PERRINE AND LOLL NAMED NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Denison's **Sarah Perrine (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)** and Oberlin's **Mike Loll (Davison, MI/Davison)** have been named women's and men's basketball "Players of the Week" in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Perrine, a 5-8, senior guard, led the Big Red to a pair of North Coast wins, helping her team retain its hold on first place in the standings. Perrine scored 15 points in an 81-53 defeat of Hiram, then added another 16 in a 70-59 victory over Ohio Wesleyan. Her totals for the week were 13-for-16 (81.3 percent) shooting from the field, including 4-of-6 from long range, and four assists. She has 100 career three-pointers and is two shy of moving into sixth place on Denison's all-time list.

Loll, a 6-5, senior forward, averaged 18 points and 9.5 rebounds per game to lead the Yeomen to a pair of victories. He was also deadly at the free throw line, going 14-of-15 in the two games – including a perfect 11-of-11 effort in a 75-62 win over Case. shot 58.8 percent (10-of-17) from the field and 50 percent (2-of-4) from long range. Loll notched his 10th career double-double with 22 points and 11 boards against the Spartans. With 14 points, he was one of four Yeomen in double figures in a thrilling 64-63 win at Denison - the first NCAC win of the season for Oberlin. He also notched three assists, two blocks and a steal for the week.

HIRAM TAKES OVER FIRST PLACE; TERRIERS TRAVEL TO SECOND-PLACE WOOSTER WEDNESDAY

CLEVELAND -- Hiram (4-0, 9-4) moved into sole possession of first place in the North Coast Athletic Conference standings after topping fourth-place (tie) Ohio Wesleyan, 77-73 this afternoon. The game was originally set to be played yesterday, but had been postponed a day due to severe winter weather in northeastern Ohio. The Terriers are the only team to boast a perfect record in league play. They test that record twice this week, first at second-place (tie) Wooster (3-1, 8-5) on Wednesday, and then at home against a hungry Denison (0-4, 3-10) squad on Saturday.

Wooster has a tough week ahead. In addition to its game against first-place Hiram, the Fighting Scots also host arch rival Wittenberg (3-1, 6-6). The two teams enter the week tied for second place. The Tigers open their week at home against eighth-place (tie) Earlham (1-3, 1-12). There are three sets of ties throughout the NCAC standings. Wooster and Wittenberg are knotted at second and Oberlin (1-3, 4-8) and Earlham share eighth. The real logjam is at fourth, where four teams find themselves this week with identical 2-2 North Coast records: Kenyon (2-2, 8-5), Wabash (2-2, 7-5), Ohio Wesleyan (2-2, 6-6) and Allegheny (2-2, 6-7). The Little Giants and Battling Bishops square off in Delaware on Wednesday and the Lords host the Gators on Saturday. Other games involving these four teams feature opponents outside the tie. On Wednesday, Allegheny hosts Oberlin and Kenyon welcomes Denison. On Saturday, Ohio Wesleyan travels to Earlham, while Wabash hosts the Yeomen.

