### NCAC Women's Basketball Report

#### **NCAC SCHEDULE TIPS OFF WEDNESDAY; FULL SLATE SET FOR SATURDAY**

**CLEVELAND** -- The 2008-09 North Coast schedule tips off on Wednesday with three conference matches: Wooster (1-2) travels to Oberlin (0-4), while Allegheny (3-2) and Ohio Wesleyan (2-3) head to Hiram (1-2) and Earlham (0-4), respectively. League play continues with a full slate on Saturday. Defending NCAC champion Kenyon (0-4) hosts the Gators and North Coast tournament champion Denison (1-2) travels to tourney runner-up Wittenberg (4-1). Also on Saturday, Earlham travels to Oberlin and Ohio Wesleyan welcomes Hiram.

There are also several non-conference games set for this week. Action begins tomorrow when Wittenberg plays at Baldwin-Wallace. The next day, Case Western Reserve visits Kenyon and Marietta is at Denison. This weekend, Case visits Wooster on Saturday. Finally, Oberlin hosts Carnegie Mellon on Sunday.

**Notes:** **ALLEGHENY** sophomore guard **Jill Gregory (Jeanette, PA/Greensburg Central Catholic)** posted a career-high 15 points and grabbed 10 rebounds as the Gators captured the Marietta Turkey Shoot title with a 64-53 victory over the host Pioneers. She was named the tournament MVP, while **Emilie Simone (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** also landed on the all-tournament team ... **DENISON** fell to Muskingum, 70-64, in its only action last week. **Shania Kaiser (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)** led the way with 12 points, seven assists and seven rebounds ... Senior **Tasha Merrill (Cedar Grove, IN/Franklin County)** scored 17 points to lead **EARLHAM** in an 81-59 loss to Bluffton, then threw in 22 in a 71-64 loss to Mount St. Joseph ... **HIRAM** junior guard **Brittany Mayle (Mantua, OH/Crestwood)** scored 16 points, grabbed four rebounds and added two assists and two steals in the Terriers' only contest last week, a 78-56 loss to Marietta ... Sophomore guard **Kat Powers (Chagrin Falls, OH/Chagrin Falls)** scored 27 points in a pair of **KENYON** losses last week. The young Ladies squad, which fell to Capital, 77-41, and Thiel, 72-62, also got 24 points and 14 rebounds from freshman **Morgan Korinek (Cuyahoga Falls, OH/Woodridge)** in the two contests ... **OBERLIN** senior center **January Baker (Pittsburgh, PA/Mount Alvernia)** and junior guard **Kayla Brandt (Pittsburgh, PA/Mount Alvernia)** each scored career bests in points against the RedHawks. Baker contributed 12 points while Brandt scored 11 ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** guard **Pam Quigney (Mentor, OH/Mentor)** scored a career-best 31 points in an 83-79 loss to Franklin, then topped that effort with 32 in an 86-78 defeat of Notre Dame (OH). Sophomore **Kayla Gordon (St. Louis, MO/Mehlville)** also added a career-best effort with 30 points, giving the Battling Bishops dual 30-point performances in a single game for the first time since February 2004. For the week, Quigney was 24 for 44 (54.5) from the field, 11 for 16 (68.8) from three-point range and 20 for 21 (95.2) from the line. She also averaged 4.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists and was named MVP of the Olivet Thanksgiving Tournament. To win the tournament, the Battling Bishops defeated the Falcons and host Olivet, 97-75. Quigney posted 16 points in the championship game against the Comets ... **WITTENBERG** junior post **Stephanie Boardman (Cincinnati, OH/McAuley)** poured in 46 points as the Tigers went 2-1 last week. Freshman **Sarah Watson (Hudson, OH/Hudson)** scored a career-best 17 points in a 75-50 victory over Bethany. Wittenberg also defeated Ohio Northern, 52-44, and lost to Wilmington, 82-74, last week. The Tigers are off to a 4-1 start in 2008-09 ... In **WOOSTER'S** only action last week, junior post **Kaitlin Krister (Kent, OH/Walsh Jesuit)** scored a career-high 26 points. The Fighting Scots dropped a 73-70 decision to Bluffton as Krister collected 11 rebounds to record her third double-double in three games this season.

