## NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (Apr. 2)

### BASEBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Ohio Wesleyan senior second baseman **Kyle Sherman (Plain City, OH/Dublin Scioto)** was 11-for-17 (.647) for the week with eight runs scored, two doubles, two triples, three homers, nine RBI and 26 total bases. He registered a 1.529 slugging percentage over the six games, leading the Battling Bishops to a 5-1 week. In the four-game league series against Earlham, he paced the Bishops, hitting 10-for-13 (.769) with seven runs scored, a double, two triples, eight RBI and 24 total bases. The highlight of his week was the third and fourth games against the Quakers when he hit three homers. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Oberlin freshman **Jack Dunn (Lake Havasu City, AZ/Lake Havasu)** picked up two complete-game wins and a save, accounting for three of the Yeomen's six wins last week. He worked 16 innings, giving up 11 hits and two earned runs and racked up 16 strikeouts.

### MEN'S LACROSSE

In a 10-7 victory over previously undefeated Kenyon, junior goalkeeper **Ryan Perone (Fairfield, CT/Fairfield Prep)** led Ohio Wesleyan in the nets. Entering the game, the Lords averaged nearly 14 goals per game, but Perone was up to the task, posting perhaps his finest performance of the season. He made 11 saves to lead the Bishop defense and hold the high-scoring Kenyon team to seven goals, its lowest offensive output of the season.

### WOMEN'S LACROSSE

Wittenberg junior **Amber Cupples (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** scored three goals in each game of the Tigers' 1-1 week. She added two assists in her team's 19-2 defeat of Fontbonne to give her eight points for the week. Cupples leads Wittenberg with 14 points and nine goals through five games. She ranks seventh in the NCAC in scoring and leads the conference with 4.8 draw controls per game.

### SOFTBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Denison senior **Andrea Carella (North York, Ontario/Michael Power)** posted a .609 on-base percentage and hit 9-for-18 as the Big Red went 3-3 last week. She is second on the team with a .426 batting average. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Kenyon junior **Stephanie Hemmingson (Beaverton, OR/Woodrow Wilson)** threw 13 innings and went 1-1. She gave up nine hits and two earned runs, fanning three batters and posting a 1.08 ERA for the week.

### OUTDOOR TRACK

**Men's Middle Distance/Distance:** Wittenberg sophomore **Gabe Savage (Lewisburg, OH/Tri-County North)** placed third the 1500 meters at the Cedarville. He finished in 3:57.20.

**Women's Middle Distance/Distance:** Oberlin sophomore **Maddy Davis-Hayes (Philadelphia, PA/Germantown Friends)** won the 5,000 meters at the Asics Invitational hosted by Winthrop University. Davis-Hayes set a school record with a time of 17:33.98. She not only beat the second-place finisher in the event by nearly a minute, but she also became a provisional qualifier for the NCAA Championships by over six seconds.

**Men's Sprints/Hurdles:** Kenyon freshman **Dondrea Brown (Columbus, OH/McKinley)** won the 100 meters in 11.31 at the Wooster Invitational. He also placed fourth in the 200 meters in 22.56.

**Women's Sprints/Hurdles:** Earlham sophomore **Starr Gary (Indianapolis, IN/Northwest)** won the 100 meters in 12.49 seconds and the 200 meters in 25.67 seconds at the Anderson Invitational. She also anchored the second-place 4x100 meter relay that set a school record (50.41 seconds), and won the long jump (16 feet, 2 inches).

**Men's Field:** Oberlin sophomore **Kyle Taljan (North Ridgeville, OH/St. Ignatius)** finished in seventh place in the decathlon by garnering an Oberlin all-time best 4,863 points. He competed at the Asics Invitational hosted by Winthrop.

**Women's Field:** Wooster sophomore **Ali Drushal (Lakeville, OH/West Holmes)** won the pole vault and javelin at the Wooster Invitational. She took the vault by clearing 9 feet, 6.5 inches, and the javelin with a throw of 121 feet even.

