BASEBALL REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 8-9 Canton, OH

Wooster (15-1, 27-11), Allegheny (9-5, 20-14), Ohio Wesleyan (12-4, 24-14) and Denison (12-4, 29-9) have earned spots in the NCAC Tournament, which will be held in two rounds, beginning Saturday and Sunday. Ohio Wesleyan, the number one seed in the West, will host Allegheny, the number two seed in the East, in a best-of-three series consisting of three nine-inning games. Wooster, the number one seed in the East, will host Denison number two in the West. The Bishops and Big Red finished with identical 12-4 divisional records; Ohio Wesleyan won the tiebreaker between the two teams by taking three out of four games from Denison earlier this season.

The two winners of the first round will advance to the tournament finals, to be held at Thurmon Munson Memorial Stadium on Thursday and Friday, May 8-9 in Canton. The NCAC champion shall be the winner of the NCAC tournament. The two teams that advance to the finals will determine first and second place in the NCAC standings. The two semifinal losers will share third place. Places 5-10 are determined by division standings – the third-place teams in each division tie for fifth, the fourth-place teams tie for seventh and the fifth-place teams tie for ninth. Ties will not be broken. The tournament winner will also receive the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Division III Tournament. Last spring, Wooster defeated Ohio Wesleyan two out of three games in the championship series to win the 2002 crown. Wooster has claimed eight championships, while the Bishops have seven. Allegheny has claimed four. The Gators and Scots shared the league's first championship in 1985.

Notes: Allegheny sophomore **Joe Ribaldo (Falconer, NY/Falconer Central)** held seventh-ranked Marietta to four hits and two earned runs in 6 1/3 innings in just his second start of the season. Marietta bats managed just a .174 average off of him. Ribaldo had a no-decision as the Gators won in the ninth, 5-4 ... Denison has won 10 straight games and 18 out of their last 19. The Big Red ended the month of April with a record of 18-2. Shortstop **Brian Regan (Cincinnati, OH/Anderson)** hit .400 for the week (6-15) and won Sunday's second game against Otterbein with his second walk-off home run of the season in the bottom of the seventh inning. Regan has 12 home runs this season - entering the season he had five career homers ... Earlham freshman **Derreck Parkevich (Logansport, IN/Logansport)** hit his first collegiate home run against Wabash to put Earlham within one run in game three. Trailing in the seventh the catcher hit his second homer of the game - this time a three-run shot to give Earlham the 9-8 advantage. He hit .333 for the week going 6-18 from the plate ... Hiram senior **Dom Yazbeck (Youngstown, OH/Chaney)** has 17 home runs this season, tying the school record shared by **Brian Frasko** and **Joe Lisko**. Last week, Yazbeck was 7-21 (.333) with five RBI and five runs scored. He was also 1-1 in two starts on the mound, including a complete-game victory at Oberlin ... Kenyon senior **Josh Pike (Orleans, MA/St. Mark's)** went 2-0 with a save in 15 innings of work last week, highlighted by a 7-0 shutout of Earlham. For the week, Pike had two complete games, fanning 24 batters and walking four. He allowed four earned runs and 10 hits. In addition, he was a combined 8-15 (.533) from the plate with five runs scored, four doubles, three RBI and a stolen base ... Ohio Wesleyan junior **Tyler Mott (Grove City, OH/Grove City)** hurled a three-hit shutout in the opener of the NCAC series against Wittenberg. He followed by picking up a win in relief in the second game of the series. He's the first Bishop pitcher to win both games of a doubleheader since 1989. From the other side of the plate he was 11-20 (.550) with six doubles, two homers and eight RBI. Senior **Joe Loudenslager (Hilliard, OH/Darby)** was 11-22 in six games last week. He sent the ball out of the park twice and had five RBI. In the four-game series against Wittenberg, he was 8-14 with three doubles. OWU's three wins against the Tigers assured the Bishops of the number one seed in the West Division heading into the NCAC Tournament ... Wabash finished the season with a record of 22-18, the third-most wins in school history. Sophomore shortstop **Danny Schubert (Lebanon, IL/Lebanon)** went 11-19 (.579) at the plate for the week, scoring five runs and tallying five RBI. Schubert was flawless in the field, playing error-free baseball while making 10 putouts and 15 assists. Freshman pitcher **John Thiry (Grand Rapids, MI/Grand Rapids Christian)** was the winning pitcher in both games on Saturday for Wabash. He came into the first game in the top of the seventh inning, allowing only one hit. He stayed on the mound as the starter in the second game, pitching seven more shutout innings to record his second win of the day. He finished the two-game stint holding Earlham to five hits in eight innings. He also struck out four ... Wittenberg freshman **Steve Less (Sheffield, OH/Elyria Catholic)** snapped a 10-game losing streak with a complete-game eight-hit win over Ohio Wesleyan ... Wooster freshman first baseman **Kurt Kapferer (Jefferson, OH/Jefferson Area)** went 12-19 (.632) from the plate with four homers and 11 RBI. He also reached base via three walks and two hit by pitches for a .708 on-base percentage for the week, and doubled once and scored nine times. Kapferer began the week with a home run in each game of the Hiram sweep (5-7, 5 RBI), followed the next day with a solo blast that gave the Scots a 13-9 lead in the eighth inning over Otterbein, and capped his week by going 6-9, including a double, a home run, and six RBI, during the first three games of the Allegheny series.

