NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (Feb. 8)

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Wittenberg senior **Kevin Murray (Carmel, IN/Carmel)**, a 6-3 wing, totaled 41 points on 14-of-24 (58.3) shooting, and added 14 rebounds as his team went 2-0. The Tigers defeated Earlham, 84-70, and Allegheny, 68-48, and enter the week tied for fourth in the standings with Kenyon. Murray shared the team lead with 26 points against Earlham, on 9-of-15 (.600) shooting from the field, including 4-of-9 (.444) from three-point range.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Denison sophomore **Shaina Kaiser (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)**, a 5-10 wing, led the Big Red to three victories as they clinched their second NCAC crown and the top seed in the 25th annual NCAC tournament. Kaiser shot 17-of-28 (61.0) from the field in the three games, including 6-of-10 (60.0) from three-point range, and was perfect at the charity stripe in six attempts. She averaged 15.3 points per game in the three contests, including 30 points in a 76-71 defeat of Ohio Wesleyan. She also pulled down 5.7 rebounds per game and contributed 10 assists and four steals. Denison has won 12 games in a row, all in conference play.

MEN'S INDOOR TRACK - DISTANCE/MIDDLE DISTANCE RUNNER

Allegheny junior **Tony Dipre (Twinsburg, OH/Walsh Jesuit)** won the mile at the Baldwin-Wallace Invitational with a time of 4:15.00.

WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK - DISTANCE/MIDDLE DISTANCE RUNNER

Allegheny junior **Mia Symoniak (Snyder, NY/Amherst Central)** was third in the mile (5:23.22) and fourth in the 3,000 meters (3:16.63) at the Baldwin-Wallace Invitational.

MEN'S INDOOR TRACK - SPRINTS/HURDLES

Oberlin sophomore **Solomon Turner (Greensboro, NC/Deerfield Academy)** won the 200 meters (22.69) and was second in the 55 meters (6.57) at Oberlin's Crimson & Gold Invitational. Turner was also part of the second place 4x200 meter relay that finished in 1:32.55 and the 4x400 meter relay that was clocked at 3:26.28.

WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK - SPRINTS/HURDLES

Earlham sophomore **Starr Gary (Indianapolis, IN/Northwest)** won the 55 meters (7.50) and 200 meters (27.00) at the Anderson Invitational. Both times are the best in the North Coast this season. She also anchored the winning 4x200 meter relay that finished in 1:53.38.

MEN'S INDOOR TRACK - FIELD EVENTS

Allegheny senior **Joe McMahon (Pittsburgh, PA/Baldwin)** won the long jump (20-10.75) and triple jump (44-11) at the Baldwin-Wallace Invitational.

WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK - FIELD EVENTS

Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Chelsea Imm (Glandorf, OH/Ottawa-Glandorf)** won the pole vault at the Greater Columbus meet. She cleared 10 feet, 2.75 inches.

NCAC CHAMPIONSHIPS BEGIN THURSDAY IN CANTON, OHIO

The 25th annual North Coast Athletic Conference Men's & Women's Swimming and Diving Championships will be held Thursday through Saturday, February 12-14, at C.T. Branin Natatorium, in Canton, Ohio. The 2009 meet, hosted by Wooster, is held at an off-campus site to accommodate overwhelming spectator response to the top NCAA Division III swimming and diving conference championship.

The Kenyon men's and women's squads are the defending champions. The Lords and Ladies have won 23 of the 25 NCAC crowns contested. The Denison men are the only team to have beaten the Lords in the NCAC meet - they claimed their title in 1997; the Denison women snapped the Ladies' 19-year hold on the crown in 2004.