## NCAC Spring Sports Update

### BASEBALL REPORT

Wooster (5-0, 17-0) extended its run to 17 straight victories, including a 12-3 win over Kenyon (1-2, 9-6) last week. The Fighting Scots and Lords managed to get in only one of four games set for last week. They will make up a doubleheader today. Oberlin (2-0, 7-10) shares first place in the NCAC East after taking two games from Hiram (1-3, 2-15) last week. The Yeomen won both ends of the twinbill, 5-4. The Yeomen and Terriers will make up their missed doubleheader this afternoon as well. This weekend's slate of East Division games sends Oberlin to Wooster on Friday and Saturday in a battle for the top spot in the division. Allegheny (0-4, 2-14), which found its way to the win column for the first time this season last week, will host third-place Kenyon on Saturday and Sunday. Fourth-place Hiram has the week off from divisional play and will resume NCAC action in two weeks at Allegheny.

Denison (4-0, 6-11) and Ohio Wesleyan (6-0, 12-7) remain linked atop the West Division. The Big Red did not play a conference contest last week, but scheduled a three-game cross-divisional non-league series with Allegheny. Denison dropped two of three to the Gators. The Battling Bishops swept their season series over Earlham (0-4, 5-12). Third-place Wittenberg (3-3, 9-11) took three of four games from fourth-place Wabash (1-7, 6-17). The Tigers opened the four-game series with a pair of wins (4-2, 13-5), before the Little Giants rebounded with a game-three victory (11-7). Wittenberg closed out the weekend with a win in game four (9-8). This week, Denison hosts Wittenberg on Friday and Saturday, while Wabash hosts Earlham. Ohio Wesleyan has the weekend off from divisional play and will resume league play on April 14-15 when the Big Red visit Delaware.

