### **NCAC Indoor Track & Field Report**

The indoor track & field season gets under way with various competitions slated for Friday and Saturday. On Friday, Oberlin will host its first Open meet of the season; two of the competitors will be NCAC opponents Hiram and Wooster. Ohio Wesleyan will travel to the Baldwin-Wallace Invitational. On Saturday, Allegheny will compete at the Fredonia State Invitational. Denison hosts its annual Lid-Lifter, at which Kenyon will also compete. Wabash hosts its traditional Alumni meet, while Wittenberg travels to the Rose-Hulman Quad.

Wabash and Wittenberg were the only NCAC squads in action last week. Little Giant junior **Geoff Lambert (Chesterton, IN/Chesterton)** topped the NCAA provisional qualifying time in his first meet of the season with his win in the 800-meter run. He bested runners from Division I Indiana State and Illinois State, winning the event in 1:53.60. Freshman **Emmanuel Aouad (Terre Haute, IN/North)** won his first competition in the 60-meter hurdles (8.52), finishing ahead of six Indiana State runners. He was the top Div. III finisher in the long jump with a mark of 21 feet, 10 inches. Tiger junior **Nicole Bailey (Cincinnati, OH/Summit Country Day)** won the long jump at the Capital Indoor Invitational.

### **CARNEY, HODGKINSON NAMED NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

**CLEVELAND** -- Wittenberg's **Gina Carney (Lexington, KY/Catholic)** and Denison's **Dan Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** have been named women's and men's basketball "Players of the Week" in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

**Carney**, a 5-5, senior guard/wing, paced the Tigers in wins over Hiram, 71-41, and Earlham, 70-40. She provided a spark off the bench against the Terriers, hitting all five shots from the field, including a quartet of three-pointers, and finishing with 16 points to go along with two rebounds, two assists and two steals. She then led a trio of players in double figures against Earlham with 14 points.

**Hodgkinson**, a 6-6, senior post, paced Denison in victories over Oberlin, 75-48, and Allegheny, 87-67. The wins were the first two consecutive victories for the Big Red this season and also snapped a 10-game losing skid. Hodgkinson scored 27 points and had four rebounds and a block against the Yeomen and returned with 16 points, seven rebounds and two blocks versus Allegheny. He leads the NCAC in scoring at 19.8 points per game and is just 152 points away from becoming Denison's all-time leading scorer. If he keeps at his current pace, Hodgkinson will pass Charlie Claggett on Feb. 10 at Allegheny.

## NCAC Men's Basketball Report

### WOOSTER EXTENDS PERFECT NCAC RECORD; FIGHTING SCOTS TRAVEL TO HIRAM AND OHIO WESLEYAN

CLEVELAND -- Wooster (6-0, 13-2) bolstered its hopes for a conference championship with two wins last week. The Fighting Scots defeated Allegheny, 97-87, and Wabash, 96-52. Wooster has rolled to an unblemished 6-0 conference record, which will be put to the test by a pair of road games in the coming week. First up, the Scots travel to fourth-place (tie) Hiram (3-3, 4-11) on Wednesday and to third-place Ohio Wesleyan (4-2, 10-5) on Saturday. It will be the first meeting between the teams this season. Wooster swept the Terriers last winter and split with the Battling Bishops. Ohio Wesleyan edged the Scots in Delaware, handing Wooster its only conference loss of the 2005-06 season.

Second-place Wittenberg also won twice last week. The Tigers topped Earlham, 71-60, and Hiram, 72-50, running their winning streak to seven straight. Wittenberg travels to Ohio Wesleyan on Wednesday and hosts sixth-place (tie) Allegheny (2-4, 6-8) on Saturday. It is the first meeting between the teams this season. The Tigers swept both opponents last winter.

Earlham (3-3, 5-10) and Hiram enter the week tied for fourth. The Quakers open their week at Wabash (1-5, 4-11) on Wednesday and close it out at home against Oberlin (2-4, 3-12) on Saturday. Four teams begin play this week holding onto a share of sixth place: Allegheny, Kenyon (2-4, 6-9), Denison (2-4, 3-11) and Oberlin. On Wednesday, the Big Red and Lords meet in Gambier, while the Gators and Yeomen meet in Meadville. Denison closes out its week at Hiram on Saturday; the Lords host Wabash.

