### **ALLEGHENY, DENISON, WITTENBERG GRAB EARLY LEAD IN STANDINGS; FINAL DECEMBER NCAC GAME SET FOR SATURDAY**

**CLEVELAND** -- The early portion of the North Coast schedule concludes tonight when Allegheny (6-1, 2-0) travels to Oberlin (0-1, 4-4). The Gators, Denison (2-0, 6-3) and Wittenberg (2-0, 3-3) share first place heading into the holidays, as all three squads have won their first two league games. Conference action does not resume until Wednesday, January 3. North Coast Athletic Conference winter sports reports will resume on Tuesday, January 2, and will continue on Sundays through the basketball season. Standings and statistics will be updated each Monday and Thursday throughout the holidays at [www.northcoast.org](http://www.northcoast.org). Scores will be updated daily.

**HOOPS NOTES:** **ALLEGHENY** won twice last week as **Katie Kestler (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** averaged 18 points and five rebounds, both team highs. Kestler led the Gators on a 15-point comeback to defeat Westminster, 73-66, with a career-high 23 points. She shot 9-for-14 from the field and 5-for-8 from three-point range, and added five assists, four steals and two rebounds. She followed that with a 13-point, eight-rebound performance in a 67-61 defeat of Ohio Wesleyan. The eight rebounds was a career high. Kestler has hit double figures in every game of Allegheny's 6-1 start and averages 16.7 points per game ... **DENISON** won twice in conference play last week, defeating Earlham, 79-44, and Hiram, 79-51. Senior **Kristen Sheffield (Dublin, OH/Scioto)** became the Big Red's all-time leading rebounder in the game against the Terriers. She led Denison with nine rebounds in that contest to surpass 1994 graduate and Denison Hall of Famer **Christy Clay's** standard of 731 career boards. Sheffield recently passed the 1,000-point plateau and is the school and conference leader in blocked shots (286). So far in 2006-07, she is averaging 13.7 points, 6.9 rebounds and 2.7 blocks per game. She's also shooting 54 percent from three-point range. Sheffield totaled a team-best 33 points in the two victories last week. Senior **Tammy Hoch (Moon Twp., PA/Sewickley Academy)** made her first start of the season and scored four points. She had nine rebounds, six assist and three steals. Last week, Hoch was named to the National Soccer Coaches Association Division III All-America team ... **EARLHAM** split a pair of NCAC games last week, defeating Kenyon, 64-55, and losing to Denison, 79-44. Senior **Casie Byrd (Bloomington, IN/North)** led the Quakers with 14 points in the victory. Junior **Whitney McBurrows (Lansing, MI/J.W. Sexton)** led Earlham with 10 points against the Big Red and totaled 21 points in the two contests ... Senior **Tania Carman (University Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)** grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds in **HIRAM'S** 57-49 loss to Thiel, then recorded a double-double in a 79-51 loss to Denison. She had 13 points and 12 rebounds against the Big Red, and totaled 17 points and 28 rebounds for the week ... **KENYON** defeated Case, 69-55, then lost to Earlham, 64-55, last week, as junior guard **Hilary Gowins (Delaware, OH/Watterson)** poured in 35 points for the two games. Gowins, last week's NCAC player of the week, also contributed six rebounds and four assists, and shot 13-for-29 from the field ... Senior captain **Jessie Oram (New York, NY/Bacon)** led **OBERLIN** to two wins in three non-conference contests last week. In the three games, Oram totaled 62 points, 33 rebounds, 12 assists, four blocks and a pair of steals. She netted 26 in both victories – 54-47 over Kalamazoo and 87-79 over Marygrove. Against Marygrove, she fell just short of a triple double with 18 rebounds and seven assists. Sophomore **Alyssa Clark (Cleveland Hts, OH/Regina)** was also close to a triple double against Marygrove with 18 points, 16 rebounds and nine assists. The Yeowomen lost to Ursuline, 70-53, last week ... In **OHIO WESLEYAN'S** lone contest last week, a 67-61 loss to Allegheny, junior wing **Steffi Graf (Poland, OH/Seminary)** scored a team-high 21 points, including nine straight early in the second half, but it wasn't enough to overcome the Gators's 15-point halftime lead ... **WITTENBERG** senior post **Kathy Hittle (Noblesville, IN/Noblesville)**, last year's NCAC Player of the Year, recorded her first double-double of the 2006-07 campaign with a 16-point, 10 rebound effort in a 71-63 defeat of Wooster. She also had eight rebounds in a 45-36 loss to Thomas More. Junior post **Katie Gregorevich (Northfield, OH/Walsh Jesuit)** came off the bench to score 22 points and pulled down 12 rebounds in the Tigers' 1-1 week ... In their only action last week, **WOOSTER** lost to Wittenberg, 71-63. Three Scots hit double figures, led by freshman **Kym Wenz (Avon Lake, OH/Avon Lake)**, who threw in 13. Senior shooting guard **Beth Besancon Sidle (Wooster, OH/Smithville)** scored 10 points, including hitting two more 3-pointers (2-for-5), and passed out five assists, compared to just one turnover.

