NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (Apr. 16)

BASEBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Wittenberg senior **Andrew Wellman (Huntington, WV/Huntington)** drove in the winning run to lift the Tigers past nationally ranked Transylvania, 3-2. He capped his 5-for-5 evening with an eighth-inning single that completed a five-run Tiger rally to clinch the come-from-behind victory. Wellman reached base six straight times, adding a walk his totals. He also finished with one run and a double to his credit. Wellman made his second start since suffering a hamstring injury more than a month ago. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Wabash sophomore right-hander **Joey Niezer (Batesville, IN/Oldenburg Academy)** went 2-0 on the week, scattering four hits in 16 innings of work. He came on in relief to pick up a 10-7 win against North Park, throwing seven innings of relief while tying a career-high with seven strikeouts. He gave up two hits and allowed one earned run. He then went the distance against previously undefeated Wooster, lifting the Little Giants past the Fighting Scots, 3-2. The victory snapped the Scots' 27-game winning streak, the longest in the nation and longest in Wooster school history. It is also the first win in 12 tries by Wabash against the Scots. Niezer allowed two hits in nine innings - giving up an infield hit in the fourth inning and an RBI single in the seventh. He struck out five, giving him 12 K's for the week. He also had four assists in the field, including throwing out a runner at the plate in the fourth inning to hold a two-run lead. He threw out a Scot pinch-hitter on a ground ball to his right in the seventh inning for the third out to preserve the lead. On the week, he allowed four hits, five runs (one earned) and walked six and hit six batters to set the Wabash and NCAC single-season record with his 21st HBP.

MEN'S LACROSSE

Senior **Luke Larson (Mercer Island, WA/Seattle Academy)** scored 12 of Kenyon's 20 goals for the week, including seven in a 10-5 victory over Wittenberg. He then tossed in five more goals, as well as an assist, in a 20-9 win over St. Vincent. Larson leads the NCAC in goals per game (3.56) and stands fourth in points with a 3.89 clip.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE

Krissy Frost (Wilton, CT/Wilton) scored five goals and added three assists as Denison defeated Oberlin, 18-12. In the Big Red's 14-6 defeat of Allegheny, she added another three goals. Frost leads Denison with 37 points and 32 goals this season.

SOFTBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Allegheny sophomore **Rachel Ryan (West Salem, OH/Northwestern)** led the Gators past Wooster, 9-1 and 11-5, and Kenyon, 5-4 and 5-0, for a perfect 4-0 week. She batted .667 (8-for-12) over the four games, with five of her eight hits going for extra bases, including three home runs. She drove in six runs and scored seven and was perfect in 24 attempts in the field. Against Wooster, she was a perfect 6-for-6 at the plate, and hit two of her homers in the nighcap of the twinbill, tying an Allegheny single-game record. She was also intentionally walked in that game. Ryan totaled 19 bases for a slugging percentage of 1.583 and had an on-base percentage of .714. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Denison senior **Rachel Thomas (Gahanna, OH/Lincoln)** earned a 9-4 complete-game victory over Ohio Wesleyan. She allowed two earned runs off five hits and struck out a season-high 11 batters.

OUTDOOR TRACK

Men's Middle Distance/Distance: Earlham senior **Walker Yane (Oldenburg, IN/St. Xavier, OH)** placed third in the steeplechase at the Indiana Intercollegiate Little State meet. He finished in 9:20.68, which is the best time in the NCAC this season, and is an NCAA provisional qualifying mark.

Women's Middle Distance/Distance: Allegheny freshman **Mia Symoniak (Snyder, NY/Amherst Central)** placed 12th in the 10,000 meters at the Bucknell Bison Outdoor Classic. It was her first time competing in the event, and she posted an NCAA qualifying time of 38:48.61.

