**OHIO WESLEYAN MEN AND WOOSTER WOMEN ADVANCE TO NCAA LAX TOURNEYS;
DENISON AND OHIO WESLEYAN ADVANCE TO BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP**

May 5, 2003

BASEBALL REPORT

NCAC Championship: May 8-9 Canton, OH

Ohio Wesleyan (27-15) and Denison (31-10) have advanced to the NCAC Tournament Championship, which will be held on Thursday and Friday at Thurman Munson Stadium in Canton, Ohio. The first game is scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m., with the second game to begin at 12:00 p.m. on Friday. The third game, if necessary, will begin no earlier than 30 minutes after the conclusion of game two. The Bishops defeated the Big Red three games to one during the regular season.

In the first round of the tournament, Ohio Wesleyan took two straight games from Allegheny (22-17-1), 2-1, and 10-8, to advance to the finals. Denison, which has won 20 of its last 22 games, advanced after taking two of three games from Wooster (30-13), last week. The Big Red opened the three-game series with a 8-6 victory over the Fighting Scots. Wooster roared back for a 10-0 win in the second game, but Denison picked up the win in game three, 16-8.

Notes: Denison junior **Adam Mandel (St. Louis, MM/MICDS)** raised his season batting average to .479 by going 9-14 with one double, three RBI and three runs scored. Shortstop **Brian Regan (Cincinnati, OH/Anderson)** improved his stolen base total by going 3-3 on the basepaths against Wooster. On the season he is 21-24 in stolen base attempts. He also extended his hitting streak to 17 games. Regan was 4-11 (.364) with seven runs scored and four walks over the weekend. Freshman catcher **A.J. Jezierski (El Cajon, CA/Valhalla)** was 8-12 (.667) at the plate with two doubles, three runs scored and six RBI. In the rubber match, Jezierski was 4-5 (.800) with three RBI and one run scored. Junior **Cam Cowden (Zionsville, IN/Zionsville)** won the first game of the NCAC Tournament against Wooster, pitching 6-2/3 innings, allowing two earned runs and striking out five. The victory was Cowden's ninth of the season ... Ohio Wesleyan senior third baseman **Mark Wherry (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** went 7-11 (.636) last week with five runs scored and two RBI. He walked four times and reached base twice via two hit by pitches for an on-base percentage of .722 (13-18). Senior first baseman **Bo Burnett (Powell, OH/Olentangy)** was 9-15 (.600) with five runs scored and three RBI for the week. Junior pitcher **Tyler Mott (Grove City, OH/Grove City)** went the distance in the Bishops' 2-1 win over Allegheny in game one of the Tournament semifinal series. He also pitched OWU out of a jam in the seventh inning of the nightcap but did not qualify for the win. He was 5-15 (.333) from the plate, scoring six runs, including both of the Bishops' runs in game one against Allegheny ... Allegheny junior **Lee Tenace (Pittsburgh, PA/Bishop Canevin)** started off the week by going 6-7 (.857) with three homers, a triple, and seven RBI in a doubleheader against Kenyon. He finished the week with a .429 batting average (9-21), three doubles and a 1.095 slugging percentage. Tenace finished the year with a .352 average, third on the team. Senior **Josh Sharpless (Freedom, PA/Freedom)** collected a 1.80 ERA in 10.0 innings of work last week. He struck out 13 and allowed six hits as he held opponents to a .162 average. He allowed four hits and one earned run while striking out nine in a loss to Ohio Wesleyan ... Wooster junior second baseman **Matt Miller (Millersburg, OH/Hiland)** was 12-24 (.500) from the plate last week with three doubles, a home run, nine runs scored, and six RBI. He also reached base via two hit by pitches and swiped two bases. Freshman righthander **Jon Oliver (West Chester, OH/Lakota West)** combined to pitch 11.0 innings last week, highlighted by seven innings of shutout ball to earn the win in game two of the NCAC Tournament semifinals. Overall, he allowed four runs on 11 hits and one walk, while striking out eight during the week ... Earlham recorded its first shutout of the season behind the arm of junior **Dave Luptak (Munster, IN/Munster)**. Luptak struck out six batters and gave up six hits in the 5-0 win over Oberlin. The Quakers end the season on a three-game win streak. Senior **Sean O'Reilly (Indianapolis, IN/Bishop Chatard)** garnered only one hit last weekend, but it was a big one pushing him to 52 on the season and breaking the Earlham single-season hit record. O'Reilly went 1-6 (.167) from the plate with an RBI as the Quakers won back-to-back games at home for the first time since 1997. Earlham's 12 wins are the most by a Quaker team since they won 13 in 1995 ... Hiram finished the 2003 season with 21 wins, the second most in a single season in Terrier history. Hiram won the last six games of the season. Senior **Dom Yazbek (Youngstown, OH/Chaney)** became the Terriers' career home run leader when he hit his 18th dinger against Grove City last week. Senior **Mike Diamond (Westlake, OH/Westlake)** ends his college career with an 11-game hitting streak. He ranks in Hiram's top five all-time in hits (168), at-bats (483), stolen bases (38) and RBI (121) ... Kenyon freshman **Michael Coe (Kensington, MD/Montgomery Blair)** threw five innings of relief to pick up an NCAC win against Allegheny last week. He allowed two hits, one earned run and struck out three. The win was the Lords' first over the Gators since 1985. Freshman infielder **Matt Marcinczyk (Trumbull, CT/Trumbull)** was a combined 6-7 (.857) against Allegheny with four runs scored, two doubles, an RBI and a stolen base. He finished the season with Kenyon's single-season record for hits (49) and doubles (14).

