### NCAC Men's Basketball Report

#### **FOUR TEAMS SHARE FIRST PLACE AS LEAGUE SCHEDULE RESUMES EIGHT GAMES SLATED FOR THIS WEEK**

**CLEVELAND** -- The 2003-04 basketball season really starts to get interesting this week, as conference teams settle into their league schedules. The defending North Coast champions, the Wooster Fighting Scots (2-0, 9-1), start things off when they host Oberlin (0-2, 4-6) on Wednesday. The Scots won both of their early season NCAC games and look to continue their winning ways, while the Yeomen are in the hunt for their first NCAC win of the season. Last season Wooster topped Oberlin, 86-45, the one time they met on the court.

The Scots have company in the ranks of undefeated teams in the NCAC. Earlham (3-0, 5-6), Wabash (3-0, 5-6) and Wittenberg (2-0, 8-3) have also won all of their early conference games. Earlham and Wooster face off in the first of two meetings this season on Saturday. The Scots swept both meetings with the Quakers last winter. Wabash puts its perfect league record on the line when the Little Giants host Oberlin on Saturday. The Yeomen and Little Giants split a pair of games last season, with each team winning at home. Wittenberg will try to add more wins to the "W" column with two home games this week. Kenyon (0-2, 3-8) rolls into Springfield on Wednesday, followed by Denison (1-1, 3-8) on Saturday. The Tigers defeated Kenyon and Denison in regular season play last season. Wittenberg also topped the Big Red in the quarterfinal round of the NCAC Tournament, 80-74.

This week's schedule includes a third midweek game: Denison at Ohio Wesleyan (1-1, 6-4) and ends on Saturday with all 10 North Coast squads in league play. Allegheny (0-3, 3-7) and Hiram (0-3, 2-10) entertain Kenyon and Ohio Wesleyan, respectively to round out the week's slate of games. **Hoops Notes:** Allegheny senior guard **Matt Magnusen (Plum, PA/Plum)** scored a career-high 33 points against Earlham and accounted for 23 points and eight rebounds against Wabash as the Gators dropped two games last week. The senior averaged 28.0 points and 5.5 rebounds, while hitting 22-of-38 shots (.579 percent) from the field. He hit 14-of-24 shots against the Quakers and went 8-of-14 against the Little Giants. On the season, Magnusen has scored in double-digits every game, is leading Allegheny, and is second in the NCAC, with 19.9 points per game. He is tied for the team lead shooting 50.3 percent (73-145) from the field ... In four games since Dec. 12, Denison freshman **Danny Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** leads the Big Red with a 16.8 points-per-game average. He has led Denison in scoring in eight of the team's 11 games this season. He is third in the NCAC scoring race, averaging 19.2 ppg and is second in field-goal percentage at .600 (72-of-120) ... Earlham's starting five certainly earned their starter status after accounting for all but two points in a 75-71 win over Allegheny last week. The Quakers have opened the season 3-0, the best conference start for an Earlham men's basketball squad since the Quakers joined the league in 1989. A trio of hometown talent led Earlham in scoring. Sophomore **Markous Jewett** and freshmen **Jermaine Crumby** and **LaRon Henry** all from local Richmond high school paced the Quakers with 20,

#### **WABASH'S JOSEPH, DENISON'S SHEFFIELD NAMED NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

**CLEVELAND** -- Wabash's **Adonis Joseph (Mishawaka, IN/Mishawaka)** and Denison's **Kristen Sheffield (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** have been named men's and women's basketball "Players of the Week" in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

**Joseph**, a 6-1, sophomore guard, scored a game-high 16 points in the Little Giants' 80-64 win over Hiram after tallying 12 points against Allegheny the previous night. Joseph added two steals and a blocked shot against the Terriers on Saturday. The sophomore guard missed the early part of the season with injuries, but has returned to average 11.1 points a game overall and 11.0 points per conference contest.

**Sheffield**, a 6-0, freshman wing, averaged 17.3 points per game in Denison's 3-0 week. She scored a career-best 26 against Mt. Vernon Nazarene, then followed with 15 and 11 against Oberlin and Kenyon, respectively. She leads the NCAC in blocked shots with 2.82 per game (31 in 11 games) and is the Big Red's second leading scorer and rebounder. **NCAC Women's Basketball Report**

**OHIO WESLEYAN AND WITTENBERG SHARE EARLY LEAD;  
SEVEN GAMES SLATED FOR THIS WEEK**

**CLEVELAND** -- The North Coast Athletic Conference season shifts into high gear with a full slate of games this week. Highlighting the schedule are Wednesday night contests featuring two teams currently tied for third and two teams looking for their first league win of the season. Denison (2-1, 8-3) hosts Allegheny (2-1, 4-8). Both teams have won two early conference contests and dropped a third. This will be the first of two meetings between the two squads this winter. Last year the squads split a pair of games, with each team winning on its own court. The Big Red are riding a six-game win streak, while the Gators have won two of their last three contests. Also on Wednesday, Wooster (0-3, 5-6) travels to Oberlin (0-3, 1-7). The Fighting Scots edged the Yeowomen twice last season.

