**DENISON SOFTBALL MOVES INTO FIRST PLACE ;
TWO WEEKS LEFT IN TENNIS REGULAR SEASON**

BASEBALL REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 8-9 Canton, OH

Wooster (6-0, 17-8) added to its East Division win streak with a four-game sweep of fourth-place Oberlin (2-6, 6-12) last week. The Fighting Scots travel to fifth-place Kenyon (2-8, 8-17) on Friday and Saturday. Second-place Allegheny (5-1, 15-7-1) also travels this week. The Gators, returning to NCAC action after a stretch of non-league play, head west to Oberlin, also on Friday and Saturday. Hiram (5-5, 14-13), currently in third place, has two non-conference contests slated for this week. The Terriers break from divisional play after taking four straight games from Kenyon last week.

Denison (8-4, 20-9) has jumped to the top of the standings in the West Division after winning three of four games against third-place Wabash (6-6, 16-14) last week. The Big Red will try to continue their winning ways at home against fourth-place Wittenberg (3-5, 14-13-1) on Thursday and Saturday. The Tigers alternated wins with Earlham last week. Second-place Ohio Wesleyan (5-3, 15-12) resumes divisional play at fifth-place Earlham (2-6, 8-15-1) on Friday and Saturday. Wabash has non-conference games lined up for this week.

Notes: Conference divisional series, usually scheduled for Saturday and Sunday have been moved this week to accommodate the Easter holiday. In the latest ABCA/Collegiate Baseball Div. III poll, Wooster is ranked 24th out of 30. The Scots lead NCAC teams in Mideast Region rankings in the fourth spot. Denison is seventh and Allegheny is one of three teams in eighth ... Allegheny senior **Jesse MacPherson (Hemlock, NY/Livonia)** allowed just one earned run over six innings of work against Point Park to run his season record to 4-1. He allowed five hits and struck out six batters in the 8-1 win. Junior **Brendon Porter, (Pittsburgh, PA/Franklin Regional)** hit .556 and had a 1.444 slugging percentage with two homers and two doubles while going 5-9 from the plate. The infielder had five RBI and took four walks as the Gators went 3-0 in non-conference action. He had two home runs and four RBI in a 9-6 win over John Carroll and was perfect in the field in 27 chances ... Denison junior **Adam Mandel (St. Louis, MO/MICDS)** hit .524 for the week, going 11-21 at the plate while scoring 11 runs to lead the Big Red to five victories. Mandel also drove in eight RBI and had four doubles and two triples. His was the first five-hit game for a Denison player since **Alex Nikolich** accomplished the feat in 2001. For the season, Mandel leads Denison with a .429 batting average and has started all 29 games. Junior shortstop **Brian Regan (Cincinnati, OH/Anderson)** tied the Denison single-season home run record with his ninth blast of the season against Wabash on Saturday ... Earlham freshman **Derreck Parkevich (Logansport, IN/Logansport)** threw three innings, earning the extra-inning win at Wittenberg on Saturday and one inning to earn a save against the Tigers on Sunday. He allowed only one run in four innings and didn't allow Wittenberg to score in the 7th and 8th innings on Saturday. He also went 2-4 from the plate on Saturday ... Hiram junior outfielder **Joe Marzano (Youngstown, OH/Cardinal Mooney)** homered in all four of the Terriers' games against Kenyon, giving him 10 for the season. He has tied **Joe Lisko's** 2000 school single-season record. Overall, Marzano was 9-15 (.600) at the plate with seven RBI and nine runs scored ... Kenyon senior **Josh Pike (Orleans, MA/St. Mary's)** was 6-14 (.429) in four games against Hiram with a double and three runs scored ... Ohio Wesleyan senior outfielder **Joe Loudenslager (Hilliard, OH/Darby)** was 6-11 (545) with three runs scored against Ohio University. In five games last week, he was 10-20 (.500) with five RBI, three homers and two doubles. He scored seven runs. Junior third baseman **Tyler Mott (Grove City, OH/Grove City)** was 7-17 (.412) with eight RBI, two home runs and a double and a triple ... Wabash senior lefty **Jake Martin (Rushville, IN/Rushville)** won his fourth game of the season with a 6-2 win over Denison on Sunday. The senior scattered three hits and three walks while striking out four to move to 4-0 for the year. He earned his third complete game victory of the season against Denison, giving the Little Giants their only victory in the four-game weekend series. In addition to his efforts on the mound, Martin hit .471 for the week, going 8-17 with an RBI and two runs scored ... Wittenberg senior **Brian Robinson (Columbus, OH/Centennial)** hurled a complete-game, four-hitter to earn a 3-0 win over Earlham on Sunday. In seven innings he faced 28 batters, striking out five and walking four ... Wooster junior right-hander **Justin Alaburda (Medina, OH/Walsh Jesuit)** pitched the first complete-game shutout of his career in game one of the Oberlin series. Over seven innings, he allowed four hits and three walks, while striking out eight. Alaburda also pitched one inning of scoreless relief, which included another strikeout, in the Baldwin-Wallace win. Sophomore third baseman **Jake Frank (Wooster, OH/Northwestern)** went 10-20 (.500) on the week with five extra base hits - three doubles, one triple, and one home run - while driving in 12 runs. He also scored six times, reached base via three walks, and stole a base. Highlighting his week, Frank hit his first career grand slam in the third game of the Oberlin series.