GOLF REPORT **NCAC Championship: May 2-3 at Oberlin**

The North Coast Athletic Conference Golf Championships are set for Friday and Saturday, May 2-3 at the Oberlin Golf Club. Oberlin College is host to the 19th annual championship. Last spring Ohio Wesleyan shot a combined 624 to earn its eighth conference title. Runner-up Allegheny (628) has also won eight championships, while Wittenberg (646) and Wooster (656), fourth and fifth last year, respectively, have each claimed one. The host Yeomen will be making their second appearance at the golf championship. Oberlin added golf as a varsity sport last season. The Yeomen shot a 697 at last spring's event.

In the final tune-up before the championships, eight of nine NCAC golf squads competed at Ohio Wesleyan's Strimer Invitational. Ohio Wesleyan and Denison, the top NCAC teams, tied for second, with a 35-over par 603. Wooster (612) placed fifth in the 17-team event, followed by Wittenberg (623) in seventh. Kenyon (634), Wabash (646), Oberlin (716) and Hiram (732) wound up in places 13, 14, 16 and 17, respectively. The top individual from an NCAC school was **Chad Poling (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** of Ohio Wesleyan, who finished second with a score of 144, three strokes off the winner from Muskingum. **Adam Klein (Brecksville, OH/Brecksville)** was Denison's top individual, who tied for sixth with a golfer from Otterbein. Allegheny, the only conference team not at the Strimer Invitational, hosted its own Griffin Motors Classic. The Gator "A" team finished third of eight teams, while the "B" team finished fourth. **Ben Rathfon (Clarion, PA/North Clarion County)** shot 76-70=146 to finish two over par on the 6,570-yard, par 72 layout. Rathfon had the low-round of 70 in the second round as the Gator "A" team had the low team total of 298.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT **NCAC Champion: Ohio Wesleyan**

The North Coast Athletic Conference season is complete and the Ohio Wesleyan Bishops (5-0, 10-2) have claimed their 13th NCAC title in men's lacrosse in 19 seasons. All that remains are a few non-conference matches. The field for the NCAA Division III tournament will be announced on Sunday, May 4.

Denison (4-1, 7-5) secured second place after winning twice in conference play last week. Kenyon (3-2, 9-4) wound up third after splitting two NCAC games in the final week. Wooster (2-3, 6-7) finished fourth and Wittenberg (1-4, 4-7) and Oberlin (0-5, 3-9) were fifth and sixth, respectively.

Notes: The STX/USILA poll (April 28) ranks Ohio Wesleyan 18th. Denison fell out of the Top 20, but received votes ... The conference's leading scorer, **Frank Bedford (Villanova, PA/Radnor)**, led Ohio Wesleyan with nine goals and five assists as the Bishops won twice in non-conference play last week. Bedford leads all scorers with 41 goals and 63 points in 12 games (5.25 points per game) ... The Big Red have won six in a row and are unbeaten in April (6-0). Senior **Kevin Sullivan (Timonium, MD/Boys Latin School)** scored five goals and added three assists to help Denison claim second place in the NCAC with two conference victories in the final week ... Kenyon senior **Julian Quasha (Mill Valley, CA/Thacher)** scored six times as the Lords went 1-1 last week ... Oberlin senior **Erik Vachon (Herndon, VA)** had a hand in all three of Oberlin's goals in a 16-3 loss to Wheeling Jesuit. He scored twice and assisted on the other ... Wooster freshman goalkeeper **Courter Shimeall (Worthington, OH/Thomas Worthington)** made 24 saves last week, including 18 in a 10-9 overtime loss to Colorado College.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT **NCAC Championship: May 2-3 at Wooster**