With four games slated for Saturday, four NCAC squads will play two conference contests this week - Allegheny, Denison, Oberlin and Wooster. The Gators, Yeowomen and Scots host Kenyon (2-2, 5-6), Wittenberg (3-0, 7-5) and Earlham (2-2, 4-7) while the Big Red travel to Hiram. Allegheny, Wittenberg and Denison swept the regular-season series against these opponents in 2002-03. Ohio Wesleyan (4-0, 8-3) has no league games this week; The Battling Bishops return to NCAC play on Wednesday, Jan. 14 at Denison. They travel to Washington & Jefferson on Wednesday in non-conference action. Wittenberg and Ohio Wesleyan share the early lead after opening their league schedule with perfect records. **Hoops Notes:** Allegheny won two of three games last week. The Gators started off with a come-from-behind defeat of Case as senior guard **Jessica Kankoski (Glenshaw, PA/Fox Chapel)** scored a career-high 31 points. She was instrumental in the comeback as 14 of her points came in the last 10:43 when the Gators trailed by 20 points. In a loss to Wittenberg, junior forward **Meredith McDonough (Pittsburgh, PA/Oakland Catholic)** scored 16 and pulled down 10 boards for her fifth double-double of the season. Sophomore guard **Caitlin Murtagh (Bethel Park, PA/Seton LaSalle)** led the team to a victory over Earlham with career-highs in points (26) and rebounds (8) ... Freshman **Kristen Sheffield (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** averaged 17.3 points per game in Denison's 3-0 week. She scored a career-best 26 against Mt. Vernon Nazarene, then followed with 15 and 11 against Oberlin and Kenyon, respectively. She leads the NCAC in blocked shots with 2.82 per game (31 in 11 games) and is the Big Red's second leading scorer and rebounder. Junior **Dana Halicki (North Royalton, OH/Padua)** scored a combined 34 points and grabbed 13 rebounds in Kenyon's three losses last week. Halicki tossed in a career-best 20 points in a loss to Denison ... Oberlin returned to action after nearly three weeks off and lost to Defiance and Denison. Junior forward **Christina Briboneria (Houston, TX/Bellaire)** scored a game-high 14 points against the Yellow Jackets and picked off seven steals. Junior **Nicole Burford (Toledo, OH/Rogers)**, who had a career-high 22 in a loss to Notre Dame College on Dec. 12, scored 18 and grabbed six boards in a loss to Denison on Saturday ... Ohio Wesleyan won twice in conference play stay on top of the standings, but also dropped a four-point decision to Ohio Northern last week. Freshman post **Tifini Ray (Hilliard, OH/Davidson)** made two critical plays in the overtime period to help the Bishops upend Kenyon, then keyed a 15-point comeback with eight straight points in the second half against Wooster. Junior **Kelly Heil (Sylvania, OH/Southview)** scored 54 points in the three games, including 21 against both ONU and Wooster. Classmate **Erica Brizendine (Grove City, OH/Grove City)** had 29 rebounds in three games and contributed 44 points ... Wittenberg extended its NCAC winning streak to 23 with victories over Allegheny and Hiram. Senior **Geri Woessner (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** scored 13 points and grabbed eight rebounds in the game against the Gators. Senior **Haley Warden (Loveland, OH/Indian Hill)** was the only Tiger in double figures (10) as the entire bench saw action in the win over Hiram ... Wooster routed Lake Erie in their first game back after a 12-day break, then lost a tight game to OWU, 67-62. All 17 Scots scored in the game against Lake Erie, led by **Sara Perry's (North Ridgeville, OH/North Ridgeville)** eight points. Versus Ohio Wesleyan, freshman **Carly Loehrke (Kalamazoo, MI/Mattawan)** led Wooster with 13 points and 11 boards in a game in which the Scots led by as much as 14 with 15:33 to play before the persistent Bishops stormed back to steal the game.