**HOOPS NOTES:** ALLEGHENY had a trio of players reach double figures in a pair of losses last week. Junior guard **Bill Babe (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** and freshman forward **George Raftis (Pittsburgh, PA/Sewickley Academy)** led the Gators in a 97-87 loss to Wooster with respective career-highs of 26 and 17 points. Senior **Jimmy Savage (North Canton, OH/Hoover)** also added 14 points in the loss. Raftis paced Allegheny with 12 points in an 87-67 loss to Denison, while also pulling down a team-high seven rebounds. Savage and sophomore forward **Ryan Hollihan (Saxonburg, PA/Knoch)** each chipped in 10 points ... DENISON won consecutive games for the first time this season by topping Oberlin, 75-48, and Allegheny, 87-67, last week. The wins snapped the Big Red's 10-game losing skid. Senior **Dan Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** paced Denison in both victories. He scored 27 points and had four rebounds and a block against the Yeomen and returned with 16 points, seven rebounds and two blocks versus Allegheny. Hodgkinson leads the NCAC in scoring at 19.8 points per game and is just 152 points away from becoming Denison's all-time leading scorer. If he keeps at his current pace, Hodgkinson will pass **Charlie Claggett** on Feb. 10 at Allegheny ... EARLHAM senior **Markous Jewett (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** totalled 53 points, 10 rebounds and six assists as the Quakers went 1-1 last week. He tallied a career-high 31 points on 13-of-18 (.722) shooting from the field in a 71-60 loss to Wittenberg. He also led Earlham in a 68-65 win over Ohio Wesleyan, with 22 points. He was 10-of-11 from the free throw line in the victory, including a perfect 7-for-7 in the second half. For the week, Jewett was 19-of-31 (.613) from the field and 14-of-16 (.875) from the charity stripe. He is now 12th on the all-time scoring list at Earlham with 1,334 points ... HIRAM went 1-2 last week with an 83-80 win over Hiram and losses to Kenyon, 86-84, and Wittenberg, 72-50. Senior guard **Brandon Pool (Elyria, OH/Elyria)** and freshmen guard **Ian McGuire (Windham, OH/Windham)** each tallied a combined 46 points over the week. Pool, who scored a career-high 25 points in the win over the Little Giants, also added 10 rebounds, six assists and six steals. He was 10-for-12 (.833) from the line. McGuire chipped in 20 boards, five assists and three steals, and was also 10-for-12 from the line ... KENYON split a pair of close games this week, getting by Hiram, 86-84, at home and losing, 63-62, in overtime to Oberlin on the road. Freshman **Dave Knapke (Westerville, OH/St. Francis DeSales)** led the Lords by averaging 11.5 points per game and 5.0 rebounds per game. He tied his personal game-high with 18 points against the Yeomen. For the week, he was 9-of-17 (.529) from the floor and 2-of-2 from the free throw line ... OBERLIN dropped a heartbreaker to Anderson, 73-72, and fell to Denison, 75-48, last week. But the Yeomen ended the week on a high note after a thrilling 63-62 overtime win over Kenyon. Sophomore forward **Mike Loll (Davison, MI/Davison)** combined for 50 points, 18 rebounds, four blocks and four steals in the three games. His best performance came against the Lords, as he totalled game-highs of 19 points and nine rebounds and also racked up two assists and two blocks ... Senior post **Ben Chojnacki (Medina, OH/Medina)** scored 47 points to lead OHIO WESLEYAN to a 1-1 week. He led OWU to a 74-50 win over Wabash with 23 points, including six during a 13-2 first-half run that put the Bishops up to stay. He followed with 24 points in a 68-65 loss to Earlham ... WABASH suffered losses to Hiram (83-80), Ohio Wesleyan (74-50) and Wooster (96-52) last week. Sophomore guard **Andy Root (Bedford, IN/Bedford)** proved to be bright spot for the Little Giants, scoring a career-best 27 points in the loss to Hiram. He went 9-for-9 from three-point range to tie the Wabash single game-record, set on two different occasions by **Josh Estelle ('00)**. His 1.000 shooting percentage from behind the arc set a Wabash record and tied the NCAC mark. He hit 11 consecutive three-pointers over a three-game stretch, connecting on his last attempt at Allegheny, all nine treys at Hiram and his first attempt against Ohio Wesleyan ... Senior posts **Dane Borchers (Russia, OH/Russia)** and **Jack Hemenway (Centerville, OH/Centerville)** led the way as WITTENBERG defeated Earlham, 71-60, and Hiram, 72-50. Borchers went for 16 points and eight rebounds against the Quakers and followed with 27 points, 11 rebounds and five blocks against the Terriers. Hemenway added 16 points against Earlham and 15 points and eight boards against Hiram ... WOOSTER picked up wins over Allegheny, 97-87, and Wabash, 96-52, last week. Junior guard **James Cooper (Springfield, OH/Springfield South)** led the Scots in scoring in each game, combining for 43 points on 16-of-27 (.593) field goals, 4-of-7 (.571) three-pointers and 7-of-8 (.875) free throws. He also tallied four assists and three steals on the week.