GOLF REPORT **NCAC Championship: May 2-3 Oberlin**

Wooster's Parlor Restaurant Invitational, to be held Friday and Saturday at the Wooster Country Club, will feature six of the nine conference golf squads. North Coast schools expected to participate are Denison, Hiram, Kenyon, Oberlin, Wittenberg and the host Scots. Ohio Wesleyan was the top NCAC finisher at last spring's event, finishing second - one stroke behind Otterbein. Wabash will travel to the Millikin Big Blue Classic, to be held at Hickory Point Golf Course in Decatur, IL on Friday and Saturday. Allegheny and Ohio Wesleyan are both idle this week. Both squads return to action in two weeks, April 26-27. The Gators will host the Griffin Motors Classic, while the Bishops will host the Strimer Invitational at Oakhaven Golf Course.

Notes: The latest GCAA Precept Division III Coaches' Poll (Apr. 9) ranks Ohio Wesleyan eighth, down two spots from last week. The Bishops received one first-place vote. Denison is tabbed 22, up three spots from last week. Allegheny dropped from the poll, missing the cut by a narrow margin. Wooster also received votes ... One week after finishing in second-place, the Wooster Scots one-upped themselves by winning the Denison Spring Invitational at Granville Golf Club. The win marks Wooster's first since claiming the 1998 Strimer Invitational at Ohio Wesleyan. The Scots (612) finished five strokes ahead of co-runner-ups Denison and Muskingum (617). Ohio Wesleyan finished fourth (619), led by **Chad Poling (Delaware, OH/Hayes)**. The junior shot identical rounds of 72 to claim medalist honors. Wittenberg (639) ended the weekend in 10th, followed by Kenyon (656) in 12th ... Oberlin finished second at the four-team Hiram Spring Invitational last week. The Yeomen shot 367-372 = 739 at the two-day event, held at Sugar Bush Golf Club in Garrettsville. The host Terriers finished fourth (750). Oberlin and Hiram were led by **G.R. Yorke** and junior **Eric Dietz (Kent, OH/Roosevelt)**, respectively. The pair tied for third ... Wabash finished 14th out of 24 teams at the Illinois Wesleyan Invitational, held at the Ironwood Golf Course in Normal, IL. The Little Giants fired 316-326 to finish with a two-day total of 647. The tournament host, Illinois Wesleyan, won the event with a two-round total of 592 strokes.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT **NCAC Championship: Regular Season Play**

Two North Coast Athletic Conference games are on the slate this week and both involve Ohio Wesleyan (3-0, 6-2). Tuesday, the Bishops travel to Springfield to play a match with Wittenberg (1-3, 4-5) that had been postponed due to weather earlier this season. The next day, Ohio Wesleyan hosts Oberlin (0-3, 3-5). If the Bishops win both contests, they will clinch their 13th NCAC Championship in 19 years. Six non-conference matches are also scheduled for the coming week.