BASEBALL PLAYER/PITCHER OF THE WEEK

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Denison freshman catcher **A.J. Jezierski (El Cajon, CA/Valhalla)** was 8-12 (.667) at the plate with two doubles, three runs scored and six RBI. GOLF REPORT **NCAC Championship: Ohio Wesleyan**

North Coast champion Ohio Wesleyan will be joined by Allegheny and Denison in the 23-team field at the NCAA Division III Championships, which began May 12 and will run through the 15th. The 72-hole event is at Dornoch Golf Club in Delaware, Ohio and will be hosted by Ohio Wesleyan. Allegheny is making its 27th consecutive NCAA appearance, extending the nation's second-longest streak. The Gators, who won the Division III title in 1983, finished 17th in last spring's event, while the Bishops finished seventh. Denison is making its first appearance at the national tournament since 1989.

Last weekend, Ohio Wesleyan senior **Jay Tilton (Cincinnati, OH/Winton Woods)** and freshman **Justin Schroeder (Shelby, OH/Shelby)** finished first and second in the individual standings to lead the Bishops to their second straight NCAC championship at Oberlin Golf Club. Ohio Wesleyan has nine league titles since 1985 - the most of any team in the conference. Allegheny follows with eight. Wittenberg and Wooster have each won one championship.

The Bishops finished with a 597, shooting back-to-back rounds of 298 and 299. Denison was 15 shots behind at 612, followed by Allegheny (618), Wooster (625), Wittenberg (626), Wabash (643), Kenyon (644), Oberlin (711) and Hiram (719).

Tilton, who fired a 68 during Friday's first round, won Bob Nye medalist honors with a 2-under-par total of 142. Schroeder finished in second place at 147. Allegheny sophomore **Ben Rathfon (Clarion, PA/North Clarion County)** earned the Dick Gordon award as the Player of the Year in voting by league coaches. Denison's **Ted Barclay** earned Coach of the Year honors.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT **NCAC Champion: Ohio Wesleyan**

North Coast Athletic Conference champion Ohio Wesleyan (5-0, 10-2) was selected to the 17-team NCAA Division III Men's Lacrosse Championships. The Bishops will play at Nazareth (11-3) on Saturday. The winner advances to the national quarterfinals and will play the winner of the Springfield (11-4) – Middlebury (14-1) contest May 14. The national semifinals are slated for May 18 and the championship game will be contested at Ravens Stadium in Baltimore on May 25.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT **NCAC Championship: Wooster**