### **KESTLER, HOLLIHAN NAMED NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

**CLEVELAND** -- Allegheny's **Katie Kestler (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** and **Ryan Hollihan (Saxonburg, PA/Knoch)** have been named women's and men's basketball "Players of the Week" in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

**Kestler**, a 5-7, senior guard, averaged 18 points and five rebounds, both team highs, as the Gators won twice last week. Kestler led AC on a 15-point comeback to defeat Westminster, 73-66, with a career-high 23 points. She shot 9-for-14 from the field and 5-for-8 from three-point range, and added five assists, four steals and two rebounds. She followed that with a 13-point, eight-rebound performance in a 67-61 defeat of Ohio Wesleyan. The eight rebounds was a career high. Kestler has hit double figures in every game of Allegheny's 6-1 start and averages 16.7 points per game.

**Hollihan**, a 6-8, sophomore forward, scored a team-high 18 points while pulling down 10 rebounds for his second straight double-double in a 73-70 overtime victory over Ohio Wesleyan. He scored seven of his points in the OT period to hand the Gators their first win over OWU since 2003. In a 102-97 loss to Westminster, he scored a career-high 24 points on 10-of-14 shooting and grabbed 11 boards. For the week, Hollihan averaged 21 points and 10.5 rebounds over the two games. He hit 18-of-28 shots from the field and 6-of-9 from the free throw line.

## **NCAC Men's Basketball Report** **WOOSTER GRABS EARLY LEAD IN STANDINGS;** **FINAL DECEMBER NCAC GAME SET FOR SATURDAY**

**CLEVELAND** -- All but one of the early North Coast games slated for December have been completed. The final early season NCAC game is slated for Saturday when Denison (0-1, 1-6) hosts Wabash (0-1, 2-5). Defending champion Wooster (3-0, 7-0) sits in first place heading into the holidays, as the Fighting Scots have won their initial league games. Conference action does not resume until Wednesday, January 3. North Coast Athletic Conference winter sports reports will resume on Tuesday, January 2, and will continue on Sundays through the basketball season. Standings and statistics will be updated each Monday and Thursday throughout the holidays at [www.northcoast.org](http://www.northcoast.org). Scores will be updated daily.

