NCAC Swimming & Diving Report

All North Coast Athletic Conference squads return to action on Friday and Saturday. Allegheny opens 2007 at Hiram on Saturday. The Terriers will also swim on Friday, at Wooster. The Fighting Scots turn around and travel to Ohio Wesleyan the next day. Denison hosts to Wittenberg on Saturday. The Tigers will have hosted Transylvania the evening before. Kenyon hosts Oakland University on Saturday. Oberlin swims twice this weekend. The Yeomen and Yeowomen travel to Ohio Northern on Friday and host Notre Dame College the following day. Wabash hosts the University of Indianapolis to close out Saturday's action.

Notes: Wabash completed its holiday break training trip in Florida with a second-place team finish in a relay meet with NCAA Division I Davidson and SUNY-New Paltz. The Little Giants opened the relay meet Wednesday afternoon with a victory by the quartet of **Matt Routh (Muncie, IN/Yorktown)**, **Kyle Weaver (Portland, IN/Jay County)**, **Adam Petro (FR/Indianapolis, IN/Decatur Central)**, and **Robert Fozkos (Valparaiso, IN/Chesterton)** in the 200 butterfly relay (1:37.52). The team of **Phil Towne (Markle, IN/Norwell)**, Weaver, **Blaine Cooper-Surma (Free Soil, MI/Ludington)**, and Fozkos took the top spot in the 200 free relay, winning the race in 1:28.90. Wabash posted another victory in the 400 free relay by the team of Towne, **Nick Rockefeller (Topeka, KS/Washburn Rural)**, Cooper-Surma, and **Jordon Blackwell (Veedersburg, IN/Crawfordsville)**. Davidson won the meet with 154 points, followed by the 146-point effort of Wabash. SUNY - New Paltz scored 44 points.

SHEFFIELD, STALEY NAMED NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Denison's **Kristen Sheffield (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** and Hiram's **Mike Staley (Perry, OH/Lake Catholic)** have been named women's and men's basketball "Players of the Week" in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Sheffield, a 6-0, senior wing, scored 13 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in a 62-49 win over Kenyon and had 15 points, 12 rebounds and three blocks in a 67-61 win over Ohio Wesleyan last week. She leads the Big Red in scoring at 12.9 points per game and in rebounding at 7.1 rpg. She needs just four blocks to reach the 300 mark for her career - an exclusive honor as only 13 players in NCAA Division III history have recorded more than 300 blocks in their careers. Sheffield has 1,160 career points and 750 rebounds.

Staley, a 6-0, freshman guard, matched a career-high with 16 points in the Terriers' 67-65 win over Earlham. The Terriers improved their conference record to 2-1 and moved into fourth place in the standings. He was a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line and also chipped in 10 assists, four rebounds and a steal.

NCAC Women's Basketball Report

DENISON CLAIMS TOP SPOT IN STANDINGS; BIG RED FACE WOOSTER AND SECOND-PLACE ALLEGHENY THIS WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Denison (5-0, 11-3) moved into sole possession of first place in the North Coast Athletic Conference standings. The Big Red have rolled to a perfect 5-0 league record and are followed by Allegheny (4-1, 10-3) in second and defending NCAC champion Wittenberg (3-1, 6-6) in third. Denison travels to fourth-place (tie) Wooster (2-2, 6-6) on Wednesday and returns home to face the Gators on Saturday. This will be the first meeting of the season between the Big Red and both teams. Denison swept the Fighting Scots and dropped both regular season contests to the Gators last winter before defeating Wooster in the quarterfinals of the NCAC Tournament and Allegheny in the semifinals.

Wooster closes out its conference competition this week with a home contest against sixth-place Hiram (1-2, 5-6) on Saturday. The Scots also have a non-league tilt at Lake Erie on Monday. The Terriers will resume their game against Wittenberg today, at the conclusion of the 2:00 p.m. men's contest. The game began last Friday evening and was suspended due to a power failure - Wittenberg held a 37-25 advantage at the time of suspension. In addition, the Terriers travel to Oberlin (0-4, 4-7) on Wednesday.