Wooster (6-1, 12-3) captured its second straight North Coast championship with an 8-7 win over Denison (6-1, 11-6) in the finals of the NCAC Tournament at Wooster on May 3. With 7:52 minutes remaining in the game, Wooster's **Lizzie Newton (Chapel Hill, NC/Chapel Hill)** scored on a free position shot to tie the game at seven. Fifty-one seconds later, **Allison Harrod (Cincinnati, OH/Sycamore)** scored the game-winner. The Fighting Scots defeated Kenyon (4-3, 7-5), 20-7, and the Big Red beat Wittenberg (5-2, 8-6), 8-6, in the semifinals to earn their trips to the Tournament Championship. As conference champions, Wooster received an automatic bid into the 19-team NCAA Division III Championships. The Scots travel to Colorado College (4-0) for a first round game on Wednesday. The winner of the contest will advance to the regionals on Saturday and Sunday to face Salisbury (10-0). The semifinals and championship game will be held Saturday and Sunday, May 17-18 at St. John Fisher in Rochester, New York.

Four Fighting Scots were selected to the all-tournament team. **Beth Hemminger (Annapolis, MD/Senior)** was a repeat selection and was joined by teammates **Megan Kennedy (Annapolis, MD/Broadneck Senior)**, **Nicole Pritchard (Wildwood, MO/Lafayette)** and **Lindsay Tingley (Rockville, MD/Walter Johnson)**. Representing the runner-up Big Red were **Jennifer Fuge (Simsbury, CT/Westminster School)**, **Katie Keating (Englewood, CO/Cherry Creek)**, **Molly Lamden (Darien, CT/Darien)** and **Abbe Stewart (Worthington, OH/Kilbourne)**. **Melissa Blum (Chevy Chase, MD/St. Andrew's)** and **Annie Huntoon (Wenham, MA/Groton)** were selected from Kenyon and **Katie Babcock (Phoenix, MD/Dulaney)** and **Cara Romanowski (Collegeville, PA/Perkiomen Valley)** represented Wittenberg.

SOFTBALL REPORT

NCAC Championship: Wittenberg

2003 North Coast runner-up Wittenberg (24-19) rolled through the NCAC Tournament without a single loss to earn a bid into this week's NCAA Tournament. The Tigers, making the second NCAA appearance in school history, were awarded the fourth seed in the Great Lakes Region and travel to Muskingum (39-3) for the first round Friday through Monday, May 9-12. Wittenberg opens the five-team, double-elimination tournament at 11:00 a.m. on Friday against the fifth seed, Cabrini (33-6). The winner advances to play Muskingum, also on Friday. The winner of the first round tournament advances as the number three seed to the Finals, hosted by the city of Salem, Virginia and the Old Dominion Athletic Conference, May 16-20 at the James I. Moyer Sports Complex.

The Tigers won three straight games to capture their first NCAC Tournament title last weekend. The clincher came Saturday as the Tigers, the No. 2 seed after finishing second in the regular season, upended two-time defending champion and No. 1 seed Denison (24-18), 2-1, in the championship game. In Friday's Tourney opener, Wittenberg defeated No. 4 seed Allegheny (16-22-1), 5-2, behind the pitching and hitting of sophomore **Norah Gillam (Canfield, OH/Canfield)**. In the second game of the day, the Tigers defeated No. 4 seed Ohio Wesleyan (20-22), 1-0, in nine innings as junior **Kristen Hillebrand (Cincinnati, OH/McAuley)** scored on a wild pitch and sophomore **Jen Fleming (Dayton, OH/Chaminade-Julienne)** hurled a complete game shutout victory. In Saturday's title game, Gillam was again outstanding on the mound and senior **Beth Walters (Westerville, OH/DeSales)** delivered a two-out run-scoring single in the bottom of the seventh inning to win the game and send the Tigers into the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2000.

