolis, IN/Cardinal Ritter)** broke her own school mark in the shot put with a toss of 39 feet, four inches, to help Earlham win the relay and place second individually. Sophomore **Tim Herrod (Gary, IN/Roosevelt)** broke his own school mark in the 55 meter hurdles with an 8.03 clocking. He had the best time individually in the event.

HIRAM'S women scored 21 points in the meet, their highest total in four appearances. Senior **Emma Brown (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** finished second individually in both the high jump (5 feet even) and 55 meter hurdles (9.13). The Terrier men placed seventh, their best in four tries, with a school-best 29 points.

WABASH senior **Peter DeYoung (Evansville, IN/Bosse)** had the top individual performance in the high jump (6 feet, 4 inches) and was second-best in the triple jump (42 feet, 10 inches).

WOOSTER junior **Keith Vance (Mt. Vernon, OH/Mt. Vernon)** set a school record in the shot put for the second straight week, this time with a toss of 50 feet, 2 1/2 inches. He finished first in the event individually and led the Scots to victory in the relay.