Men's Sprints/Hurdles: Allegheny senior **Marcus Solomon (Rockwell, TX/Dallas Christian)** placed 11th in the 100-meter dash at the Slippery Rock Invitational with a time of 11.60. He also ran a leg on the fourth-place 4x100-meter relay with a time of 43.04.

Women's Sprints/Hurdles: Earlham junior **Sara Bohall (Westport, IN/Columbus East)** won the 400-meter hurdles at the Indiana Intercollegiate Little State meet. She finished in 1:04.32, and was the anchor of the second-place 4x400-meter relay and the sixth-place 4x100-meter relay.

Men's Field: Allegheny junior **Frank Tupta (University Hts., OH/Hawken)** placed fifth in the shot put at the Slippery Rock Invitational. He threw a distance of 14.98 meters (49 feet, 1-3/4 inches).

Women's Field: Allegheny senior **Katie Pankowski (Pittsburgh, PA/Woodland Hills)** placed third in the javelin at the Slippery Rock Invitational. She threw the javelin 122 feet, 4 inches.

NCAC Spring Sports Update

BASEBALL REPORT

Wooster (11-0, 27-1), has clinched the top spot in the East Division. The Fighting Scots, who did not play a conference divisional game last week, have their final NCAC series of the season set for this weekend, when they travel to Hiram (1-7, 4-20) on Saturday and Sunday. Third-place Allegheny (2-4, 5-15) will travel to second-place Oberlin (4-4, 10-14) the same days. Kenyon (1-4, 9-8) will host the Yeomen for a makeup doubleheader tomorrow. The two squads are tentatively set to conclude their divisional series with a doubleheader on May 1. Other announced makeup dates in the East include: a Kenyon at Hiram doubleheader on April 25 and a Kenyon at Allegheny four-game series on April 28-29. No makeup date has been announced for a doubleheader between Hiram and Allegheny in Meadville.

The West Division standings are much less clear than in the East. Ohio Wesleyan (7-1, 14-9) retains its hold on the top spot in the West Division. The Battling Bishops, who took two games from second-place Denison last week, will makeup their final doubleheader with the Big Red (6-2, 10-14) on Wednesday, before traveling to Wabash (3-7, 11-20) on Saturday and Sunday. The Little Giants are on a high of their own after halting Wooster's 27-game win streak, with a 3-2 victory in the third game of their non-conference series last weekend. In addition to its makeup with OWU, Denison will play Case at Jacobs Field in Cleveland on Thursday before resuming NCAC play with four divisional games at Earlham (0-6, 5-15) on Saturday and Sunday. The Quakers face a busy week as they will travel to Wittenberg (4-4, 11-12) today and tomorrow, as those games were postponed last week due to weather. Other makeup dates in the West include: Earlham at Wabash and Wittenberg at Ohio Wesleyan for respective doubleheaders on April 28 and Wittenberg at Denison for a twinbill on April 29.

