The 22nd annual North Coast Athletic Conference Men's & Women's Swimming and Diving Championships will be held February 9-11 at C.T. Branin Natatorium, in Canton, Ohio. The 2006 meet, hosted by Ohio Wesleyan, is held at an off-campus site to accommodate overwhelming spectator response to the top NCAA Division III swimming and diving conference championship. The Kenyon men's and women's squads are the defending champions. The Lords and Ladies have won 20 of the 21 NCAC crowns contested; The Denison men are the only team to have beaten the Lords in the NCAC meet when they claimed their title in 1997, while the Denison women snapped the Ladies' 19-year hold on the crown in 2004. Swimming & Diving Notes: The Kenyon men swam their last three dual meets in preparation for the upcoming NCAC Championships. The Lords defeated conference foe Hiram, 93-63, were edged by Penn State, 110-94, and defeated Johns Hopkins, 130-97. Against Penn State, Senior **David DeHart (Boulder, CO/Fairview)** registered an NCAA "B" cut and winning time in the 100 backstroke with a season-best clocking of 52.43. He also guided the 200 medley relay team (1:35.33) past the Nittany Lions. DeHart added another season-best, as well as another "B" cut time, winning the 200 freestyle (1:42.78) against Johns Hopkins. The Kenyon women defeated Hiram, 114-84, in their last dual meet before the NCAC Championships. Freshman **Adrienne Amador (Woodstock, GA/Woodstock)** won two individual events, collecting her first victory in the 200 individual medley (2:13.43) and following with a win in the 500 free (5:13.56).

NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (Feb. 5)

CO-MEN'S BASKETBALL

Wooster sophomore **James Cooper (Springfield, OH/Springfield South)**, a 6-0 shooting guard, was the leading scorer in both Fighting Scot wins last week. In a 121-88 win over Allegheny, he went for 25 points and then scored 24 in the win over top-ranked Wittenberg. Overall, he shot 17-of-24 (.708) from the field, including 7-of-9 (.778) three-pointers and 8-of-10 (.800) free throws. He also combined for eight assists (five against Wittenberg), six rebounds and two steals.

Oberlin junior **Quinton Spencer (Chicago, IL/Brother Rice)**, 6-1 guard/forward, led the Yeomen to their first win of the 2005-06 season, a 102-100 triple-overtime victory over Hiram. Spencer racked up a career-high 47 points and 12 rebounds. His point total tied the Oberlin record for most points in a game, held by Chip Winiarski. Spencer also led the way with 27 points and nine rebounds in a 74-65 loss to Denison. For the week, he finished with 74 points and 21 rebounds, nine assists, six steals and a block. He was 27-for-49 (.551) from the floor, 5-for-13 (.385) from the three-point arc and 15-for-20 (.750) from the free throw line.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Denison junior **Caitlin Krupka (Westlake, OH/Holy Name)**, a 5-8 guard, led the Big Red in two victories last week, scoring 17 in an 80-60 decision over Oberlin and 16 in a 58-49 defeat of Wooster. She shot 11-for-23 (.478) from the field including 5-for-9 (.556) from three-point range.

Wabash junior **Nathan Bates (Ossian, IN/Norwell)** was third in the 400 meters (50.76) and ran on the 4x400 meter relay that finished in 3:25.87 at the Illinois Wesleyan Invitational on Feb. 4.

Allegheny freshman **Katie Stewart (Warren, PA/Warren)** was third in the 55 meters (7.69) and fourth in the 200 meters (27.67) at the Case Invitational on Feb. 3.

WOOSTER ROLLS TO 12-0 CONFERENCE RECORD;

FIGHTING SCOTS PLAY THREE OF FOUR REMAINING GAMES AT HOME

CLEVELAND -- Wooster (12-0, 20-1) took a giant step towards its second straight North Coast championship, after rolling past Allegheny, 121-88, and Wittenberg, 88-77, last week. The Fighting Scots, who entered the week ranked second in NCAA Division III by D3hoops.com, will most likely take over the top spot in the national rankings. Wooster hosts three of its four remaining games at home, including both slated for this week. First up is Hiram (1-11, 3-18) on Wednesday, followed by Wabash (7-5, 13-8) on Saturday. The Fighting Scots defeated both of this week's opponents earlier this season. Second-place Wittenberg, who entered the week as the top team in the Div. III rankings, looks to rebound from last week's loss to the Scots with a pair of road games this week. The Tigers travel to third-place Ohio Wesleyan (9-3, 14-7) on Wednesday and to Hiram on Saturday. Wittenberg, which will play three of its four final games on the road, also defeated both teams earlier this season.

