MEN'S BASKETBALL

Ohio Wesleyan junior **Dustin Rudegear (Yellow Springs, OH/Yellow Springs)**, a 6-5 post, scored the Bishops' first six points and had eight points during a game-opening 17-0 run in a 96-59 win over Oberlin. He finished with 10 points and was 4-for-5 (.800) from the field. He returned to action in a 92-86 win over Hiram, hitting a jumper to break a 65-65 tie and putting Ohio Wesleyan ahead to stay. He finished with 10 points and four boards and was 4-for-7 (.571) from the floor.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Wooster senior **Beth Besancon Side (Wooster, OH/Smithville)**, 5-6 guard, led the Scots to a pair of conference victories last week. Side hit six three pointers as part of a game-high 24 points in a 77-71 overtime win at Allegheny. She went on to contribute 10 points and five assists in a 71-59 decision over Earlham. For the week, Side combined for 34 points, eight three-pointers, six rebounds, seven assists and two steals.

MEN'S INDOOR TRACK - DISTANCE/MIDDLE DISTANCE RUNNER

DENISON WINS SCHOOL RECORD 13 STRAIGHT;
BIG RED FACE OBERLIN AND WOOSTER THIS WEEK

CLEVELAND -- First-place Denison (11-0, 17-3), which remained unbeaten with victories over seventh-place Earlham (2-8, 3-16) and sixth-place Kenyon (5-5, 8-11) last week, travels to ninth-place Oberlin (1-9, 5-13) on Friday night, then returns home to host fifth-place Wooster (5-4, 10-8) on Saturday. The Big Red and the Yeowomen meet for the first time this season. They will meet again in Granville on Feb. 14. The Scots and Denison met earlier this season, and the Big Red walked away with a 51-47 decision.

Ohio Wesleyan (7-3, 12-7) holds a half-game lead over Wittenberg (6-3, 9-8) for second place. The Bishops host the Quakers on Tuesday night, then travel to take on the Scots Friday night. The Bishops defeated Earlham earlier this season, 69-48 and meet Wooster for the first time.

The Tigers visit the Ladies on Tuesday, then host eighth-place Hiram (1-8, 5-12) and fourth-place Allegheny (6-4, 12-6) on Friday and Saturday, respectively. Wittenberg and Kenyon meet for the first time this season; the Tigers defeated the Terriers (71-41) and the Gators (59-50) on the road earlier this season.

Other games on the schedule on Tuesday are Hiram at Allegheny and Oberlin at Wooster. Friday night, Allegheny visits Earlham. Saturday features match ups between Hiram and Earlham in Indiana and Oberlin at Kenyon in Gambier. Complete basketball statistics, available at www.northcoast.org, are updated each Sunday and Thursday throughout the basketball season.

HOOPS NOTES: **ALLEGHENY** dropped decisions to Wooster (77-71 OT) and Ohio Wesleyan (66-39) last week. After connecting on 32 three-pointers in their previous three games, the Gators went cold, hitting just 2 of 16 attempts against OWU. **Jennifer Latronica (Gibsonia, PA/Deer Lakes)** led the team with 14 points and seven rebounds in the loss ... **DENISON** extended its win streak to 13 to break a school record for consecutive victories as they defeated Earlham (57-39) and Kenyon (50-39) last week. The Big Red have not lost a game since Dec. 2. Sophomore point guard **Ellen O'Brien (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman)** led the team against Earlham with 14 points, six rebounds and four assists. Sophomore **Carolyn Simpson (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** finished with nine points and eight rebounds in 21 minutes against Kenyon, including a key three-point-play with nine minutes left ... Freshman **Starr Gary (Indianapolis, IN/Northwest)** had a team-best 21 points in **EARLHAM'S** 71-59 loss to Wooster, and a team-best seven rebounds in a 57-39 loss to Denison ... Senior **Cassie Bedard (Randolph, OH/Waterloo)** scored 26 points on 10-for-14 (.714) shooting to lead **HIRAM** in its only game last week, a 77-58 loss to Kenyon ... The Ladies' 77 points scored against the Terriers were **KENYON'S** highest point output of the season. That was followed by the team's lowest offensive output of 39 points, scored in a 50-39 loss to Denison. Junior forward **Anne Dugan (Dublin, OH/Watterson)** totaled 33 points, 14 rebounds and five steals in the two games, including 19 points and seven boards in 27 minutes of play against Hiram ... Senior captain **Jessie Oram (New York, NY/Beacon)** led **OBERLIN** in three losses last week, finishing with 49 points and 27 rebounds. The Yeomen fell to LaRoche, 59-50, Ohio Wesleyan, 75-45, and to Wittenberg, 68-45 ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** won twice last week as senior wing **Rachel Messaros (Reynoldsburg, OH/Bishop Hartley)** totaled 38 points on 11-for-23 (.478) shooting, including 8-for-12 (.667) from long range, and seven rebounds. The Bishops topped Oberlin, 75-45, and Allegheny, 66-39 ... **WITTENBERG** won its only game last week, 68-45 over Oberlin. Senior **Gina Carney (Lexington, KY/Catholic)** hit her first four shouts from the field in the game, including three three-pointers and finished with a team-best 14 points ... Senior guard **Beth Besancon Sidle (Wooster, OH/Smithville)** led **WOOSTER** to a pair of conference victories last week. Sidle hit six three pointers as part of a game-high 24 points in a 77-71 overtime win at Allegheny. She went on to contribute 10 points and five assists in a 71-59 decision over Earlham. For the week, Sidle combined for 34 points, eight three-pointers, six rebounds, seven assists and two steals.

