OHIO WESLEYAN WINS 13TH NCAC MEN'S LACROSSE CHAMPIONSHIP

BASEBALL REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 8-9 Canton, OH

Wooster (9-1, 20-11) remains in first place in the East after winning three of four games against Kenyon last week. However, the Fighting Scots have company in the top spot, as Allegheny (9-1, 19-9-1) moved into a tie for first after its four-game sweep of Oberlin. Both Wooster and Allegheny have completed two NCAC divisional series. The two teams meet on Saturday and Sunday in Wooster. Each team also has two conference games left from series postponed due to weather earlier this year. The Scots play a doubleheader at third-place Hiram Tuesday, while the Gators have yet to schedule a twinbill against fourth-place Kenyon. Hiram (5-5, 15-14) travels to nearby rival, fifth-place Oberlin (2-10, 8-16) this weekend. The Terriers did not have any divisional competition last week. Kenyon entered last week in fifth place in the division, but jumped to fourth courtesy of a win over Wooster. The Lords will complete their NCAC schedule when they play their makeup games with Allegheny. Oberlin will complete its regular season conference schedule at the conclusion of the Hiram series. Allegheny, Wooster, and Hiram each have six games remaining. Those six games will determine which two East teams will advance to the NCAC Tournament.

Denison (12-4, 25-9) strengthened their hold on first place in the West after last week's sweep of fourth-place Wittenberg (3-9, 14-18-1). Denison is the only team, in both divisions, to complete their North Coast regular season schedule. The Big Red are guaranteed a spot in the NCAC Tournament, but their seed will not be determined until after this weekend. If second-place Ohio Wesleyan (9-3, 20-12) wins three or more games against Wittenberg on Saturday and Sunday, the Bishops will claim first place and the number one seed in the West. Should Ohio Wesleyan split with the Tigers, Denison would retain their number one standing. If the Big Red and Bishops are tied at the conclusion of the regular season, Ohio Wesleyan wins the tiebreaker - OWU topped Denison three games to one earlier this season. In the event that Wittenberg wins three or more games against the Bishops, there is a chance third-place Wabash (6-6, 17-18) could move into second place. The Little Giants host fifth-place Earlham (2-10, 8-19-1) on Saturday and Sunday. Wabash would need to win three or more games to set up a potential tie with Ohio Wesleyan. Wabash and Ohio Wesleyan split their four-game series earlier this season.

Home field advantage in the first round of the North Coast tournament, scheduled for May 3-4, belongs to the respective winners of each division, who will host the second place team from the opposite division in a best-of-three series (i.e. West #1 vs. East #2 and East #1 vs. West #2). The two winners of the first round will advance to the tournament finals, to be held at Thurmon Munson Memorial Stadium May 8-9 in Canton. The two teams that advance to the finals will determine first and second place in the NCAC standings. The two semifinal losers will share third place. Places 5-10 are determined by division standings - the third-place teams in each division tie for fifth, the fourth-place teams tie for seventh and the fifth-place teams tie for ninth. Ties will not be broken.