**Notes:** **ALLEGHENY** picked up its first two wins of the season, topping Denison in non-conference play, 4-3 and 10-9. In between those contests, the Gators dropped a 13-3 decision to the Big Red. The first win against Denison snapped the Gators' 13-game losing skid. Junior **Eric Rich (McMurray, PA/Peters Township)** led Allegheny with a .375 batting average. In the three games with Denison, he tallied four hits, four runs scored and three RBI. He started all six games on the week, going 9-for-24 with seven runs scored, a triple, a home run, five runs batted in and a team-best .583 slugging percentage ... **DENISON** senior **Chris Day (Holmesville, OH/Waynedale)** hit .444 with a homer, a triple, a double and three RBI as the Big Red went 1-4 last week. Day is third on the team with a .381 batting average. He is also the team leader with 18 RBI and a perfect 12-for-12 in stolen bases. Freshman pitcher **Aidan Lucas (Evanston, IL/Evanston Township)** threw 3.2 innings of relief in game three versus Allegheny and struck out seven of his 12 batters faced. He has 14 strikeouts in 8.2 innings pitched this year ... **EARLHAM** sophomore **Cal Wilson (Pendleton, IN/Pendleton Hts.)** hit .333 (6-for-18) with a homer and four RBI as the Quakers dropped five games last week, including four in NCAC play. Junior **Eric Sturgeon (Logansport, IN/Logansport)** hit a team-best 6-for-13 (.462) on the week, driving in two runs ... **HIRAM** split a makeup doubleheader with Kenyon, dropping the first game, 6-0, and winning the second, 7-6, after sophomore **Joe Trela (Lakewood, OH/Lakewood)** hit a walk-off homer in the bottom of the eighth inning. Sophomore **Craig Dobos (Warren, OH/Howland)** is riding a four-game hitting streak and has recorded multi-hit games in three of the last four Hiram outings ... **KENYON** opened NCAC play with a doubleheader split at Hiram. The Lords opened with a 6-0 victory, then dropped the second game, 7-6. They then fell to Wooster, 12-3. Against the Terriers, sophomore ace **Geoff Bollier (Carmel, IN/Carmel)** allowed three hits and struck out seven in a complete game shutout. At the plate, senior **Brad Reynolds (Duxbury, MA/Duxbury)** was a combined 5-for-10 in the three games. He also scored twice and had one RBI ... **OBERLIN'S** week included eight spring break games in Phoenix and an NCAC doubleheader against Hiram. The Yeomen went 6-4 on the week, including a sweep of the Terriers. Senior **Jesse Cullen-Dupont (Brooklyn, NY/Archbishop Molloy)** went 11-for-20 (.550) with six RBI, six runs scored, four walks, a double and five stolen bases. Sophomore **Brian Verne (Shaker Hts., OH/Shaker Hts.)** went 15-for-35 (.429) with nine runs scored, two RBI, two doubles, five walks and seven stolen bases. Freshman **Jack Dunn (Lake Havasu City, AZ/Lake Havasu)** picked up two complete-game wins and a save. He worked 16 innings, giving up 11 hits and two earned runs and racked up 16 strikeouts ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** went 5-1 last week, taking four games from Earlham in NCAC action and also topping Mount Union, 8-4. The Battling Bishops fell to Marietta, 8-4. Senior **Kyle Sherman (Plain City, OH/Dublin Scioto)** was 11-for-17 (.647) for the week with eight runs scored, two doubles, two triples, three homers, nine RBI and 26 total bases. He registered a 1.529 slugging percentage over the six games. In the league series against Earlham, he paced the Bishops, hitting 10-for-13 (.769) with seven runs scored, a double, two triples, eight RBI and 24 total bases. The highlight of his week was the third and fourth games against the Quakers when he hit three homers. Shortstop **Logan Hronis (Rocky River, OH/St. Edward)** hit 11-for-19 (.579) against Earlham with 10 runs, six doubles, a homer and six RBI. Overall he was 17-for-26 (.654) for the week, highlighted by five hits at Mount Union, tying an OWU record. Freshman righthander **Tyler Smith (Bryan, OH/Bryan)** earned a complete-game win in game one against Earlham. He struck out 12 and walked four while allowing eight hits and three runs ... **WABASH** junior **David Culp (DeKalb, IL/DeKalb)** returned to the Little Giant lineup after suffering an ankle injury a week ago to hit .533 (8-for-15) with six RBI, a walk and no strikeouts. Culp collected two doubles, a triple and scored three runs and stole two bases in his five starts. He picked up five RBI in the 11-7 victory over Wittenberg, going 3-for-5 (.600) with a three-run double and a two-run triple.

Sophomores **Jake Thomas (Evanston, IL/Evanston)** and **Matt Dodaro (St. John, IN/Lake Central)** each hit a pair of dingers against the Tigers. Dodaro's grand slam in the top of the seventh inning of game four gave Wabash an 8-7 lead while helping erase a five-run deficit before Wittenberg mounted its comeback ... **WITTENBERG** went 3-3 last week, which included taking three of four games from Wabash. Freshman **Chris Dorka (Worthington, OH/Thomas Worthington)** hit safely in all six games, going 7-for-17 (.412) with four runs and seven RBI. He drove in a career-high four runs in the second game against the Little Giants. Sophomore **Jon Dalton (Beavercreek, OH/Beavercreek)** hit a two-run single in the bottom of the seventh inning of game four to lift the Tigers from an 8-7 deficit. Senior **Tyler McClain (Springfield, OH/North)** tossed a complete game in the Wabash series opener, picking up a 4-2 victory despite allowing eight hits and four walks in his seven innings of work. The win was his first of the season ... **WOOSTER** added two victories to its record start last week, topping Baldwin-Wallace, 18-12, and defeating Kenyon, 12-3. In a record of another sort entirely, the Fighting Scots set an NCAA Div. III record for most team hit by pitches in a single inning. In the seventh inning against Kenyon, six Wooster batters were struck by pitches. Senior **Sheldon Steiner (Dalton, OH/Central Christian)** went 4-for-10 with eight RBI in the two games. He also scored four runs and reached base once after being hit by a pitch. Against B-W, he hit a two-run double as part of Wooster's key seven-run fifth inning and then gave the Scots a 4-0 lead via a three-run homer in the third inning against the Lords. Junior lefty **Adam Samson (Orville, OH/Orville)** was the Scots' lone pitcher to throw in both of last week's games. He threw a complete game against Kenyon, yielding three runs on eight hits. He struck out seven and improved to 3-0 for the season. He pitched the sixth inning against B-W, giving up a single run and setting down one on strikes.