Notes: ALLEGHENY is on a season-high three-game winning streak after taking both ends of a doubleheader from Hiram, 10-3 and 8-6. **Mike Pereslucha (Pittsburgh, PA/Kiski)** and **Zach Skowvron (Georgetown, PA/South Side Beaver)** each went 3-for-5 (.600) in the series with a pair of walks, while **Brian Schmidt (Utica, PA/Franklin)** and **Alex Herrnberger (Eighty Four, PA/Canon McMillan)** went 3-for-6. Skowvron drove in three runs, scored once and included a triple amongst his hits. **Colt Viehdorfer (Morrisdale, PA/West Branch)** went the distance in the opener, striking out four and walking none. He did not give up an earned run as he scattered five hits ... DENISON went 2-2 with a win over Muskingum, 3-2, and loss to Otterbein, 5-0, before splitting a pair of games to Ohio Wesleyan. Denison won the opener 11-9 and fell in the nightcap, 9-8. The Big Red hit five homers in the two games against the Bishops; senior **Chris Day (Holmesville, OH/Waynedale)** stroked a homer in each game to run his season total to four. Sophomore **Andy Johnson (Cincinnati, OH/Sycamore)** went 4-for-11 (.364) with two walks in three starts on the week. His two-run homer in the top of the ninth gave Denison its victory over the Battling Bishops ... EARLHAM only played once last week, due to the weather. The Quakers fell to Cedarville, 16-7, as freshman **Jake Carr (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** led the way with three hits ... Freshman **Kyle Kovach (Garfield Hts., OH/Garfield Hts.)** went 2-for-3 (.667) to lead all HIRAM hitters last week. He scored two runs and was 1-for-2 on stolen base attempts as the Terriers dropped games at Lake Erie, 29-3, and at Allegheny, 10-3 and 8-6 ... KENYON was idle last week as its divisional series with OBERLIN was postponed due to weather. The Yeomen managed to get in one game, a 7-6 win over Myers. Seniors **Jesse Cullen-Dupont (Brooklyn, NY/Archbishop Molloy)** and **Rick Betzel (Elyria, OH/Elyria)** both homered in the contest, including a walk-off dinger by Betzel. Cullen-Dupont went 2-for-3 (.667) with three runs batted in and a stolen base, while Betzel was 1-for-4 (.250) with an RBI and two runs scored. Cullen-Dupont leads the Yeomen with a .446 batting average, a .607 slugging percentage and a .551 on-base percentage ... OHIO WESLEYAN went 2-1 last week, picking up wins over Capital, 7-3, and Denison, 9-8. The Bishops dropped the opener against the Big Red, 11-9 in nine innings. Senior **Sean Ring (Hilliard, OH/Davidson)** slammed a three-run homer to break a 1-1 tie and put the Bishops past Capital for good. He hit a three-run homer and went 3-for-5 (.600) with four RBI in the loss to the Big Red. He then drove in a run with an infield single during the Bishops' five-run seventh-inning rally to help lift OWU to victory in the second game of the NCAC doubleheader. For the week, he was 5-for-12 (.417) with the pair of homers and eight RBI ... WABASH went 3-3 last week, beginning and ending the week with victories. The Little Giants began their run with a 10-7 win over North Park at the Steel Yard in Gary, IN, and followed with a split against Robert Morris-Springfield, dropping the first, 8-7 and winning the second, 12-2. Wabash then lost both ends of a doubleheader against undefeated Wooster, 8-0 and 6-0, before rebounding to hand the Fighting Scots their first loss in 2007, a 3-2 decision. Sophomore right-hander **Joey Niezer (Batesville, IN/Oldenburg Academy)** went 2-0 on the week, scattering four hits in 16 innings of work. He came on in relief to pick up the win against North Park, throwing seven innings of relief while tying a career-high with seven strikeouts. He gave up two hits and allowed one earned run. His biggest hit of the week came in the win over Wooster when he blasted a two-run homer off the scoreboard in right centerfield

to break a 1-1 tie against the Scots. His diving catch of Wooster's **Jake Sankal's** line drive to right in the sixth inning helped preserve the Little Giants' victory ... **WITTENBERG** posted a 13-12 victory over 17th-ranked Transylvania. Senior **Andrew Wellman (Huntington, WV/Huntington)** reached base six straight times, going 5-for-5 with a walk. His eighth-inning single pushed across the go-ahead run to cap a five-run Tiger rally. He made his second start since suffering a hamstring injury more than a month ago. The last of four Wittenberg pitchers to enter the game, freshman **Darin Mumaw (Fort Laramie, OH/Fort Laramie)** earned his first collegiate victory with 1.1 innings of relief, allowing no hits or runs and just one baserunner while striking out two ... **WOOSTER** went 4-1 last week. The Fighting Scots extended their school-record win streak to 27 games with wins over Case, 17-0, 9-1, and Wabash, 8-0, 6-0, before falling to the Little Giants, 3-2, in their final game of the week. The Scots fell six victories shy of setting the NCAA Div. III record for the best start to a season, held by Johns Hopkins at 33-0 in 2004. Junior **Pat Christensen (Cincinnati, OH/Sycamore)** batted .563 (9-for-16) for the week, scoring eight runs and driving in eight others. He had four extra-base hits - two doubles and two homers - and also reached base two other times via walks. Sophomore right-hander **Anthony Trapuzzano (Pittsburgh, PA/Canevin Catholic)** pitched a one-hit shutout in his lone appearance last week, the opener of the Wabash series. He struck out 10, matching a career high, and did not walk a batter. The game marked the first complete-game shutout of his career.

