NCAC Football Report

**FOUR CONFERENCE GAMES SLATED FOR SATURDAY;
OBERLIN AND WABASH SHARE FIRST PLACE AFTER FIRST NCAC GAMES**

CLEVELAND -- The race for the NCAC championship begins in earnest this week, with four league games slated for Saturday. Three of the contests will feature a team striving to hang on to its currently undefeated record. Wabash (1-0, 3-0), Wittenberg (0-0, 3-0) and Wooster (0-0, 3-0), all at 3-0 overall, look to keep the wins rolling in.

The Little Giants, currently tied with Oberlin for first place in the conference standings by virtue of a single NCAC win, welcome Allegheny (1-2) to Crawfordsville. Last week, Wabash topped Kenyon, 58-0. The Little Giants lead the all-time series against the Lords, 4-1. Kenyon last beat Wabash in 1942, a 7-0 shutout. Junior running back **Chris Morris (Zionsville, IN/Zionsville)** paced the Little Giants with 205 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 12 carries. He's the first Wabash running back to to rush for over 100 yards in three straight games since 1998. Wittenberg opens its NCAC title defense at home against Denison (0-0, 0-3). The Tigers, ranked fourth in the country, rolled over Thomas More last week, 31-6. Last year, Wittenberg traveled to Kentucky and defeated the Saints 41-0 in the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament. The Big Red were idle last week.

Wooster travels to Ohio Wesleyan (0-0, 2-1) Saturday. The Fighting Scots fended off the powerful offense of Case Western Reserve last week for a hard-fought 27-22 win. Sophomore **Tony Sutton (Akron, OH/Archbishop Hoban)** rushed for 261 yards, the third-highest total in Wooster history and the second-highest at John P. Papp Stadium, the Scots home field. His performance was highlighted by a 35-yard touchdown run at the beginning of the second quarter which gave the Scots a 17-13 lead after they trailed for the first and only time this season (13-10). Kenyon (0-1, 0-4) and Earlham (0-0, 0-3) will both be looking for their first wins of the season when they meet in Gambier in the fourth and final NCAC game this week. The Lords look to rebound from a loss to Wabash, while the Quakers return to action after a week off.

There is only one non-conference game slated for this week: Frostburg State at Oberlin (1-0, 1-2). The Yeomen share first place in the standings with Wabash, after last week's come-from-behind 35-14 win over Hiram. Hiram (0-1, 0-4) is idle on Saturday. The Terriers resume play on Oct. 12 at Allegheny.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Oberlin sophomore **Chris Jordan (Temecula, CA/Chapparral)** and Wittenberg senior **Dustin Goldsbury (Columbus, OH/Bishop Ready)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances last week in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Jordan, a 5-10, 185-pound running back, rushed for 181 yards on 23 carries. With Oberlin trailing 14-6 after the first half, Jordan opened the third quarter with two touchdowns, leading the Yeomen to a 35-14 come-from-behind win.

Goldsbury, a 6-0, 235-pound linebacker, recorded three tackles, leading the Tiger defense that held Thomas More to just 13 yards on 27 rushing attempts. Goldsbury also had two sacks for a loss of 14 yards, as well as one interception, which he returned six yards. Wittenberg beat Thomas More 31-6.

GRID NOTEBOOK

Three NCAC teams have perfect records after four weeks of play with all four at 3-0: Wabash, Wittenberg and Wooster ... Wittenberg remains fourth in the second AFCA Division III Coaches' poll, while Ohio Wesleyan moves up three spots to 13th. Both Allegheny and Wabash received votes for the second straight week ... Allegheny junior quarterback **Bubba Smith (Doylestown, OH/Chippewa)** led Allegheny against Westminster in rushing (19 carries for 78 yards) and passing (16-of-37, 245 yards) ... Hiram's 35-14 loss to Oberlin overshadowed the outstanding play of freshman running back **Tim Anderson (Akron, OH/Central-Hover)**. Anderson ran with the ball 22 times, grinding out 221 yards, the second most in a single game in Terriers' history. The record of 222 was set by **Kris Giebel** last fall in a win over Oberlin. Anderson also scored the first two touchdowns of the game, giving Hiram a 14-0 lead through the first quarter. He finished the game with 237 of the Terrier's 274 total net yards ... Kenyon's **Jeremiah Thompson (Cleveland, OH/University)** made 11 tackles against Wabash, including three and one-half tackles for a loss ... Wabash has won 10 consecutive games dating back to last season, including seven straight NCAC games ... Wittenberg last lost a league game in 1997, dropping a 21-19 decision to Wooster ... *d3football.com*'s **Keith McMillan** had the readers of his weekly column recommend the "Best Places to Watch a Division III Game." Wabash and Wooster were two of 13 fan favorites (*Around the Nation*, Sept. 20).