Notes: Allegheny sophomore **Evan Vonleer (State College, PA/State College)** hit .529 (9-17) in six games last week with two home runs, a double, nine runs scored and eight runs batted in. He had a slugging percentage of .941. He finished the four games against Oberlin hitting .600 (9-15) with seven RBI, two homers, and a 1.067 slugging percentage ... At 25-9, Denison has won the most games in a season in school history. Junior **Brian Regan (Cincinnati, Ohio/Anderson)** hit .625 in five games and raised his season batting average to .409. He was 10-16 (.625) at the plate with two home runs, nine RBI and 10 runs scored. He also broke Denison's single-season home run record (11). He is currently in the midst of a 10-game hitting streak ... Earlham sophomore **Kevin Carr (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** completed the four-game weekend with Ohio Wesleyan going 7-11 (.636) from the plate with two doubles and two RBI's. He also crossed the plate six times and stole one base ... Hiram has some hot bats. Junior outfielder **Joe Marzano (Youngstown, OH/Cardinal Mooney)** has hit a home run in each of his last five games. He has 11 on the season, a new Terrier single-season mark. Marzano has an eight-game hitting streak. So does sophomore **Dante Delisio (Poland, OH/Cardinal Mooney)**, freshman **Jacob Bailey (Cleveland, OH/Padua Franciscan)** is working on a nine-game streak. Sophomore **Matt Mansfield (Canton, OH/Glen Oak)** set a Terrier mark of a different sort after being hit by a pitch five times last week. He has been plunked 15 times this season ... Junior **Adam Selhorst (Westerville, OH/St. Charles)** picked up his fourth win of the season, leading Kenyon to its first victory over Wooster since 1985. Senior **Jesse Gregory (Gainesville, FL/Eastside)** was 5-13 against Wooster, including two home runs. He now owns the Lords' single-season home run mark with nine ... Ohio Wesleyan has racked up its 18th consecutive 20-win season. Bishops' Freshman **Josh Nice (Hinckley, OH/Highland)** pitched 6.2 innings of shutout baseball to pick up a win over nationally ranked Heidelberg. He also hurled 3.0 innings of scoreless relief to get a win over Earlham. Junior **Tyler Mott (Grove City, OH/Grove City)** recorded a save to seal the win over Heidelberg ... Wooster junior **Justin Alaburda (Medina, OH/Walsh Jesuit)** allowed one earned run on 10 hits, while striking out six in leading the Scots to a win over Kenyon - his third complete game of the season. GOLF REPORT **NCAC Championship: May 2-3 Oberlin**

In the final weekend of competition before the NCAC Championship, Ohio Wesleyan's Strimer Invitational will feature eight of the nine conference golf squads. It will be held Saturday and Sunday at the Oakhaven Golf Course. North Coast schools expected to participate are Denison, Hiram, Kenyon, Oberlin, Wabash, Wittenberg, Wooster and the host Bishops. Allegheny is set to host their annual Griffin Motors Classic. The North Coast Athletic Conference Championship, to be hosted by Oberlin at the Oberlin Golf Club, is set for Friday and Saturday, May 2-3.

Notes: Last week, Wooster hosted the Parlor Restaurant/Bank One Invitational. Denison, the top NCAC team, was edged out of second place by one stroke. The Big Red finished third (631) behind first-place Muskingum (620) and second-place Otterbein (630). Denison was followed by Wittenberg (634) in fourth and the host Scots (657) in ninth. Kenyon (12th-693), Oberlin (14th-725) and Hiram (15th-750) round out North Coast squads in the 15-team tournament. Wittenberg shot a 310 on the second day of the tournament - the best team round of the day. Freshman **Dane Sandridge (Westfield Center, OH/Cloverleaf)** helped the Tigers to the low tally with a hole-in-one on the 168-yard eighth hole. He ended the two-day event in 16th place. Denison sophomore **Fred Waddell (Wilmette, IL/Lake Forest)** paced the Big Red with a 10-over-par 154 (78-76) and was the highest individual NCAC finisher in second place. Senior **Adam Klein (Brecksville, OH/Brecksville)** (78-77=155) and Wittenberg freshman **Kristopher Schmelzer (Lancaster, OH/Lancaster)** (79-76=155) both finished one shot behind Waddell and were part of a six-man tangle at third ... Allegheny was second of 15 teams at last week's Mid-Atlantic Regionals. Junior **Joe Zumpella (Struthers, OH/Struthers)** earned his third top-10 finish of the season, shooting a 78-75=153 (+11) to finish tied for fifth ... Wabash finished with 627 strokes to earn eighth place at the Millikin Big Blue Golf Classic.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT **NCAC Champion: Ohio Wesleyan**