The championships will be streamed online for the first time. Each morning and afternoon session will be shown live, online, for alums, families and friends who cannot make the trip to Canton. Morning preliminary sessions begin at 10:00 a.m. each day, while the evening finals sessions begin at 6:30 p.m. each evening. Fans can purchase a Meet Pass for \$45 up through the first day of competition. The meet pass allows viewers to log in to the meet whenever they want for the full three days of competition (morning and evening sessions). Day passes will also be available once the meet begins for \$15. A day pass will allow for viewing of the morning and evening session on the day of purchase. 2009 NCAC SWIMMING & DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS SET FOR FEBRUARY 12-14 IN CANTON

CLEVELAND – The 25th annual North Coast Athletic Conference Men's & Women's Swimming and Diving Championships will be held February 12-14 at C.T. Branin Natatorium, in Canton, Ohio. The 2009 meet, hosted by Wooster, is held at an off-campus site to accommodate overwhelming spectator response to the top NCAA Division III swimming and diving conference championship.

The Kenyon men's and women's squads are the defending champions. The Lords and Ladies have won 23 of the 24 NCAC crowns contested. The Denison men claimed their title in 1997, while the Denison women snapped the Ladies' 19-year hold on the crown in 2004.

WOMEN'S TEAM PREVIEWS

KENYON senior **Brittany Hurd (Orange Village, OH/Orange)** earned all-conference recognition in six events last winter, including third-place finishes in the 50 and 100 freestyles and a runner-up showing in the 100 back. Junior **Tina Ertel (Halle, Germany/Sportgymnasium Halle)** is the defending conference champion in the 200 individual medley and was runner up in the 200 back in 2008. She is a contender in the 200 freestyle this season as well. Sophomore **Kati Meirs (Cream Ridge, NJ/Peddie)** dominated the distance events in the conference. She is the defending NCAC champion in the 500 and 1650 freestyles, and was runner up in the 200 free. Senior **Tracy Menzel (Greencastle, IN/Greencastle)** was runner up in both breaststroke events last year and is a contender in those events again this season, as well as in the individual medley. A newcomer to watch is freshman **Alisa Vereshchagin (Solon, OH/Solon)** who has the top time in Division III this season in the 200 breaststroke.

Junior **Olivia Zaleski (Corry, PA/Corry Area)** was the NCAC Swimmer of the Year last season and she returns to lead **DENISON**. Zaleski is the defending champion in the 100 butterfly and was all-conference in the 50 free and 100 free as well as in four relays. All but one of the Big Red's All-NCAC relay team members return for the 2009 campaign. Senior **Kristen Hohl (Winfield, IL/Wheaton North)** was a member of four of the five relay teams and is the defending champion in the 50 free and 100 free. Senior **Annamarie Novinger (Longmont, CO/Niwot)** was part of three of the relays and is the defending champion in the 200 freestyle. Sophomore **Ksenia Golovkina (Newton, MA/Newton South)** is the defending champion in both breaststroke events and was part of two relay teams. Reigning NCAC Diver of the Year, sophomore **Samantha Salas (Fairfax, VA/Robinson Secondary School)** aims to defend her titles on both the 1m- and three-meter boards.

WOOSTER has exceptional depth in 2009 and expects a top-three team finish for the 10th time in the past 12 seasons. The top veteran is junior breaststroke specialist **Syd Kelly (Edina, MN/Edina)**, who reached the championship finals of both breaststroke events at last year's NCAC meet. Sophomore **Tamari Farquharson (Kingston, Jamaica/Mercersburg Academy, PA)** has led the team in the sprint freestyles. Up-and-coming newcomers to watch are freshman identical triplets: **Melissa, Priscilla** and **Rebecca Haug (Lexington, KY/Homeschooled)**. Melissa has fared well in the butterfly, Priscilla is a top backstroker and Rebecca consistently scores in the individual medleys.

ALLEGHENY returns senior **Erin Ham (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)**, who earned All-NCAC honors as part of third-place 200 and 400 medley relays. She is the team's top breastroker and ranks in the top 10 in Division III in both breaststroke events in 2008-09. Sophomore **Ashley Whitehead (Conneaut Lake, PA/Meadville Area)** earned all-conference recognition in all four relays last year and is the team's top sprint freestyler this season. Diving is always a strength for the Gators. The team's top divers are freshmen **Heather Daly (Sudbury, MA/Lincoln Sudbury)** and **Bridget McCartin (Raleigh, NC/Leesville Road)**.