Wittenberg hosts Earlham (1-4, 2-12) on Wednesday. Fourth-place (tie) Ohio Wesleyan (2-2, 7-6) travels to seventh-place Kenyon (1-3, 4-9) the same day. On Saturday, the Battling Bishops travel to Earlham, while the Ladies head to Oberlin. Complete basketball statistics are available at www.northcoast.org.

HOOPS NOTES: **ALLEGHENY'S Jennifer Reimer** earned her record-setting 111th victory, a 55-44 win over Earlham, as head coach of the Gators. Reimer, who is in her seventh season at the helm, passed **Ronda Seagraves** (110-49 (.692), 1986-1992). Reimer's career record at Allegheny now stands at 111-61 (.645). Senior **Jennifer Latronica (Gibsonia, PA/Deer Lakes)** scored a career-high 19 points on 8-of-11 (.728) shooting from the field in the victory over the Quakers. She also set the Gator career blocks record with her fourth of the night. She ended the game with five blocks and a team-high eight rebounds. She followed her performance with a game-high 14 points in a 59-50 loss to Wittenberg. Against the Tigers, the Gators first league loss of the season, she blocked four shots, pulled down four boards and shot 7-for-10 from the field. For the week she was 15-of-21 (.714) from the floor with 33 points, 11 boards and nine blocks ... **DENISON** stands alone as the only unbeaten team in NCAC play after a pair of wins over Kenyon (62-49) and Ohio Wesleyan (67-61). Senior **Kristen Sheffield (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** scored 13 points and grabbed 11 rebounds against the Ladies and 15 points, 12 rebounds and three blocks against the Bishops. She leads the Big Red in scoring at 12.9 points per game and in rebounding at 7.1 rpg. She needs just four blocks to reach the 300 mark for her career - an exclusive achievement as only 13 players in NCAA Division III history have recorded more than 300 blocks in their careers. Sheffield has 1,160 career points and 750 rebounds ... **EARLHAM** freshman **Shontavia Davis (Indianapolis, IN/Warren Central)** led the Quakers with 11 points in a 55-44 loss at Allegheny. **Tasha Merrill (Cedar Grove, IN/Franklin County)** scored a season-high 19 points and grabbed seven rebounds in a 76-64 loss at Hiram. Davis and senior **Casie Byrd (Bloomington, IN/North)** chipped in 11 points each against the Terriers ... **HIRAM** senior **Cassie Bedard (Randolph, OH/Waterloo)** leads the Terriers, and the NCAC, in scoring with 207 points over 11 games for an 18.8 average. She scored a team-high 24 points off 10-of-16 (.625) shooting from the floor in a 76-64 win over Earlham. She was 4-of-5 (.800) from the free throw line and added nine rebounds, two blocks and an assist in the victory. **Brittany Mayle (Ravenna, OH/Crestwood)** added a career-high 16 points and nine assists against the Quakers ... **KENYON** split a pair of conference games this week, getting past Wooster (63-56) on the road and losing to Denison (62-49) at home. Junior **Anne Dugan (Dublin, OH/Watterson)** paced the Ladies' efforts with a combined 22 points and 13 rebounds. She was one of four double-digit scorers against the Scots and led Kenyon with 12 points and six rebounds against Denison. She was a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line, improving her season free-throw shooting percentage to .867 ... **OBERLIN** dropped a pair of games last week, falling to Ohio Wesleyan, 86-55, and to Wooster, 61-51. Senior **Jessie Oram (New York, NY/Beacon)** tallied 33 points and 17 rebounds in the two games. She also added five assists and seven blocks. Sophomore **Alyssa Clark (Cleveland Hts., OH/Regina)** totalled 29 points, 18 boards, five assists and four steals ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** went 2-1 last week. The Bishops opened the week with a 64-63 win over Case. Junior wing **Lindsey Macklin (Columbus, OH/Bexley)** hit a free throw with no time on the clock to lift the Bishops past the Spartans. OWU then topped Oberlin, 86-55, before falling, 67-61, to Denison. Senior wing **Rachel Messaros (Reynoldsburg, OH/Bishop Hartley)** paced the Bishops with 21 points against the Yeowomen, while senior guard **Emily Lloyd (Canton, OH/Massillon Jackson)** scored 17 points to lead OWU against the Big Red. She was 5-for-6 (.833) from the field and was a perfect 3-for-3 from three-point range and 4-for-4 from the charity stripe. She also led the Bishops with six boards and four assists ... **WITTENBERG** split a pair of road games, falling 54-41 to Denison and defeating Allegheny, 59-50. Senior wing **Rachel Clark-Haggy (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern)** supplied a combined 24 points while leading the Tigers offensively in each game. She is averaging a team-best 10.0 ppg this season and has reached double figures in five straight games ... **WOOSTER** also split a pair of games last week. The Scots lost to Kenyon, 63-56, and defeated Oberlin, 61-51. Senior post **Carly Loehrke (Kalamazoo, MI/Mattawan)** combined for 27 points on 11-of-17 (.647) field goals and 5-of-6 (.833) free throws as well as 20 rebounds, three assists, two blocks, and seven steals over the two games. She had 17 points, in addition to game-highs of 13 boards and four steals, at Oberlin.

