## NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (Feb. 11)

### MEN'S BASKETBALL

Allegheny junior **Bill Babe (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** averaged 25 points per game in the Gators' 2-0 week that lifted them into a fourth-place tie in the standings. Babe scored a career-high 34 points in a 94-67 defeat of Denison, then added another 16 in a 74-69 victory over Oberlin. For the week, he pulled down seven rebounds, dished out six assists and picked off four steals. He hit 18-of-30 (60%) shots from the field in the two games, including 10-of-21 (47.6%) from three-point range.

### WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Kenyon junior guard **Alisha Moreno (Mesa, AZ/Dobson)** led the Ladies to a pair of victories last week to lift Kenyon to fourth place in the NCAC standings. For the week, she totaled 27 points, seven three-pointers, seven rebounds and seven assists. Moreno had a game-high 15 points in a 56-49 defeat of Ohio Wesleyan, then had four three-pointers and 12 points in a 47-39 defeat of Earlham.

### MEN'S INDOOR TRACK - DISTANCE/MIDDLE DISTANCE RUNNER

Kenyon sophomore **Jim Boston (Brookfield, WI/Marquette)** placed fourth in the mile at the All-Ohio meet with a time of 4:20.48. He broke a school record that had stood since 1982.

### WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK - DISTANCE/MIDDLE DISTANCE RUNNER

Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Claire Everhart (Edinboro, PA/General McLane)** won the mile at the All-Ohio meet with a time of 5:14.22, which was a meet record. Everhart also anchored the second-place distance medley relay that placed second in 12:15.57, and met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard.

### MEN'S INDOOR TRACK - SPRINTS/HURDLES

Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Ryan Ellis (Columbus, OH/Dublin Scioto)** placed sixth in the 55 meters at the All-Ohio meet in 6.71 seconds. He was also part of the 4x200 meter relay that placed third in 1:33.08.

### WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK - SPRINTS/HURDLES

Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Casey Ridgeway (Fredericktown, OH/Fredericktown)** set a school record in the 55 meters with a 7.43 clocking, good for third place at the All-Ohio meet. She was also part of the third-place 4x400 meter relay and the fourth-place 4x200 meter relay.

### MEN'S INDOOR TRACK - FIELD EVENTS

Wittenberg junior **Erik Larkin (Cincinnati, OH/Country Day)** was second in the triple jump at the All-Ohio meet with a leap of 43 feet, 6.5 inches. He also placed seventh in the long jump (20-5).

### WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK - FIELD EVENTS

Wittenberg junior **Nicole Bailey (Cincinnati, OH/Summit Country Day)** won the long jump at the All-Ohio Championships with a provisional qualifying leap of 17 feet, 9.5 inches. She also took first in the triple jump (35-9.25), and was second in the 55 meters (7.40). Her time in the prelims of the 55 (7.36) was a meet record, later broken by the winner in the finals.

## **NCAC Women's Basketball Report**

### **FIVE TEAMS STILL BATTLING FOR HOME QUARTERFINAL GAMES; WITTENBERG HOLDS HALF-GAME LEAD FOR THE SECOND SPOT**

**CLEVELAND** -- While Denison (13-1, 19-4) has clinched its first North Coast Athletic Conference Championship, the rest of the conference is still jockeying for positions in the upcoming NCAC tournament. Entering the week, the Big Red the only squad assured of a home game in the upcoming quarterfinals of the NCAC Tournament. The first-round games will be played at the sites of the highest four teams in the standings after the completion of the regular season. Wittenberg, Allegheny, Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster all have a shot at the three remaining positions for home games. The NCAC Tournament quarterfinals will be played on Tuesday, Feb. 20. The Tournament semifinals and championship will be played at the site of the highest remaining seed after the first round.