**HOOPS NOTES:** **ALLEGHENY** split a pair of games last week, falling to Westminster, 102-97, before picking up a 73-70 overtime win over Ohio Wesleyan in conference play. The Gators trailed the Bishops, 40-25, at the half but held OWU to 21 second-half points before outscoring the Bishops, 12-9, in the overtime period to earn their first "W" over Ohio Wesleyan since the 2003 season. Sophomore **Ryan Hollihan (Saxonburg, OH/Knoch)** scored a team-high 18 points while pulling down 10 rebounds for his second straight double-double. He was one of four Allegheny players to reach double figures in scoring. In the loss to Westminster, he scored a career-high 24 points on 10-of-14 (.714) shooting and grabbed 11 boards. For the week, Hollihan averaged 21 points and 10.5 rebounds over the two games. He hit 18-of-28 (.643) shots from the field and 6-of-9 (.667) from the free throw line ... **DENISON** senior **Dan Hodgkinson (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** was 7-of-10 from the field and led the Big Red with 16 points in a 71-49 loss at Washington & Jefferson. The Big Red host Wabash on Saturday. Spectators who bring a canned food item, or a donation, will be granted free admission. All the donations and canned food items will go to the Licking County Food Pantry to assist local families during the holidays. This is the second "Food Pantry Night" held by Denison in 2006. On Nov. 21, prior to a basketball doubleheader, the Big Red collected approximately 128 pounds of food and over \$200 in donations ... **EARLHAM** senior **LaRon Henry (Indianapolis, IN/Sccecina)** scored 15 of his game-high 23 points in the second half to lead the Quakers to a 69-60 comeback win over Kenyon. He also led both teams with nine rebounds as Earlham posted its first victory of the season. He is now 17th on the Quaker all-time scoring list with 1,155 points - two spots below teammate **Markous Jewitt (Richmond, IN/Richmond)**, who has accumulated 1,181 points ... **HIRAM** picked up its first win of the young season, a 74-71 thriller over Oberlin. The Terriers also fell to Mt. Union, 81-54. The Terriers were led by **Mike McDevitt's (Lisbon, OH/David Anderson)** combined 28 points. He shot 11-of-21 (.524) from the field and was 5-of-9 (.556) from the charity stripe. He also snagged 14 rebounds and chipped in three assists and a steal for the week ... **KENYON** split a pair of games, defeating Case, 85-76, and losing to Earlham, 69-60. Sophomore **David Jolson (Wyoming, OH/Wyoming)** threw in a combined 38 points while shooting 53.8 percent from the floor and 8-of-13 (.615) from three-point territory. In the victory over Case, he knocked down a trio of three-pointers and posted a team-high 19 points. Three days later, in the loss to Earlham, he rang up five more three-pointers and again led the Lords, with 19 points ... **OBERLIN** dropped a pair of NCAC games last week, 95-76 to Wooster and 74-71 to Hiram. Senior **Quinton Spencer (Chicago, IL/Brother Rice)** and junior **Jordan Beard (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)** once again stepped up to lead the Yeomen. Spencer tallied 39 points, 22 rebounds, 11 assists and six steals over the two contests. He reached the 1,000-point plateau early in the Wooster contest on a fade-away jumper. Beard collected 32 points in the two games and went 7-for-11 (.636) from behind the three-point arc ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** lost a heartbreaker in overtime to Allegheny, 73-70, in its only action last week. Senior post **Ben Chojnacki (Medina, OH/Medina)** hit a free throw to send the game into the extra session, but a Battling Bishops' rally fell short as Allegheny took the win. Chojnacki scored 21 points in the first half on 9-of-10 shooting and led all players with 22 points. He was one of three Bishops to score in double figures ... **WABASH** tied a record for three-point baskets in a game, hitting 15 long-range shots in its 83-51 win over UC-Clermont in the first round of the Little Giants' Pete Thorn Invitational. Freshman guard **Chase Haltom (Quincy, IN/Cloverdale)** led the way as he hit 6-of-8 (.750) treys. Overall, he had a career-high 22 points. Wabash then fell to Olivet Nazarene, 75-60, in the championship game the next day. The Little Giants rallied to cut the Tigers' 22-point lead to seven in the final five minutes of the game, but would draw no closer. Haltom scored 17 points in the contest and was joined on the all-tournament team by junior **Andrew Zimmer (Hobart, IN/Hobart)**, who finished with a game-high 21 points and a team-best six boards. Haltom scored a combined 39 points on 13-of-22 (.591) shooting over the two games ... **WITTENBERG** senior post **Dane Borchers (Russia, OH/Russia)** posted back-to-back double-doubles as the Tigers defeated Cedarville, 66-61, and lost to Wooster, 68-65. He had 19 points and 13 rebounds against Cedarville and 18 points and 13 boards against the Fighting Scots. Senior **Jack Hemenway (Centerville, OH/Centerville)** led all scorers in the Wooster game with 20 points and sophomore **Gregg Hill (Redford, MI/Union)** added another 18 points, including eight of Wittenberg's final 10 points in the game ... **WOOSTER** sophomore **Brandon Johnson (Columbus, OH/Groveport Madison)** paced Wooster in both scoring and rebounding as the No. 1 ranked Fighting Scots defeated No. 6 Wittenberg, 68-65, in NCAC play. The point guard put 18 tallies in the scorebook and grabbed eight rebounds. **James Cooper (Springfield, OH/Springfield South)** chipped in 11 during another return trip to his hometown. **Tom Port (Avon Lake, OH/Avon Lake)** made a series of key plays during the final 45 seconds of the tight game, first grabbing an offensive rebound and taking it to the left corner where he drained a three-pointer to give Wooster a 66-65 lead, and then stealing the ball on the ensuing possession to seal the Scots' victory. He finished with 13 points. Wooster, the only undefeated team in the conference (NCAC play and overall), opened last week with a 95-76 win over Oberlin. Cooper and Port shared team scoring honors with 17 points apiece, while four others also reached double-digits for the Scots. Port finished the week with 30 points, 10 rebounds, four assists, three blocked shots, and three steals.

## **NCAC Indoor Track & Field Report**

**For Immediate Release  
December 11, 2006**

Four North Coast Athletic Conference track & field programs competed for the first time in 2006-07. Three of those teams - Allegheny, Hiram and Oberlin – competed at the Kent State Gala, a non-scoring meet. The fourth, Ohio Wesleyan, ran at the Marietta First Glimpse, another early season non-scoring event. The indoor track season resumes after the first of the year for all 10 schools.