A pair of sophomore All-NCAC honorees return for **OBERLIN**. Sophomore **Sara Kadi (Oakland, CA/Piedmont)** is having an outstanding season. She earned all-conference honors with a third-place finish in the 200 butterfly at the 2008 NCAC Championships. This season, Kadi consistently scores in fly, freestyle and individual medley events for the Yeowomen. Sophomore diver **Christine Martin (Jamacia Plain, MA/Milton Academy)** was All-NCAC as a freshman when she placed third in three-meter diving. Senior **Bryne Ulmschneider (Midland, TX/Midland)** has the team's top times in the 500 free and the 200 breast this season. Sophomore **Kelsey Sherman (Indian Wells, CA/Palm Desert)** leads the Yeowomen in distance freestyle events.

WITTENBERG juniors **Adeline Brym (Mansfield, OH/Lexington)** and **Kristin Elber (Brunswick, OH/Brunswick)** earned All-NCAC recognition as part of the third-place 800 free relay in 2008. Brym leads this year's Tigers in the backstroke, individual medley and distance freestyle. Elber excels in the sprints. Sophomore **Megan Shubitowski (Columbus, Ohio/Watterson)** aims to better her third-place, all-conference showing in the one-meter diving event. Newcomers to watch include freshmen **Keaton Hannon (Peachtree City, GA/McIntosh)** and **Megan Tassone (Cincinnati, OH/Ursuline Academy)**. Hannon is the team's top swimmer in the butterfly, while Tassone has the Tigers' top efforts in both breaststroke events.

Junior **Kendra Klossner (Naperville, IL/Neuqua Valley)** has posted **OHIO WESLEYAN'S** top times in both backstroke events, as well as in the 50 freestyle. Junior **Erin Hanahan (Madison, OH/Perry)** is the top diver for reigning NCAC Diving Coach of the Year Brian Book. Freshman **Marina Metzler (Columbia, MD/Hammond)** leads the team in the butterfly, while sophomore **Marisa Obuchowski (Baltimore, MD/Pikesville)** has the team's top efforts in both breaststroke events.

A pair of seniors, **Amy Kocka (Strongsville, OH/Strongsville)** and **Raisa Janke (Spring, TX/Klein Oak)**, lead **HIRAM** into the 2009 NCAC Championships. Kocka competes in the freestyle, breaststroke and individual medley. Janke leads the Terriers in the backstroke and middle distances. Both swimmers are part of three school-record relay teams. Senior diver **Jen Fowler (Canton, OH/McKinley)** finished fourth in the one-meter competition in 2008, less than two points shy of third place and All-NCAC recognition.

MEN'S TEAM PREVIEWS

Junior **Blair Withington (Hastings, New Zealand/Hastin Boys')** earned six all-conference certificates last season and is **KEY-NYON'S** top returning conference award winner. Withington was part of three All-NCAC relay squads and placed in the top three in three other individual events. He is the defending conference champion in the 200 individual medley, and has Division III's top effort in the 100 free this season. Junior **Kegan Borland (Vandergrift, PA/St. Joseph)** was part of the champion 800 free relay in 2008, was the winner of the 1650 freestyle and was runner up in both the 500 free and 400 IM. Sophomore **Michael Mpitsos (Newport, OR/Newport)** earned four All-NCAC certificates as part of the second-place 200 free relay and for third-place finishes in the 100 fly, 100 back and 200 back. He is a top contender in the sprints this season.