Last week was the busiest week of the season in terms of conference competition. Seven NCAC games were contested and the big winners were Denison (5-1, 9-5) and Wittenberg (5-2, 7-5) with two victories apiece. Wooster (5-1, 9-3), Denison, Wittenberg and Kenyon (4-2, 7-3) are assured of slots in the upcoming four-team NCAC tournament. Tuesday's matches will finalize the seedings.

Entering this final week of the regular season, every squad but third-place Wittenberg and seventh-place Oberlin (1-6, 1-11) has conference games remaining. Sixth-place Allegheny (2-4, 4-8) visits first-place (tie with Denison) Wooster on Tuesday in an important contest. If the Scots win, Wooster clinches the first seed in the NCAC Tournament. Even if Denison wins its final contest against fourth-place Kenyon on Tuesday, the Big Red lose a tiebreaker with Wooster by virtue of the Scots' 9-8 victory over Denison on April 19. Fifth-place Ohio Wesleyan (3-3, 7-7) and eighth-place Earlham (0-6, 1-6) square off Tuesday as well. If the Bishops and the Ladies finish the season tied for fourth place, Kenyon wins the tiebreaker based on its 17-15 defeat of Ohio Wesleyan on April 2.

Notes: Allegheny freshman **Emily Deering (Hollis, ME/Hollis)** notched 11 goals for the Gators last week, including six in a 13-7 victory over Oberlin ... Freshman **Courtney Abrams (Washington, DC/Bullis School)** led Denison with six goals and four assists in two Big Red victories. **Stephanie Pratzner (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** scored the game-winner for Denison over Allegheny with 1:37 left in the game. The final score was 12-11 ... Kenyon senior **Melissa Blum (Chevy Chase, MD/St. Andrews)** hit the back of the net 11 times as the Ladies clinched a tournament spot. She scored seven goals in the clincher, an 18-9 decision over Oberlin ... The Yeowomen's **Anna Ialeggio (Randolph, VT)** scored six of Oberlin's 16 goals last week ... Ohio Wesleyan junior **Alexa Laub (Buffalo, NY/Nichols School)** led the Bishops with three goals and an assist in a 11-10 victory over St. Vincent ... Wittenberg senior **Cara Romanowski (Collegeville, PA/Perkiomen Valley)** scored 20 goals on 24 shots as the Tigers won three times last week. She scored seven in a 17-10 defeat of Kenyon and knocked in six in a 12-6 win over Allegheny. She also had seven scores in a non-conference victory over Medaille. She ranks fifth all-

time in goals scored with 168, and is Wittenberg's all-time leader in that category. This season, Romanowski has 50 goals in 12 games for a conference-best average of 4.17 goals per game ... Wooster senior **Beth Hemminger (Annapolis, MD/Senior)** scored six times and assisted on two others in the Scots' 15-11 loss to Division II Mercyhurst.

SOFTBALL REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 2-3 at Denison

Denison (12-2, 22-16) compiled the best conference record during the regular season to claim their third straight Regular Season Championship, as well as the number one seed heading into the NCAC Softball Tournament. The Big Red will host the top-four double-elimination tournament Friday and Saturday. Second-seeded Wittenberg (10-4, 21-15) will take on third seed Allegheny (9-4-1, 15-19-1) in the event's opening game at 10:00 a.m. Denison will face fourth-seed Ohio Wesleyan (8-6, 17-18) in the second game at noon (see attached bracket for full schedule). As NCAC champions, Denison has hosted the tournament each of the past two seasons and has put the home-field advantage to good use by winning tourney titles each year. As the league added a tournament for the 2000 season, the Big Red have been the only host for the event. Allegheny won the first two North Coast softball championships, in 1998 and '99. Wittenberg was champ in 2000.