The first North Coast Athletic Conference champion of the spring was crowned last week when Ohio Wesleyan (5-0, 8-2) capped its perfect conference season with dominating victories over Wittenberg and Oberlin. The Bishops claim their 13th NCAC title in men's lacrosse in 19 seasons. The remaining three games in NCAC play will be contested in the coming week. Denison (2-1, 5-5), which is tied for second with Kenyon (2-1, 8-3), travels to sixth-place Oberlin (3-7, 0-4) on Tuesday for the Yeomen's final NCAC game of the year. The Lords visit fourth-place Wooster (2-2, 6-5) for the Scots' NCAC finale on Wednesday. Then Denison and Kenyon wrap up the conference season with their head-to-head meeting on Saturday. Wittenberg (1-4, 4-6) is assured of at least a share of fifth as the Tigers completed their conference schedule last week.

Notes: Ohio Wesleyan senior midfielder **Frank Bedford (Villanova, PA/Radnor)** led the Bishop attack with seven goals and six assists in two contests. Sophomore **Paul McCommons (Smyrna, DE/Dover)** posted his first career shutout against Wittenberg. Senior **Jeff Hollway (Lewis Center, OH/Suffield Academy, CT)** scored his first career hat trick against Oberlin. ... Wooster split a pair of non-conference games last week. Freshman attacker **Shawn Hardy (Carrboro, NC/Chapel Hill)** scored a game-high eight points on four goals and four assists in a victory over Washington & Jefferson, then added a goal in the loss to Mercyhurst ... Denison freshman **Yanni Savoulidis (Maplewood, NJ/Columbia)** scored his first hat trick of the season to lead the Big Red to victory over Colorado College ... Freshman **Will Walker (Houston, TX/Pomfret)** contributed five goals and three assists as Kenyon won twice in non-conference play last week.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT **NCAC Championship: May 2-3 Wooster**

Two weeks remain in the regular season and every squad has at least two contests remaining on its conference schedule. Defending champion Wooster (4-1, 8-2), which enters the week alone in first place, will play at eighth-place Earlham (0-5, 1-5) on Saturday. Kenyon (3-1, 6-2) and Denison (3-1, 7-5), tied for second, each play twice this week. The Ladies visit fourth-place (tie) Wittenberg (3-2, 4-5) on Wednesday, then host seventh-place Oberlin (1-4, 1-9) on Saturday. The Big Red travels to fourth-place (tie) Ohio Wesleyan (3-2, 6-6) on Thursday, and makes the drive to Meadville to take on sixth-place Allegheny (1-2, 3-6) on Saturday. The Gators kick off the week when they entertain the Yeowomen Tuesday, and wrap it up with a home contest with the Tigers Sunday. The final day of the regular season is Tuesday, April 29, when Denison and Earlham host Kenyon and Ohio Wesleyan, respectively. The NCAC Tournament takes place May 2-3 at the College of Wooster. The top four teams qualify for the championship.

Notes: Last week, Wooster picked up two important conference victories, both over teams that were 3-0 in the NCAC entering the games, but also lost, 6-4, to Wittenberg. Senior **Megan Kennedy (Annapolis, MD/Broadneck Senior)** totalled 11 points on nine goals and two assists in the Scots' 2-1 week, highlighted by a seven-point performance against Kenyon. Denison and the Ladies are just a half-game behind Wooster in the standings. The Big Red also defeated Earlham last week, behind **Courtney Abrams (Washington, DC/Bullis School)**, who had seven goals and two assists in her team's two contests. Kenyon senior **Melissa Blum (Chevy Chase, MD/St. Andrew's)**, the NCAC's third-leading scorer at 4.25 points per game, led her team with two goals and an assist in her team's only action, a 18-5 loss to Wooster ... Ohio Wesleyan won its only contest of the week, a 15-7 decision over Oberlin. **Carrie Williams (Hingham, Ma/Hingham)** and **Amanda McDermontt (Wayne, PA/Episcopal Academy)** each finished with three goals and an assist for the victors ... Wittenberg senior goalkeeper **Rebecca Russ (Louisville, KY/Sacred Heart)** stopped 22 shots for a saves percentage of 84.6 in her team's upset of the first-place Scots. She has been in goal for the Tigers in the past five games and has a 64.7 saves percentage ... **Ashley Lemmon (Allison Park, PA/Winchester)** scored the game-winning goal in overtime for Allegheny over St. Vincent. The Gators won, 8-7, as Lemmon scored three times and added an assist ... Oberlin sophomore **Alice Powlen (Redwood City, CA)** scored five