NCAC Fall Sports Update

**UNDEFEATED WITTENBERG FIELD HOCKEY FACES TWO NCAC FOES;
WOOSTER MEN'S SOCCER CLAIMS FIRST PLACE AS ONLY UNDEFEATED TEAM**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

CROSS COUNTRY REPORT

At last week's College of Wooster Invitational, Kenyon finished second in both the men's and the women's competition. Oberlin was third in the women's race, followed by Wooster in fourth. Hiram ran eighth in the 11-team meet. Wooster was fifth in the men's meet, followed by the Yeomen in sixth and the Terriers in ninth. Six woman runners from North Coast schools finished in the top 10 of a field of 121 runners. Kenyon freshman **Christina McNamera (Chappaqua, NY/Horace Greeley)** led the way in second place with a 19:22 clocking. Oberlin senior **Laura Feeney (Stattsburg, NY/Franklin D. Roosevelt)** was right behind her in third (19:41) with teammate **Lori Tuchfeld (North Merrick, NY/Sanford H. Calhoun)** in sixth (19:54). Wooster sophomores **Tiffany White (Kent, OH/Roosevelt)** and **Jennifer Stockdale (Rocky River, OH/St. Joseph Academy)** finished side-by-side in seventh (19:55) and eighth (19:56) places, and Kenyon junior **Tenaya Britton (Bethesda, MD/Walter Johnson)** was ninth (19:57). Senior **Jenny Wilke (Sandusky, OH/Sandusky)** was Hiram's top finisher in 16th (20:16).

On the men's side, Kenyon seniors **Ben Hildebrand (Fairport, NY/The Harley School)** and **Michael Baird (Temple, TX/Temple)** were second (26:05) and third (26:26) and classmate **Matt Cabrera (Longmont, CO/Skyview, WA)** was fifth (27:05) in the 104-runner field. Also in the top 10 were Oberlin junior **Adam Greeney (Amherst, MA/Regional)** in sixth place (27:11) and Wooster senior **Evan McDaniel (Grass Valley, CA/Nevada Union)** in ninth (27:20). The top individual for the Terriers was freshman **Aaron Adams (Coldwater, OH/Celina)** in 29th place (28:34).

The only other team to see action last week was Ohio Wesleyan. The Bishop women were sixth of seven and the Bishop men sixth of eight at Otterbein's invitational. Freshman **Nina DiTraglia (Portsmouth/Gilmour Academy)** paced the women's squad with a 24th place finish in 21:03.6. Sophomore **Bill Bedford (Strongsville, OH/Strongsville)** was the men's top individual in 37th place (28:43.5).

In the coming week, Allegheny will compete in the Dickinson Invitational, Denison and Earlham will run in the Earlham Invitational, Wabash will participate in the Notre Dame Invitational and Wittenberg is scheduled to compete in the Loyola Lakefront Invitational. Hiram, Kenyon, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster are idle.

Polls: In the NCAA Division III Men's Cross Country Poll (Sept. 25), Allegheny was ranked in a tie for 23rd place. In the women's poll, the Gators stand 14th, and Denison makes its debut in 25th.

FIELD HOCKEY REPORT

Wittenberg (5-0, 9-0), ranked 14th nationally by the NFHCA, continues to roll through the season. The Tigers are the North Coast's only undefeated team at the season's midpoint and are one of only eight teams across the nation without a loss. Wittenberg puts its unblemished mark on the line in two conference matches this week. On Wednesday, the Tigers travel to fifth-place Earlham (2-4, 4-5). The Tigers and Quakers met earlier this season, with Wittenberg taking a 3-0 win in Springfield. Earlham has won four of its six games since that date. On Friday, the Tigers return home to host the first of this season's two matchups with defending NCAC champion Wooster (4-1, 6-2).