Wabash (7-5, 13-8) and Earlham (7-5, 10-11) sit in fourth place. With two weeks left, the two teams would each like to claim the standing, or a higher one, for their own. Things could be decided on Wednesday, when the Quakers and Little Giants face off in Crawfordsville on Wednesday. Earlham won the first meeting between the two squads, 71-59, this winter. The Quakers will close out their week with a home contest against Ohio Wesleyan. Earlham edged the Bishops earlier this season, 87-86 in overtime. Sixth-place Denison (6-6, 10-11) is not out of the running for a top-four spot. The Big Red travel to Kenyon (3-9, 6-15) on Wednesday and host Allegheny (4-8, 8-12) on Saturday. The week's final games pit, Oberlin (1-11, 1-19) at Allegheny on Wednesday and Kenyon at Oberlin on Saturday. The Yeomen are coming off their first win of the season, a thrilling 102-100 triple-overtime win over Hiram. Notes: **ALLEGHENY** dropped a pair of games last week, falling to Wooster, 121-88, and to Ohio Wesleyan, 77-67. Four Gators reached double figures against Wooster, including **Jimmy Savage (North Canton, OH/Hoover)** and **Casey McCloskey (Erie, PA/Cathedral Prep)**, who each notched 16 points. Against the Bishops, freshman **Ryan Hollihan (Saxonburg, PA/Knoch)** chipped in 11 points and pulled down 10 rebounds for the second double-double of his career and also added two steals. McCloskey dished out eight assists. ... **DENISON** split a pair of games last week, defeating Oberlin, 74-65, and falling to Wabash, 92-80. Senior **Dan Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** averaged 20.6 points per game and 10 rebounds per game over the two contests. He shot 14-of-21 (.667) and finished with 29 points and 14 rebounds against the Yeomen. He scored 23 points against the Little Giants, becoming the 10th player in Denison history to surpass the 1,300-point mark for his career (1,309). He needs just 20 points to move from 10th to seventh place on the Big Red all-time scoring list. Senior **Robb Hern (Madeira, OH/Madeira)** needs just 63 points to reach 1,000 for his career. Hern is tied for the NCAC lead with 9.0 rebounds per game this season and is trying to become the sixth player in league history to lead the conference in rebounding twice ... **EARLHAM** split a pair of games last week. The Quakers opened with a 61-49 loss to Wittenberg, then rebounded for a 70-60 win over Kenyon. Senior **Brandon Miller (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** paced Earlham with 20 points, 13 rebounds and four assists against Kenyon. Miller, who has 1,380 career points, needs 21 points to move into ninth place on Earlham's all-time scoring list, moving past **Nathan Stoops (1999-2003)** who stands at 1,400 points ... **HIRAM** senior **TC Spencer (Yorkville, OH/Tri-State Christian Academy)** led the Terriers with 44 points and 16 rebounds in losses to Kenyon and Oberlin. For the week, he was 21-37 (.567) from the floor. He picked up a double-double with 22 points and 11 boards in a heart-breaking, triple-overtime loss to Oberlin, 102-100. The Terriers fell to Kenyon, 72-63 ... **KENYON** senior **Matt Formato (Downers Grove, IL/Downers Grove North)** continued his scoring spree with 30 points in a 72-63 win over Hiram and 15 in a 70-60 loss at Earlham. He was a combined 15-of-25 (.600) from the floor in those two games and has averaged 23.4 points per game over his last five games ... **OBERLIN** picked up its first win of the season, with a 102-100 triple-overtime victory over Hiram. The Yeomen had four players reach double figures, led by junior **Quinton Spencer (Chicago, IL/Brother Rice)** who racked up a career-high 47 points and 12 rebounds. His point total tied the Oberlin record for most points in a game, held by **Chip Winiarski**. Oberlin opened the week with a 74-65 loss to Denison. Spencer led the way with 27 points and nine rebounds. For the week, he finished with 74 points and 21 rebounds, nine assists, six steals and a block. He was 27-for-49 (.551) from the floor, 5-for-13 (.385) from the three-point arc and 15-for-20 (.750) from the free throw line ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** junior **Ben Chojnacki (Medina, OH/Medina)** scored to put the Bishops ahead to stay and sophomore **Dustin Rudegear (Yellow Springs, OH/Yellow Springs)** added a free throw for the final margin as OWU defeated Wabash, 71-68. The teams exchanged leads throughout the game, especially in the second half, when each team would hold a five-point lead. The Bishops came out on top, led by senior **Andy Warnock (Delaware, OH/Hayes)**, who tipped in 15 points. Chojnacki scored to tie the game with 1:05 left, then picked up a steal and scored the go-ahead bucket on a putback. He finished with eight points. Ohio Wesleyan also defeated Allegheny, 77-67, last week. The Bishops and Gators were tied 47-47 with 12 minutes on the clock, when Bishop sophomore guard **Casey Teeters (Westerville, OH/Columbus St. Charles)** drilled a three-pointer to put OWU up to stay. Chojnacki led the Bishops with 19 points and 12 rebounds. He scored four points during an 8-0 OWU run in the second-half that turned a one-point Bishop lead into a nine-point margin. Allegheny rallied to within four points on two occasions, but both times Chojnacki scored to keep the Gators at bay ... **WABASH** split a pair of games last week, falling to Ohio Wesleyan, 71-68, and defeating Denison. Senior **Kyle Medeiros (Indianapolis, IN/Ben Davis)** paced the Little Giants against Ohio Wesleyan with 14 points. Senior guard **Adonis Joseph (Mishawaka, IN/Mishawaka)** scored a career-best 35 points, picking up more than a third of the total scored by the Wabash team in its 92-80 win over Denison. He was 10-of-17 (.588) from the field, connecting on seven three-pointers and going a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line. The 35 points were the most since **Josh Estelle** scored 36 against Wooster in 2000. Joseph also had seven rebounds and had an assist and a steal ... **WITTENBERG** split a pair of games last week. The Tigers opened with a 61-49 win over Earlham and then fell, 86-77, to Wooster. Senior **Dane Borchers (Russia, OH/Russia)** led the Tigers against Wooster with 22 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. Senior **Daniel Russ (Louisville, KY/Trinity)** also finished with 22 points and added eight boards ... **WOOSTER** sophomore shooting guard **James Cooper (Springfield, OH/Springfield South)** was the leading scorer in both Fighting Scot wins last week. In a 121-88 win over Allegheny, he went for 25 points and then scored 24 in the win at Wittenberg. WITTENBERG HOLDS TWO-GAME LEAD ENTERING LAST TWO WEEKS OF SEASON; TIGERS FACE EARLHAM AND OHIO WESLEYAN THIS WEEK