Notes: The latest STX/USILA poll (Apr. 14) ranked Ohio Wesleyan 18th, down four from the previous week. Denison appeared on the poll for the first time at 20th ... Sophomore attackman **Craig Pastor (Columbus, OH/Upper Arlington)** scored a career-high seven goals and added an assist as Denison toppled rival OWU 16-12 in a non-conference match last weekend. He leads the Big Red with 19 goals and nine assists (3.11 points per game) which ranks seventh in the NCAC ... Kenyon won twice last week, including a conference match with Wittenberg. Senior **Justin Hamilton (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** had eight points in the two games on five goals and three assists. On the year, he averages 3.22 points per game, fifth-best in the conference ... Ohio Wesleyan defeated Wooster for its third conference victory of the season. Senior **Andy Rowe (Alpharetta, GA/Penfield, NY)** contributed six goals and two assists in the Bishops' 1-1 week ... Freshman goalie **Courter Shimeall (Worthington, OH/Thomas Worthington)** made 27 saves as the Scots went 1-1 last week. He made 21 stops in the loss to OWU, including 14 in the first half alone, keeping the game tied 2-2 at the half.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT **NCAC Championship: May 2-3 Wooster**

Six conference games are slated for the coming week. Denison (2-0, 6-4), which shares the NCAC lead with Kenyon (3-0, 6-1) and defending champion Wooster (2-0, 6-1), travels to Earlham (0-3, 1-4) today for a rescheduled contest, then hosts the Scots on Saturday. Before playing the Big Red, Wooster hosts Kenyon on Tuesday and Wittenberg (2-2, 3-5) Thursday. Oberlin (0-3, 0-7) is involved in both of the remaining two conference games this week. The Yeowomen travel to Ohio Wesleyan (2-2, 5-6) Thursday then host Earlham on Saturday.

Last week, Denison won its first two NCAC games of the year to keep pace with Kenyon and Wooster, both of whom won once last week. Someone is sure to fall out of the unbeaten ranks as these three squads square off against one another beginning this week.

Notes: Senior attack **Leslie Masterpaul (Cleveland Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)** led the Big Red with nine goals and two assists in the two conference victories. She is the team's leader with 26 goals and 34 points through 10 games this season, which ranks ninth in the conference scoring race ... Earlham sophomore **Brooke Sachs (Houston, TX/Bellaire)** recorded her second hat trick of the season in a loss to Kenyon. Freshmen **Weronika Kowalczyk (Cleveland, OH/Cleveland Hts.)** and **Kaley Bell (Pennington, NJ/Hopewell Valley Central)** each scored five goals for the Ladies. Kowalczyk has eight goals in the past two games ... Oberlin goalkeeper **Sarah Pilzer (Takoma Park, MD)** made 33 saves in her team's loss to Denison ... Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Liz Stockdale (Beaver, PA/Mercersburg Academy)** scored the game-winning goal with 2:17 left to give the Bishops a 14-13 victory over Allegheny. She totaled a team-best three goals and two assists in the game. Stockdale added another goal in her team's loss to Wooster earlier in the week. TV fans: she will be appearing on an episode of *The Price Is Right* later this summer ... Wittenberg had a 2-1 week. Sophomore **Jenny Burns (Dublin, OH/Coffman)** led the way with

11 goals, three assists, four ground balls, four forced turnovers and six draw contols in the three games ... Wooster won twice last week behind senior midfielder **Beth Hemminger (Annapolis, MD/Senior)**. She combined for 19 points on 10 goals and nine assists in two games. She tied a school record with 12 points in a 20-9 decision over Alfred, and set a school mark with seven assists in that game. She became Wooster's all-time leading scorer, with 253 points on 136 goals and 117 assists. Hemminger entered the season as the NCAC's all-time assists leader and now ranks second all-time in points.