goals as the Yeowomen notched their first NCAC victory of the year, a 13-6 decision over Earlham. **Mareike Stanitzke (Hamburg, Germany/White Mountain)** scored a hat trick for the Quakers.

SOFTBALL REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 2-3 at High Seed

Last week's matchup between Wittenberg (7-1, 18-12) and Denison (7-1, 17-15) was rescheduled for this Wednesday, due to rain. The two teams are deadlock in first place and a chance at the number one seed in the upcoming North Coast tournament. The regular season champion earns the right to host the four-team event. Denison has hosted the tournament each of the past two seasons and has put the home-field advantage to good use by winning tourney titles each year.

Aside from the Denison-Wittenberg makeup, each NCAC squad will play two league doubleheaders this week - the final week of competition in the regular season. The Big Red host fourth-place Ohio Wesleyan (6-4, 15-14) on Wednesday and then travel to Oberlin (1-9, 5-14) on Saturday. The Tigers also play Wednesday and Saturday, travelling to sixth-place Kenyon (4-6, 8-19) midweek and to third-place Allegheny (6-3-1, 11-17-1) on the weekend.

The week opens Tuesday with Allegheny at Oberlin and Hiram (2-8, 6-20) at fifth-place Wooster (4-5-1, 15-16-1). The week ends with Ohio Wesleyan and Kenyon at Hiram and Wooster, respectively.

Notes: Allegheny junior **Shawn Gledhill (Erie, PA/McDowell)** went 4-11 (.364) with two runs batted in and two runs scored as the Gators went 2-2 last week. Freshman **Giannina Cocco (Miami, FL/Palmetto)** recorded her first career no-hitter in a 3-0 win over Kenyon. In the game, she struck out nine and also had an RBI and a run scored from the other side of the plate. For the week, she was 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA as she allowed five earned runs and seven hits in 14.0 inning pitched. Opponents hit just .152 off of her ... Denison was 8-8 in stolen base attempts last week. Sophomore third baseman **Gina Villegas (Tuscon, AZ/Pueblo)** hit .636 for the week and raised her season batting average to .319. She was 7-11 at the plate and had two doubles and three RBI. Junior **Sara Mullen (Seymour, WI/Seymour)** led Denison to a 3-1 victory over the Wooster, pitching seven innings, allowing three hits and zero earned runs. The victory improved her season record to 6-5 and lowered her ERA to 1.89 ... Hiram sophomore **Jen Melfi (Girard, OH/Girard)** tossed her 18th complete game of the year in a 3-2 win over Oberlin, tying the school single-season mark. In seven innings of work, she allowed three hits, two earned runs, and struck out and walked two batters. At the plate, she drove in the winning run in the bottom of the seventh inning ... Kenyon senior **Samantha Foy (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** pitched all four of the Ladies' games last week, including a 3-0 shutout over Ohio Wesleyan. For the week, she allowed 34 hits, 17 runs and 12 earned runs. She walked five batters and fanned 14 over 25 innings. Freshman **Jenny Glaeser (Houston, TX)** was a combined 6-10 (.600) in the four games. She scored two runs and drove in three. She hit a double and a home run, and also stole one base ... Oberlin's **Kate Oberg** led the Yeowomen to a 1-0 win over Hiram, allowing only three hits in seven innings ... Sophomore **Janelle Thompson (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** went the distance in a 6-2 win over Kenyon. She struck out five over seven innings. Freshman **Amy Mazur (Elyria, OH/Elyria)** extended her hitting streak to 17 games, breaking the NCAC season record of 16 set by **Kady Krivos** of Wooster in 2001. For the week she was 4-5 (.800) from the plate ... Wittenberg junior **Carmen Montgomery (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern)** was 4-8 (.500) from the leadoff spot in two games last week. She hit a triple, scored three runs and drove in two. She has started all 30 of the Tigers' games in five different positions (pitcher, catcher, shortstop, left field and right field). She is hitting .310 and is tied for the team lead with 31 hits. She has the most at-bats (100), doubles (eight) and triples (six) on the team this season. ... Wooster junior **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** went 3-0 last week, highlighted by the first perfect game in Wooster softball history. On Wednesday, she sent down all 15 batters she faced - 10 on strikeouts - before the Scots defeated Oberlin 8-0 after five innings, marking her third career no-hitter. Barone also pitched the first six innings of Saturday's key 3-0 win over Denison, yielding no runs and just one hit before giving way to the closer. Overall, she combined to allow two runs on six hits and six walks, while striking out 21 in 18.0 innings during the week. Junior **Brianne Diorio (Boardman, OH/Cardinal Mooney)** had a hit in five of Wooster's six games last week, going 8-21 overall (.381) with five runs and six runs batted in. She totaled three doubles, giving her a school-record 10 for the season and stole a pair of bases.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