WOOSTER TEST PERFECT NCAC RECORD TWICE THIS WEEK; FIGHTING SCOTS TO FACE ALLEGHENY AND WABASH

CLEVELAND -- Wooster (4-0, 11-2) strengthened its hold on first place with a 96-67 win over Denison last week. The Fighting Scots, the only team with a perfect NCAC record, will test its unbeaten status with two North Coast tilts this week. Wooster travels to fifth-place (tie) Allegheny (2-2, 6-6) on Wednesday and hosts seventh-place Wabash (1-2, 4-8) on Saturday. This is the first meeting between the Scots and both teams this season. Wooster registered two regular season wins over both squads last winter.

Ohio Wesleyan (3-1, 9-4) and Wittenberg (3-1, 11-2) enter the week tied for second place. The Battling Bishops travel to Wabash on Wednesday and to fifth-place (tie) Earlham (2-2, 4-9) on Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan took both games from the Little Giants last season; OWU and Earlham traded one-point overtime wins, with each team winning on the road. The Tigers travel to Earlham on Wednesday and to fourth-place Hiram (2-1, 3-9) on Saturday. Wittenberg swept both the Quakers and Terriers last winter.

Hiram opens its week at Kenyon (1-3, 5-8) on Wednesday. Oberlin (1-3, 2-10) travels to Denison (0-4, 1-11) the same day. On Saturday, the Big Red host Allegheny, while the Yeomen welcome the Lords. Oberlin also plays Anderson on Monday in non-conference competition. Complete basketball statistics are available at www.northcoast.org.