#### **DENISON TIGHTENS GRIP ON FIRST PLACE;**

#### **BIG RED HAVE REMATCH WITH SECOND-PLACE WITTENBERG WEDNESDAY**

**CLEVELAND** -- Denison (7-0, 13-3) tightened its grip on first place in the North Coast Athletic Conference standings with a pair of victories last week. The Big Red edged Wooster, 51-47, and defeated third-place Allegheny, 52-39, to roll to a perfect 7-0 league record. Denison travels to second-place Wittenberg (5-1, 8-6), the defending NCAC champions, on Wednesday and returns home to face Hiram (1-5, 5-9) on Saturday. The Big Red defeated both the Tigers (54-41) and the Terriers (79-51) earlier this season.

Following its home contests against the Big Red, Wittenberg will travel to fourth-place (tie) Ohio Wesleyan (3-3, 8-7) on Saturday. This is the first meeting between the two teams this season. The Tigers took both contests last winter. Ohio Wesleyan, which begins its week with a game at Hiram on Wednesday, is one of three teams tied for fourth place. Kenyon (3-3, 6-9) and Wooster (3-3, 8-7) have also compiled identical 3-3 league records. The knot might be untied after this week, as the Ladies and Fighting Scots square off in Gambier on Wednesday. Kenyon closes out its week with a visit from third-place Allegheny (4-2, 10-4) on Saturday; Wooster has only the one contest this week.

In other action, Allegheny hosts Oberlin (1-5, 5-8) on Wednesday. The Yeowomen then travel to Earlham (1-6, 2-14) on Saturday. Complete basketball statistics, available at [www.northcoast.org](http://www.northcoast.org), are updated each Sunday and Thursday throughout the basketball season.