Third-place Allegheny (10-5, 16-7) is a half-game behind second-place Wittenberg (10-4, 13-9). Last week, the Gators handed Denison their first loss in conference play when they claimed a 55-48 victory over the regular season champs. All that remains on the schedule for Allegheny is a road game at Hiram (1-13, 6-17) on Wednesday. The Tigers host the fourth-place team, Kenyon (9-5, 12-11), on Wednesday, then finish with a road contest at fifth-place (tie) Wooster (8-6, 13-10) on Saturday.

Ohio Wesleyan (8-6, 13-10), which enters the week tied for fifth, welcomes the team they are tied with in the standings, the Fighting Scots, to Delaware on Wednesday. The Bishops then take on Denison to wrap up the season on Saturday.

At the other end of the standings, eighth-place Oberlin (2-12, 6-17) faces Denison on Wednesday, then hosts seventh-place Earlham (3-12, 4-20) on Saturday. In addition to hosting Allegheny, ninth-place Hiram travels to Kenyon this week. Denison wraps up its regular season with a home game against the Bishops Saturday afternoon.

**HOOPS NOTES: ALLEGHENY** had a big week last week with a 64-55 defeat of Wooster, and a 55-48 victory over regular-season champ Denison. It was the Big Red's first loss in conference play this season. **Stephanie Wolf (Pittsburgh, PA/North Allegheny)** averaged 12 points, 8.5 rebounds, 5.0 assists, 3.0 steals and 2.0 blocks for the week. Wolf had 13 rebounds, including five offensive, in the win over the Scots, then contributed a game-high eight assists in the win over Denison ... **DENISON** had not lost since Dec. 2 against West Virginia Tech when Allegheny upended the Big Red last week, 55-48. Last week, after the team had clinched the regular season title and the top seed in the NCAC tournament, DU sophomore guard **Ellen O'Brien (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman)** was named to the D3hoops.com national Team of the Week. O'Brien posted 11 points, 7.4 assists and 3.5 rebounds in the two-game stretch, and committed only one turnover in 56 minutes of action ... **EARLHAM** freshman **Shontavia Davis (Indianapolis, IN/Warren Central)** led Earlham with 20 points in a 58-55 loss to Wittenberg. Classmate **Starr Gary (Indianapolis, IN/Northwest)** led the way in a 47-39 loss to Kenyon with her second double-double of the season. Gary posted 10 points and 10 rebounds ... **HIRAM** lost to Oberlin (61-56) and Wooster (73-60) last week as senior forward **Cassie Bedard (Randolph, OH/Waterloo)** scored 43 points and pulled down 11 rebounds in the two games ... **KENYON** swept a pair of conference games to remain in the hunt for a home tournament game. The Ladies, who have won four straight, knocked off Ohio Wesleyan, 56-49, and Earlham, 47-39. Junior guard **Alisha Moreno (Mesa, AZ/Dobson)** scored 27 points and posted seven three-pointers, seven rebounds and seven assists in the two games ... **OBERLIN** took a step closer to earning a playoff spot after it went 1-1 last week. The Yeowomen defeated Hiram, 61-56, as freshman shooting guard **Monica Zell (Santa Monica, CA/Santa Monica)** led all scorers with 22 points, six three pointers, four rebounds and three assists. For the week Zell totaled 39 points and 11 three-pointers. Sophomore **Alyssa Clark (Cleveland Hts., OH/Regina)** had a solid week as well, pouring in 36 points, pulling down 22 rebounds, distributing 12 assists and stealing the ball six times. Oberlin also lost a non-conference contest to Ursuline last week, 85-82 ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** lost twice in conference play to fall into a tie for fifth place. OWU fell to Kenyon, 56-49, and to Wittenberg, 70-54. Bishop senior wing **Rachel Messaros (Reynoldsburg, OH/Bishop Hartley)** led the way with 26 points on the week ... Second-place **WITTENBERG** extended its win streak to four with a 70-54 decision over Ohio Wesleyan. It was head coach Pam Smith's 399th career victory. Senior **Kathy Hittle (Noblesville, IN/Noblesville)** had 12 points and 12 rebounds against the Bishops, and enters the final week of the regular season with 999 career points ... **WOOSTER** went 1-1 last week with a loss to Allegheny (64-55) and a win over Hiram (73-60). Freshman guard **Kym Wenz (Avon Lake, OH/Avon Lake)** led the Scots against Hiram with 19 points. Freshman guard **Winnie Adrien (Selden, NY/Blair Academy, NJ)** led the team with 16 in the loss.