NCAC Championship: April 25-27 Denison

The 19th North Coast Athletic Conference Men's Tennis Championships will be held at Denison from Friday through Sunday. In the West, Wittenberg (4-0) will be the top seed, followed by Denison (3-1) in second, Ohio Wesleyan (2-2) third and Earlham (1-3) fourth. The fifth team, Wabash (0-4), will not compete. In the East, one match remains to be played and that match will determine the top seed. Wooster (3-0) and defending champion Kenyon (3-0) meet on Tuesday in Gambier for the final regular-season divisional match of 2003. Oberlin (2-2) is assured of the third seed and Allegheny (1-3) is fourth. Fifth-place Hiram (0-4) will not travel to the championship. See attached schedule for tournament match times.

Notes: Last week was the busiest of the season in terms of divisional play. In the East, Kenyon defeated Allegheny and Oberlin by a combined 13-1 score. The Yeomen went 1-1 on the week and Wooster also picked up a divisional victory. In the West, Earlham won its first divisional match of the season, assuring itself a spot in the NCAC tournament. Wittenberg clinched the top seed in the West with a 4-3 decision over Denison ... Junior **Nilesh Saldanha (Bombay, India)** of Wooster has the best winning percentage at number-one singles (16-1, .941) ... Kenyon sophomores **Mike Herrick (Amherst, OH/Elyria Catholic)** and **Joe Freeman (Philadelphia, PA/Germantown Friends)** combined for a 10-4 mark at first doubles, the best in the NCAC entering the final week of the season (.714).

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

NCAC Championship: April 25-27 Denison

The 19th North Coast Athletic Conference Women's Tennis Championships will be held at Denison from Friday through Sunday. Defending champion Denison (3-0) is the only team undefeated in conference matches this season. The Big Red are slated to take on fourth-place Oberlin (5-2) Tuesday in the final regular-season match of the year. Wittenberg (4-1) and Kenyon (3-1) stand second and third. Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster are each 2-3 and tied for fifth. Earlham (1-3) stands seventh, Allegheny (1-4) is eighth and Hiram (0-4) is ninth. Tournament seedings will be announced later this week. See attached schedule for tournament match times.

Notes: Winners in conference play last week were Kenyon (twice) and Denison, Oberlin and Wooster (once each) ... The Ladies' **Christina Reimers (Mt. Vernon, OH)** has the top record at first singles in terms of winning percentage (.714). She is 10-4 at the top slot ... Wittenberg sophomore **Emily Figel (Ft. Wayne, IN/Homestead)** and senior **Shannon Oliphant (Columbus, OH/Hilliard Davidson)** are tops at first doubles with a 9-4 mark (.692).