**HOOPS NOTES:** **ALLEGHENY** freshman guard **Brittany Bell (Greensburg, PA/Hempfield)** scored 10 points to lead the Gators in a 52-39 loss to Denison in their only conference game last week. Sophomore guard **Stephanie Wolf (Pittsburgh, PA/North Allegheny)** added eight points in the losing effort ... **DENISON** remained perfect in league play and ran their winning streak to nine games with wins over Wooster (51-47) and Allegheny (52-39) last week. The 7-0 conference start is the best in school history. Senior **Kristen Sheffield (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** scored 14 points and had five rebounds against the Scots and chipped in eight points and six boards against the Gators. Sheffield passed **Leslie Quinn** and moved into third place on the Denison all-time scoring list with 1,182 points. Senior **Tammy Hoch (Moon Township, PA/Sewickley Academy)** posted a season-high 15 rebounds against Allegheny; the Big Red out-rebounded the Gators 48-36 ... Appropriately named freshman, **Starr Gary (Indianapolis, IN/Northwest)**, scored 31 points and grabbed 16 rebounds in two games for **EARLHAM** last week. She scored a team-high 18 points in a 70-40 loss to Wittenberg and then tossed in 13 to go with a game-high 10 rebounds in a 69-48 loss to Ohio Wesleyan ... **HIRAM** senior **Cassie Bedard (Randolph, OH/Waterloo)** continues to lead the NCAC in scoring, averaging 17.9 points per game over 14 games. The Terriers went 0-3 last week, with losses to Wittenberg (71-41), Oberlin (57-54) and Wooster (72-64). Bedard tallied 43 points in the three contests and also chipped in 14 rebounds, four blocks, three assists and two steals ... **KENYON** got back to the .500 mark in conference play thanks to a pair of wins over Ohio Wesleyan (62-57) and Oberlin (66-49) last week. Junior **Anne Dugan (Dublin, OH/Watterson)** spearheaded the run with a combined 20 points and 10 rebounds in the two games. She also had three blocked shots and six steals. Dugan shot 57.1 percent (4-of-7) from the three-point arc and was a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line ... **OBERLIN** picked up its first North Coast win of the season, slipping past Hiram, 57-54. Junior forward **Roneisha Kinney (Cleveland, OH/Rhodes)** and sophomore **Alyssa Clark (Cleveland Hts., OH/Regina)** each registered double-doubles in the win. Kinney accumulated game-highs of 14 points and 15 boards, while Clark scored 13 points and 11 boards. She also dished three assists and had two steals. Clark also scored 11 points and had eight rebounds in a 66-49 loss to Kenyon. Senior **Jessie Oram (New York, NY/Beacon)** paced the Yeowomen with game-highs of 15 points, 10 rebounds and three blocks in the loss. She finished the week with a team-high 33 points and had 15 rebounds and four blocks ... Senior wing **Rachel Messaros (Reynoldsburg, OH/Bishop Hartley)** drilled three three-pointers as **OHIO WESLEYAN** opened its game at Earlham with a 16-4 run. The Battling Bishops went on to defeat the Quakers, 69-48. Messaros finished with 17 points in the victory. She scored 13 points in OWU's 62-57 loss to Kenyon. Messaros had hit a three-pointer with :17 remaining on the clock to pull the Bishops within 58-57, but Kenyon hit four straight free throws to hold off OWU ... **WITTENBERG** went 2-0 last week, as the Tigers defeated Hiram, 71-41, on Sunday, in a game that had begun 48 hours earlier. The contest was scheduled for the previous Friday but was suspended due to a power failure. Wittenberg also defeated Earlham, 70-40. Senior **Gina Carney (Lexington, KY/Catholic)** paced the Tigers in both games. She provided a spark off the bench against the Terriers, scoring 16 points and adding two rebounds, two assists and two steals to her totals. She then led a trio of players in double figures against Earlham with 14 points ... **WOOSTER** had a 2-1 week with wins over Lake Erie (65-48) and Hiram (72-64) and a four-point loss to Denison (51-47). Senior guard **Maria Gonzalez (Millersburg, OH/West Holmes)** set her career high in rebounding twice over the three games. She posted the first double-double of her career with season-highs of 15 points and 10 rebounds at Lake Erie and scored eight points and grabbed 11 rebounds against Hiram. She finished the week with 26 points, 29 rebounds, five assists and three steals.

## NCAC Swimming & Diving Report

All North Coast Athletic Conference squads, except for Wabash, will see action this week. On Friday, Allegheny is at Clarion, Denison hosts Case and Hiram is at John Carroll. Kenyon will host Ohio Northern; Oberlin and Ohio Wesleyan travel to Washington & Jefferson and Mt. Union, respectively. The next day, the Gators return home to host Carnegie Mellon, the Big Red host Duquesne and Wittenberg hosts the Terriers. The Battling Bishops travel to Kenyon, while the Lords and Ladies also send a portion of their squad to Ashland. Oberlin hosts John Carroll and Wooster welcomes Grove City. On Sunday, the Kenyon women compete at Ohio State. Wabash returns to competition on Jan. 27 at the University of Indianapolis.