A pair of seniors lead **DENISON** into the 25th North Coast Championships. **Jon Behnke (Orinda, CA/Miramonte)** and **John Geissinger (Darien, CT/The Lawrenceville School)** were both part of all four Big Red relays that earned All-NCAC recognition last season. They each claimed third-place finishes in sprint freestyles as well, Behnke in the 50 free, Geissinger in the 100 free. Senior **David Curtis (Ann Arbor, MI/Pioneer)** is the defending conference champion in the 200 and 500 freestyles and was part of the first-place 400 freestyle relay in 2008. Diver **Russ Bornscheim (Ann Arbor, MI/Pioneer)** is the top returnee in the conference on both boards after finishing second in the three-meter competition and third on the one-meter board. Freshmen **Robert Barry (Richmond, VA/St. Christopher's School)** and **Dan Thurston (Ann Arbor MI/Huron)** are swimmers to watch in the backstroke and individual medley, respectively.

Seven **WABASH** swimmers who earned All-NCAC honors as part of relays in 2008 return. Senior **Jordon Blackwell (Veedersburg, IN/Crawfordsville)** earned all-conference in three relays, and is one of the team's top sprint freestylers. Juniors **Craig Vektor (Indianapolis, IN/Franklin Central)** and **Elijah Sanders (Mt. Vernon, IN/Mt. Vernon)** are returning all-conference performers. Vektor should score in the 100 and 200 freestyles, while Sanders is among the conference leaders in the distance events. Sophomores **Eric Vaughn (McMurray, PA/Peters Township)** and **Evan Rhinesmith (McCordsville, IN/Mt. Vernon)** are the Little Giants' leading contenders in the backstroke and breaststroke, respectively.

WITTENBERG finished fourth in 2008 and head coach **Natalie Koukis** was named NCAC Coach of the Year. The 2009 Tigers are led by junior **Neil Anderson (Lakewood, OH/Lakewood)** and sophomore **Chris Culkin (Novi, MI/Northville)** in the distance freestyles. Sophomore **Matt Higbee (Columbus, OH/Upper Arlington)** should score in the sprints and backstroke, while classmate **Zach Stewart (Vincennes, IN/Lincoln)** is a contender in the butterfly.

All four members of **WOOSTER'S** 2008 All-NCAC 200 freestyle relay return this winter. One of those swimmers, junior **Eric Babbitt (Rancho Santa Margarita, CA/Santa Margarita Catholic)** heads the list of returnees for the Fighting Scots as he is having an outstanding season. Babbitt could score in three freestyle and both butterfly events, in addition to the relays. Juniors **Ryan Radtke (Wiloughby, OH/NDCL)** and **Michael Saltzman (Evansville, IN/Asheville School, NC)**, as well as sophomore **Brendan Horgan (Hudson, OH/Western Reserve Academy)** are the other returning all-conference performers. Radtke should score in the distance freestyle and individual medley. **Logan LaBerge (Towson, MD/Towson)**, another junior, is a contender in the backstroke.

Freshman **Ryan Inwood (Roswell, GA/Centennial)** has had an outstanding start to his collegiate career. He leads **ALLEGHENY** in the sprints, while juniors **Alex Smith (DuBois, PA/DuBois Area)** and **Ashton Kinney (Sewickley, PA/Sewickley Academy)** are the Gators' top distance swimmers. Junior **Josh Sese (Pittsburgh, PA/Brentwood)** is a contender in the breaststroke and the individual medley. Freshman **Jesse Rakovan (Brookville, PA/Brookville Area)** aims to become the newest Gator to dominate the conference in diving.

A trio of sophomores pace **HIRAM** in the 2008-09 campaign. Leading the way is **Santiago Morales (Mexico City, Mexico/Cole-**

gio Bilboa) in the butterfly and individual medley. He narrowly missed all-conference honors with a fourth-place finish in the 200 fly as a freshman and holds the Terrier school mark in the 500 free, 200 fly and 400 IM. **Travis Subda (Spring, TX/Klein Collins)** holds the school record in the 100-yard breast and was part of a school-record 800 yard free relay. **Zach Wegman (Knoxville, TN/Bereon)** is an up-and-comer in the distance freestyle. He holds the school record in the 1000 free.