Notes: **ALLEGHENY** dropped a pair of games last week, falling to non-conference foe Penn State-Behrend, 69-52, and to Wittenberg, 72-64. **Ryan Hollihan (Saxenburg, PA/Knoch)** scored a career-high 27 points and grabbed eight boards in the loss to Behrend. **Charlie Jaicks (Gibsonia, PA/Mars Area)** netted 20 to lead the Gators against the Tigers in NCAC play ... **DENISON'S Chris Luther (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** tied a career-high with 24 points in a heartbreaking 64-63 loss to Oberlin this afternoon. The game had been set for yesterday, but severe winter weather conditions postponed the game to today. Luther averaged 15.0 ppg in three games this week and was 16-for-17 from the free throw line. He has led DU in scoring nine times this season. Denison fell at Bethany, 71-64, and to Ohio Wesleyan, 85-60 ... **EARLHAM** suffered a pair of narrow defeats last week. The Quakers dropped an 81-74 decision to Anderson midweek. Senior **Tristian Gregory (Evansville, IN/Harrison)** led the way with 18 points and six assists. Earlham missed a shot at the buzzer against in conference play against Kenyon, resulting in a 72-69 loss to the Lords. Earlham had held a 64-57 lead with 3:44 to play, but Kenyon battled back to make it 72-69 with 15 seconds left. Gregory again led the Quakers, scoring 17 points on the night. He has 1,276 career points and moved into 16th on Quakers' all-time list ... **HIRAM** sits alone in first place in the NCAC after its 77-73 victory over Ohio Wesleyan this afternoon. **Ian Pfouts (Green, OH/Green)** led the way with 16 points and eight rebounds. He also chipped in three assists and two blocks ... **KENYON** bounced back from a 74-64 loss to Wooster with a hard-fought 72-69 win over Earlham. The victory was their first on the Quakers' home court since 1996-97. Senior **Bryan Yelvington (Arlington Hts., IL/John Hersey)** tossed in 33 points and snared 13 rebounds in the two league games. He was instrumental in the win at Earlham, scoring seven of the Lords' final eight points after the Quakers had rallied from a 12-point deficit for a 66-64 lead ... **OBERLIN** converted 28 of 31 free throws to snap a seven-game losing skid with a 75-62 win over local rival Case Western Reserve. Senior **Mike Loll (Davison, MI/Davison)** notched his 10th career double-double with 22 points and 11 boards. With 14 points, Loll was one of four Yeomen in double figures in a thrilling 64-63 win at Denison this afternoon - the first NCAC win of the season for Oberlin. The game had been set for yesterday, but severe winter weather conditions postponed the game to today. Loll averaged 18 points and 9.5 rebounds per game on the week. He was also deadly at the free throw line, going 14-of-15 in the two games - including a perfect 11-of-11 effort against Case - and was efficient from the field - shooting 58.8 percent (10-of-17) overall and 50 percent (2-of-4) from long range ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** junior post **Brent Pleiman (Russia, OH/Russia)** scored to kick off an 11-2 run that gave the Battling Bishops a double-digit lead, and the Bishops pulled away during the second half to take an 85-60 victory over Denison. Senior wing **Kyle Miller (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** led OWU with 17 points and shared the team lead with four assists. The Bishops closed their week with a 77-73 loss to Hiram today. Senior wing **Kyle Holliday (Van Wert, OH/Van Wert)** hit a pair of three-pointers to shave a nine-point second-half deficit to a single marker, but Hiram withstood the Bishop rally. Holliday led the Bishops with 22 points, scoring 14 of those during the second half, dished out a team-high five assists and shared the team lead with eight boards ... **WABASH** head coach **Mac Petty** won his 500th career game with the Little Giants' 75-58 victory over Wooster. Petty became the 10th active Division III coach and 22nd to coach at the DIII level to reach that plateau. He is the third NCAC coach to reach 500 victories, joining Wooster's **Steve Moore** and former Ohio Wesleyan coach **Gene Mehaffey**. Petty spent three seasons at Sewanee, where he won 48 games, before coming to Wabash in 1976. Saturday's win was his 452nd with the Little Giants. The win ended a 12-game NCAC regular season losing streak by the Little Giants against Wooster and was the first home conference win for Wabash against the Fighting Scots since joining the league in 1999. The last time Wabash had defeated the Scots at Chadwick Court was in 1975. Sophomore guard **Wes Smith (Indianapolis, IN/Lawrence North)** scored seven of the Little Giants' first ten points on the way to a game-high 24-point effort. He was 10-for-17 from the field and 4-of-8 from the free throw line. He also led both teams with 14 rebounds, five steals, and three assists. Smith added a blocked shot to his totals, as well. Smith joined Petty as a member of the "500 Club," sitting at 497 career points scored coming into the game ... **WITTENBERG** started fast and finished strong to claim a 72-64 victory over visiting Allegheny in its only game last week. The Tigers' win was their season-best third in a row and their fifth in their last seven outings. Wittenberg put together a balanced offensive effort, led by freshman wing **Josh McKee (New Carlisle, OH/Tecumseh)** who tallied 14 points before suffering what appeared to be a minor ankle injury. He was one of three starters to finish in double figures offensively ... **WOOSTER** sophomore guard **Nathan Balch (Westerville, OH/Olentangy)** was the Fighting Scot's leading scorer as they split a pair of games last week. He put in 16 points in a 74-64 win at Kenyon and then tossed in 13 in a 75-58 loss at Wabash. He registered 13 rebounds in the two games, including a season-high nine against the Lords, as well as two assists and two steals.