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 2-3 Ohio Wesleyan

On Friday and Saturday, the NCAC Multi-Event championships will be contested at Wittenberg. Athletes from around the conference will compete in the heptathlon and decathlon and scoring from both events will be included in the final championship team standings. Most of the squads, though, will take the week to rest up for the NCAC Championships, to be held at Ohio Wesleyan May 2-3. Several teams will send split squads to Otterbein's qualifier on Wednesday, Wooster's Last Chance meet on Friday and/or Baldwin-Wallace on Saturday. Allegheny will send some athletes to the Penn Relays, while Wabash hosts an invitational.

At last week's all-Ohio Championships, Oberlin was the top women's team finisher from the NCAC in third place. Denison placed fourth, Ohio Wesleyan was ninth, Kenyon 11th, Hiram 14th and Wooster 17th in the 19-team field. The Yeowomen had two individual champions. Senior **Courtney Stackhouse (Woodbridge, VA)** won the 100 meters in 12.95, and sophomore **Emily Enderle (Covington, OH)** won the javelin (132-3). Denison senior **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** remained undefeated outdoors in two events as she won and set a school record in the shot put (42-10 1/4) and also took the discus (136-1). Ohio Wesleyan junior **Akeya Terrell (Gahanna, OH/Westerville North)** won the 400 meters in meet-record time (56.56), Denison junior **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** won the 200 meters (25.35), and Kenyon freshman **Katie Walker (Columbus, OH/Academy)** won the long jump (18-0 1/4). The Hiram women set three school records: **Emma Brown (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** in the long jump (17-6), **Beth Groselle (Hiram, OH/Crestwood)** in the shot put (36-11) and **Julie Hajny (Piney Fork, OH/Buckeye Local)** in the steeplechase (12:03.24). Kenyon's **Katy Cameron (New Orleans, LA/Isidore Newman)** set a school mark in the pole vault (10-0). In the men's meet, Kenyon was the top NCAC finisher in 10th place. Ohio Wesleyan followed in 13th, Wooster was 14th, Oberlin, Denison and Hiram wound up in places 16 through 18, respectively. The only individual winner from an NCAC school was Kenyon senior **Ben Hildebrand (Fairport, NY/The Harley School)**, who took the 10,000 meters in 31:56.91. Oberlin's **Bret Peterson (Greenville, MI)** was runner up in the 400 (49.18), Denison junior **Andy Stromwall (Waukesha, WI/South)** took second in the triple jump (44-2 1/2) ... Earlham and Wittenberg competed in the Earlham Invitational. The Quaker women were second at their own meet. **Tashi Johnson (Bloomington, IN/South)** won the 100 meters (12.3) and 200 meters (26.0) and **Carmen Batts-Porter (Indianapolis, IN/Cardinal Ritter)** won the shot put (38-9). The Quaker men placed fifth in the six-team event. **James Segrest (Indianapolis, IN/Northwest)** was a double winner as he took both the high jump (5-10) and triple jump (40-3). **Andy Graham (Hiram, OH/Mogadore)** won the steeplechase (10:18.5). Leading the Wittenberg women was **Geri Woessner (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)**, who took first in the javelin (112-1) and second in the shot (36-0), and **LaRissa O'Neal (Indianapolis, IN/Broad Ripple)**, who won the pole vault with a school record height of 9 feet, 6 inches. The Tiger men had three individual winners in **Joel Drake (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)**, **Alex Yurovitsky (Richmond Hts., OH/Lyndhurst Brush)** and **Mark Trempe (Springfield, OH/St. Paris Graham)**, who claimed the shot put (47-8), javelin (147-8) and 400 meters (50.7), respectively ... Wabash placed ninth of 13 teams at the Millikin Classic with 26 points ... At the unscored Slippery Rock Invitational, Allegheny's men had first place finishes by **Mark Delaney (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** in the 800 meters (1:56.46) and **Jason Betts (Conneaut Lake, PA/Conneaut Lake)** in the 10,000 meters (34:27.77). **Jen Surace (Bethel Park, PA/Bethel Park)** was the lone individual winner for the women as she took the pole vault (10-6). **Tiffany Bennett (Russell, PA/Eisenhower)** met the NCAA qualifying standard in the javelin with a throw of 130 feet, 3 1/2 inches.

NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (Apr. 21)

BASEBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Kenyon senior **Jesse Gregory (Gainesville, FL/Eastside)** was 5-13 (.385) in four games against Wooster, including a perfect 4-4 performance in game four of the series - the Lords' first win over the Scots since 1985, the first season of NCAC baseball. In game four, he cracked two home runs and had seven RBI. For the week, Gregory scored four runs, hit three homers and drove in eight runs. He now owns the Lords' single-season home run mark with nine **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Wooster junior right-hander **Justin Alaburda (Medina, OH/Walsh Jesuit)** allowed just one earned run on 10 hits, while striking out six and not walking a batter in leading the Scots to their game-one victory over Kenyon. He pitched all seven innings for his third complete game of the season. Alaburda was the lone Wooster pitcher who saw action against Ohio State to not allow a run, as he pitched a 1-2-3 ninth inning.

MEN'S LACROSSE

Kenyon freshman attackman **Will Walker (Houston, TX/Pomfret)** contributed five goals and three assists as Kenyon won twice in non-conference play last week. He scored four goals and two assists in his team's 19-12 victory over Colorado College.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE

Wooster senior **Megan Kennedy (Annapolis, MD/Broadneck Senior)** totaled 11 points on nine goals and two assists in the Scots' 2-1 week, highlighted by a seven-point performance in a win over Kenyon. She also notched two goals in a victory over Denison and a goal and an assist in a loss to Wittenberg.

SOFTBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Denison sophomore third baseman **Gina Villegas (Tuscon, AZ/Pueblo)** hit .636 for the week and raised her season batting average to .319. She was 7-11 at the plate and had two doubles and three RBI. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Wooster junior **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** went 3-0 last week, highlighted by the first perfect game in Wooster softball history. On Wednesday, she sent down all 15 batters she faced - 10 on strikeouts - before the Scots defeated Oberlin 8-0 after five innings, marking her third career no-hitter. Barone also pitched the first six innings of Saturday's key 3-0 win over Denison, yielding no runs and just one hit before giving way to the closer. Overall, she combined to allow two runs on six hits and six walks, while striking out 21 in 18.0 innings during the week.

MEN'S: Kenyon senior **Matt Cabrera (Longmont, CO/Skyview, WA)** placed third in the 5,000 meters at All-Ohio Championships with a time of 15:29.23. **WOMEN'S:** Oberlin senior **Lori Tuchfeld (North Merrick, NY/Sanford H. Calhoun)** placed second in the 1500 meters (4:44.47) and third in the 5,000 meters (18:38.59) at the All-Ohio Championships.

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK - SPRINTS/HURDLES

MEN'S: Hiram freshman **Mike Shafer (Martins Ferry, OH/Martins Ferry)** placed ninth in the 200 meters (22.83) and 11th in the 100 meters (11.47) at the All-Ohio Championships. **WOMEN'S:** Denison junior **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** won the 200 meters with an NCAA provisional qualifying time of 25.35 at the All-Ohio Championships. She also anchored the Big Red's third-place 4x100 meter relay team that finished in 49.59.

MEN'S: Denison junior **Andy Stromwall (Waukesha, WI/South)** placed second in the triple jump at the All-Ohio Championships with a leap of 44-2 1/2. **WOMEN'S:** Denison junior **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** remained undefeated in both the shot put and discus this outdoor season. She won the shot (42-10 1/4 - school record) and discus (136-1) at the All-Ohio Championships.
