**WABASH CLINCHES NCAC TITLE;
KENYON, WITTENBERG SHARE SECOND**

CLEVELAND -- Wabash (7-0, 9-0) clinched its second North Coast Athletic Conference football title in four years with a 52-0 defeat of Denison (3-3, 5-4). The Little Giants, who won their first NCAC title in 2002, finished the conference season with a perfect 7-0 mark and are preparing for the 112th Monon Bell Classic at DePauw on Saturday to close out the regular season. Wabash receives the North Coast's automatic bid into the NCAA Division III Football Tournament, which begins on Saturday, November 19.

Wittenberg (5-1, 5-4) and Kenyon (5-1, 5-4) enter the final week of the regular season tied for second place in the conference standings after they defeated Wooster (3-3, 6-3) and Hiram (1-5, 1-8), respectively. This week, the Tigers travel to Allegheny (2-5, 2-7) and the Lords host the Big Red.

Ohio Wesleyan (4-2, 6-3) stands alone in third after a 24-14 defeat of Oberlin (1-5, 2-7) last week. The Bishops take on the Scots this week in Wooster, while the Yeomen entertain the Terriers. Earlham (0-7, 1-9) finished its disappointing, injury-riddled season with a 41-0 loss to Allegheny.

Grid Notebook: Despite winning for just the second time in nine games this season, ALLEGHENY has outscored its opposition, 216-197. In a 41-0 defeat of Earlham, the Gators had three different rushers and three different receivers score touchdowns. **Jim Lieb (Carrolltown, PA/Northern Cambria)** snagged five passes for 105 yards, including one for a 55-yard score ... If DENISON defeats Kenyon this week, the Big Red will have back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 1985-86 seasons. In a 52-0 loss to Wabash, senior quarterback **Larry Cappetto (Troy, MI/Troy)** surpassed 5000 yards of total offense in his career. He has thrown for 4584 yards and rushed for 667 in 36 career games ... EARLHAM's season came to an end with the loss to the Gators last week. Sophomore **Manny Myers (Fairmount, IN/Madison-Grant)** upped his single-season school record for all-purpose yardage to 1504, and set another single-season mark with 900 yards rushing. Myers broke **Darrian Story's** record of 893 rushing yards, set in the 2000 campaign ... In a heartbreaking 41-38 loss to Kenyon, HIRAM freshman quarterback **Trevor Henderson (Rural Valley, PA/West Shamokin)** led the way as the Terriers set three single-game school records. His 34 completions and 428 yards passing were both single-game marks, and he accumulated 473 yards of offense, another single-game record. He also rushed for three touchdowns, a career best. Senior wideout **Max Kravitz (Beachwood, OH/Beachwood)** broke single-game school records with 12 receptions and 184 yards receiving ... The victory over the Terriers assured KENYON of its first .500 season since 1994, and gives the Lords a shot at its first winning season since 1990 when they face Denison next week. Freshman running back **Javier Arbolaez (Bavernier, FL/Coral Shores)** rushed for 171 yards on 24 carriers, ably filling in for

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Wabash senior **Russ Harbaugh (Evansville, IN/Bosse)** and Wittenberg senior **Ken Bibb (Cincinnati, OH/Prcell Marian)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Harbaugh, a 6-1, 189-pound quarterback, helped the Little Giants clinch the North Coast conference championship by setting a conference record for completion percentage (.950) in a victory over Denison. He completed 19-20 passes for 317 yards and three touchdowns in less than three quarters of action.

Bibb, a 6-0, 190-pound linebacker, made the most of his third career start with a career-high seven tackles, his first career interception and a forced fumble that was returned for a touchdown in the first quarter, in the Tigers' defeat of Wooster.

the injured **Alby Coombs (Boston, MA/Belmont Hill)**. Sophomore cornerback **Nick Fanning (Warrensville, OH/Warrensville Hts.)** made the game-deciding play when he intercepted a Hiram pass on his own 11-yard line, ending the Terriers' last-chance drive. Fanning finished with 10 tackles ... OBERLIN freshman **R.V. Carroll (Perry, OH/Perry)** gained 93 yards on six carries to lead his team in a 24-14 loss to Ohio Wesleyan ... Senior quarterback **Ryan Sir Louis (Hinckley, OH/Highland)** completed 10 of 20 passes for 152 yards and two touchdowns in OHIO WESLEYAN's victory over the Yeomen. Junior end **Owen Case (Marion, OH/River Valley)** led the Bishop defense with nine tackles, a sack, two tackles for a loss and an interception ... WABASH senior quarterback **Russ Harbaugh (Evansville, OH/Bosse)** completed 19 of 20 passes for 317 yards and three touchdowns, in the process breaking the single-game conference and school mark for completion percentage (.950). Harbaugh bested Little Giant **Tom Vandergriff's** 1985 mark against Taylor (.900) and Earlham alum **Mark Thompson's** record (.909) set against Principia in 1995. For the game, Wabash completed 22 of 23 passes, and rushed for a season-high 282 yards on 53 attempts. Sophomore defensive **Richard Roomes (South Bend, IN/Clay)** led Wabash to its first shutout since Sept. 2004 with seven tackles, five solo, and a 56-yard interception return the led to