OHIO WESLEYAN junior **David Gatz (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** is the defending conference champion in the 100 breast and 200 breast, and is again one of the premier breaststrokes in the North Coast this season. In addition to the two breaststroke events, Gatz has posted the Battling Bishops' top times in both butterfly events. Another junior to watch is junior **Kevin Fahey (Delaware, OH/Hayes)**, who leads the team in the sprints and the individual medley. Freshmen who are expected to score are **Jesse Sheldon (Mansfield, OH/Ontario)** in the backstroke and **Nathan Eckersley (Cleveland, OH/Mayfield)** in the distance events.

OBERLIN has several swimmers who are making their mark on the 2009 version of the Yeomen swim squad. Senior **Scott McInerney (Randolph, NJ/Randolph)** is having a fine season in the sprints and butterfly. Freshman **Dimitri Macris (Woodlands, TX/Woodlands College Prep)** is expected to score in the distance freestyle, while classmate **Nick Lashway (Leeds, MA/Norhampton)** should contribute in the backstroke and individual medley.

DENISON CLINCHES SECOND NCAC CHAMPIONSHIP; BIG RED TO ENTER NCAC TOURNAMENT AS TOP SEED

CLEVELAND -- Denison (13-0, 15-6) claimed its second North Coast Athletic Conference championship after topping Earlham, 90-51, Ohio Wesleyan, 76-71, and Oberlin, 82-47, last week. The Big Red, who have won 12-straight games and have rolled to a perfect 13-0 record, enter the second last week of the regular season also having clinched the top seed in the upcoming NCAC tournament. Denison only has one game on the schedule this week, a home contest against second-place Kenyon (9-4, 10-11) on Wednesday. The Big Red took a 71-49 decision at Kenyon on January 21.

Denison is the only team in the top four positions in the standings to know their tournament seed. The five teams in places 2-6 all are jostling for tournament position. While the top eight teams at the end of the regular season make up the tourney field, the top four teams earn the chance to host a quarterfinal contest. Kenyon, which has run up five straight wins, looks to strengthen its hold on second place. The Ladies host Earlham (1-12, 2-19) on Saturday, in addition to their early week contest at Denison. Ohio Wesleyan (7-5, 11-10) and Allegheny (7-5, 11-10) share third place. The two teams will square off in Meadville on Saturday. Before that weekend matchup, the Gators travel to eighth-place Oberlin (3-9, 5-16) on Tuesday, while the Battling Bishops host fifth-place Wittenberg (7-6, 12-9) on Wednesday. Wittenberg closes out its week at home against sixth-place Wooster (5-7, 7-14). The Fighting Scots also travel to Hiram (4-8, 6-15) on Wednesday.

The final game of the week sends Hiram to Oberlin on Saturday.

The season-ending North Coast Tournament tips off with quarterfinal games on Tuesday, Feb. 24. The semifinals and finals will be held Friday and Saturday, Feb. 27-28, at the site of the highest seed to emerge from the quarterfinal games.