The Fighting Scots open the week at fourth-place Oberlin (3-2, 4-2) on Tuesday. Also on Tuesday, third-place Denison travels to Kenyon (1-5, 3-5). On Thursday, Ohio Wesleyan (0-5, 2-7) heads up the road to Denison. Oberlin and Earlham close out the week's schedule on Saturday with a game in Richmond, IN.

Notes: Last week Denison topped Earlham, 3-1, behind the efforts of sophomore **Karen Lancaster (Hurst, TX/L.D. Bell)**, who tallied two goals and one assist against the Quakers. Earlham's **Becca Aldred (Glen Mills, PA/West Nottingham Academy)**,

a junior midfielder, scored the Quakers' lone goal. Aldred is fourth among NCAC scorers with six goals and one assist over nine games (1.44 points per game), while Lancaster is seventh with four goals and two assists in 10 games (1 ppg) ... Kenyon junior goalkeeper **Tamar Chalker (Meriden, NH/Deerfield)** made a combined 30 saves in losses to Wittenberg and Oberlin last week ... Wittenberg goalkeeper **Jan Meyer (Solon, OH/Hathaway Brown)** earned her seventh shutout of the season last week. The senior, who is working on a streak of five straight NCAC shutouts, entered the week ranked third in Div. III in Goals Against Average and in save Percentage. She currently leads the NCAC in both categories (.43 GAA and .936 save percentage).

MEN'S SOCCER REPORT

The NCAC season gets into high gear with eight conference matches on the slate in the coming week. Unbeaten Wooster (2-0-0, 10-0-1) enters the week alone in first place and travels to Hiram (0-0-0, 1-6-1) in the Terriers' conference opener on Tuesday. The Scots return home Saturday to host Ohio Wesleyan (1-1-0, 10-1-0), which lost for the first time in 22 games last week. Hiram travels to Earlham (1-0-1, 3-3-3), 2-1 winners over Kenyon (0-1-0, 3-8-0) last weekend, to close out its week. Denison (1-0-1, 5-4-1), fresh off a 1-0 defeat of the Bishops, visits both Oberlin (0-0-0, 6-3-1) and Wittenberg (0-1-0, 2-7-1) this week. The Yeomen travel to Wabash (0-2-0, 5-5-0) on the weekend for the Little Giants' only competition this week. The Tigers take on Earlham on Tuesday. After a non-conference contest at John Carroll on Wednesday, Allegheny (1-1-0, 6-3-0) travels to take on the Lords. The Gators picked up a 2-0 decision over Wittenberg last week.

Notes: Ohio Wesleyan entered the week ranked third in the latest NSCAA/adidas National Rankings (Sept. 23). The Bishops top the Great Lakes Regional Ranking, where they are joined by Wooster in fourth. Allegheny, ninth last week in the regional rankings dropped off the list ... Denison goalkeeper **Nick Saper (Evanston, IL/Evanston Township)** led the Big Red to victory over Ohio Wesleyan with eight saves. The Bishops outshot Denison 25-9 in the contest but couldn't get the ball past Saper ... Earlham's leading scorer **Jason Seaman (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** scored twice in the Quakers' 4-1 defeat of Taylor then tallied one in a 2-1 decision over Kenyon. Seaman ranks fifth in the NCAC with 1.44 points per game ... Kenyon senior **Andrew Sheridan (Cleveland Hts., OH/Hawken)** scored the Lords' goal in the loss to Earlham. He has four goals and nine points in the past four games ... Wittenberg's 2-1 loss to Wilmington was the team's fifth loss by one goal this season ... Wooster senior forward **Ryan McManus (Westfield, OH/Cloverleaf)** totaled seven points last week. He recorded one goal and two assists in a 6-0 defeat of Muskingum, then scored the first goal and assisted on the second in a 2-0 defeat of Wabash ... Three different players notched three points in the Little Giants' 4-2 victory over Hanover. Freshman **Chase Lamm (Brownsburg, IN/Brownsburg)**, senior **Carlos Aguirre (Indianapolis, IN/Ben Davis)** and sophomore **Tom Reifenberg (Ft. Wayne, IN/Bishop Luers)** each recorded one goal and one assist. Lamm's goal was the game-winner, the first of his collegiate career.

WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT

With six North Coast Athletic Conference contests slated for the coming week, the standings could see quite a shakeup. Defending champion Ohio Wesleyan (2-0-0, 10-0-0), currently tied with Allegheny (2-0-0, 8-2-0) in first place, square off on Saturday in Meadville. The four teams stuck in a logjam at third also face off this week. Denison (1-0-0, 9-2-0) and Wooster (1-1-0, 8-1-2) meet on Tuesday in Granville, while Kenyon (1-0-0, 4-5-1) and Wittenberg (1-1-0, 3-8-0) meet in Springfield on Saturday. The Big Red and Ladies will each play twice this week. Kenyon hosts Oberlin (0-1-0, 4-5-0) on Tuesday; Denison travels to Oberlin on Saturday. The final game of the week sends Hiram (0-1-0, 3-4-1) to Earlham (0-3-0, 0-9-0). The Terriers and Quakers are tied for seventh with Oberlin.

Notes: In the NSCAA/adidas NCAA Division III Poll (Sept. 23), Ohio Wesleyan remains number one while Denison moves up two spots to 18th. In the Great Lakes Region, Ohio Wesleyan is first, Denison, third, Wooster is sixth and Allegheny is seventh ... The NCAC boasts four teams without a loss in conference play: Allegheny, Denison and Kenyon and Ohio Wesleyan. Only the Bishops are undefeated overall. With two wins last week, Ohio Wesleyan has extended its school-record winning streak to 31 games ... Denison senior midfielder **Sarah Finke (Centerville, OH/Centerville)** led the Big Red past Hiram, 7-0, with three goals and an assist. **Kerry Doman (Bloomfield Hills, MI/Detroit Country Day)**, a junior forward, recorded identical numbers last week, but spread her scoring out. She had two goals in a 4-0 win over Ohio Northern and picked up a goal and an assist against the Terriers ... Kenyon sophomore midfielder **Heather Preston (Berea, OH)** scored on a penalty kick with 10 seconds left on the clock to lead the Ladies to a 1-0 win over Earlham. The goal was her team-leading sixth of the year ... Wittenberg All-NCAC junior forward **Geri Woessner (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** is out for the rest of the soccer season, as well as the basketball season, with a torn ACL. Woessner was the NCAC women's soccer player of the week last week ... Senior midfielder **Jessica Bacon (Rocky River, OH/Rocky River)** scored one goal in each of Wooster's two wins last week with both goals coming in the ninth minute of each game.

VOLLEYBALL REPORT

The second of three conference tri-match weekends is upcoming this Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan (0-2, 1-17) hosts Allegheny (1-2, 5-13) and NCAC co-leader Denison (2-0, 9-6); Earlham (1-2, 1-17) plays host to this year's surprise team Hiram (3-1,

10-7) and Kenyon (1-1, 9-12); And Oberlin (0-2, 2-14) welcomes Wooster (1-1, 13-9) and conference co-leader Wittenberg (3-0, 16-4). Last week's conference action featured a win by Hiram over Oberlin on Wednesday and victories by Allegheny and Wittenberg over the Terriers and Quakers, respectively on Saturday. The Gators snapped Hiram's six-match winning streak in straight sets.

Notes: In the second AVCA Division III Coaches Poll of 2002, Wittenberg ranks 14th ... Kenyon senior **Lauren Camp (Westerville, OH/Olentangy)** led Kenyon to a 2-2 mark last week with 53 kills and 80 digs in four matches ... Wittenberg senior middle hitter **Tiffany Keller (Massillon, OH/Tuslaw)** led the Tigers to victory in the Wittenberg Invitational. She had 62 kills (3.8 per game average), six stuff blocks, eight assists and a .523 kill percentage ...