## NCAC Men's Basketball Report

### WOOSTER HOLDS ONE GAME LEAD ENTERING FINAL WEEK; FIVE TEAMS TIED FOR FOURTH PLACE

Wooster (13-1, 20-3) maintains its slim lead for first place and the top seed in the upcoming North Coast Athletic Conference Tournament entering the final week of the regular season. The top four seeds after the completion of the regular season will host quarterfinal games on Tuesday, February 20. The Fighting Scots, second-place Wittenberg (12-2, 20-3) and Ohio Wesleyan (9-5, 15-8) have each assured themselves a home game in the quarterfinals. The race for the fourth and final quarterfinal home game involves almost all of the remaining schools: Allegheny (6-8, 10-12), Kenyon (6-8, 10-13), Wabash (6-8, 9-14), Earlham (6-8, 8-15) and Hiram (6-8, 7-16) are all tied for fourth place with two games to play. Only Denison (3-11, 4-18) and Oberlin (3-11, 4-19) are out of the playoff picture.

The schedule this week for the first-place Scots involves a road game at Kenyon on Wednesday, and a home game versus Ohio Wesleyan on Saturday. The Lords fell to Wooster earlier this season by an 89-54 count. The Bishops dropped a 61-54 decision to the Scots a few weeks ago. OWU is the only team this week who knows exactly where they will stand in the opening round of the tournament. The Bishops have clinched the third seed and can not catch either of the top two squads. Wittenberg has a home game with Wabash on Wednesday, then finishes with a road game at Allegheny on Saturday.

Two teams involved in the fourth-place tie meet on Wednesday when Allegheny visits Hiram. Another pair involved in the tie - though they may not be tied by Saturday - meet on the final day of the regular season when Kenyon travels to Wabash. Other games on Wednesday are Denison at Earlham and Oberlin at Ohio Wesleyan. Rounding out the regular season on Saturday are Earlham at Oberlin and Hiram at Denison.