Notes: After starting the week with a 63-60 loss to Hiram, **ALLEGHENY** went on to win a pair of road games over Wittenberg, 58-52, and Earlham, 88-65. Senior **Stephanie Wolf (Pittsburgh, PA/North Allegheny)** totaled 42 points, 17 rebounds, seven assists, six steals and three blocks. She shot 18-of-41 (43.9) and 6-of-10 (60.0) from the line ... **DENISON** clinched the regular season title and the top seed in the 25th North Coast Athletic Conference tournament after winning all three games last week. Sophomore **Shaina Kaiser (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)** shot 17-of-28 (61.0) from the field in the three games, including 6-of-10 (60.0) from three-point range, and was perfect at the charity stripe in six attempts. She averaged 15.3 points per game, including 30 points in a 76-71 defeat of Ohio Wesleyan. She also pulled down 5.7 rebounds per game and contributed 10 assists and four steals. Denison has won 12 games in a row, all in conference play, to clinch its second NCAC crown. Senior **Ellen O'Brien (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman)** totaled 16 assists during the week, which moved her into fourth place on Denison's all-time list. The 16 helpers combined with just one turnover improved O'Brien's Division III-leading assist-to-turnover ratio to 4.13 ... **EARLHAM** claimed its first victory in conference play when the Quakers defeated Hiram, 65-51. Senior **Tracy Hill (Copley, OH/Cuyahoga Valley Christian)** posted career highs in both points (20) and rebounds (17) in the game to lead all players. Senior **Tasha Merrill (Cedar Grove, IN/Franklin County)** stands fifth on the Quakers' all-time scoring list with 1,166 points. She totaled 24 points in three contests last week ... **HIRAM** went 1-2 last week, the victory coming over Allegheny, 63-60. Junior forward **Ashley Drum (Parma, OH/Valley Forge)** finished the week with 43 points and 16 rebounds to lead the Terriers. Sophomore guard **Jess Cowan (Hiram, OH/Crestwood)** totaled 42 points, with 6-of-18 shooting from long range and 10 rebounds and six assists ... **KENYON** kept hold of second place in the standings with victories over Wittenberg, 71-57, and Wooster, 72-59. The Ladies, who have won five in a row, were paced by freshman **Morgan Korinek (Cuyahoga Falls, OH/Woodridge)**, who exploded for 43 points in the two games. Senior forward **Rachel Dixon (West Liberty, OH/Salem)** totaled 20 points and 19 boards as **WITTENBERG** went 1-1 last week. The Tigers defeated Hiram, 74-46, and lost to Allegheny, 58-52 ... Junior guard **Kym Wenz (North Ridgeville, OH/Avon Lake)** continued her standout season for **WOOSTER**, collecting 44 points, 21 rebounds, four assists, and six steals during their three-game week. She had a double-double of 10 points and 10 rebounds against Ohio Wesleyan, an 84-67 loss, and later in the week, produced a game-high 25 points in a 72-59 loss at Kenyon.

OWU MOVES INTO TIE WITH WOOSTER FOR FIRST PLACE; HIRAM DROPS INTO THIRD

CLEVELAND -- Ohio Wesleyan (10-2, 14-6) and Wooster (10-2, 15-6) enter the final two weeks of the regular season tied for first place. The Battling Bishops moved into the top spot after defeating Wabash, 51-45, and first-place Hiram, 70-62 in overtime, last week. Wooster also won twice last week, edging the Terriers, 89-87, and topping Wabash, 78-58. With the competitiveness of the 2008-09 season taken into account, OWU and Wooster cannot afford to look ahead at claiming the conference title, nor at their respective places in the season-ending NCAC tournament. They each have four games left to play. The Bishops host fourth-place (tie) Wittenberg (8-4, 11-9) on Wednesday, while the Scots stay home to face a surging sixth-place Denison (4-8, 7-14), which has won four out of its last five games. On Saturday, OWU hosts Earlham (3-9, 3-18) and Wooster travels to arch-rival Wittenberg.

Hiram (9-3, 14-7) fell into third place after dropping games to both Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster. The Terriers look to regain their winning form when they host sixth-place (tie) Allegheny (4-8, 8-13) on Wednesday and travel to Denison on Saturday. The Terriers are not out of the championship race, however, they will need some help from league teams to claim even a share of the title.

Other Wednesday games this week: Oberlin (1-11, 4-17) at fourth-place (tie) Kenyon (8-4, 14-7) and Wabash (3-9, 8-12) at Earlham. The week's slate winds up Saturday with Kenyon at Allegheny and Wabash at Oberlin.

The top eight teams at the end of the regular season make up the field of the North Coast Tournament. With two weeks left on the schedule, every league team still has a shot, at least mathematically, at qualifying for the post-season. The season-ending event tips off Tuesday, Feb. 24, with games hosted by the top four teams. The semifinals and finals will be held Friday and Saturday, Feb. 27-28, at the site of the highest seed to emerge from the quarterfinal games.