GOLF REPORT

All 10 NCAC schools will compete at Ohio Wesleyan's Strimer Invitational on Saturday and Sunday, to be held at Dornoch and Oakhaven Golf Clubs. The event is the third, and final, regular season event in the North Coast's new championship system, which the conference revised in reaction to the NCAA's move to the automatic qualifier system in golf. The 2006-07 champion will be the top finisher for all rounds completed at three required, 36-hole, regular-season events and a 54-hole, post-season championship. The champ will earn the conference's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament. Wooster will host the post-season championship at the Legends of Massillon, in Massillon, Ohio, on May 5-6. Ohio Wesleyan (302.75) leads the team standings after the fall competitions, followed by Allegheny (305.25) in second. Wooster (318.75), Wittenberg (319.25) and Denison (323.75) round out the top five entering the spring.

In other competition this week, Wabash will play Rose-Hulman in the Little Giant-Engineer Match Play Classic on Thursday at Hulman Links in Terre Haute. Allegheny had been scheduled to compete in the Guy W. Kuhn Golf Invitational today, but play was cancelled due to inclement weather.

Notes: **ALLEGHENY** took second place at the Mid-Atlantic Regional, hosted by the University of Rochester in Hershey, PA. Three Gators, **Christian Goetz (Burgettstown, PA/Burgettstown Area)**, **John Bouger (Clark, PA/Sharpsville)** and **Mike Wolfe (Erie, PA/McDowell)**, recorded top-10 finishes ... **WOOSTER** (648) paced all NCAC teams at its own Nye Invitational with a sixth-place finish. The Fighting Scots were followed by **DENISON** (654) in seventh, **WITTENBERG** (673) in 10th and **WABASH** (686) in 12th. **HIRAM** (701), **KENYON** (725) and **OBERLIN** (757) rounded out places 14 through 16. Scot senior **Matt Mellott (Baltimore, MD/Friends School)** finished 12th in the field of 84 golfers with a team-best 80 on the first day, followed by a second-day 78 (158). Big Red junior **Brian Casey (Madison, NJ/Madison)** finished third overall, carding a two-day total of 154. Sophomore **Garrett Smith (Powell, OH/Worthington Christian)** paced the Tigers with a 21st place finish (164). Wabash sophomore **Jordan Vice (Bedford, IN/Bedford North Lawrence)** tied for 13th with a two-day total of 159 (80-79). Senior **Adam Pontious (Crooksville, OH/Crooksville)** carded the low round for the Terriers on the final day with an 83. Combined with his first-day 92, he compiled a 175 stroke total, good for 57th place overall. Lords sophomore **Dan Dierenfeld (Arlington, VA/Potomac School)** shot a 169 to finish in a tie for 38th. Oberlin junior **Matt Standeven (Ellicott, MD/Centennial)** placed 65th with a score of 177.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

North Coast Athletic Conference co-leader Ohio Wesleyan (2-0, 8-3) returns to action after a week off at fifth-place Wittenberg (1-2, 5-4) on Wednesday. One other NCAC game is on tap, and it features the teams tied at third: Kenyon (1-1, 8-1) at Wooster (1-1, 5-2) on Friday.