SOFTBALL REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 2-3 at High Seed

Defending champion Denison (6-0, 14-14) moved into sole possession of first place after sweeping two conference doubleheaders last week. The Big Red won twice against fifth-place Kenyon (3-3, 7-16) and against fourth-place Allegheny ((4-3-1, 9-15-1). Senior catcher **Lindsey Fischer (Gahanna, OH/Gahanna)** led Denison with a .455 average through the four games. She was 5-11 with three doubles and four runs batted in. In the second game of the twinbill against the Gators, Fischer went 2-3 with one RBI and scored the game's winning run in the bottom of the seventh inning. The Big Red can strengthen their hold on first place with wins this week. Denison plays at second-place Wittenberg (7-1, 16-12) on Thursday and hosts sixth-place Wooster (1-4-1, 10-15-1) on Saturday. Wooster opens its week on Wednesday, welcoming Oberlin (0-6, 4-11).

Also on Wednesday Kenyon travels to third-place Ohio Wesleyan (5-3, 14-13) The Ladies travel to Allegheny on Saturday. Oberlin heads to Hiram (1-7, 5-19) on Friday.

Notes: Allegheny junior **Tracie Gaydos (Sarvar, PA/Freeport)** went 2-1 with a 1.84 earned run average in three games for the Gators, including her first no-hitter of the season against Penn State-Behrend. Gaydos allowed nine hits and five earned runs while striking out eight in 19.0 innings. Opponents hits just .134 off of her. Junior **Jessica Monti (Pittsburgh, Pa./Upper St. Clair)** hit .421 and had three doubles and four runs scored as Allegheny went 4-2 last week. She had one RBI and a .579 slugging percentage. Monti did not make an error in the field in 41 chances ... Denison sophomore third baseman **Gina Villegas (Tuscon, AZ/Pueblo)** went 4-11 (.364) on the week and drove in the winning run against Allegheny in the bottom of the seventh inning with a single that scored Fischer. **Erin McClincy (Hilliard, OH/Darby)** went 2-0 this week and allowed just two earned runs in 14.0 innings pitched for the Big Red. She struck out eight batters while holding Kenyon and Allegheny hitters to a .185 batting average ... Hiram sophomore third baseman **Anna Feliciano (Watkins Glen, NY/Odessa-Montour Central)** batted .400 (4-10) in four games last week with a double and a run scored. Sophomore **Jen Melfi (Girard, OH/Girard)** threw her 17th complete game of the season against Wittenberg, moving within one of the Terriers' single-season record. The mark is currently shared by **Mandi Wieclaw** (2000) and **Sarah Kidd** (1999). Melfi has also hurled 112.2 innings this season, the fifth most in Hiram history for a single season. Her 48 strikeouts are the fourth most in a season ... Kenyon senior **Samantha Foy (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** is second in the NCAC in strikeouts with 63 over 105.0 innings pitched. She added to her total by fanning six Denison batters last week. In 12.0 innings of work, Foy allowed six runs, two earned, and 12 hits. Senior catcher **Leslie Carroll (Bloomington, MN/Thomas Jefferson)** went 3-6 (.500) in the doubleheader against Denison with a double, two singles and one run scored ... Ohio Wesleyan freshman shortstop **Tiffany Stinemetz (Marysville, OH/ North Union)** drove in five runs and senior righthander **Emily Thornton (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** and sophomore righthander **Janelle Thompson (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** turned in dominating pitching performances to lead the Bishops to a sweep of both Oberlin and Wooster last week. In the opener against Oberlin, the Bishops scored five runs in the first and tied a school record with seven runs in the second. Eight of the nine starting batters in the Bishops' lineup drove in runs. Ohio Wesleyan's 12 runs in the game set a school record, as did the Bishops' 17 hits, 21 total bases and 10 runs batted in. For the week, Stinemetz, who owns OWU season records for hits (34) and RBI (20), was 7-12 (.583) with eight RBI and two doubles, including the gamewinner in the first game against Wooster. Freshman third baseman **Amy Mazur (Elyria, OH/Elyria)** extended her school-record hitting streak to 15 games after hitting safely last weekend. Over the course of the streak, she is hitting .524 (22-42). She was 8-10 (.800) last week with two RBI and five runs scored. Thornton picked up a win at Oberlin with 3.0 innings of hitless pitching. Against Wooster, she had a no-hitter into the fifth inning of the opening game, before allowing three hits. In the second game against the Scots, she pitched the final 1.2 innings to seal the win, but did not qualify for the save. Thompson pitched a complete game two-hitter against Oberlin and picked up a win against Wooster. Ohio Wesleyan's sweep of Wooster set a new Bishops' record for wins in a season (14) ... Wittenberg recorded three shutouts last week - two were tossed by sophomore **Jen Fleming (Dayton, OH/Chaminade-Julienne)**. She opened her week with a complete-game two-hitter against Wooster and followed with a complete-game five-hitter against Hiram. She struck out five batters on the week.

