NCAC Men's Basketball Report

ALL 10 NCAC TEAMS TO SEE NCAC PLAY

WOOSTER OPENS TITLE DEFENSE WITH WIN

CLEVELAND -- Every conference team will see North Coast Athletic Conference action this weekend. Defending champion Wooster (1-0, 4-1) and Denison (0-1, 1-5) played the conference opener on Wednesday night, and the Fighting Scots came away with an 84-67 decision.

The Scots host their NCAC home opener on Saturday when Ohio Wesleyan (0-0, 3-2) comes to town. Both squads enter the game riding two-game winning streaks. The Big Red travels to Hiram (0-0, 1-4) hoping to stop a four-game skid, while the Terriers aim to stop a three-game slide of their own. Last year's runner-up, Wittenberg (0-0, 3-2), opens the NCAC schedule with a road game at Allegheny (0-0, 2-3), last year's third-place squad. Wabash (0-0, 1-5) looks to snap a five-game losing streak with a home contest against Kenyon (0-0, 3-3). The Lords are coming off of two straight victories and have won three of their last four. Finally, Earlham (0-0, 2-4) and Oberlin (0-0, 3-2) face off in Richmond, Indiana.

Hoops Notes: Allegheny senior forward **Matt Magnusen (Plum, PA/Plum)** scored a career-high 31 points as the Gators won for the first time this season, 86-77 over LaRoche. He also recorded eight rebounds and four assists. In Allegheny's National City Holiday Classic, Magnusen averaged 21 points and 6.5 rebounds. Sophomore forward **Matt Majzlik (Monaca, PA/Hopewell)** averaged 20.3 points and 9.3 rebounds as the Gators went 2-1 for the week. He leads his team and the NCAC in scoring (20 ppg) and rebounding (9.4 rpg) ... Denison junior forward **Chris Hull (Winnetka, IL/New Trier)** posted a career-best 18 points in the Big Red's conference-opening loss to Wooster. Freshman **Danny Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** leads Denison, and shares the conference lead, in scoring (20.0 ppg) and is second in the NCAC in rebounding (9.2 rpg) through six games. His best effort came in his team's loss to Wooster when he had a career-high in points (22) and hauled in eight boards. He is shooting 63 percent from the field, second-best in the NCAC ... Earlham sophomore **Brandon Miller (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** averaged 12.3 points and eight boards as the Quakers went 1-2 last week. Sophomore **Markous Jewett (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** hit 20 of 22 free throw attempts (.909) and dished out 10 assists in those contests. Freshman **Jermaine Crumby (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** had 42 points and 20 rebounds in three games last week ... Sophomore **Matt Formato (Downers Grove, IL/North)** led Kenyon to a 2-1 week with 53 points and 13 assists and hit nine three-pointers ... Freshman **Alex Malone (Toledo, OH/Woodward)** scored a career-best 22 points in Oberlin's loss to Baldwin-Wallace. Senior **Chris Ikpoh (Michigan City, IN/Michigan City)** led a quintet of Yeomen in double figures in a victory over Manchester. He sank 18 points and averages 16.4 points per game through five contests. Freshman **Chris Williams (Pittsburgh, PA/Woodland Hills)** recorded his first collegiate double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds against Manchester ... Ohio Wesleyan's **Charlie Smith (Centerburg, OH/Centerburg)** scored 38 points as the Bishops went 2-0 in the NCAC-OAC challenge. OWU nipped Mount Union 77-76, and then edged Marietta, 69-65 in overtime. Smith shot 16-for-19 (.842) in the two games. Senior **Travis Schwab (Medina, OH/Medina)** scored 44 points, with 22 in each game, in his first action of the season after recovering from an injury ... Wabash sophomore **Kyle Coffey (Greenwood, IN/Center Grove)** scored 12 points to lead the Little Giants in a loss to Rose-Hulman, a career-best ... Wittenberg sophomore **Daniel Russ (Louisville, KY/**

RUSS, HEIL NAMED NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Allegheny's **Matt Majzlik (Monaca, PA/Hopewell)** and Ohio Wesleyan's **Kelly Heil (Sylvania, OH/Southview)** have been named men's and women's basketball "Players of the Week" in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Majzlik, a 6-5, sophomore forward, averaged 20.3 points and 9.3 rebounds as the Gators went 2-1 last week. The sophomore shot 52.9 percent (27-51) from the field and recorded a double-double in two of the games. He had 22 points and 13 rebounds against LaRoche and added 16 points and 10 rebounds against St. John Fisher. For the year, Majzlik is leading the team, and the NCAC, in scoring (20.0 ppg) and in rebounding (9.4 rpg), while shooting 50.0 percent (41-82) from the field.