#### **SMITH/QUIGNEY NAMED NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

**CLEVELAND** -- Ohio Wesleyan's **Pam Quigney (Mentor, OH/Mentor)** and Wabash's **Wes Smith (Indianapolis, IN/Lawrence North)** have been named women's and men's basketball "Players of the Week" in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

**Quigney**, a 5-6, sophomore guard, scored a career-best 31 points in an 83-79 loss to Franklin, then topped that effort with 32 in an 86-78 defeat of Notre Dame (OH). For the week, Quigney was 24 for 44 (54.5) from the field, 11 for 16 (68.8) from three-point range and 20 for 21 (95.2) from the line. She also averaged 4.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists and was named MVP of the Olivet Thanksgiving Tournament. To win the tournament, the Battling Bishops defeated the Falcons (NDC) and host Olivet, 97-75.

**Smith**, a 6-3, sophomore guard/forward, erupted for a career-best 41 points, including 24 in the second half, to lead the Little Giant attack in an 89-63 win over Haonver. It was the eighth-best effort in school history and the most scored by a Wabash player since 2000. He also grabbed eight rebounds, dished two assists, and registered two steals and two blocks.

### NCAC Men's Basketball Report

#### **DEFENDING CHAMP WOOSTER TIPS OFF NCAC SCHEDULE WEDNESDAY; THREE LEAGUE GAMES SET FOR SATURDAY**

**CLEVELAND** -- The 2008-09 North Coast schedule tips off with one game on Wednesday. Defending NCAC champion Wooster (2-3) begins its title defense at home with a game against Oberlin (2-3). The bulk of the league begins conference play on Saturday: Allegheny (2-3) is at Denison (1-3), Earlham (0-5) travels to Oberlin, Wabash (2-1) heads to Kenyon (4-1) and Ohio Wesleyan (3-1) plays at Wooster. Wittenberg (1-2) begins NCAC play on Dec. 10, when the Tigers host Denison. Hiram (2-1) opens league play on Dec. 13, when the Terriers host the Tigers.

In non-conference action, Hiram travels to Case Western Reserve tonight, while Wabash plays at rival DePauw tomorrow. On Wednesday, Ohio Wesleyan heads to Capital, Allegheny is at Gannon, Denison plays at Marietta and Earlham drives to Wilmington. Wittenberg hosts Ohio Northern the same night. Hiram will be at Franciscan on Friday and Wittenberg will play at nearby Cedarville on Saturday.