CLEVELAND -- With three conference victories last week, Wittenberg (11-1, 15-6) opened up a two-game lead in the North Coast standings with two weeks left in the regular season. This week, the Tigers hope to take two steps closer to the top seed in the upcoming conference tournament with a home game against eighth-place Earlham (3-10, 4-18) Wednesday night, and a road contest at fourth-place Ohio Wesleyan (8-4, 12-9) Saturday. Red-hot Allegheny (10-3, 14-8) had its eight-game win streak – all in NCAC play – snapped last Saturday in a 57-54 loss to the Tigers. The Gators are tied with Denison (10-3, 18-4) for second and the two teams square off Saturday in Granville. Allegheny won the previous meeting, 61-51, on Jan. 14. Denison is on a six game win streak and has won nine of the last 10, the only loss being to the Gators. Before Saturday, however, the Gators host sixth-place (tie) Wooster (3-9, 5-15). The Bishops and fifth-place Kenyon (7-5, 15-6) are battling it out for the fourth and final spot as a host in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament on Feb. 21. The teams meet at Kenyon on Wednesday; Ohio Wesleyan won the previous meeting in Delaware, 88-75, on Jan. 11.

The other game scheduled for Wednesday is sixth-place (tie) Hiram (3-9, 8-11) at ninth-place Oberlin (1-12, 3-18). Saturday, the Terriers travel to take on Wooster, and Kenyon makes the trip west to visit Earlham. Finally, Oberlin has a non-conference matchup at Ursuline. Complete basketball statistics, updated each Sunday and Thursday, are available at www.northcoast.org.