The teams have three weeks left, including this week, to prepare for the North Coast Athletic Conference Swimming & Diving championships, which will be held Feb. 8-10 at C.T. Branin Natatorium in Canton, Ohio. Wabash is the 2007 championship host.

**MEN'S NOTES:** ALLEGHENY, now 2-4 in dual meet competition this season, took 14 of 16 events against Hiram. Five swimmers accounted for a dozen of the Gator victories, including three each by **Ryan Lawrence (Union City, PA/Union City)** and **Josh Sesek (Pittsburgh, PA/Brentwood)**. Lawrence swept the sprint freestyle events, easily taking the 50 (25.61), 100 (55.99) and 200 (2:02.17) events, while Sesek claimed the 100 (1:10.45) and 200 (2:35.57) breaststrokes and the 200 individual medley (2:24.24) ... DENISON locked up top-three finishes in five events to defeat Wittenberg, 145-92. **Bryce Peterson (Niwot, CO/Niwot)** swam a time of 1:46.47 in the 200 free to win the event. **John Geissing (Darien, CT/Lawrenceville)** won the 50 free (22.10) and **Andy Brabson (Boonsboro, MD/Boonsboro)** claimed the 400 IM (4:19.91) ... HIRAM dropped a pair of meets last week, falling to NCAC foes Wooster, 149-80, and Allegheny, 210-80. Freshman diver **Glen Switzer (Dade City, FL/Zephyrhills)** swept both diving events against the Fighting Scots and also claimed the three-meter board against the Gators. His score of 269.30 against Allegheny met the NCAA automatic qualifying standard. He qualified for the NCAA championships in the one-meter board earlier this season. The Terriers also won the 200 free relay in both meets. Against Wooster, freshmen **Adam Warner (North Lima, OH/South Range)** and **Kyle Kiffer (Parma, OH/Valley Forge)**, junior **Jared Drummer (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** and senior **Dan Factor (Hiram, OH/Crestwood)** combined for a time of 1:39.22. Against the Gators, Warner and Kiffer were joined by senior **Jon Weaver (North Lima, OH/South Range)** and junior **Bryan Christiansen (Rochester, NY/Penfield)** to turn in a winning time of 1:46.46 ... KENYON fell to Oakland University 193-100 after the Grizzlies won 13 of 16 events. Freshman **Kegan Borland (Vandergrift, PA/Saint Joseph)** and senior **Eduardo Rodriguez (Sao Paulo, Brazil/Colegia Luiz de Queiroz)** were the only two Kenyon swimmers to collect individual event wins. Borland won the 1,000 free (9:52.75) and Rodriguez won the 200 IM (2:02.45) ... OBERLIN sophomore **Scott McInerney (Randolph, NJ/Randolph)** paced the Yeomen with three second-place finishes in a 225-53 loss to Ohio Northern. The Oberlin men also fell to Lake Forest (93-19) and to Ursinus (67-44) ... OHIO WESLEYAN fell 137-99 to Wooster. Freshmen **Kevin Fahey (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** and **Brad Russell (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** won two events apiece in the loss. Fahey finished first in the 200 IM (2:04.23) and also won the 500 free (5:02.64). He also combined with freshmen **David Gatz (Delaware, OH/Hayes)**, **Usman Javid (Lahore, Pakistan/Aitchison)** and **Jaimito Fuentes (Massillon, OH/Glen Oak)** to win the 400 medley relay in a clocking of 3:45.15. Russell swept both diving events ... Due to weather in the Missouri area, WABASH'S home meet against Washington University was canceled as the Battling Bears could not get to Crawfordsville. The Little Giants will return to action on Jan. 27 at the University of Indianapolis. Wabash will attempt to complete an undefeated dual meet season for the first time under head coach **Peter Casares** ... WITTENBERG freshman **Neil Anderson (Lakewood, OH/Lakewood)** turned in a first-place finish in the 1650 free in a 145-92 loss to Denison ... WOOSTER swept dual meets against Hiram (149-80) and Ohio Wesleyan (137-99) last week. Freshman **Eric Babbitt (Rancho Santa Margarita, CA/Santa Margarita Catholic)** was a double-winner against the Terriers, hitting the wall first in both the 200 IM (2:06.22) and the 500 free (5:15.50). He also emerged victorious in the 200 free (1:49.40) and the 200 fly (2:08.03) at Ohio Wesleyan.