**GOLF REPORT**

Five North Coast squads compete at this weekend's Ted Barclay Spring Invitational at the Granville Golf Course. Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster will join host Denison on Saturday and Sunday. Allegheny will begin competition at the two-day Mid-Atlantic Regional, hosted by Rochester at the Hershey Country Club in Hershey, PA, on Sunday. Wabash takes to the course tomorrow at the Big Four Classic against Butler, DePauw and Hanover at Crooked Stick Golf Course in Indianapolis.

**Notes:** **WITTENBERG** won the seven-team Kenyon Invitational at Apple Valley Golf Course in Howard, Ohio, last week. The Tigers took three of the top four individual spots in the tournament, led by freshman **Andrew Flint (Cincinnati, OH/Sycamore)** who earned medalist honors after a career-best two-day total of 155. Wittenberg carded a two-day team total of 629. **WOOSTER** (636) placed a season-best second, the host **KENYON** Lords (661) were fourth and Hiram (701) and Oberlin (725) finished sixth and seventh. All five Fighting Scot individuals placed in the top 12, led by junior **Pat Lynch (Naperville, IL/Marmion Academy)**, who was part of a three-way tie for second (80-77). On day two, Lord senior captain **Will O'Keefe (Hamden, CT/Cheshire Academy)** duplicated his first-round total of 80 to finish in sixth-place overall with a combined 160. Sophomore **Dan Dierenfeld (Arlington, VA/Potomac School)** tied O'Keefe for sixth by firing rounds of 82 and 78. The Terriers were led by junior **Craig Blaustein (Beachwood, OH/Beachwood)** who carded a total of 160 to also finish sixth. Yeoman freshman **Matt Aucunas (Chicago, IL/Chicago Lab)** scored a 168, good for 20th place ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** tied for eighth of 30 at the Camp LeJeune Intercollegiate Invitational. Senior **Doug McCullough (Sleepy Hollow, IL/St. Edward)** led the Bishops, finishing in a tie for 12th with a 140 ... **WABASH** finished second of seven at the Hanover Invitational. Freshman **Sam Russell (Springfield, OH/Greenon)** shot an even-par 72 on the final day of competition to clinch medalist honors. He shot 74 on day one to finish with a two-day total of 146 (+2). He is the first medalist for Wabash at a tournament since **James Lisher ('01)** fired a 77 at the 1999 Marian College Invitational to earn the top individual spot. Sophomore **Jordan Vice (Bedford, IN/Bedford North Lawrence)** tied for low-score honors at last year's Hanover Invitational, but lost on the second playoff hole to Brescia's Ty Whittler. Vice finished seventh at this year's event with a 151.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT**

The only conference game scheduled for the coming week is a Saturday afternoon tilt between Kenyon (0-1, 6-1) and Wittenberg (1-1, 4-3) in Springfield. Both teams are looking to bounce back from conference losses suffered last week. The Lords lost for the first time this season, a 10-7 decision to Ohio Wesleyan (2-0, 6-2) while the Tigers were beaten by Denison (1-0, 6-2) by a 15-3 count. The Big Red's only action this week is at Colorado College on Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan has a trio of home non-conference matches on tap. The Battling Bishops host Whittier tomorrow, St. Vincent on Thursday and Stevens Tech on Sunday. Oberlin (0-3, 1-5) and Wooster (1-0, 5-1) are both idle.