HOOPS NOTES: ALLEGHENY built up a 10-point halftime lead, but were not able to hold off Earlham and suffered a heart-breaking 56-55 loss. Senior **Jimmy Savage (North Canton, OH/Hoover)** scored a game-high 14 points in the loss. The Gators rebounded with a narrow 72-69 win over visiting Wabash. Savage and **Ben Torsney (Morgantown, WV/Morgantown)** each scored a team-high 10 points in the victory. The Gators used a balanced offensive attack against the Little Giants as they had four players score nine points in the game ... DENISON senior **Dan Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** moved past **Lou Mitchell** and into third place on the Big Red's all-time scoring list following his 25-point performance in a 96-67 loss at Wooster. He has scored 1,643 career points and is 97 points behind 1997 graduate **Brian Malinowski** for second place on Denison's list. Hodgkinson leads the NCAC in scoring this season with 19.5 points per game ... EARLHAM split a pair of games, beginning with a 56-55, come-from-behind win over Allegheny. **LaRon Henry's (Indianapolis, IN/Scecina)** 10 points led a balanced Quaker offense. Junior **Nick Welsh (Muncie, IN/Wes-Del)** and two other players each added nine points in the victory. Henry and Welsh also paced the Quakers in a 67-65 loss at Hiram. Henry scored 18 points, followed by Welsh with 17. Welsh also snagged a game-high 11 rebounds and seven blocks. All three totals were career highs for Welsh; he also recorded his first collegiate double-double ... HIRAM defeated Earlham, 67-65, in the only game the Terriers were able to play last weekend. The Terriers were scheduled to host Wabash on Friday evening, but the game was postponed to today because of a power failure. **Mike Staley (Perry, OH/Lake Catholic)** tied a career-high with 16 points against the Quakers. He was a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line and also chipped in 10 assists ... KENYON took a pair of games down to the wire last week. The Lords battled to a 72-67 overtime loss against Wittenberg and fell in the final minutes, 53-47, against Ohio Wesleyan. Sophomore **Bryan Yelvington (Arlington Hts., IL/John Hersey)** had a combined 18 points and 13 rebounds in the two games. He had team-highs of 14 points and seven rebounds against the Tigers, while sophomore **Korey Haddox (Zanesville, OH/Zanesville)** led the way against the Bishops with 10 points and a career-best eight boards ... OBERLIN dropped a pair of games to Carnegie Mellon (91-65) and Wittenberg (71-41). Sophomore **Mike Loll (Davison, MI/Davison)** led the Yeomen, racking up 40 points and 13 rebounds over the two contests. He tallied a game-high 22 points against the Tartans and turned in game-highs of 18 points and nine rebounds against the Tigers. He was a combined 17-for-20 (.850) from the charity stripe in the two losses ... OHIO WESLEYAN went 2-0 last week with wins over Denison (72-50) and Kenyon (53-47). Senior post **Ben Chojnacki (Medina, OH/Medina)** scored 10 of his team-high 11 points during the second half as OWU broke open a close game and went on to defeat the Big Red. He also led the Bishops with five assists. Against Kenyon, he assisted on the basket that put Ohio Wesleyan ahead to stay and followed with the bucket for a 49-45 OWU lead. He led the Bishops with 21 points. Chojnacki moved to 12th place on the all-time Ohio Wesleyan scoring list with 1,257 career points ... WABASH freshman **Chase Haltom (Quincy, IN/Cloverdale)** led a short-handed Little Giants' squad with a career-best 23 points in a 72-69 loss at Allegheny. He connected on 9-of-12 (.750) shots from the field, including 4-of-6 (.667) from behind the arc, and added four assists and three rebounds. Classmate **Aaron Brock (Bremen, IN/Bremen)** added 20 points for a Wabash team missing leading scorer **Andrew Zimmer (Hobart, IN/Hobart)** and starting center **Ryan Stephens (Zionsville, IN/Zionsville)** due to injuries suffered earlier in the week ... The same two players led WITTENBERG to a pair of wins last week. Senior post **Dane Borchers (Russia, OH/Russia)** posted his fourth straight double-double in a 72-67 overtime win at Kenyon and followed with a 14-point, eight rebound effort in a 71-41 win over Oberlin. Sophomore **Greg Hill (Redford, MI/Union)** supplied 27 points in the two games on 10-of-14 (.714) shooting from the field ... WOOSTER senior forward **Tom Port (Avon Lake, OH/Avon Lake)** scored 17 of the Scots' first 20 points on his way to producing game-high totals of 26 points and 10 rebounds in a 96-67 win over Denison. He was 10-for-13 (.769) from the field, including 3-of-4 three-pointers, and 3-of-3 free throws as he reached the 20-point mark for the fourth time in six games.