WOOSTER SITS IN FIRST WITH 10-0 RECORD;

FIGHTING SCOTS LOOK FORWARD TO ALLEGHENY AND WITTENBERG THIS WEEK

CLEVELAND -- With three weeks left on the conference schedule, Wooster (10-0, 17-2) sits in first place in the North Coast Athletic Conference with an unblemished 10-0 record. The Fighting Scots, ranked third in the country by d3hoops.com, can take a major step toward the North Coast title, and the top seed in the upcoming NCAC Tournament, with two wins this week. The Scots can extend their eight-game winning streak with a pair of home contests: sixth-place (tie) Allegheny (4-6, 8-10) on Wednesday and second-place Wittenberg (8-2, 16-3) on Saturday. The Fighting Scots defeated the Gators, 97-87, on Jan. 10, and topped the Tigers, 68-65, on Dec. 9.

Allegheny, knotted in sixth place with Wabash, is coming off a 70-65 win over Kenyon, which snapped a two-game losing skid for the Gators. In addition to Wooster, they also face third-place Ohio Wesleyan (7-3, 13-6) this week. Allegheny travels to Delaware on Saturday. The Tigers, winners of three straight and 10 of their last 11, open their week at home against fourth-place (tie) Earlham (5-5, 7-12) on Wednesday. Ohio Wesleyan hosts Wabash (4-6, 7-12) on Wednesday; the Little Giants close their week at home on Saturday against Denison (2-8, 3-15).

Hiram (5-5, 6-13) has shown much improvement this season, under new head coach, **Steve Fleming**, thus far winning more games in conference play than they won overall last season. The Terriers, who share fourth place with Earlham, are gunning for their best finish in NCAC play since they joined the league for the 1999-00 season. They are also fighting for a potential home playoff game, as the top four seeds in the NCAC Tournament host a first-round contest. Hiram hosts eighth-place Kenyon (3-7, 7-12) on Wednesday and Oberlin (2-8, 3-16) on Saturday.

On Wednesday, Denison travels to Oberlin and Earlham heads to Kenyon on Saturday to complete this week's slate of games. Complete basketball statistics, available at www.northcoast.org, are updated each Sunday and Thursday throughout the basketball season.