The remainder of the schedule features non-conference action. Wednesday, Washington & Jefferson travels to Oberlin (0-3, 3-5), the next day the Battling Bishops travel to take on Eastern. Friday afternoon, W&J returns home to host NCAC co-leader Denison (2-0, 8-2). Saturday, Colorado College visits the Tigers, then heads north to take on Wooster on Sunday. Rounding out the schedule, the Yeomen entertain Fontbonne on Sunday.

Notes: **DENISON** won its only contest last week, an 18-5 decision over Wooster, to remain in a first-place tie with idle Ohio Wesleyan. The Big Red jumped out to a 13-2 lead, and went on to win for the 14th consecutive time over the Scots. It was Denison's fifth win in a row in 2007. Freshman **Brady Burton (Dublin, OH/Jerome)** scored five goals to improve his season total to 33, the most in the conference this season and the most by a Denison player since 2000. His 4.20 points per game is currently third-best in the NCAC. DU is 42 percent in man-up opportunities this season, converting 14 of 33 attempts. If they keep to that pace, they will post their highest percentage in that category since the 2000 team converted 52.8 percent of their man-up opportunities ... **KENYON** upped its record to 8-1 with two victories last week, one in conference play. The Lords knocked off Wittenberg, 10-5, then went on to defeat St. Vincent, 20-9. Senior **Luke Larson (Mercer Island, WA/Seattle Academy)**, scored 12 of Kenyon's 20 goals for the week, including seven of 10 in the contest against the Tigers. Larson leads the NCAC in goals per game (3.56) and stands fourth in points with a 3.89 clip ... **OBERLIN** also went 2-0 last week,

with an 18-11 victory over Mt. St. Joseph and an 18-9 defeat of Medaille. Freshman **Nick Sherman (Los Angeles, CA/St. Monica)** led the Yeomen with 10 goals and one assist in the two contests ... After dropping a 10-5 decision to Kenyon, **WITTENBERG** went on to defeat Washington & Jefferson by a 12-8 score. Freshman **Jeff Capella (Columbus, OH/Worthington Kilbourne)** scored a goal and an assist against the Lords, then added four goals against W&J. He leads the Tigers with 23 goals and 29 points this season ... Sophomore attacker **Mark Weschler (Silver Spring, MD/Our Lady of Good Counsel)** recorded six points on three goals and three assists to lead **WOOSTER** to a 12-3 decision over Washington & Jefferson. Weschler, who is third in the NCAC in goals per game at 2.71, also added a goal in an 18-5 conference loss to Denison.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Five NCAC women's lacrosse matches featuring all seven conference squads are on tap for the coming week. First-place Wooster (2-0, 6-3), coming off of a two-win week, puts that streak on the line twice. Thursday, the Scots travel to fifth-place Oberlin (1-1, 6-3), then Saturday, they return home to entertain fourth-place Kenyon (2-1, 6-4). Denison (3-1, 5-6) and Ohio Wesleyan (3-1, 6-2) are tied for second in the standings. The Big Red, who also won two North Coast games last week, look to extend their streak with a home contest against Kenyon on Thursday. The Bishops lost for the first time in conference play last week, 10-9 to Wooster, and travel to take on sixth-place (tie) Wittenberg (0-4, 2-8) on Saturday. In addition to facing the Fighting Scots, fifth-place Oberlin meets sixth-place (tie) Allegheny (0-3, 2-7) on Saturday.