**Notes: Greg Devinney (Allison Park, PA/Shaler)** was **ALLEGHENY'S** top scorer in the championship game of the Gators' National City Holiday Classic. He scored 17 points as the Gators fell to Ithaca, 85-63. **George Raftis (Pittsburgh, PA/Sewickley Academy)** was named to the all-tournament team after he recorded 25 points in the team's two games. Allegheny defeated Hilbert, 58-54, in the first round of the tourney ... **DENISON** went 1-1 last week with a 92-82 overtime victory over Case and an 87-63 loss to Capital. Senior center **Jeremy Stuhlfauth (Columbus, OH/Whetstone)** scored a career-high 22 points and collected a career-best 12 rebounds against the Spartans. Sophomore **Larry Farmer (Gurnee, IL/Warren Twp.)** led the Big Red against the Crusaders with 19 points and five rebounds ... **EARLHAM** is off to an 0-5 start after losing to Manchester, DePauw and Defiance last week. Senior **Tristian Gregory (Evansville, IN/Harrison)** scored 26 points in a 72-61 loss to Manchester, and contributed a team-best 18 points and five assists in an 83-68 loss to Defiance. For the week Gregory totaled 65 points. Freshman **Shane Heidt (Colfax, IN/Clinton Central)** led the way with 25 points when the Quakers fell, 92-57, to DePauw. Earlham also dropped an 83-68 decision to Defiance ... **HIRAM** sophomore guard **Chris Roberts (Cleveland, OH/Kennedy)** led the Terriers with 18 points and eight rebounds in a 74-69 loss to Mount Union ... After defeating Albion, 61-55, and Marietta, 74-58, in the OWU/Kenyon Classic, **KENYON** is 4-1 on the year. Senior forward **Bryan Yelvington (Arlington Hts., IL/John Hersey)** played a major role in the strong start by averaging 18 points, eight rebounds, four blocks and four assists in three games last week. Yelvington recorded his 16th career double-double against the Pioneers with 23 points and 11 rebounds ... **OBERLIN** is off to its best start in 30 years with a 2-3 record as the Yeomen went 2-2 last week. OC recorded wins over Westminster, 67-52, and Cal Tech, 76-58, and losses to Pomona-Pitzer, 69-56, and Claremont-McKenna, 67-60. Senior **Jordan Beard (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)** averaged 19.8 points per game and shot 55.3 percent (26 of 47) from the floor. Beard made 18 of 19 free-throw attempts and connected on 11 of 20 three-pointers. He also contributed eight assists and five steals ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** is off to a 3-1 start after winning both of its games in the OWU/Kenyon Classic. The Battling Bishops were led by senior wing **Kyle Holliday (Van Wert, OH/Van Wert)**. He scored a career-high 25 points in an 80-58 decision over Marietta, including a key three-pointer that helped OWU pull away in the second half. The next day, the Battling Bishops defeated Albion, 69-66, as Holliday scored a team-best 18 points, including a key basket in the second half after an Albion rally brought the Britons from 18 points down to within three. Holliday also added 11 rebounds and five assists in the tournament ... In its only action last week, **WABASH** defeated Hanover, 89-63. Sophomore guard/forward **Wes Smith (Indianapolis, IN/Lawrence North)** erupted for a career-best 41 points, including 24 in the second half, to lead the Little Giant attack. It was the eighth-best effort in school history and the most scored by a Wabash player since **Josh Estelle** recorded 40 in a 2000 matchup with Wooster. Smith also grabbed eight rebounds, dished two assists, and registered two steals and two blocks ... **WITTENBERG** senior wing **Kevin Murray (Carmel, IL/Carmel)** was named to the Pacific Northwest All-Tournament team with 33 points in two games. Murray led the Tigers to a 70-67 win over NAIA power Concordia-Portland, and an 80-60 loss to host Pacific Lutheran ... **WOOSTER** is off to a 2-3 start and last week lost to Carnegie Mellon, 74-66, and then fell to Wisconsin-Platteville, 76-67, and defeated Hanover, 93-61, at the Hanover Tournament. Freshman forward **Justin Hallowell (Worthington, OH/Thomas Worthington)** was named to the all-tournament team after leading the Fighting Scots. He combined for 29 points, including 9-of-18 three-point shooting in the games against Platteville and Hanover.

#### **FOOTBALL REPORT-- WABASH NCAA PLAYOFF RUN ENDS IN SECOND ROUND**

North Coast Athletic Conference champion Wabash's (10-2) NCAA tournament run ended in the second round as the Little Giants fell to Wheaton, 59-28. Senior linebacker **David Mann (Tipton, IN/Tipton)** picked off the opening pass of the game by the Thunder to set up a Wabash touchdown, giving the Little Giants a short-lived, 7-0 lead. Mann picked off another pass later in the game that also led to another score. Sophomore wideout **Kody LeMond (Pendleton, IN/Pendleton Hts.)** hauled in five passes and one touchdown to finished the season with single-season school and conference records in receiving yards with 1,228. #### **SWIMMING & DIVING REPORT-- SQUADS COMPETE IN FINAL 2008 MEETS**

Every North Coast squad will see action this week for the last time in 2008. Allegheny and Oberlin join Wooster at the Wooster Invitational Thursday through Saturday at Wooster High School. Denison competes at the Miami (OH) Invitational, and Kenyon hosts the Nike Invitational the same days.

On Friday and Saturday, Hiram competes in the Grove City Invitational, Wabash is at the TYR Classic hosted by Carthage and Wittenberg is at the DePauw Invitational. Ohio Wesleyan joins the field at the John Carroll Invitational on Saturday and Sunday.

The Thanksgiving week was a light one in terms of competition in the pool among North Coast swimming & diving teams. **ALLEGHENY** competed against Grove City and dropped a 159-139 meet on the women's side, and a 152-127 score on the men's. **Erin Ham (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)** led the Gator women with three individual wins, and was part of the victorious 200 medley relay team that touched in 1:55.51. Freshman **Mirno Pasquali (Laconia, NH/Laconia)** and junior **Ashton Kinney (Sewickley, PA/Sewickley Academy)** won the 100 butterfly (54.18) and 500 freestyle (5:06.03), respectively, to lead the men.