**MEN'S NOTES:** At Kent State, ALLEGHENY senior **Devin Cruea (Geneva, OH/Geneva)** broke the Gator school record in the weight throw with a toss of 48 feet, 2.5 inches, breaking the record by over 2.5 feet. He finished 20th in the event. Senior **Pat Confer (Bradford, PA/Bradford)** also posted a career-best effort in the event, finishing 27th with a toss of 45 feet, 2.5 inches. Junior **Ryan Place (Meshoppen, PA/Elk Lake)** won the 5,000 meters in 14:48.25, outpacing the second-place runner by 25 seconds, and beating his previous career-best effort by 15 seconds. He missed the NCAA provisional qualifying mark by a fraction of a second. **Joe McMahon (Pittsburgh, PA/Baldwin)** set a career-high in the triple jump, leaping 44 feet, 11.75 inches, just short of the school mark. He placed fifth in the event ... Four individuals represented HIRAM at the Kent Gala. The best finish was achieved by junior **Chris Hostetter (Morrow, OH/Little Miami)**, who competed in the shot put and placed fifth in his flight (37-3.25) ... Senior **John Shaw (Roseville, MN/Roseville Area)** was eighth in the 5K to lead OBERLIN at Kent State. Shaw finished in 15:35.53, nine seconds short of the school mark. **Ryan King (Glastonbury, CT/Glastonbury)** was eighth in the 3K (9:02.42) ... Senior **Steffan Horst (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** was second in the 800-meter run to lead OHIO WESLEYAN at the Marietta First Glimpse. He was also part of the second-place 1600-meter relay. Junior **Lynn Hutchison (Solon, OH/Solon)** finished her 60-meter heat in 10.10 seconds, while freshman **Nadrienna Damaris (Detroit, MI/Renaissance)** finished her 200-meter heat in 28.75 seconds ... Sophomore **Flannery Cerbin (LaCrosse, WI/LaCrosse Central)** was the top finisher for OBERLIN at the Kent State Gala. She finished the one-mile run in second place with a time of 5:14.39. Her time was one second off the school record. She also placed seventh in the 800 meters with a 2:21.60 clocking. ## **NCAC Swimming & Diving Report**

Hiram and Ohio Wesleyan competed last week to close out the 2006 portion of the 2006-07 swimming & diving season.

The Terrier women, off to their best start in school history (4-0), defeated Grove City, 144-130, while the men were edged, 147-133. The women had nine individual event winners and a winning relay team. Junior **Shelly Leshe (Palm City, FL/Mantlin County)** won both the 200 freestyle (2:01.63) and the 200 butterfly (2:17.33), while sophomore **Raisa Janke (Spring, Texas, Klein Oak)** took top honors in the 100 (1:04.40) and 200 (2:17.24) backstrokes. Leshe and Janke combined with freshman **Jess Shake (Bellbrook, OH/Bellbrook)** and sophomore **Amy Kocka (Strongsville, OH/Strongsville)** to touch first in the 200 medley relay (1:57.79). Sophomore **Jen Fowler (Canton, OH/McKinley)** swept the diving events. In the men's competition, freshman **Glen Switzer (Dade City, FL/Zephyrhills)** set a pool record in the one-meter diving event with 257.55 points. He also won the three-meter event (256.75). Freshman **Ben Adams (Lakewood, OH/Wheat Ridge)**, junior **Jared Drummer (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** and freshmen **Kyle Kiffer (Parma, OH/Valley View)** and **Adam Warner (Norwalk, OH/Norwalk)** claimed the 400 freestyle relay, posting a time of 3:46.13.

Ohio Wesleyan swept Wilmington, with the women racing to a 113-89 victory and the men winning, 104-73. Junior **Kara Roby (Massillon, OH/Washington)**, senior **Whitney Snow (West Chester, OH/Lakota East)** and senior **Jackie Chapple (Medina, OH/Hawken School)** each won two events and helped a relay team to a win. Roby won the 1000 and 100 freestyles in respective times of 11:45.79 and :59.73. Chapple won the 200 IM (2:26.56) and the 500 free in (5:48.52). The pair also combined with senior **Rasika Sridhar (Bangalore, India/Sophia)** and sophomore **Meghan Warren (Marlton, NJ/Shawnee)** to win the 400 free relay (4:02.16). Snow won the 50 free (25.96) and the 100 fly (1:03.85) and teamed with sophomore **Katie Keleshian (Richmond Heights, OH/Regina)**, sophomore **Megan Downing (Mentor, OH/Gilmour Academy)** and senior **Christina Schilling (Painesville, OH/Painesville)** to win the 400 medley relay (4:23.28). In the men's race, freshman **David Gatz (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** won the 50 free in a time of 23.59 and took the 100 breaststroke in 59.25, breaking the school record of 59.34 set by **Matt Colvig** in 1994. He also helped the 400 medley relay team open the meet with a win, combining with sophomore **Brian Fahey (Delaware, OH/Hayes)**, freshman **Jaimito Fuentes (Massillon, OH/Glen Oak)** and junior **Robert Naples (Hamden, CT/Notre Dame)** to take the event in 4:03.48.