Four Tiger players were named to the 2003 NCAC All-Tournament Team: Walters, Gillam, junior outfielder **Carmen Montgomery (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern)** and sophomore second baseman **Katie Niemeyer (Findlay, Ohio/Findlay)**. Gillam was named Most Outstanding Player. Denison and Ohio Wesleyan each had three players named to the All-Tournament team. The Big Red were represented by seniors **Nikki Brehm (Bexley, OH/Bexley)**, **Lindsey Fischer (Gahanna, OH/Gahanna)** and junior **Sara Mullen (Seymour, WI/Seymour)**. The Bishops were represented by seniors **Tammy Blair (Radnor, OH/Buckeye Valley)** and **Emily Thornton (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** and freshman **Lindsey Longstreth (Akron, OH/Archbishop Hoban)**. Allegheny's **Sarah Johnston (Renfrew, PA/Butler Area)**, a sophomore, and **Shawn Gledhill (Erie, PA/McDowell)**, a junior, also earned All-Tourney nods.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

NCAC Champion: Kenyon

After defeating Kalamazoo, 5-0, in the first round of the NCAA Division III Championship, the Kenyon men's tennis team could not repeat the feat against Washington (Mo.) in the regional final. The Lords fell to the Bears, 5-0, and were eliminated from tournament play.

The Lords' appearance in the NCAA Championship tournament was their second in a row and their seventh overall. It was also the second season in row that the team won its first-round match, but lost its second-round match. The loss also ended a 14-match winning streak for Kenyon, which wrapped up its season with an overall record of 19-4.

Kenyon entered the match ranked 15th in the nation, while Washington was 11th.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

NCAC Champion: Denison

Washington (Mo.) defeated Denison, 7-2 in the first round of the 2003 NCAA Division III Women's Tennis Championships hosted by DePauw University.

The Big Red entered singles competition trailing 2-1 after picking up a victory in doubles play. The team of **Katie Lavoie (Birmingham, MI/Cranbrook Kingswood)** and **Allison Lesnett (Canfield, OH/Canfield)** won 8-4 over Washington's Steph Cook and Kacie Cook. In singles play **Ali Hughes (Wauwatosa, WI/Divine Savior Holy Angels)** was Denison's lone winner as she defeated Steph Cook, 6-1, 5-7, 6-1.

Denison entered the match ranked 15th in the nation. Washington is ranked ninth in NCAA Division III.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT **NCAC Championship: Allegheny Men and Women**

The Allegheny women won their third straight team title at the NCAC Championships, held at Ohio Wesleyan on May 2-3. The Gators captured four first and eight other top-three finishes to total 161 points and outdistance Oberlin (139), Denison (124) and Wittenberg (119) in the women's field. The North Coast championship is the 10th for the Gators. The Allegheny men claimed their fourth NCAC crown and first since 1998, scoring 197 points to surpass defending champion Wittenberg (172), Wooster (85) and Wabash (81). The Gators won six events and posted eight other top-three finishes.

The NCAA Division III Championships will take place Thursday through Saturday, May 22-24 at St. Lawrence. A total of 334 athletes will compete in the championships. Athletes qualify by reaching the automatic and provisional standards established for each event. The spots remaining in the field after the automatic qualifiers are filled from the descending order list of provisional qualifiers May 19.

Women's Most Valuable Performers: Denison junior **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** was voted Sprints/Hurdles MVP for the second time after she won the 100 meters (12.25), 200 meters (25.37) and anchored the winning 1600 meter relay team. She met the NCAA provisional standard in both sprints and broke her own conference mark in the 100. Allegheny sophomore **Leah Shouey (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)** was the Middle Distance/Distance MVP. She won the 1500 meters (4:40.59) and was runner up in the 800 meters (2:21.05) and 5000 meters (18:19.86). She met the NCAA provisional standard in the 1500. Denison junior **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** kept her unbeaten streak in the shot put (40-8 1/4) and discus (145-6) alive to earn Field MVP honors. She met the NCAA provisional standard and set a conference mark in the discus.

Men's Most Valuable Performers: Allegheny freshman **RaShaun Allen (Columbus, OH/St. Charles Prep)** was named Sprint/Hurdles MVP after he won the 200 meters (22.73), was second in the 100 meters (11.11) and led off the winning 4x100 meter relay. Teammate **Dan Princic (Carrolton, OH/Carrolton)** earned Middle Distance/Distance MVP honors after he won the 1500 meters (4:02.89), 5000 meters (15:13.95) and 10,000 meters (31:27.98). He met the NCAA provisional cut in the 1500. The Field MVP was Wittenberg junior **Tim Gaal (Amanda, OH/Clearcreek)**, who won the decathlon (6101 points) and javelin (200'3"), and was third in the long jump (20'10"). He met the NCAA provisional standard in the decathlon and the javelin.