Notes: **ALLEGHENY** won two of three last week, defeating Hiram, 65-60, and Earlham, 88-74, before having its eight game streak snapped against the Tigers, 57-54. **Valery Medwid (Pittsburgh, PA/Montour)** led the Gators versus Hiram with her season-best 16 points. **Meghan Vasilisin (Munhall, PA/Oakland Catholic)** led a quartet of Gators in double figures against Earlham with 15 points. The loss to Wittenberg came despite a 20-0 run by the Gators in the second half and a team-high 12 points from **Courtney Steding (McDonald, PA/Fort Cherry)** ... **DENISON** has the best overall record in the conference, entering the week at 18-4 and has won all 10 home games this season. Junior guard **Caitlin Krupka (Westlake, OH/Holy Name)** led the Big Red in two victories last week, scoring 17 in an 80-60 decision over Oberlin and 16 in a 58-49 defeat of Wooster. She shot 11-for-23 (.478) from the field including 5-for-9 (.556) from three-point range ... Freshman **Tasha Merrill (Cedar Grove, IN/Franklin County)** totalled 58 points in **EARLHAM's** 0-3 week, scoring 19 in a 70-78 loss to OWU, 18 against Allegheny, an 88-74 decision, and 21 in a 72-56 loss to Hiram. Freshman **Janee Covington (Indianapolis, IN/Arlington)** scored 24 points, six rebounds and six assists against the Bishops ... **HIRAM** junior **Cassie Bedard (Randolph, OH/Waterloo)** led her team to a 1-2 week with 47 points. The Terriers lost to Allegheny, 65-50, and Wittenberg, 80-58, before defeating Earlham, 72-56... **KENYON** went 1-1 last week as senior **Katy Zeanah (New Orleans, LA/Metairie Park)** had team highs of 15 points and 11 boards in a 54-46 loss to Wittenberg, then scored 11 with four rebounds in a 98-40 victory over Oberlin ... Junior **Jessie Oram (New York, NY/Beacon)** and freshman **Alyssa Clark (Cleveland Hts., OH/Regina)** scored 26 and 20 points, respectively, in **OBERLIN's** 81-60 loss to Denison ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** never trailed in its 60-45 victory over Wooster. Junior guard **Rachel Messaros (Reynoldsburg, OH/Bishop Hartley)** sank two consecutive three-pointers in the middle of a 16-2 first half run en route to a team best 14 points versus the Scots. In a 90-78 defeat of Earlham, the contest was tight right up to the final 12 minutes, when the game was tied at 61. At that point, Ohio Wesleyan junior guard **Emily Lloyd (Canton, OH/Massillon Jackson)** and sophomore guard **Molly Baker (Avon Lake, OH/Avon Lake)** each sunk three pointers in an 8-0 run that put the Bishops up to stay. Baker finished with a team high 21 points and Lloyd with 18. for the week, Messaros totalled 29 points on 10-for-16 (.625) shooting ... **WITTENBERG** junior guard **Andrea Hackett (Springfield, OH/Catholic Central)** scored 22 points in the Tigers' 3-0 week. The Tigers knocked off Kenyon (54-46), Hiram (80-58) and Allegheny (57-54) ... **WOOSTER** junior **Carly Loehrke (Kalamazoo, MI/Mattawan)** has led the Scots in scoring for 13 straight games and totaled 37 points in three games last week. She also had 18 rebounds, four assists, five blocks and six steals in Wooster's 1-2 week. The Scots Defeated Oberlin, 66-60, and lost to Ohio Wesleyan (60-45) and Denison (58-49).

NCAC Indoor Track & Field Report

February 5, 2006**

Kenyon hosts an indoor track meet for the first time in the new \$70 million Kenyon Athletic Center Friday night. Denison, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster join the Lords and Ladies for the Kenyon Invitational. Also that night, Hiram competes at Oberlin and Allegheny visits Baldwin-Wallace. Saturday, Denison, Kenyon, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster all travel to the All-Ohio Championships at Ohio Northern. Wabash makes a short trip to rival DePauw's Tiger Invitational, while Earlham is idle until February 17.