HOOPS NOTES: Junior guard **Bill Babe (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** hit a three-point basket with 37 second left on the clock to hand **ALLEGHENY** a two-point lead that they would not relinquish in their 70-65 win over Kenyon. Babe, who had been held scoreless to that point, beat the shot-clock buzzer and helped Allegheny even the season series with the Lords at one game apiece. **George Raftis (Pittsburgh, PA/Sewickley Academy)** and **Ryan Hollihan (Saxonburg, PA/Knoch)** each scored 12 points in the win. The Gators lost a heart-breaker to Hiram, 82-81, earlier last week, after building up a 28-point lead. **Ben Torsney (Morgantown, WV/Morgantown)** recorded his first double-double with a team-high 14 points and 12 rebounds ... **DENISON** suffered a pair of losses this week, falling to Earlham, 80-60, and to Wittenberg, 87-65. Senior **Dan Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** paced the Big Red against the Quakers with 20 points on 9-of-11 (.818) shooting. In the first half, he moved past **Brian Malinowski ('96)** and into second place on the DU all-time scoring list. Hodgkinson has 1,765 points and needs 73 more to pass all-time leading scorer **Charlie Claggett ('70)** ... **EARLHAM** sophomore **Markous Jewett (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** totalled 48 points as the Quakers went 1-1 last week. He scored the first eight points of the night for Earlham in their 80-60 win over Denison, before going on to lead all scorers with 24 points. He then matched his points total in a 64-51 loss to first-place Wooster. He moved into 10th place on Earlham's all-time scoring list with 1,421 points, passing former teammate **Nathan Stoops (1999-03)**. For the week, Jewett shot 20-for-34 (.588) from the floor and was 4-for-4 from the free throw line. He added 13 rebounds and five assists ... In a repeat of his dramatic performance in **HIRAM'S** quadruple-overtime win over Denison last week, junior forward **Chuck Williams (Cortland, OH/Lakeview)** hit the go-ahead basket with five seconds left in the game as the Terriers overcame a 28-point deficit to defeat Allegheny, 82-81. The 28-point comeback was the largest in Hiram history. Junior forward **Mike McDevitt (Lisbon, OH/David Anderson)** scored a career-high 23 points in the win. He followed that with a 21-point performance in a 92-86 loss to Ohio Wesleyan ... **KENYON** dropped a pair of NCAC games last week. Wooster handed the Lords an 89-54 defeat, then the Lords were edged by Allegheny, 70-65. Sophomore **Bryan Yelvington (Arlington Hts., OH/John Hersey)** racked up a double-double against the Scots and finished off the week with a total of 29 points and 14 rebounds. He was 7-of-8 (.875) with 20 points and 10 boards against Wooster ... Sophomore forward **Mike Loll (Davison, MI/Davison)** scored 35 points and 11 rebounds as **OBERLIN** fell to Ohio Wesleyan (96-59) and Wabash (66-61) ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** junior post **Dustin Rudegear (Yellow Springs, OH/Yellow Springs)** scored the Bishops' first six points and had eight points during a game-opening 17-0 run in a 96-59 win over Oberlin. He finished with 10 points and was 4-for-5 (.800) from the field. He returned to action in a 92-86 win over Hiram, hitting a jumper to break a 65-65 tie and putting Ohio Wesleyan ahead to stay. He finished with 10 points and four boards and was 4-for-7 (.571) from the floor ... **WABASH** junior forward **Andrew Zimmer (Hobart, IN/Hobart)** picked up his fourth and fifth double-doubles of the season. He posted a 15-point, 10-rebound effort in a 64-51 loss to Wittenberg, then rallied the Little Giants to a 66-61 comeback victory over Oberlin with 29 points and 13 boards. He scored 21 of his 29 points against the Yeomen in the final period, hitting seven of eight attempts (.875). Nine of his 13 rebounds came on the offensive end for Wabash ... **WITTENBERG** sophomore wing **Gregg Hill (Redford, MI/Union)** hit for 21 points in a 64-51 win over Wabash and a game-high 14 points in an 87-65 win over Denison. He was 12-of-18 (.667) from the floor, including 2-of-6 (.333) from three-point range, and 9-of-12 (.750) from the charity stripe. Senior post **Dane Borchers (Russia, OH/Russia)** scored a game-high 22 points to go along with eight rebounds against the Little Giants and followed with 12 points and five boards against the Big Red ... Senior forward **Tom Port (Avon Lake, OH/Avon Lake)** continues to lead first-place **WOOSTER**, scoring 15 points in each of the Scots' victories last week. Wooster topped Kenyon, 89-54, and defeated Earlham, 64-51. Port posted a double-double with 11 rebounds and also had team-highs in assists (four without a turnover) and blocks (three) in the hard-fought win over the Quakers. In total, he combined for 30 points, six assists, four blocks and two steals.

NCAC Swimming & Diving Report

The 23rd North Coast Athletic Conference Men's & Women's Swimming & Diving Championship, hosted by Wabash, will be held February 8-10, 2007, at C.T. Branin Natatorium in Canton, Ohio. With just over one week to go, conference squads are finished with the dual meet portions of their schedules and are idle until the conference meet.