DENISON REMAINS PERFECT IN NCAC; BIG RED TEST RECORD TWICE IN COMING WEEK

CLEVELAND -- First-place Denison (4-0, 6-6) is the only remaining undefeated North Coast team after the Big Red defeated Hiram (2-3, 3-9) and Ohio Wesleyan (4-2, 8-6) last week. DU hosts fifth-place Wooster (2-2, 4-8) Wednesday and travels to eighth-place Oberlin (1-3, 2-9) on Saturday afternoon. The standings are tight as three teams have won four times in NCAC play.

Wittenberg (4-1, 9-4) is a half-game off the pace and has one conference contest on tap in the next seven days, at fourth-place Kenyon (3-2, 4-9) Wednesday evening. The third-place Battling Bishops, one full game back, host ninth-place Earlham (0-6, 1-13) in both teams' only action in the coming week. The Ladies, who are in fourth place, host Oberlin Wednesday and sixth-place (tie) Allegheny (2-3, 6-8) Saturday.

Rounding out Wednesday's schedule: Allegheny hosts Oberlin and sixth-place (tie) Hiram travels to non-conference foe Carnegie Mellon. Saturday afternoon the Terriers visit the Fighting Scots.

Notes: In two games last week, **ALLEGHENY** lost to Penn State-Behrend, 64-63, and Ohio Wesleyan, 72-54. **Jill Gregory (Jeanette, PA/Greensburg Central Catholic)** led the Gators with 19 points against Behrend, while **Emilie Simone (Pittsburgh, PA/Mount Lebanon)** posted a double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds. In the loss to the Battling Bishops, Gregory was again the high scorer, this time with 17 points and added eight rebounds ... **DENISON** defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 70-59, and Hiram, 81-53, to emerge as the leader in the conference standings entering the week. Senior guard **Sarah Perrine (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)** led the team in scoring with 15 points against the Terriers and 16 versus the Battling Bishops. For the week, she shot 13-for-16 (81.3 percent) from the field. The Hiram game was played this afternoon, after severe winter weather prevented the Terriers from leaving campus yesterday ... **EARLHAM** dropped a pair of North Coast games last week, losing to Wittenberg, 78-59, and Kenyon, 69-52. Freshman **Nikki Darrett (Evansville, IN/Bosse)** topped the Quakers with 20 points and six rebounds versus the Tigers, while senior **Tasha Merrill (Cedar Grove, IN/Franklin County)** was top scorer against the Ladies with 15. Merrill moved into seventh place on Earlham's all-time list and enters the week with 1,063 career points ... **HIRAM** lost to Case, 69-52, and to Denison, 81-53. Freshman guard **Tiffany Shields (Bedford Hts., OH/Bedford)** led the offense with 13 points against Denison, while sophomore guard **Jess Cowan (Hiram, OH/Crestwood)** tied her career-high with 14 to lead the Terriers against Case ... **KENYON** split a pair of conference contests with a 56-48 loss to Wooster and a 69-52 defeat of Earlham. Freshman **Andrea Pohly (Fairview Park, OH/Laurel School)** scored a career-high 17 points against the Quakers, tossing in 12 of those points in the pivotal second half ... Senior guard/forward **Alyssa Clark (Cleveland Hts., OH/Regina)** led **OBERLIN** to a 2-1 week with an average of 21 points and eight rebounds per game. She recorded her third double-double of the season with a 25-point, 12-rebound effort in a 53-47 win over Bryn Mawr. The Yeowomen followed with a 72-64 victory over Haverford the next night as Clark poured in 21 points. In an 81-40 loss to Wittenberg to close out the week, Clark scored a team-best 17 points to go with eight boards. For the week, Clark shot 20-of-25 from the line and was 7-for-17 from three-point range ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** opened the week with a 70-59 loss to Denison. Senior post **Katie Hamilton (Hilliard, OH/Darby)** and sophomore post **Kayla Gordon (St. Louis, MO/Mehlville)** each scored 15 points to lead the Battling Bishop attack. Hamilton hauled in a career-high 18 rebounds as well. Hamilton also led OWU in a 72-56 defeat of Allegheny. She scored a career-high 19 points in the game, including five in a 7-0 game-opening run ... **WITTENBERG** junior post **Stephanie Boardman (Cincinnati, OH/McAuley)** scored 12 points to lead the Tigers to their fourth win in five games, a 78-59 decision over Earlham. She followed that performance with a 24-point, 13-rebound effort in Wittenberg's 81-41 victory over Oberlin this afternoon. **Kelsey Casey (Columbus, OH/Upper Arlington)** recorded a career-high nine points and added a game-high five assists. The game was played today after severe weather conditions prevented Oberlin from leaving campus yesterday ... **WOOSTER** junior guard **Kym Wenz (North Ridgeville, OH/Avon Lake)** extended her streak of 20-point games to four with 23 in a 56-48 defeat of Kenyon and 20 in a 66-63 loss at Ursuline. She has a 21.3 scoring average this season and last week totaled 12 rebounds, six assists and five steals.