Notes: Allegheny freshman infielder **April Tantalo (Pittsburgh, PA/Carrick)** hit .409 last week and led the team with six runs batted in as the Gators went 4-2. She had two doubles and three runs scored, going 9-22 on the week. Tantalo was 4-4 with three runs scored and two RBI in a 16-1 win over Oberlin. Freshman **Giannina Cocco (Miami, FL/Palmetto)** went 3-0 with a 1.67 earned run average last week to improve to 8-5 on the season. Opponents hit just .202 off of her as she struck out 17 batters and allowed five earned runs in 21.0 innings of work. She allowed just two extra-base hits ... In four games this week Denison senior **Nikki Brehm (Bexley, Ohio/Bexley)** was 10-14 (.714) with two doubles and five RBI. She was also 2-2 in stolen base attempts. Senior catcher **Jessica Simpson (Powell, OH/Olentangy)** had a strong week at the plate. Recovering from a back injury that slowed her during the early part of the season, she went 6-11 (.545) with five RBI in four games for the Big Red. Simpson is batting .345 in 17 games. **Sara Mullen (Seymour, WI/Seymour)** went 2-0 this week earning victories over Ohio Wesleyan and Wittenberg. She is 8-5 on the season and has a 1.70 ERA. Senior **Katie Speakman (Columbus, Ohio/Grandview Heights)** was 10-20 in six games last week for the Big Red. She hit two home runs and drove in 11 RBI. The two home runs were the first for Speakman in her four-year career at Denison. On the season Speakman leads the Big Red with 28 RBI and is second on the team in extra-base hits with 11 ... Hiram sophomore **Jen Melfi (Girard, OH/Girard)** was 2-2 in five appearances last week, capping a record-setting season. She made four starts, completing all four, and allowed only eight runs (six earned) in 29 innings with 14 strikeouts and only five walks. She finished the year with school single-season records of 148 2/3 innings pitched and 22 complete games. She tied **Mandi Wieclaw's** record for appearances with 27 and posted the second most wins (eight) and strikeouts (64) by a Terrier in a season. Hiram led the NCAC in stolen bases for the second straight season. The Terriers finished with 51, including 11 from freshman **Audrah Hyatt (Akron, OH/North)** which led the league ... Kenyon senior **Samantha Foy (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** pitched all four games last week and shut out Wooster in the final game of the season. She allowed 16 runs (15 earned) over 26 innings of work, striking out 12 batters. Sophomore **Dana Halicki (North Royalton, OH/Padua Franciscan)** went a combined 6-14 (.429) in the Ladies' four games last week. She now holds the highest Kenyon single-season batting average (.415) ... Ohio Wesleyan's **Emily Thornton (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** pitched a five-hit shutout at Hiram giving the Bishops their second appearance in the NCAC Tournament in three years. **Sandra Mowery (Euclid, OH/Euclid)** was 5-15 (.333) for the week with four walks for an on-base percentage of .474 ... Wittenberg sophomore **Norah Gillam (Canfield, OH/Canfield)** allowed five hits in a 5-0 shutout of Kenyon. She also earned a 6-4 win over Allegheny last week. Sophomore **Katie Carver (Enon, OH/Greenon)** started four of six games for the Tigers last week. She went 7-14 with three runs, nine RBI and two homers. She leads Wittenberg with three homers on the season ... Wooster junior shortstop **Brianne Diorio (Boardman, OH/Cardinal Mooney)** went 7-11 (.636) with two doubles, a triple, three runs scored, and three RBI during Wooster's 3-1 week. In the sweep of Hiram, she went 4-5 with a double in the nightcap and a triple in the opener and three RBI overall. Diorio was 2-3 in the first Kenyon game, including her league-leading 12th double. Junior right-hander **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** extended her personal winning streak to five straight with two victories last week. She completed both opening games of Wooster's twinbills, combining for two runs allowed on six hits and nine walks while striking out 12 over 14.0 innings.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