MEN'S NOTES: In the final dual meet of the season for **ALLEGHENY**, three swimmers won individual events and were part of the winning 400 medley relay as the Gators defeated Edinboro, 121-84. Those swimmers were senior **Nick Johnson (Hastings-on-the-Hudson, NY/Hastings)**, freshman **Josh Sese (Pittsburgh, PA/Brentwood)** and freshman **Robert Schreiner (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair)**. Johnson won the 100 backstroke (54.70). Sese touched first in the 200 individual medley (2:02.80) and 100 breaststroke (1:02.17), while Schreiner was also a double winner with victories in the 200 free (1:49.14) and 100 free (49.80) ... **DENISON** upped its dual record to 10-1 with a 116-85 victory over Xavier. The Big Red won seven events, led by **John Geissinger (Darien, CT/Lawrenceville)**, **David Curtis (Ann Arbor, MI/Pioneer)** and **Bryce Peterson (Niwot, CO/Niwot)**. All three were part of the winning 400 freestyle relay and won individual events. Geissinger took the 100 free (47.96), Curtis the 200 free (1:45.16) and Peterson won the 1000 free (9:51.06) and 500 free (4:48.96) ... In the final dual meet of the season for **HIRAM**, the Terriers dropped a 117-99 decision at home to Washington & Jefferson. Senior **Jon Weaver (North Lima, OH/South Range)** and freshman **Adam Warner (Norwalk, OH/Norwalk)** each won an individual event and were part of the winning 200-meter freestyle relay. Weaver touched first in the 100-meter backstroke with a time of 1:09.39, while Warner took the 100-meter breaststroke with a 1:11.94 clocking ... **KENYON** defeated Miami, 158-156 as the Lords won eight of 18 events. Junior **Josh Mitchell (Iron Mountain, MI/Kingsford)** blazed to first place in the 50-yard freestyle. He touched in 21.19 seconds, which was the fastest time in the event by a Kenyon swimmer this season, and met the NCAA "B" cut ... The University of Indianapolis put an end to **WABASH'S** perfect run through the dual-meet portion of the season, taking a 179-119 decision. The loss drops the Little Giants to 6-1 on the year. Senior **Tony Caldwell (Washington, IA/Washington)** won the 100-yard backstroke in 53.44 and the 200-yard back in 1:59.07 ... **WITTENBERG** wrapped up the dual-meet portion of the schedule with a victory over Case Western Reserve. Junior **Brian Harris (Harrisonburg, VA/Harrisonburg)** was part of the winning 200-yard medley relay, and finished first in the 100- and 50-yard freestyles. Freshman **Neil Anderson (Lakewood, OH/Lakewood)** was also a double winner, as he won the 1000- and 500-yard freestyles. The Tigers finish with a 7-4 dual meet record ... Freshman **Eric Babbitt (Rancho Santa Margarita, CA/Santa Margarita Catholic)** was a double winner as **WOOSTER** defeated OAC regular-season champion Ohio Northern, 143-98. Babbitt won the 200 freestyle (1:48.58) and 200 backstroke (2:09.55).