NCAC Championship: April 25-27 Denison

Four East division matches are slated for this week. Action begins on Thursday, when Hiram (0-3,4-8) and Oberlin (1-1, 10-9) travel to Wooster (2-0, 7-8) and Kenyon (1-0, 10-3), respectively. The Fighting Scots and Lords are tied for first place entering the second last week of the regular season. Kenyon hosts Allegheny (1-1,5-13) on Friday. Notes: The North Coast Athletic Conference Tennis Championships will be held the weekend of April 25-27 at Denison ... Last week, Kenyon won three times to win the GLCA Tournament. The Lords defeated Wooster (5-1), DePauw (5-2) and Kalamazoo (4-3). Sophomore **Borko Tesic (Amherst, OH/Elyria Catholic)** was 3-0 at number three singles and was 2-1 at number two doubles with sophomore partner **Josh Mabra (Springfield, OH/Springfield Catholic)**. Ohio Wesleyan and Oberlin each went 1-1 at the event. The Bishops defeated Wabash, 6-1, and lost to DePauw, 7-0. Oberlin topped Albion, 4-3, and lost to Kalamazoo, 6-1. Junior **Jamie Frankel (West Bloomfield, MI/Bloomfield Hills-Andover)** led the Yeomen with wins against Albion and Kalamazoo at number one singles. Denison's **Patrick Bouchard (Naples, FL/Naples)** went 3-0 in singles play and was 2-1 at number one doubles with partner **Chris Compton (Cincinnati, OH/Indian Hills)**.

NCAC Championship: April 25-27 Denison

Tennis season is drawing to a close as all but one of the remaining NCAC regular-season matches are slated for this week. The North Coast Athletic Conference Tennis Championships will be held the weekend of April 25-27 at Denison. The Big Red (2-0, 8-4) and Kenyon (1-0, 6-6) are both undefeated in conference play. The two squads face off on Tuesday in Granville. The Ladies also host Oberlin (4-1, 13-7) and Allegheny (1-2, 6-11) this week, and have a makeup match with Ohio Wesleyan (2-3, 4-6) that hasn't yet been rescheduled. Denison's final regular-season NCAC match will be April 22 at Oberlin. Wooster (1-3, 2-9) and Hiram (0-3, 1-7) are slated to face one another on Tuesday. It is the Terriers' last chance to earn a spot in the NCAC tournament. The Gators and the Yeowomen meet in Oberlin on Saturday to round out the week's slate. Wittenberg (4-1, 7-7) and Earlham (1-3, 8-6) have already completed the regular season portion of the NCAC schedule.

Notes: Hiram picked up its first victory of the 2003 campaign with a 8-1 decision over Notre Dame of Ohio. The Terriers won five of six singles matches and all three doubles ... Kenyon's top singles player **Christina Reimers (Mt. Vernon, OH)** defeated the second-ranked player in the region last week, Washington's (Mo.) **Jenny Stein**, 5-7, 6-4, 6-4 ... Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Jess Amlin (Tipp City, OH/Tippecanoe)** accounted for both of the Bishops' points in a 7-2 loss to Wittenberg. She won at third singles and second doubles with partner **Katie Kneas (Kalamazoo, MI/Loy Norrix)**.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 2-3 Ohio Wesleyan

In the coming week, Allegheny will travel to the Slippery Rock Invitational. Denison, Hiram, Kenyon, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster will be at the All-Ohio Championships (hosted by Otterbein on Friday and Ohio Wesleyan on Saturday). Earlham hosts its own invitational and will have Wittenberg among the participants. Wabash will run at the Taylor Invitational. The NCAC Championships begin the following weekend, April 26-27 with the Combined Events Championship at Wittenberg. The decathlon and heptathlon will be contested. Ohio Wesleyan will host the 19th NCAC Championships on May 2-3.

