NCAC Men's Tennis Special
KENYON VOTED PRESEASON FAVORITE IN
23RD NORTH COAST MEN'S TENNIS SEASON

CLEVELAND, Ohio -- Kenyon narrowly edged defending champion Denison as the preseason favorite in balloting by eight of nine North Coast Athletic Conference men's tennis coaches.

The Lords, who last season finished with a 6-0 league record and 16-6 overall mark, earned five of eight first-place votes cast and totalled 69 points. Denison was selected second just two points back (67) and received the other three first-place votes. Wooster, last season's third-place team, was predicted to finish third again with 55 points. Allegheny (48) was picked to finish fourth, followed by Oberlin (38), Wabash (33), Wittenberg (22), Ohio Wesleyan (18) and Earlham (10) in places five through nine.

Last spring Kenyon, under the direction of head coach **Scott Thielke**, was selected to the NCAA Division III Tournament for the ninth time, falling to Carthage in the first round. The Lords return their entire lineup from 2006, led by senior **Sean Stewart (Bay Village, OH/St. Ignatius)** and sophomore **Rob Alef (Golf, IL/Glenbrook South)**, who each earned first-team All-NCAC honors last season.

In 22 years of North Coast men's tennis competition, three schools have claimed championships: Denison, Wooster and Kenyon. The Big Red have won or shared the most titles (12), followed by the Lords with nine, including the four of the past five. The Scots have claimed a share of four NCAC titles, last in 1996. All three teams shared the crown in 1989; Wooster and Denison shared the first one, contested in 1985.

Founded in 1983, the North Coast Athletic Conference consists of 10 academically selective colleges and universities - Allegheny College, Denison University, Earlham College, Hiram College, Kenyon College, Oberlin College, Ohio Wesleyan University, Wabash College, Wittenberg University and the College of Wooster. The NCAC sponsors 22 championship sports, 11 for men and 11 for women.