**HOOPS NOTES:** **ALLEGHENY** junior **Bill Babe (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** averaged 25 points per game in the Gators' 2-0 week that lifted them into a fourth-place tie in the standings. Babe scored a career-high 34 points in a 94-67 defeat of Denison, then added another 16 in a 74-69 victory over Oberlin. For the week, he pulled down seven rebounds, dished out six assists and picked off four steals ... Senior **Dan Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** became the all-time leading scorer in **DENISON** history during a 68-65 defeat of Kenyon. He scored 22 points in the game, including 19 in the second half. The points that put him over the top came with 1:26 remaining on the clock, when he took a feed from freshman guard **Chris Luther (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** in the post and spun to the right to bank it in. He breaks 1970 graduate Charlie Claggett's 37-year old mark. The Big Red snapped a six-game losing skid with the win. They also lost to Allegheny last week, 94-67, as Hodgkinson contributed another 15 to move his career point total to 1,855 ... **Markous Jewett (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** led **EARLHAM** past Wabash last week, 72-70, with 24 points and six rebounds in an important victory for the Quakers. Earlham went on to lose to Ohio Wesleyan, 82-70, as Jewett contributed 21 points. He enters the final week of the regular season with 1,489 points in his career, and stands seventh on the school's all-time list ... **HIRAM** had the misfortune to face the top two teams in the league in the same week. The Terriers dropped a 90-73 decision to Wooster and lost 78-41 to Wittenberg as **Mike McDevitt (Lisbon, OH/David Anderson)** totaled 36 points and 13 rebounds in the two games ... **KENYON** sophomore forward **Bryan Yelvington (Arlington Hts., IL/John Hersey)** registered two double-doubles this week and guided the Lords to a split of two NCAC games. In a 68-65 loss to Denison, Yelvington had 12 points and 12 rebounds. Three days later, he poured in 24 points and snared 12 rebounds in a 73-66 defeat of Oberlin. Kenyon hit the 10-win plateau for the first time since 1996 ... **OBERLIN** sophomore **Mike Loll (Davison, MI/Davison)** led the Yeomen in scoring in both of his team's losses last week. Loll accumulated 19 points and 11 rebounds and dished four assists in a 74-69 loss to Allegheny, then pulled down eight rebounds to go with 20 points in a 73-66 loss to Kenyon. Against Kenyon, Oberlin made all 20 of its free-throw attempts. Junior guard **Jordan Beard (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)** needs three more three-pointers to become Oberlin's all-time leader in three-pointers made. He had six in two games last week. He is also within reach of the school's single-season mark for free-throw percentage ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** also split a pair of NCAC contests last week, losing to Wittenberg, 71-64, and defeating Earlham, 82-70. Junior post **Jesse Jean (Alexandria, VA/Hyde, CT)** scored a team-high 20 points and 12 rebounds with three blocks against the Tigers, then added 12 points and 12 rebounds against the Quakers with another three blocked shots ... Junior forward **Andrew Zimmer (Hobart, IN/Hobart)** averaged 23.5 points per game as **WABASH** lost both of its games last week, including a game-high 25 in a heartbreaking 68-63 loss to Wooster. The Little Giants also dropped a narrow 72-70 decision to Earlham ... **WITTENBERG** defeated Ohio Wesleyan (71-64) and Hiram (78-41) at home last week. Senior post **Dane Borchers (Russia, OH/Russia)** scored 19 and 14 points, respectively, in the two games. The Tigers have topped the 20-win plateau for the seventh straight season, and the senior class lays claim to an impressive 99-16 record in their careers ... **WOOSTER** managed to make a comeback after being down, 61-60 against Wabash. A foul on a three-point field goal and the subsequent successful free throw gave the Scots a key four-point play and let them take the lead for good. Wooster escaped Crawfordsville with a 68-63 victory. Senior **Tom Port (Avon Lake, OH/Avon)** finished with 23 points to lead the Scots. In other action, the Scots defeated Hiram, 90-73, as four players hit double figures.

KENYON LORDS AND LADIES CLAIM NCAC CHAMPIONSHIPS;  
DENISON MEN AND WOMEN FINISH SECOND

CANTON, Ohio – The Kenyon College Lords and Ladies successfully defended their respective team titles at the North Coast Athletic Conference Swimming & Diving Championships, hosted by Wabash at C.T. Branin Natatorium, February 8-10.

The Lords, who now own 22 of 23 NCAC titles, won 12 of 20 events to total 1,643 points to best second-place Denison. The Big Red won eight events to enroute to 1,514 points. Wabash placed third for the six time in eight years with 998 points, the second highest total in Little Giant history. Wooster placed fourth with 808 points, followed by Wittenberg (786.5), Allegheny (635), Ohio Wesleyan (381), Hiram (321) and Oberlin (285.5) in positions five through nine, respectively.

The Ladies, who also have 22 crowns, won 12 of 20 events to total 1,636.5 points to top second-place Denison. The Big Red women recorded six first-place finishes on the way to 1,555.5 points and their 22nd second-place finish. Wittenberg placed third with 847.5 points; Allegheny compiled 800 points to place fourth, followed by Wooster (739.5), Ohio Wesleyan (518), Oberlin (497) and Hiram (496) in positions five through eight, respectively.

Kenyon freshman **Tina Ertel (Halle, Germany/Sportgymnasium Halle)** was voted the Female Swimmer of the Year after winning all seven of her events at the championships. Individually, she collected wins in the 200 individual medley (2:07.46), the 100 butterfly (56.33) and the 100 freestyle (51.47). Her time in the 100 fly established a new NCAC record, and also qualified her for the upcoming NCAA Division III Championships in Houston. Additionally, she qualified for the national meet in the 100 free. She also swam on four winning relays.