Last week, Allegheny competed in the non-scored Bison Outdoor Classic at Bucknell and the unscored Mount Union Invitational. At Mount Union, senior **Jen Surace (Bethel Park, PA/Bethel Park)** placed second in the women's pole vault (10-6), while classmate **Tiffany Bennett (Russell, PA/Eisenhower)** was runner-up in the javelin (126-1) ... Four NCAC schools competed at Ohio Wesleyan's Marv Frye Invitational. On the women's side Denison placed third, followed by Ohio Wesleyan in fifth, Kenyon in seventh and Wooster, eighth. Juniors **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** and **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** were double winners for the Big Red. Finkes remained undefeated in two events this season as she took the discus (143-3) and shot put (42-2 1/2), both with NCAA provisional qualifying distances. Berner won the 100 meters (12.36) and 200 meters (25.50), and was part of the winning 4x100 meter relay. She met the NCAA provisional standard in the 100. Junior **Julie Hufnagel (Ann Arbor, MI/Marian)** took the 1500 meters (4:47.44) for Denison. Kenyon freshman **Katie Walker (Columbus, OH/Academy)** won the long jump (17 feet even) and Ohio Wesleyan junior **Akeya Terrell (Gahanna, OH/Westerville North)** met the NCAA provisional standard (57.21) in the 400 meters as she won the event. The top team finisher on the men's side was Ohio Wesleyan in eighth. Denison was 10th, Wooster finished 11th and Kenyon was 15th. Denison junior **Andy Stromwall (Waukesha, WI/Waukesha South)** was the only event winner from an NCAC school. He won the triple jump (44-2 1/4) ... Hiram competed at the unscored Mount Union meet. Senior **Emma Brown (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** placed in the high jump (tied for third, 5-2), set a school record in the 100 hurdles (fourth, 15.78) and placed in the long jump (7th, 16-5) ... Wabash senior **Peter DeYoung (Evansville, IN/Bosse)** won the high jump and was fourth in the triple jump at the 98th Annual Indiana Little State Track And Field Championships. He was named Men's Outstanding Field Performer as the Little Giants placed 11th of 19 teams. He cleared 6 feet, 8 inches which meets the NCAA provisional qualifying standard ... Wittenberg hosted the Tiger Twilight Invitational, a non-scored meet. Senior **Amanda Young (London, OH/London)** won the women's high jump (1.59 meters/5-2 3/4) and junior **Kristen Mumper (Cincinnati, OH/Purcell Marian)** won the women's triple jump (11.01 meters/36-1 1/2). Leading the Tiger men were junior **Skip Ivery (Columbus, OH/Groveport Madison)** who won 100 meters (11.15) and the 110 hurdles (14.65). Freshman **Jared Glover (Middletown, OH/Middletown)** claimed first place in the 200 meters (23.03).

NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (Apr. 14)

BASEBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Allegheny junior **Brendon Porter, (Pittsburgh, PA/Franklin Regional)** hit .556 and had a 1.444 slugging percentage with two homers and two doubles while going 5-9 from the plate. The infielder had five RBI and took four walks as the Gators went 3-0 in non-conference action. He had two home runs and four RBI in a 9-6 win over John Carroll and was perfect in the field in 27 chances. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Denison junior **Cam Cowden (Zionsville, IN/Zionsville)** pitched 11 scoreless innings last week and went 2-0, running his season record to 5-2 with wins over Oberlin and Wabash. In two starts Cowden allowed just one run on 10 hits. He struck out 16 and improved his season ERA to 2.52.