WOMEN'S NOTES: Junior **Carolyn Nairn (Lubbock, TX/Bownell-Talbot)** of ALLEGHENY finished the regular season unbeaten in 21 individual races. She won the 100 free (55.62) and 200 free (1:56.12) as the Gators defeated Edinboro, 107-98 ... On the strength of eight event victories, **DENISON** defeated Xavier, 117-78. The trio of seniors **Meg Cassell (Albany, OR/South Albany)** and **Mary Dain (Mt. Laurel, NJ/Holy Cross)** and freshman **Olivia Zaleski (Corry, PA/Corry Area)** led the way. All three were part of the winning 400 medley relay team. Cassell also took first in the 200 backstroke (2:08.8), Dain touched first in the 200 butterfly (2:10.64) and Zaleski was the winner in the 100 freestyle (53.32). Zaleski has the fastest time in NCAA Div. III this season in the 100 free (51.55) ... Diver **Jen Fowler (Canton, OH/McKinley)** won both diving events to lead **HIRAM** in their dual-meet loss to Washington & Jefferson, 134-100. Sophomores **Amy Kocka (Strongsville, OH/Strongsville)** and **Raisa Janke (Spring, TX/Klein Oak)** won the 100-meter free (1:03.85) and 100-meter back (1:13.21), respectively ... **KENYON** dropped its final dual meet of the season, 177-118 to Miami, yet finished with an 8-4 record, their best since going 9-5 in 1999. Senior **Jessica Connors (Cedarburg, WI/Divine Savior Holy Angels)** won both breaststroke events, finishing the 100 in 1:04.86 and the 200 in 2:22.64. Her time in the 100 was an NCAA automatic qualifying time, and her best effort of the season. Connors also swam a leg on the winning 400-yard freestyle relay ... Senior **Jackie Chapple (Medina, OH/Hawken)** and senior **Christina Schilling (Painesville, OH)** led **OHIO WESLEYAN** to a 140-104 victory over Notre Dame of Ohio. Chapple won the 100 butterfly in 1:06.04, while Schilling took the 50 backstroke in 31.14 ... Senior **Jen Mulligan (Cheyney, PA/Delaware Valley Friends)** led **WITTENBERG** in its final dual meet of the year. She placed first in the 100 backstroke and was part of the winning 200 medley relay. Junior **Lindsay Smith (Mount Vernon, OH/Mount Vernon)** and freshman **Adeline Brym (Mansfield, OH/Lexington)** were also double winners. Smith took the 50 and 100 free, while Brym won the 200 and 500 free ... A pair of **WOOSTER** swimmers won two events each to lead the Scots past Ohio Northern, 141-99. Sophomore **Molly Bittner (Westfield Center, OH/Cloverleaf)** captured top honors in the 50 freestyle (25.42) and 200 butterfly (2:23.08), while freshman **Alice Case (Berkeley Hts., NJ/Mount Saint Mary Academy)** earned victories in the 100 freestyle (55.43) and 200 freestyle (2:01.64).

**OHIO WESLEYAN WOMEN CLAIM NORTH COAST RELAY TITLE;
WABASH WINS MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP**

GRANVILLE, Ohio -- Ohio Wesleyan's women and Wabash's men claimed team championships at the 23rd North Coast Athletic Conference Indoor Track & Field Relays, held Jan. 27 at Denison's Mitchell Recreation and Athletic Center. The Bishops won for the tenth time in 23 years, while the Little Giants finish on top for the second time, and first since 2004.

Ohio Wesleyan totaled 98 points to outdistance runner up Allegheny with 76, and third-place Oberlin with 65. Wooster finished fourth with 53 points, followed by Denison (39) in fifth.

Team scores are compiled using the results of five running relays and the combined time/length of the top two performances in each of the seven remaining events.

In the women's relays, the Bishops won seven of 12 relays, while Earlham took the 4x200, Oberlin won the distance medley, Wooster was first in the pole vault relay, Allegheny won the triple jump relay and Wittenberg was victorious in the shot put relay.

Ohio Wesleyan senior **Ericka Newell (Delaware, OH/Hayes)**, junior **Ashley Shaffer (Lancaster, OH/Lancaster)** and freshman **Ashlie Britton (LeRoy, OH/Painesville Riverside)** were each part of three winning relays to pace the Bishops. Allegheny's triple jump relay set a meet record in winning the event. The duo of junior **Emily Pfeufer (St. Marys, PA/Elk County Catholic)** with a throw of 36 feet, 0.5 inches and freshman **Hannah Smith (Rice Lake, WI/Rice Lake)**, at 33 feet, 0.75 inches, combined for an effort of 69 feet, 1.25 inches to set the new standard.

In the men's relays, the Little Giants won two of 12 events and had top-three finishes in seven others to total 78 points. Ohio Wesleyan won two events and totaled 68.5 points, followed by Allegheny (60) with two wins in third. Denison (59) won three events and finished fourth, and Wooster (53.5) wound up fifth after winning two events.

Wabash freshman **Emmanuel Aouad (Terre Haute, IN/North)** was the individual winner in the 55-meter hurdles (7.88) and long jump (21 feet, 5 inches) and was part of the winning 4x200 relay that finished in 1:35.90. **Michael Barnes (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** of Denison was part of the winning distance medley relay and the second-place 4x400 meter relay. Allegheny sophomore **Joe McMahon (Pittsburgh, PA/Baldwin)** broke his own school record in the triple jump. He'd set the mark a week ago, and bettered it by more than four feet. His mark of 46 feet, 7.75 inches is also an NCAC Relay meet record and meets the NCAA III provisional qualifying standard.