Lords' junior **Josh Mitchell (Iron Mountain, MI/Kingsford)** was tabbed the Male Swimmer of the Year after posting individual victories in the 50 free (20.79), 100 backstroke (51.40) and the 100 free (45.94). He was a part of six victories for the Kenyon men, as he also swam on three winning relays.

Wittenberg junior **Courtney Roth (Gurnee, IL/Lake Forest)** swept both diving events to repeat as the Female Diver of the Year. Denison junior **Stephen Julka (Madison, WI/James Madison Memorial)** also took both diving events to earn Male Diver of the Year honors for the third consecutive year. He surpassed the NCAA automatic qualifying standard with his 443.90 total on the 3-meter board.

Allegheny's **Tom Erdos** and Kenyon's **Jim Steen** were voted Co-Women's Swimming Coaches of the Year by their peers. Erdos earns the honor for the third time, while Steen earns his eighth award. Steen was also voted Men's Swimming Coach of the Year - the fourth time he has been honored for his efforts with the men's squad. Ohio Wesleyan's **Brian Book** was named Women's Diving Coach of the Year. The award is his first. Denison's **Stephen Ritter** was named Men's Diving Coach of the Year for the second straight year after his divers placed first and second on the 1-meter board and first and third on the 3-meter board.

## **NCAC Indoor Track & Field Report**

**For Immediate Release  
February 11, 2007**

Two weeks remain before the North Coast Athletic Conference Indoor Track & Field Championships, to be held March 2-3 at Denison. A busy week lies ahead for NCAC track squads as they prepare for the upcoming championship meet. Friday night, Allegheny and Oberlin will compete at the Kent State Tune-Up Meet and Hiram, Oberlin and Wooster join the field at the Greater Cleveland Championships, to be hosted by Baldwin-Wallace. Also Friday night, Ohio Wesleyan competes at the Hoosier Hills Invitational.

Saturday, Denison, Kenyon and Ohio Wesleyan compete at the Greater Columbus meet, to be hosted by the Lords. Wabash also hosts a meet that day, the Wabash Indoor Open. Finally, Wittenberg travels to compete at the Scarlet & Gray Invitational, hosted by Ohio State.

**WOMEN'S NOTES:** At the Fourth Annual Indoor Division III All-Ohio Championships, Ohio Wesleyan finished second, followed by Wittenberg in sixth, Oberlin in 11th and Wooster in 15th. Denison tied for 16th. Bishop freshman **Claire Everhart (Edinboro, PA/General McLane)** led Ohio Wesleyan with a victory in the mile. She ran a meet-record time of 5:14.22, and anchored the second-place distance medley relay that met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard with a time of 12:15.57. OWU frosh **Sarah Shinn (Edinboro, PA/General McLane)** won the 800 meters with a time of 2:17.68, and was part of the provisional qualifying relay. Wittenberg junior **Nicole Bailey (Cincinnati, OH/Summit Country Day)** won the long jump (5.42 meters/17 feet, 9.5 inches) and triple jump (10.90 meters/35-9.25) and was second in the 55 meters with a time of 7.40 seconds. Bailey's mark in the long jump met the NCAA provisional standard and shattered the 15 year old Tiger school mark, and her time in the 55 in the prelims (7.36) broke a meet record. The record was broken by another runner in the finals. Oberlin's top individual finisher was sophomore **Maddy Davis-Hayes (Philadelphia, PA/Germantown Friends)**, who was runner-up to Everhart in the mile with a time of 5:15.09. Wooster sophomore **Ali Drushal (Lakeville, OH/West Holmes)** was the Scots' top finisher with a fifth-place showing in the pole vault (9 feet, 8 inches). Denison freshman **Emily Hammeren (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** was the top individual for the Big Red. She placed seventh in the pole vault (9 feet, 2.5 inches).