Notes: **ALLEGHENY** dropped a 17-9 decision to St. Vincent and a 14-6 decision to Denison last week. **Christina Zanich (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair)** scored a team-best five goals in the two games, while **Meg Grossman (Lexington, KY/Sayre School)** added five points on two goals and three assists ... **DENISON** improved to 5-6 overall with a pair of conference victories last week. The Big Red defeated Oberlin, 18-12, as senior **Krissy Frost (Wilton, CT/Wilton)** scored five goals and added three assists. In DU's 14-6 defeat of Allegheny, Frost added another three goals. She leads the Big Red with 37 points and 32 goals. Senior defender **Lindsay Buhr (Manhasset, NY/Manhasset)** leads the team and ranks third in the NCAC in both ground balls per game (3.5) and caused turnovers per game (1.8). Last week, Buhr contributed 11 ground balls and five caused turnovers ... **KENYON** posted a 3-0 record last week, including a 17-11 decision over Wittenberg. Despite poor weather conditions, the Ladies' offense averaged 18 goals per game over the three contests. Leading the outburst was freshman **Frankie De Lavis (Wilton, CT/Hopkins School)**, who piled up 14 goals and seven assists in the week. Her best performance came in the victory over Wittenberg when she tallied six scores and assisted on four others. She easily leads the NCAC in scoring with 7.0 points per game, 4.63 goals per game and 2.38 assists per game and is 15 points shy of Kenyon's single-season scoring record ... **OBERLIN** went 1-2 last week, losing their only conference match of the week, 18-12 to Denison. Sophomore **Lela Hull (Cumberland, ME/Greely)** racked up 14 goals, three assists, 14 draw controls and five caused turnovers in the three contests. Hull leads the conference with 4.44 draw controls per game, and stands second in points (5.56 per game) and assists (1.78 per game) and is third in goals (3.78 pg). Freshman **Scarlett Prati (Cloverdale, CA/Sonoma Academy)** hit the back of the net 12 times and won 10 draws during the week. Both Hull and Prati contributed nine goals in a 21-16 decision over Puget Sound ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** lost for the first time in conference play this season, 10-9 to Wooster. Junior midfielders **Polly Burke (Milton, MA/Milton)** and **Julia Fouts (Cleveland Hts., OH/Hathaway Brown)** each scored goals in the final 1:17 but the rally fell short. Junior goalkeeper **Maggie Eichenlaub (Crystal, MN/Robbinsdale Cooper)** stopped 13 shots ... **WITTENBERG** lost three times last week, including twice in NCAC play. Junior **Amber Cupples (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** scored five goals and two assists in the three games to lead the Tigers ... **WOOSTER** won three times last week, twice in North Coast play, to up their record to 6-3. Junior attacker **Emily Baab (Chagrin Falls, OH/Walsh Jesuit)** had nine goals and two assists to lead the Scot attack. She scored three times in a key, 10-9, decision over Ohio Wesleyan, including two in the final 10 minutes. Baab tied a career-best effort with a six-point game in a 20-11 decision over Puget Sound.

SOFTBALL REPORT

The NCAC softball schedule for the week is extremely full, with a full slate of eight doubleheaders set for Wednesday and Saturday, along with five makeup doubleheaders throughout the week. Action begins tomorrow, when Kenyon (3-3, 10-12) travels to Ohio Wesleyan (2-2, 9-9). On Wednesday, the Ladies travel to nearby Denison (3-1, 15-11), while the Battling Bishops head to Wittenberg (3-3, 18-10). Hiram (2-2, 12-8) is at Allegheny (6-0, 11-11) and Oberlin (0-6, 1-17) is at Wooster (1-3, 8-16). On Thursday, the Tigers travel to Wooster for a makeup that has been rescheduled several times due to weather.

Saturday sees games at Denison, Hiram, Wittenberg and Wooster. Allegheny, Ohio Wesleyan, Kenyon and Oberlin will travel to those sites, respectively. Three games are set for Sunday: Allegheny at Ohio Wesleyan, Oberlin at Hiram and Wooster at Denison in the Big Red's annual Strike Out Cancer game. One hundred percent of the donations gathered will go to the American Cancer Society. In addition, the game will be a celebration of the 10-year anniversary of softball at Denison. Wooster and the Big Red will both wear throwback jerseys to commemorate the event.

Notes: **ALLEGHENY** swept Wooster, 9-1, 11-5, and Kenyon, 5-4, 5-0, last week.