**WOMEN'S NOTES:** ALLEGHENY swept 10 of 16 events against Hiram to improve their dual meet record to 3-2. Sophomore **Erin Ham (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)** and junior **Carolyn Nairn (Lubbock, TX/Brownell-Talbot)** paced the Gators with three victories each. Ham swept both breaststroke events, winning the 100 in 1:17.69 and the 200 in 2:51.94, and also claimed the 200 IM (2:39.30). Nairn won both backstroke races as well as the 200 free (2:12.40) ... DENISON notched 10 first-place finishes en route to a 139-92 win over Wittenberg. Sophomore **Annamarie Novinger (Longmont, CO/Niwot)** took first place in the 200 (1:56.83) and 500 (5:15.11) frees to lead the Big Red. Freshman **Olivia Zaleski (Corry, PA/Corry Area)** won the 50 free (24.96) and anchored the winning 400 medley relay, along with **Meg Cassell (Albany, OR/South Albany)**, **Mary Dain (Mt. Laurel, NJ/Holy Cross)** and **Kathy Faingold (Wexford, PA/North Allegheny)**. The foursome touched in 3:59.86. Cassell also finished first in the 200 back (2:10.26), while Faingold claimed the 200 breast (2:27.22), touching the wall over 10 seconds in ahead of the second-place swimmer ... HIRAM junior **Shelly Leshe (Palm City, FL/Martin County)** won two events in each of the Terriers' meets last week. In a 132-105 loss to Wooster, she claimed the 200 free (2:00.36) and the 100 butterfly (1:00.92). In a 170-118 loss to Allegheny, she touched first in the 100 (1:08.43) and 200 (2:28.40) fly events. She also was a member of the winning 200 free relay (1:58.01) against the Gators, along with freshmen **Danielle Fisher (Aurora, OH/Aurora)** and **Gillian Millwood (Kingston, Jamaica/Campion College)** and **Amy Kocka (Strongsville, OH/Strongsville)** ... KENYON senior **Jessica Connors (Cedarburg, WI/Divine Savior Holy Angels)** guided the Ladies to a 145-143 win over Oakland University. She swam a leg of the winning 200 medley relay (1:49.57) and then posted individual wins in the 100 (1:07.22) and 200 (2:23.53) breaststrokes and in the 200 IM (2:12.28) ... OBERLIN posted a 3-1 week. Junior **Kiri Ulmschneider (Midland, TX/Midland)** won the 200 free and the 100 fly in a 99-82 win over Notre Dame College and won the 400 IM, 1,000 free and 200 fly in a 177-119 loss to Ohio Northern. The Yeowomen also earned wins against Lake Forest (86-24) and Ursinus (62-51) during their winter training trip ... Senior **Whitney Snow (West Chester, OH/Lakota East)** won the 1650 (18:24.19) and 500 (5:26.51) freestyles in OHIO WESLEYAN'S 141-91 loss to Wooster. She also combined with senior **Christina Schilling (Painesville, OH/Painesville)** and sophomores **Caitlin Hagen (East Lyne, CT, East Lyne)** and **Meghan Warren (Marlton, NJ/Shawnee)** to win the 400 free relay (4:00.24) ... WOOSTER swept Hiram (132-105) and Ohio Wesleyan (141-91) with the help of freshman **Syd Kelly (Edina, MN/Edina)**, who won both the 200 IM (2:20.29) and the 200 breast (1:13.03) in the Hiram dual and added another victory in the 200 IM (2:22.08) against OWU.