At Capital's Rev. Mike Hout Invitational, Ohio Wesleyan was second, followed by Denison in third, Wittenberg seventh and Kenyon in eighth. Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Amber Allegría (Tucson, AZ/Salpointe Catholic)** won the 300 meters in 45.27 seconds and the 500 meters in 1:23.77, and ran the lead leg on the winning 4x400 meter relay (4:25.50). Bishop senior **Marie Rymut (Broadview Hts., OH/Brecksville-Broadview Hts.)** won the 800 meters in 2:32.77 and was part of the first-place 4x400 relay. Denison senior **Christine Collins (Chagrin Falls, OH/Chagrin Falls)** won the mile in 5:27.33 and the 1000 meters in 3:11.71. Kenyon sophomores **Jessica Francios (Yorktown Hts., NY/Yorktown)** and **Allegra Fety (Rogue River, OR/Rogue River)** had third-place showings to pace the Ladies. Francios was third in the mile (5:33.07), while Fety was third in the 1000 meters (3:18.45).

At the Oberlin Open, the host Yeowomen finished second, followed by Hiram in fifth and Wooster in sixth. Four different individuals won events for Oberlin. Junior **Chisara Nwabara (Valparaiso, IN/Valparaiso)** took first in the long jump with a leap of 4.59 meters/15 feet, 0.75 inches. Senior **Ariane Burwell (San Francisco, CA/Urban School)** won the 3000 meters in 1:06.01. Freshman **Madeline Schultz (Concord, MA/Concord Carlisle)** cleared 1.42 meters/4 feet, 7.75 inches to win the high jump, and junior **Deysi Villarreal (Tuscon, AZ/Canyon del Oro)** took top honors in the pole vault after clearing nine feet even (2.74 meters). Leading Hiram was junior **Lynne Hutchison (Solon, OH/Solon)**, who won the 55-meter hurdles in 9.03 seconds.

Allegheny junior **Liz Earley (Venetia, PA/Peters Township)** broke her own school record in the weight throw for the third time this season at the Baldwin-Wallace Mid-February Invitational. This time she upped her mark to a distance of 52 feet, 3.25 inches, which is one of the top 10 efforts in NCAA Division III this season. Earley was also second in the shot put, clearing 40 feet for the first time in her career, with a mark of 40 feet, 0.75 inches. Junior **Emily Pfeufer (St. Mary's, PA/Elk County Catholic)** won the triple jump, and fell a millimeter short from winning the long jump as well. She leapt 36 feet, 2.25 inches in the triple jump, outdistancing second place by nearly two feet. Her lean of 16 feet, 11.25 inches fell a quarter-inch out of first. Freshman **Hannah Smith (Rice Lake, WI/Rice Lake)** won the 55-meter hurdles in 9.15 and was third in the long jump (14-6.5).

Oberlin's distance medley relay team of senior **Barrie Newberger (Winfield, WV/Winfield)**, sophomore **Flannery Cerbin (LaCrosse, WI/LaCrosse)**, Davis-Hayes and **Nicole Ouellet (Dunbarton, NH/Goffstown)** ran at the Boston University St. Valentine Invitational. The foursome placed sixth in the strong field and posted the fourth-best time in Division III this season, 12:06.71.

**MEN'S NOTES:** At the Fourth Annual Indoor Division III All-Ohio Championships, Ohio Wesleyan placed sixth, Wooster tied for ninth, Wittenberg was 11th, Kenyon 12th, Denison 14th and Oberlin 17th. Wooster junior **Tristan Jordan (Virginia Beach, VA/Floyd E. Kellum)** won the triple jump (13.60 meters/44 feet, 7.5 inches), while Wittenberg sophomore **Erik Larkin (Cincinnati, OH/Country Day)** was right