NCAC Champion: Kenyon

Kenyon (4-0, 18-3) swept three opponents 12-0 without dropping a point on the way to its seventh team title at the NCAC Championships held at Denison (see attached bracket). The Lords, the top seed in the East, capped their championship run with a 4-0 triumph over the top seed out of the West, Wittenberg (4-0, 15-5), in the finals. Kenyon claims its second straight title; before last spring the Lords last won the NCAC title in 1995. Denison has claimed 11 league championships, including five straight from 1997-2001. Kenyon marched through its first two matches, 8-0, topping Earlham (1-3, 18-5) and Denison (3-1, 9-7) to reach the final. Wittenberg defeated Allegheny (1-3, 5-18) and Wooster (3-1, 10-12) before falling to the Lords. Denison captured third with a 4-2 win over Wooster in the consolation final.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

NCAC Champion: Denison

Denison (3-0, 12-4) swept three opponents 16-1 on the way to its third team title at the NCAC Championships hosted by the Big Red April 25-27 (see attached bracket). Top-seeded Denison topped Earlham (1-3, 9-8) and Oberlin (5-3, 15-10) in early rounds. The Big Red capped its championship run with a 5-1 triumph over second-seeded Kenyon (3-1, 10-9) in the finals. Denison has placed second 14 times in 17 years of North Coast competition; this is the Big Red's second straight women's title and their third since 1994. Kenyon has won 15 NCAC team titles, including the seven of the last eight. The Ladies defeated Allegheny (1-4, 6-16) and Wittenberg (4-1, 8-7) before falling to Denison. Wittenberg captured third with a 6-1 win over Oberlin in the consolation finals.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 2-3 at Ohio Wesleyan

The 19th NCAC Championships will take place on Ohio Wesleyan's George Gauthier Track on Friday and Saturday, May 2-3. The Wittenberg men are the defending champions. The Tigers also won three straight titles from 1995-97. Allegheny's women are four-time defending champions, and the Gators have claimed eight NCAC crowns overall.

At last weekend's Combined Events Championship, the results of which count toward the team standings, athletes from Wittenberg and Hiram took individual titles. Tiger junior **Tim Gaal (Amanda, OH/Clearcreek)** won the decathlon competition and Terrier senior **Emma Brown (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** claimed the heptathlon. Gaal is the third straight Tiger in five years to win the decathlon title. He scored 6101 points, which was a personal record and met the NCAA provisional standard. Brown scored 4184 points, which was a school record and met the NCAA provisional standard.

Notes: Allegheny senior **Dan Princic (Carrolton, OH/Carrolton)** shattered his own school record by over 16 seconds and met the NCAA automatic qualifying standard in the 5000 meters. His time of 14:31.94 placed him eighth in the Olympic Development heat at the Penn Relays, and was the fifth fastest in NCAA Division III this season ... Denison junior **Andy Stromwall (Waukesha, WI/South)** was runner-up in the decathlon at the NCAC Combined Events Championship. He scored a school-record 5712 points and won the 110 hurdles (16.23) and pole vault (3.85 meters/12 feet, 7 1/2 inches) ... Hiram freshman **Beth Groselle (Hiram, OH/Crestwood)** set a school record in the discus with a throw of 115 feet, 9 inches at the Baldwin-Wallace Invitational. She placed 17th overall and fourth among Division III participants ... Kenyon was represented at the Penn Relays by seniors **Michael Baird (Temple, TX/Temple)** and **Ben Hildebrand (Fairport, NY/the Harley School)**. Both runners competed in the Olympic Development 3000-meter steeplechase. Hildebrand placed 13th and broke Kenyon's school mark and met the NCAA provisional standard in the event with a time of 9:13.84. Baird finished 16th with a time of 9:27.72 ... Oberlin sent their 4x100 meter relay team to the Penn Relays. The team of **Leslie Bosworth (Bolton, CT)**, **Amber Coleman (Maple Hts., OH)**, **Teresa Collins (Stone Mountain, GA)** and **Courtney Stackhouse (Woodbridge, VA)** placed fifth in their heat with a time of 49.98 ... Wabash senior **Peter DeYoung (Evansville, IN/Bosse)** cleared 6 feet, 8 inches for the second time this season. He competed at the NJCAA Super Regional, hosted by Wabash ... Wittenberg freshman **Jered Glover (Middletown, OH/Middletown)** won the triple jump and the 100 meters at the Otterbein Invitational on April 26. Junior **Tim Gaal (Amanda, OH/Clearcreek)** became the third Wittenberg athlete in the past five years to win the NCAC decathlon title. The Tigers have claimed every title since 1999, when **Josh Guerreri** won the first of his three straight titles. Brian Gehle won the event last spring. Junior **Geri Woessner (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** was runner up in the heptathlon after winning it in each of the past two seasons.