**Notes:** **DENISON** won its conference opener last week, a 15-3 decision over Wittenberg. Freshman **Brady Burton (Dublin, OH/Jerome)** scored twice and added two assists to lead the Big Red against the Tigers. Burton also paced Denison in its 12-5 decision over St. Vincent with a career-high six goals. Burton ranks third in the conference with 2.75 goals scored per game this season (22 in 8 games played). Junior attacker **Topher Nazaruk (Stratford, CT/Fairfield Prep)** leads the conference with 4.33 points per game ... **KENYON** senior **Luke Larson (Mercer Island, WA/Seattle Academy)** scored four of the Lords' seven goals in a 10-7 loss to Ohio Wesleyan. He stands second in the North Coast with 20 goals in seven games (2.86 goals per game) ... **OBERLIN** won for the first time in 2007 when they defeated Vassar, 11-9, in front of a large crowd of Oberlin alumni in attendance at the game in Poughkeepsie, New York. Senior **Bryan Harfenist (Larchmont, NY/Mamaroneck)** scored five times to lead the way. Junior goalkeeper **Drew Zambelli (East Chester, NY/Fieldston School)** made 22 saves ... In its 10-7 victory over Kenyon, **OHIO WESLEYAN** built up a 5-0 lead to open the game and never looked back. Junior **Ryan Perone (Fairfield, CT/Fairfield Prep)** made 11 saves in perhaps his finest performance of the season in the nets. Sophomore attacker **Dave Castignola (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** scored four goals, and added two more in a 19-4 defeat of Washington & Jefferson last

week. Junior midfielder **Chris Eccles (Secane, PA/Monsignor Bonner)** contributed four goals and four assists against the Presidents ... **WITTENBERG** freshman **Jeff Capella (Columbus, OH/Worthington Kilbourne)** totaled five goals and one assist in the Tigers' 1-1 week, which included a 20-3 defeat of Fontbonne and a 15-3 loss to Denison ... Freshman midfielder **Pat Coyne (Chatham, NJ/Chatham)** had a breakout game in **WOOSTER'S** 13-6 win over Whittier. Coyne scored three times, including two in a key 5-0 fourth-quarter run, and added an assist.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT**

Every North Coast Athletic Conference squad sees conference play this week but one. The action begins Wednesday, when Wittenberg (0-0, 2-3) welcomes Denison (0-0, 2-5) and Kenyon (0-0, 2-3) entertains Ohio Wesleyan (1-0, 4-1). The Bishops are coming off a victory in the first NCAC contest of 2007. They defeated Allegheny (0-1, 2-3) by a 17-8 score on March 31. Saturday, the Ladies host the Gators, the Bishops travel to the Big Red's home field and Wittenberg (0-0, 2-3) visits Oberlin (0-0, 4-1). Wooster (0-0, 2-3) does not open conference play until April 11.