Heil, a 5-10, junior wing, averaged 28.3 points and 10.67 rebounds in three wins last week. Against Case, she scored six of her game-high 28 points during the final :15 as the Bishops finished the game with a 12-0 run. With OWU trailing, 73-71, Heil stole the ball and streaked downcourt for a lay-in to tie the game with :12 left. Fouled on the play, Heil was awarded two free throws and the Bishops retained possession of the ball. Heil hit her first free throw, giving Ohio Wesleyan a 74-73 lead, but missed the second. On the ensuing possession, Heil converted a 3-point play to account for the 77-73 final. She finished with 28 points, eight rebounds. Heil scored 7 consecutive points to put Ohio Wesleyan ahead to stay against Mt. Union. She broke a 10-10 tie with a three-point play off a fast break to give the Bishops a 13-10 lead with 10:36 left in the first half and went on to lead the Bishops with 30 points and 12 rebounds. Heil led the Bishops with 27 points, 12 rebounds and 6 assists in Ohio Wesleyan's NCAC opener against Oberlin. The game featured 22 lead changes and 12 ties.

CLEVELAND -- With three league games slated for Saturday, all nine NCAC teams will have begun their conference schedules by the end of the week. Hiram (0-2) is the only school to not play a league game. The Terriers host Ohio Wesleyan (1-0, 5-1) on Saturday. Hiram is looking for their first win of the season, while the Battling Bishops have won four straight, including their NCAC opener against Oberlin, 69-66.

The other two conference tilts this weekend send Oberlin (0-1, 1-2) to Earlham (0-1, 1-3) and Kenyon (1-0, 3-3) to Wooster (0-1, 3-2). The Ladies opened their 2003-04 league schedule with a 63-61 win over the Quakers. Allegheny (1-0, 2-3) and defending North Coast champion Wittenberg (1-0, 3-2) also won their conference openers last week. The Gators topped the Fighting Scots, 63-50, while the Tigers defeated Denison, 50-45.

Hoops Notes: Allegheny junior forward **Meredith McDonough (Pittsburgh, PA/Oakland Catholic)** averaged a double-double last week with 13.5 points and 13.5 rebounds as the Gators went 1-1. In a loss to Pitt-Greensburg, she had 12 points and 14 rebounds and added 15 points and 12 rebounds in a win over Wooster. McDonough leads the squad, and is second in the NCAC, with 10.4 rebounds per game. She also leads the Gators with 13.4 points per game ... Denison freshman **Kristen Sheffield (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** scored eight points, grabbed nine rebounds and blocked a career-high six shots in the loss to Wittenberg. She leads the league averaging 4.0 blocks per game and is second on the Big Red in scoring (11.3 ppg) and in rebounding (8.0 rpg) ... Freshman **Guin Summerton (Williams, IN/Shoals)** scored 16 second-half points to help Earlham overcome a 15-point deficit against Kenyon. She netted a three-pointer with 15 seconds left on the clock to tie the game. She finished with a game-high 18 points, including 4-for-5 from behind the three-point arc, and grabbed five rebounds. Senior **Lindsey Chappell (Highland, IN/Highland)** recorded a double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds. She was a perfect 7-for-7 from the free throw line Kenyon freshman **Amy Thurber (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** threw in a career-high 16 points to help the Ladies earn the victory ... Oberlin junior guard **Nicole Burford (Toledo, OH/Rogers)** scored 18 points, grabbed seven boards and had two assists and steals in the loss to Ohio Wesleyan. Senior **Tranice Harrell (Houston, TX/Bellaire)** added 15 points and nine rebounds ... In wins against Case, Mt. Union and Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan junior wing **Kelly Heil (Sylvania, OH/Southview)** averaged 28.3 points and 10.67 rebounds. Against Case, she scored six of her game-high 28 points during the final :15 as the Bishops finished the game with a 12-0 run. With OWU trailing, 73-71, Heil stole the ball and streaked downcourt for a lay-in to tie the game with :12 left. Fouled on the play, Heil was awarded two free throws and the Bishops retained possession of the ball. Heil hit her first free throw, giving Ohio Wesleyan a 74-73 lead, but missed the second. On the ensuing possession, Heil converted a 3-point play to account for the 77-73 final. She finished with 28 points, eight rebounds. Heil scored 7 consecutive points to put Ohio Wesleyan ahead to stay against Mt. Union. She broke a 10-10 tie with a three-point play off a fast break to give the Bishops a 13-10 lead with 10:36 left in the first half and went on to lead the Bishops with 30 points and 12 rebounds. Notre Dame)** were named to the Marietta Turkey Shootout all-tournament team. Hall combined for 24 points and 16 rebounds in the two games, while Schaaff totalled 26 points, eight rebounds and two assists.