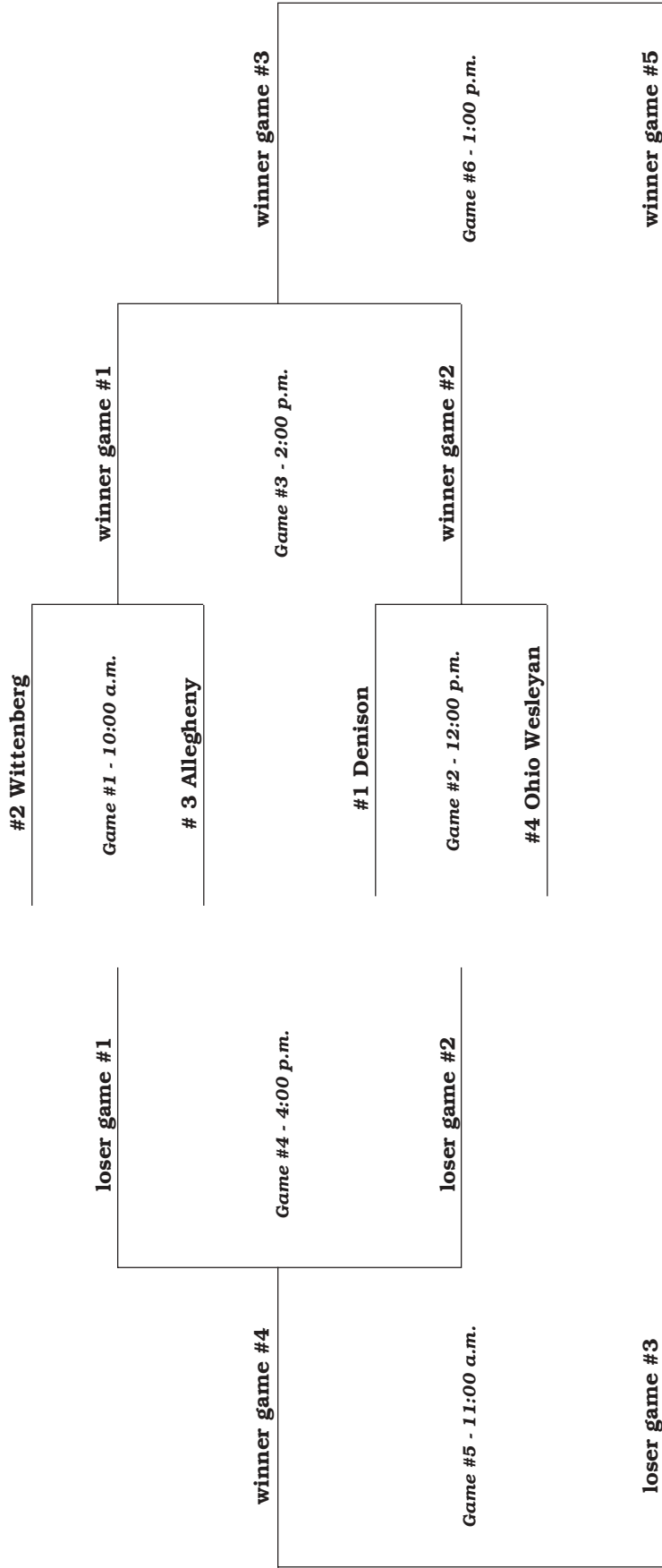

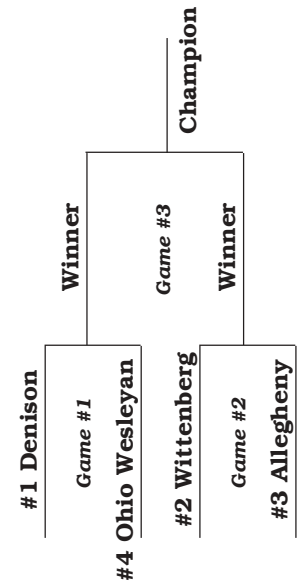