**Notes:** **ALLEGHENY** lost twice last week, including a 17-8 decision to Ohio Wesleyan in the 2007 NCAC opener. The Gators also lost to Fredonia State, 12-3. Junior goalkeeper **Lesley Stange (Murrysville, PA/Franklin Regional)** made 10 saves in each game, and added a team-high five ground balls in the game against the Bishops ... **DENISON** suffered two losses at the Heron Draw, hosted by William Smith. The Big Red lost to Colorado College, 11-8, and then 15-5 to the hosts, who are ranked 15th by the USILA. **Krissy Frost (Wilton, CT/Wilton)** led Denison with five goals in the two games and leads DU with 18 on the season ... St. Vincent made a late rally to hold off **KENYON**, 11-10. Sophomore **Sarah Masel (Westfield, NJ/Westfield)** scored three times and added an assist to lead the Ladies' offense ... **OBERLIN** had an outstanding week on its spring break trip to Texas. The Yeowomen defeated Fontbonne (19-2), Linfield (20-15), Pacific (18-4) and Dallas (13-5) on their trip. Sophomore attacker **Lela Hull (Cumberland, ME/Greeley)** scored 17 goals, dished 13 assists, and won 18 draw controls in the four contests. Junior **Kira Thorien (Boise, ID/Boise)** won all four games in goal, collecting 41 saves in the process ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** won its conference opener, 17-8 over Allegheny. Senior attacker **Jamie Blake (Ballston Lake, NY/Shenendehwa)** totaled three goals and three assists, including two goals and two assists in a 6-0 game-opening run. The Bishops also lost, 9-3, to Brockport State. Sophomore attacker **Channing Bush (Chevy Chase, MD/Connelly School)** contributed a goal and an assist ... **WITTENBERG** went 1-1 in non-conference play, losing to Notre Dame (OH), 13-4, and defeating Fontbonne, 19-2. Junior **Amber Cupples (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** scored three goals in each game, and added two assists against Fontbonne. Cupples leads the Tigers with 14 points and nine goals in five games ... **WOOSTER** also posted a 1-1 record in non-conference action, losing to Notre Dame (OH) (9-8) and defeating Fontbonne (24-2). Junior attacker **Emily Baab (Chagrin Falls, OH/Walsh Jesuit)** combined for five goals in two games, including three against Notre Dame. She also scored the first goal against Fontbonne, just 12 seconds into the game.

**SOFTBALL REPORT**

The 2007 North Coast season gets fully underway in the coming week with each NCAC team set to play a pair of doubleheaders. Allegheny (5-11) and Hiram (10-6) start things off when they travel to Oberlin (1-9) and Wooster (7-13), respectively, tomorrow. Defending NCAC champion, Denison (11-9) opens its title defense at Wittenberg (15-7) on Wednesday. Kenyon (7-9) travels to Ohio Wesleyan (7-7) the same day. Four doubleheaders are also set for this weekend, starting with Wittenberg at Wooster on Friday. On Saturday Allegheny, Hiram and Oberlin welcome Kenyon, Denison and Ohio Wesleyan, respectively.

**Notes:** **ALLEGHENY** was idle last week, as the Gators' game against Mount Union was postponed ... **DENISON** went 3-3 last week, handing Ursuline a pair of losses (7-4, 9-2) and splitting a doubleheader with Case. The Big Red actually lost three straight, after opening the week against Ursuline. They dropped two to Muskingum (8-4, 6-3) and then lost to Case, 7-4, in the first game of the twinbill. Denison rebounded for a 9-7 win over the Spartans to close out their week. Sophomore **Mary Beth Krolikowski (Brunswick, OH/Holy Name)** hit a grand slam in the third inning against Case. It was her first career homer and Denison's third round-tripper of the season. She had five hits in six starts this week and drove in a team-best seven runs. Senior **Andrea Carella (North York, Ontario/Michael Power)** posted a .609 on-base percentage in the six games and hit 9-for-18. She is second on the team with a .426 average. **Rachel Thomas (Gahanna, OH/Lincoln)** allowed one earned run in 12.1 innings of work last week. She lowered her season earned run average to 0.88 and struck out eight batters this week. She leads the team with 34 K's and a 3-1 record ... **HIRAM** freshman **Whitney Dropsey (Ashland, OH/Hillsdale)** went 8-for-16 with a double and an RBI as the Terriers went 1-3 last week. She also scored one run and was 2-for-3 on stolen base attempts. Hiram dropped both ends of a doubleheader against Case (6-4, 8-7), then split with Malone, winning and losing by an identical 4-1 score ... **KENYON** lost three of four games last week, but did turn in an 8-7 win over Marietta. The Ladies fell 3-2 to Marietta, in game one of the doubleheader and also lost twice against Mount Vernon Nazarene (2-1, 5-3). Junior **Stephanie Hemmingson (Beaverton, OR/Woodrow Wilson)** threw 13 innings and went 1-1. She gave up nine hits and two earned runs, fanning three batters and posting a 1.08 ERA for the week.