Last Week: At last Friday's Case Invitational, Allegheny won the men's portion of the 10-team meet, and was second in the 11-team women's field. Wooster finished eighth in both meets, Oberlin was seventh in the men's competition and ninth in the women's, while Hiram was ninth in the men's and eleventh in the women's. The **Gator** women won four events, led by sophomore **Lisa Earley (Venetia, PA/Peters Township)**, who won the shot put (11.12 meters/36 feet-5.75 inches) and weight throw (15.31m/50-2.75). Sophomore **Emily Pfeufer (St. Mary's, PA/Elk County Catholic)** took the triple jump (11.07m/36-4) and also met the NCAA provisional qualifying mark in the long jump with her third-place finish in that event (5.43m/17-9.75). Junior **Rashelle Glass (New Castle, PA/Shenango)** crossed first in the 800 meters (2:22.06) and ran the lead leg of the second-place 4x400 meter relay. **Oberlin** freshman **Flannery Cerbin (LaCrosse, WI/Central)** was her team's highest finisher when she was runner-up to Glass in the 800 meters (2:22.89). **Wooster** senior **Jill Berner (Dunkirk, NY/Fredonia)** won the high jump and in the process broke the Scots' indoor record in the event (3.44m/11-3.5). **Hiram's** top finish was fifth in the 55 hurdles (9.30) by sophomore **Lynne Hutchison (Solon, OH/Solon)**. The **Allegheny** men took five first-place finishes en route to the team title, and finished in the top two spots in all three jumping events. Senior **Sean Laird (Monroeville, PA/Gateway)** had an outstanding meet with victories in the high jump (1.82m/6-0) and long jump (6.82m/22-4.5) and a second-place finish in the triple jump (12.77m/41-10.75). Freshman **Joe McMahon (Pittsburgh, PA/Baldwin)** bested Laird in the triple jump (13.22m/43-4.5) and finished runner up to him in the long jump (6.41m/21-0.5). Sophomore **Conrad Rapp (Medway, MA/Worcester Academy)** won the pole vault (4.49m/14-9). The Gators got second-place finishes from senior **Dave Griffin (Pittsburgh, PA/Montour)** in the 55 hurdles (8.34), **Jacob Harrison (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)** in the high jump (1.77m/5-10), and junior **Pat Confer (Bradford, PA/Bradford)** in the shot put (14.33m/47-0.25). **Oberlin's** top individual finisher was freshman **Ryan King (Glastonbury, CT/Glastonbury)**, who placed second in the mile (4:30.59). Sophomore **Mike Grafton (Canton, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** was **Hiram's** top individual with a fourth-place finish in the long jump (6.25m/20-6.25). **Wooster** sophomore Tristan Jordan (Virginia Beach, VA/Floyd E. Kellam) was the Scots top individual, finishing behind Gators Laird and McMahon in both the long and triple jumps ... In the five-team Big Red Invitational, senior **Kim Murley (Dalton, PA/Tunkhannock)** took first in the 800 meters (2:26.49) and was second in the 1500 meters (5:22.39) to lead **Denison** on their home track. The Big Red again dominated the 55-meter hurdles competition in the women's portion of the meet. Senior **Brie Jaquette (McKee's Rocks, PA/Montour)** defeated teammate **Meagan Coneybeer (Uniontown, PA/Uniontown)**, with Jaquette crossing in 8.98 and Coneybeer in 9.01. Senior **Jessica Holder (Dover, OH/Dover)** outpaced the field in the 3000 meters with a time of 10:47.37, almost eight second faster than the runner up. Leading the **Kenyon** Ladies was sophomore **Katie Walker (Columbus, OH/Columbus Academy)**, who won the 55 meters in school-record time (7.69 seconds). Later in the meet, Walker took first in the long jump with her best effort of the season (17-6), also the best performance in the event in the conference to date this season. In the men's meet, freshman **Mike Barnes (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** won the 400 meters in 52.13 seconds to lead **Denison**. Sophomore **Brandon Balthrop (Burtonville, MD/Edmund Burke)** was **Kenyon's** top performer with a third place finish in the triple jump (41-5.75) and fourth in the 55 hurdles (8.73 seconds) ... The Quakers' men's 800-meter relay combination of **Colin McCullough (Gary, IN/Bishop Noll)**, **Chris Owens (Cincinnati, OH/Highlands, KY)**, **Brad Remsburg (Lafayette, IN/McCutcheon)** and **Nhlanhla Maduna (Mbabane, Swaziland/Li Po Chun)** won the event in 1:36.59 ... **Wittenberg's** women were sixth of 15 and the men were eighth of 17 at DePauw. Top Tiger finishers were senior **Gregg Carter (Wellsville, OH/Wellsville)**, who was second in the men's 55 meters (6.61 seconds), sophomore **Nikki Bailey (Cincinnati, OH/Summit Country Day)** who was second in the women's triple jump (10.46m/34-4) and senior **Anna Finkelstein (Whitehall, MI/Reeths-Puffer)**, the runner up in the women's 800 (2:28.47) ... **Ohio Wesleyan** junior **Doug Sampson (Ridgewood, NJ/Ridgewood)** won the men's 800 meters (1:59.05) to lead the Bishops to a second-place team finish (of 10 teams) at the Cedarville Invitational.