**CLEVELAND** -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's recent swimming and diving action.

North Coast Athletic Conference swimming squads return to regular-season action in the next two weeks. Allegheny swims at Westminster on Jan. 16 ... Denison, which is currently competing against Indiana and Bucknell in Naples, Florida, returns home on Saturday to take on Eastern Michigan ... Hiram spent the winter break competing at the non-scoring University of Hawaii Rainbow Invitational. Senior **Jason Groselle (Hiram, OH/Crestwood)** was seventh in the 50 breaststroke (28.72) and the 11th in the 50 freestyle (22.67), and junior **Zach Huggins (Ashtabula, OH/Sts. John and Paul)** was seventh in the 50 backstroke (27.93) and 11th in the 100 back (59.12). Sophomore **Beth Groselle (Hiram, OH/Crestwood)** led the women's squad with a sixth-place finish in the 100 individual medley (1:00.62) and a tenth-place finish in the 50 butterfly (27.53). The Terriers travel to Mount Union for a dual meet on Saturday ... Kenyon sees competition next on Jan. 16 when they meet Cincinnati and Miami (OH) in the Red Hawks' pool ... Oberlin spent the winter break in Clearwater, Florida, and next compete at home with a dual against Kenyon on Jan. 17 ... Ohio Wesleyan finished ninth of 12 NCAA Division II, III and NAIA teams at the Ed Kennedy Invitational in Fort Lauderdale. Sophomore **Lindley Stirn (Madison, WI/James Madison Memorial)** placed sixth in the 200 free (2:23.75) as the top individual finisher for the Bishops. Sophomore **Rachel Kaufman (Lima, OH/Senior)** was seventh in the 50 free. OWU's next competition is a dual meet at Findlay on Saturday ... The Wabash tankers trained in the Bahamas over the holiday break. The Little Giants return to action at this weekend's University of Indianapolis Invitational, and also host the Wabash January Diving Classic in their own natatorium ... Wittenberg returns to competition with a Jan. 17 dual at Denison ... Wooster resumes varsity action on Saturday with a double-dual at Oberlin with Case Western Reserve.

He led the Yeoman past Bethany with 28 points, shooting 11-for-15 from the floor and grabbing 11 rebounds. Ikpoh is fifth in NCAC scoring (17.8 ppg) ... Ohio Wesleyan senior post **Travis Schwab (Medina, OH/Medina)** was named to all-tournament team at the Otterbein "O" Club Classic after he led the Battling Bishops with 28 points and nine rebounds in 89-88 win over 19th-ranked Maryville in semifinals and scored 15 points and 10 rebounds in 65-64 loss to Otterbein in the championship game. He scored five points to highlight a 13-2 run that put Ohio Wesleyan ahead to stay, then scored eight points during a 12-0 burst that helped break open a 78-56 NCAC win at Kenyon on Saturday. He led the Bishops with 22 points and grabbed five rebounds. Schwab continues to pace all North Coast scorers with 149 points in seven games (21.3 ppg) ... Wabash sophomore **Adonis Joseph (Mishawaka, IN/Mishawaka)** scored a game-high 16 points in the Little Giants' 80-64 win over Hiram after tallying 12 points against Allegheny the previous night. Joseph added two steals and a blocked shot against the Terriers on Saturday. The sophomore guard missed the early part of the season with injuries, but has returned to average 11.1 points a game overall and 11.0 points per conference contest ... Wittenberg sophomore **Daniel Russ (Louisville, KY/Trinity)** combined for 24 points to help the Tigers win twice last week. He had a team-high 14 points in a 72-62 win over Case Western Reserve and was one of four Tiger players in double figures against the Spartans. He then scored 10 points and picked up nine rebounds in a 67-48 win over Oberlin. Russ leads the NCAC in blocked shots with 23 blocks over 11 games (2.09 bpg) and ranks in the top 10 in four other NCAC statistical categories: scoring (ninth - 15.6 ppg), rebounding (fourth - 8.3 rpg), field goal percentage (seventh - 66-127/.520) and offensive rebounds (eighth - 2.45 orpg) ... Wooster senior **Rodney Mitchell (Elida, OH/Elida)** scored six straight points in the closing moments of the game to give 12th-ranked Wooster a 68-61 win over No. 4 Hanover in the championship game of the 41st annual "Mose" Hole/Wooster Kiwanis Classic. He finished the game with 15 points and six rebounds and was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player. During the Scots' first game of the tournament, a 93-55 win over MacMurray, he produced a double-double with 22 points and 11 rebounds.