Coach of the Year: Allegheny head coach Bill Ross was named coach of the year of both the men's and women's championships. It is his second men's outdoor track honor and fifth straight women's nod.

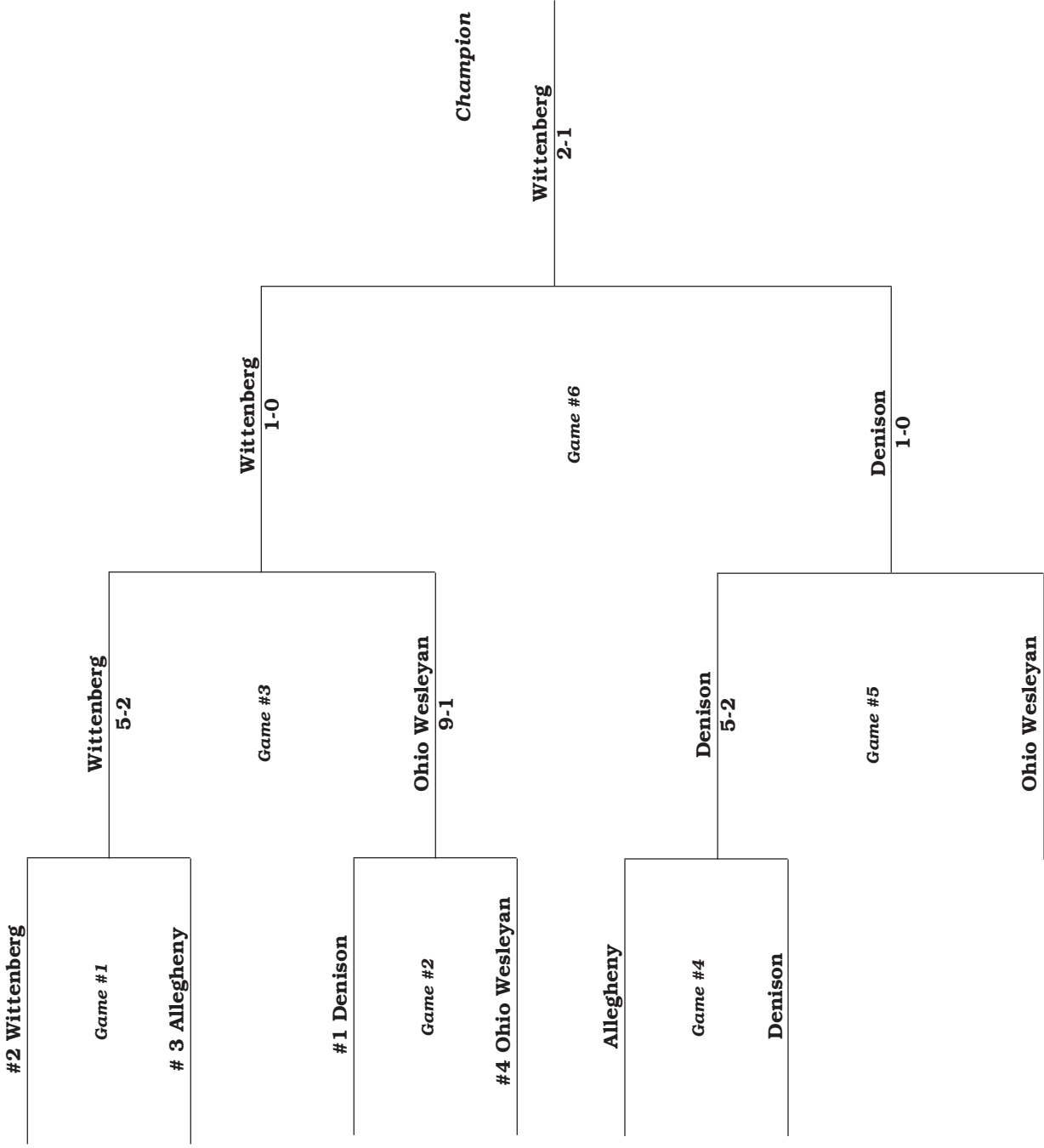