a Wabash field goal ... Senior tailback **Tristan Murray (New Carlisle, OH/Tecumseh)** rushed for 174 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries in less than three quarters of work against Wooster. In just 19 career games, Murray already ranks in WITTENBERG's all-time top 10 in career rushing and scoring. Senior linebacker **Ken Bibb (Cincinnati, OH/Purcell Marian)** made a career-high seven tackles, intercepted the first pass of his career and forced a fumble that was returned for a touchdown in just his third career start ... WOOSTER junior wide receiver **Shaun Swearingen (Hilliard, OH/Bishop Watterson)** caught six passes for 79 yards. Junior outside linebacker **Andre Smith (Hendersonville, TN/Beech)** made eight stops, including the 200th of his career, and broke up a pass in his team's loss to Wittenberg.

**OHIO WESLEYAN CLAIMS MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SOCCER TOURNEY TITLES;
FIELD HOCKEY AND VOLLEYBALL CROWNS GO TO OBERLIN AND WITTENBERG;**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

[CROSS COUNTRY REPORT](#)

The NCAA will stage eight regional qualifying events on Saturday to narrow the men's and women's championship fields to 24 teams. The regionals are open to all Division III schools. Teams from Ohio, Indiana and Michigan will compete in the Great Lakes Regional at Wilmington while squads from Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania and West Virginia will participate in the Mideast Regional at Dickinson. The NCAA Championships will be held on November 19 in Delaware, Ohio, and will be hosted by Ohio Wesleyan.

[FIELD HOCKEY REPORT](#)

North Coast champion Oberlin picked up its first NCAC tournament title. The Yeowomen swept through the NCAC Field Hockey Tournament, capping their run with a 3-0 win over Wooster in the championship game. In the semifinals, top-seeded Oberlin edged fourth-seeded Denison, 4-2. The Fighting Scots, seeded second in the four-team event, had advanced to the final courtesy of a 2-1 win over third-seeded Wittenberg in their semifinal matchup. As North Coast Tournament Champions, Oberlin has earned the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Div. III playoffs. First-round games are scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 9. Complete matchups and site information will be released by the NCAA on Monday.

[MEN'S SOCCER REPORT](#)

North Coast champion Ohio Wesleyan claimed its fifth North Coast Tournament Championship. The Battling Bishops swept through the NCAC Men's Soccer Tournament without allowing a single goal. They capped their run with a 3-0 win over Allegheny in the championship game. In the semifinals, top-seeded Ohio Wesleyan defeated fourth-seeded Wittenberg, 3-0. The Gators, seeded third, had advanced to the final after upsetting second-seeded Oberlin, 1-0, in their semifinal matchup. As North Coast Tournament Champions, Ohio Wesleyan has earned the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Div. III playoffs. First-round games are scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 9. Combined first- and second-round dates are also set for Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 11-12 or Sunday and Monday, Nov. 12-13. Complete matchups and site information will be released by the NCAA on Monday.

The win over Allegheny did more than give the Battling Bishops their fifth tournament title in six seasons. It also marked the 500th career win for Ohio Wesleyan head coach **Jay Martin**. Martin becomes the seventh college coach to reach the 500-win mark, according to records of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and the National Collegiate Athletics Association. None of the 6 coaches that preceded him to the 500-win mark got there faster than Martin, who is in his 29th season at Ohio Wesleyan. Indiana University's **Jerry Yeagley** also recorded his 500th win during his 29th season as a head coach. Martin has had phenomenal success since taking over the Bishop helm in 1977. His overall record is 500-97-36, a winning percentage of .818. Ohio Wesleyan compiled the best winning percentage in the NCAA -- regardless of division -- during the 1980s, a lofty .815. The Battling Bishops topped that during the 1990s, fashioning a winning percentage of .825. But the Battling Bishops' success is not limited to a sparkling won-loss record. Ohio Wesleyan has competed in 25 of the last 27 NCAA Division III tournaments and holds NCAA Division III records with 27 playoff appearances and 47 playoff victories. The pinnacle of Martin's career came at the end of the 1998 season, when the Battling Bishops won their first NCAA Division III championship.

[WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT](#)

Third-seeded Ohio Wesleyan claimed their fifth North Coast Athletic Conference tournament championship. The Battling Bishops capped their 2005 regular season with a perfect run through the season-ending tourney. In the semifinals, OWU topped second-seeded Kenyon, 3-2. Ohio Wesleyan then followed with a hard-fought 2-1 upset win over top-seeded Denison in the championship game. The Big Red had advanced to the championship game with a 2-1 win over fourth-seeded Wittenberg in their semifinal matchup. The Bishops are the first team in the six-year history of the conference tournament to win two tourney games on the road. They are also the lowest seed to claim the title. As North Coast Tournament Champions, Ohio Wesleyan has earned the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Div. III playoffs. Denison may also be considered for an at-large tournament berth due

to its successful season. First-round games are scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 9. Combined first- and second-round dates are also set for Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 11-12 or Sunday and Monday, Nov. 12-13. Complete matchups and site information will be released by the NCAA on Monday.

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SWIMMING REPORT

ALLEGHENY hosted the 20th annual Allegheny Sprint and Distance Invitational. The Gator women won the three-team sprint meet, scoring 399 points to Edinboro's 344 and Gannon's 328. Gannon took the men's competition, posting 424 points to Allegheny's 376 and Edinboro's 290. Sophomore **Carolyn Nairn (Lubbock, TX/Brownell-Talbot)** led the women's squad by winning the 100-yard freestyle in 55.31 and the 100-yard backstroke in 1:03.50, and was part of the second-place 200-yard medley relay. Junior **Nick Johnson (Hastings-on-the-Hudson, NY/Hastings)** won the 200-yard individual medley (2:08.56) to lead the men's squad. The Allegheny women won the Distance meet the next day with 664 points, ahead of second place Gannon (363) and third-place Grove City (343). Nairn won the 500-yard freestyle (5:21.45) and the 200-yard backstroke (2:18.24), then was second in the 1650 freestyle (19:10.00) to lead the Gators. The men's distance competition was won by Grove City with 664 points, followed by Gannon (315) in second and Allegheny (310) in third. Johnson led the men again with a second-place finish in the 200-yard backstroke (2:08.36) and a third in the 500 free (5:12.29) ... DENISON and Kenyon squared off for their annual, early season tangle last weekend. In the women's meet, the score was tied at 112 points each entering the final event, the 200 freestyle relay. The Big Red's combination of **Annamarie Novinger (Longmont, CO/Niwot)**, **Kristen Hohl (Winfield, IL/Wheaton North)**, **Meg Cassell (Albany, OR/South Albany)** and **Katey Klippel (St. Louis, MO/Kirkwood)** nipped the Ladies on the final stretch to win the event by seven one-hundredth's of a second. The Big Red are 3-0 in dual meets this season. In the men's meet, Kenyon handed Denison their first dual meet loss of the season, 144-95. Junior **Bryce Peterson (Niwot, CO/Niwot)** was second in both the 1000 (9:57.50) and 500 (4:52.42) freestyles ... KENYON junior **Davis Zarins (Riga, Latvia, Piga Specialized School)** led the Lords in their victory over Denison and another over Ohio University (158.5-129.5). Against the Bobcats, Zarins won three individual events (both breaststroke events and the 200 individual medley) and was part of the winning 200 medley relay. Versus the Big Red, he took the 200 IM and 100 breast and was part of the 200 medley relay that placed first. Leading the Ladies in a loss to Ohio was junior **Jessica Connors (Cedarburg, WI/Divine Savior Holy Angels)**. Connors won both breaststroke events and swam a leg on the victorious 200 medley relay team. Junior **Rebecca Allison (Paradise Valley, AZ/Phoenix Country Day)** won the 200 free and 500 free against Denison ... OHIO WESLEYAN lost dual meets to Wittenberg (105-41) and Oberlin (141-56) in men's swimming. Freshman **Brian Fahey (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** led the Bishops with a victory in the 100 breast (1:07.10), was second in the 200 free, and was part of the winning 200 medley relay. Against Oberlin, he took the 200 breast (2:30.82) and was second in the 500 free. In the women's meets, the Bishops lost to the Tigers, 129-99, and to the Yeowomen, 121-118. Junior **Whitney Snow (West Chester, OH/Lakota East)** won the 100 free (55.99) and was second in the 200 free against Wittenberg, then won the 200 free and was runner up in the 500 free against Oberlin. Snow was part of the winning 200 free relay versus Wittenberg and part of the victorious 400 free relay against Oberlin ... WABASH lost to Transylvania, 126-117, and defeated Rose-Hulman, 124-100, last week. Against Transy, diver **Clayton Craig (Morristown, IN/Indiana Academy)** won the three-meter board with 206.40 points, and was second in the one-meter competition with 189.80. Sophomore **Michael Belanger (Crawfordsville, IN/Crawfordsville)** and freshman **Jordon Blackwell (Veedersburg, IN/Crawfordsville)** each were double winners in the same meet: Belanger took the 500 free (5:09.42) and 1000 free (10:30.05), while Blackwell touched first in the 200 free (1:50.24) and 100 free (49.08). Against Rose-Hulman, Belanger took the same two events improving his times in both (500 free in 5:02.35; 1000 free in 10:25.89). Craig took the one-meter board with 194.50 points ... WITTENBERG junior **Cody Nicely (Knoxville, TN/Bearden)** won both diving events in a victory over OWU and a loss to DePauw. Junior **Sean Wolf (White Lake, MI/Walled Lake Central)** won the 50 and 100 frees to lead the Tigers in the swimming events. Senior **Becca Searcy (Shelbyville, KY/Shelby County)** won two events in each meeting as the Tigers defeated the Bishops and DePauw.