Notes: **ALLEGHENY** junior guard **Craig Devinney (Allison, Park, PA/Shaler)** finished the Gators' 1-1 week with 34 points, eight steals, five rebounds, and five assists. In a 76-67 defeat of Oberlin, Devinney scored 16 points and posted a career-best seven steals. He followed that performance with 18 points in a 68-58 loss to Wittenberg ... **DENISON** also went 1-1 last week, losing to Kenyon, 78-68, then defeating Oberlin, 73-64. Junior **Chris Luther (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** averaged 13.0 points per game as he shot 5-of-8 (63.0) from long range. Senior **Pat Sullivan (Loveland, OH/Loveand)** averaged 11.5 points per game and totaled 10 assists. Both players averaged 3.5 rebounds per game ... **EARLHAM** senior **Tristian Gregory (Evansville, IN/Harrison)** led the Quakers with 26 points in an 84-70 loss to Wittenberg, then added nine points in a 91-62 loss to Kenyon. Gregory moved into 11th place on Earlham's all-time scoring list and enters the week with 1,408 career points ... Sophomore guard **Chris Roberts (Cleveland, OH/Kennedy)** finished **HIRAM'S** disappointing 0-2 week with 21 points and eight rebounds. Sophomore guard **Glenn Campbell (Copley, OH/Buchte)** added 22 points, five rebounds and six assists. The Terriers, who had started the week alone in first place in the North Coast, fell to Wooster, 89-87, and Ohio Wesleyan, 70-62 in overtime, and those two teams moved head of the Terriers to share top honors this week. Hiram moves to third place ... **KENYON** remained in the fight for a top-four spot in the standings and a home game in the conference tournament quarterfinals with a pair of NCAC wins last week. Junior forward **Dave Knapke (Westerville, OH/St. Francis DeSales)** defeated Denison, 78-68, and Earlham, 91-62, to improve to 14-7 overall, the Lords' best record since the 1994-95 Kenyon team finished 20-9. Knapke recorded his third straight double-double with 20 points and 10 boards against the Big Red, then posted a career-high with 26 points versus the Quakers. In the two games, he had 46 points, 17 rebounds and eight rebounds and shot 16-of-23 from the floor (69.6) and was 14-of-19 from the line (73.7) ... Senior **Jordan Beard (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)** hit a career-high seven three-point baskets in **OBERLIN'S** 73-64 loss to Denison. He is now two triples shy of the single-season school record of 65 set in 2004-05. The Yeomen also fell to Allegheny last week, 76-67 ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** moved into a first-place tie with Wooster on the strength of two key North Coast wins last week. The Battling Bishops started the week with a 51-45 defeat of Wabash. Freshman post **Pat Pellerite (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** led his team with 19 points and added a game-high 12 rebounds. He posted another double-double in a 70-62 overtime victory over Hiram. He finished with 18 points and 11 boards against the Terriers. For the week, Pellerite shot 17-of-23 (73.9) from the field and totaled 37 points, 23 rebounds and four assists ... **WABASH** fell twice last week, 51-45 to OWU and 78-58 to Wooster. Sophomore **Wes Smith (Indianapolis, IN/Lawrence North)** totaled 29 points in the two games, including 18 versus the Battling Bishops **WITTENBERG** won twice in conference play to remain in the tight race for a top-four spot in the NCAC tournament. The Tigers' **Kevin Murray (Carmel, IN/Carmel)** totaled 41 points on 14-of-24 (58.3) shooting, and added 14 rebounds. Wittenberg defeated Earlham, 84-70, and Allegheny, 68-48, and enters the week tied for fourth in the standings with Kenyon ... Sophomore guard **Ian Franks (Greenwich, OH/South Central)** had back-to-back 20 point games, going for 21 in an 89-87 defeat of Hiram, then adding a game-high 23 in a 78-58 win over Wabash. His 44 points included 19 in the second half against the Terriers. He shot 13-of-24 (54.2) from the field and contributed eight assists, four caroms and three steals. The Fighting Scots surged into a first-place tie with Ohio Wesleyan with the two victories.