behind him in second with a leap of 13.27 meters (43-6.5). Denison's top finish was third in the distance medley. The foursome of **Mike Barnes (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)**, **Ben Pendery (Ft. Thomas, KY/Highlands)**, **Lex Hultquist (Knoxville, TN/Webb School)** and **Joel Bendtsen (Chillicothe, OH/Chillicothe)** finished in 10:23.63. Kenyon freshman **Dondrea Brown (Columbus, OH/McKinley)** and sophomore **Jim Boston (Brookfield, WI/Marquette)** each established school records at the all-Ohio meet. Brown broke his own school mark in the 55 meters, finishing fourth in 6.63 seconds. Boston ran the mile in 4:20.48 to take fourth and best the Kenyon mark of 4:22.84 that had stood since 1982. Pacing Ohio Wesleyan at the meet were sophomore **Clay Davis (Dublin, OH/Coffman)** and junior **Michael Tornifolio (Stow, OH/Stow-Monroe Falls)**. Both earned fourth-place finishes, Davis in the 5000 meters, Tornifolio in the pole vault. Sophomore **Ryan King (Glastonbury, CT/Glastonbury)** set an Oberlin school record in the mile, finishing in 4:23.09, good for sixth place.

At Capital's Rev. Mike Hout Invitational, Wittenberg wound up third, Kenyon was fourth, Ohio Wesleyan fifth, and Denison seventh. Kenyon freshman **Rob Carpenter (North Yarmouth, ME/North Yarmouth)** paced the field in the mile in 4:31.40 and the 800 meters in 2:03.93 to win both events. Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Matt MacKenzie (Franklin, MA/Franklin)** won the 500 meters in 1:10.16, while Bishop senior **Seth Moore (Xenia, OH/Yellow Springs)** took first in the 5000 meters (16:09.25). Denison was paced by freshman **Bill Horn (Indianapolis, IN/Roncalli)**, who won the pole vault by clearing 4.27 meters (14 feet even). **Adam Tewahade (Aurora, CO/Regis Jesuit)** was second in the mile and **Matt Perkett (Newburgh, IN/Indiana Academy)** was runner up in the 800 meters.

Wooster paced NCAC squads at the Oberlin Open Friday night, with a third-place team finish. The host Yeomen were fourth and Hiram was fifth in the six-team field. Hiram's top finish was posted by sophomore **Kevin Tolbert (Shaker Hts., OH/Shaker Hts.)**, who was third in the 55 meters in 6.76 seconds. He was also fifth in the 200 meters (24.32). Junior **Mike Grafton (Canton, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** was fourth in the 55 meters (6.82), was fifth in the long jump (19-1.5) and fourth in the triple jump (38-7.75). Junior **Cassius Harris (Chicago, IL/Loyola)** led an Oberlin trio of individual event winners with a victory in the long jump. He sailed 6.45 meters (21-2) to best a 10-man field. **Everett Schlawin (Princeton, NJ/W. Windsor Plains)**, a sophomore, also claimed an event title for the Yeomen. Schlawin top an 18-man field in the 3000 meters with a time of 9:03.43. Senior John Hepp (**Bay Village, OH/Lutheran West**) took top honors in the shot put with a heave of 14.25 meters (46-9). Wooster's top individual was senior **Tim Presto (Wadsworth, OH/Wadsworth)**, who won the mile in 4:44.92.

Allegheny competed at the Baldwin-Wallace Invitational and won several events. The 4x400 and 4x200 relays were each victorious. The Gators swept the top two spots in the pole vault with **Peter Sotherland (Kalamazoo, MI/Kalamazoo Central)** and **Erich Wittmer (Se-wickley, PA/Quaker Valley)** tying for first at 13 feet, 4.25 inches. Allegheny also dominated the mile, taking three of the top four spots. **Ben Mourer (Chicora, PA/Karns City)** paced the trio in second place, just two hundredths of a second behind the winner from Fredonia State (4:29.86).

Wabash finished 10th of 23 teams at the DePauw Invitational. **Geoff Lambert (Chesteron, IN/Chesterton)** won the 800 meters in meet record time (1:54.61) to lead the Little Giants. **Nathan Bates (Ossian, IN/Norwell)** was third in the 800 in 1:56.4 while freshman **Em-manuel Aouad (Terre Haute, IN/North)** was ninth in the 55-meter hurdles (8.10 seconds).