VOLLEYBALL REPORT

Second-seeded Wittenberg successfully defended its North Coast Tournament championship and earned an automatic bid into the NCAA Division III Championship with a 30-27, 24-30, 31-25, 30-27 decision over Hiram in the championship match. The Tigers claimed their 11th tournament title by sweeping past Denison and the Terriers dropping only a single set. Top-seeded Hiram advanced to the final after sweeping fourth-seeded Wooster in straight sets in their semifinal matchup. Tournament most valuable player, senior **Emily Dixon (Granville, OH/Granville)** was a key component of the Tiger defense, sharing the team lead in the final with six blocks, and registering a season-high eight blocks in the semifinals. Joining her on the all-tournament team were two teammates, senior **Linda Young (Minster, OH/Minster)** and freshman **Jackie Williams (Rocky River, OH/Magnificat)**. The Terriers placed two on the all-tournament team: sophomore **Katie Moore (Lakewood, OH/St. Joseph Academy)** and senior **Shana Toth (Mantua, OH/Crestwood)**. Denison senior **Ellen Price (Maple City, MI/Leland)** and Wooster sophomore **Carolyn Ciriegio (Covington, OHCovington)** rounded out the squad.

Wittenberg, ranked sixth in the nation by the American Volleyball Coaches Association, will learn their opponent in the NCAA tournament on Monday, when complete matchups and site information will be released. The Tigers will now have nine straight NCAA Tournament appearances; this will be their 11th overall. Hiram may also be considered for an at-large tournament berth due to its successful season.

FIELD HOCKEY

Oberlin senior **Rosemary Mudry (University, Hts., OH/Laurel)** scored two goals in the NCAC Field Hockey Tournament championship, both off of penalty shots, to help lift the Yeowomen to a 3-0 win over Wooster and their first NCAC Tournament title. OHIO WESLEYAN WINS 100TH NORTH COAST CHAMPIONSHIP

Ohio Wesleyan University claimed its 100th North Coast Athletic Conference championship this fall, when the men's soccer team completed its perfect 9-0 campaign. The Battling Bishops lead all NCAC teams with 100 conference championships since the league began play in 1984.

Allegheny is second with 90 championships, followed by Denison (87) in third and Kenyon (80) and Wooster (57) in fourth and fifth, respectively. Wittenberg (55), Case (9), Oberlin (6), Earlham and Wabash (2) and Hiram (1) round out championship ownership.

Ohio Wesleyan has won championships in 16 of the league's 22 sports. They lead the conference with crowns in field hockey (8), golf (11), men's lacrosse (15), men's soccer (15), women's soccer (8) and men's indoor track (6). They are defending champions in golf, men's and women's lacrosse and softball. Their men's soccer title is their first of the 2005-06 calendar year.