The 2009 portion of the season is well under way. Allegheny meets Hiram tomorrow in a meet that was rescheduled from Saturday. The Gators also host Carnegie Mellon Friday night. Also Friday, Wittenberg travels to Denison, and Kenyon heads to Ashland. Hiram meets John Carroll Friday night and Wittenberg on Saturday. Wabash heads to Washington (Mo.) Thursday and to the University of Indianapolis on Friday. Ohio Wesleyan welcomes Wilmington on Tuesday.

WOMEN'S NOTES: **DENISON** returned to the pool after winter break and dropped a 171-121 decision to Ohio University. Senior **Kristen Hohl (Winfield, IL/Wheaton North)** won the 50 freestyle in 24.31, was part of the first-place 400 free relay and was second in the 100 free (52.86). **Olivia Zaleski (Corry, PA/Corry Area)** won the 100 butterfly (58.29) and was also part of the victorious 400 free relay ... **HIRAM** met Wooster in the pool Friday night. The Terrier women lost to the Fighting Scots, 157-66. Senior diver **Jen Fowler (Canton, OH/McKinley)** won both diving events ... **OBERLIN** upended Colorado College, 122.5-103.5, on its Florida training trip ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** and Wooster were scheduled to meet at OWU's Pfeiffer Natatorium, but unsafe travel conditions kept the Fighting Scots from leaving their campus on Saturday. Instead, the two teams held a 'telephone meet', in which each team competed in its own pool and the two sets of results were compared and scored to produce the final results. Wooster won, 146-85. Junior **Kendra Klossner (Naperville, IL/Neuqua Valley)** won the 50 freestyle (26.30) and was second in the 100 free. Junior **Erin Hanahan (Madison, OH/Perry)** took first in both one-meter diving events (157.65 and 178.35 points). Freshman **Marina Metzler (Columbia, MD/Hammond)** won the 200 butterfly (2:19.33) ... In addition to the meet with OWU, **WOOSTER** had a dual with Hiram. The Fighting Scots took both meets, defeating Hiram, 157-66, and Ohio Wesleyan, 146-85. Freshman **Priscilla Haug (Lexington, KY/Homeschooled)** won four individual events during the two meets. She took first in the 200 free (2:02.12) and 500 free (5:27.39) against the Terriers, and emerged the winner in the 400 individual medley (4:53.25) and 200 backstroke (2:20.95) in the 'telephone meet' with the Battling Bishops. Unsafe travel conditions kept the Fighting Scots from leaving their campus on Saturday. Instead, the Scots and Bishops teams held a 'telephone meet', in which each team competed in its own pool and the two sets of results were compared and scored to produce the final results.
