NON-CONFERENCE PLAY DOMINATES SCHEDULE; NCAC ACTION RESUMES JANUARY 2

The week ahead features non-conference action for seven of nine North Coast teams. Tonight, Allegheny (1-1, 4-3) travels to PSU-Behrend, then the Gators head to Grove City on Wednesday. Also mid-week, Denison (1-0, 3-2) meets Bethany. Thursday evening, Oberlin (1-1, 1-6) visits Ursuline. Saturday, Earlham (0-2, 0-6) and Kenyon (0-1, 0-6) head to St. Mary of the Woods and Mt. Vernon Nazarene, respectively, while Hiram (1-1, 2-3) hosts Thiel. The schedule wraps up with a Sunday game as Wooster (1-0, 2-3) is at Pine Manor.

The conference schedule resumes on Friday, January 2, 2009.

The next North Coast Athletic Conference Basketball report, and the last of 2008, will be Monday, Dec. 15. Releases will resume on Sunday, Jan. 4, and will continue on Sundays through the conclusion of the basketball season. Notes: Hilary Collins (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area) finished with 20 points, including 15 of the Gators' last 23, to lead **ALLEGHENY** to victory over Kenyon, 51-47. She also had six steals. In a week that included a conference-opening loss to Hiram, 68-62, **Stephanie Wolf (Pittsburgh, PA/North Allegheny)** totaled 20 points, 15 rebounds, eight assists, four steals and a block ... **DENISON** won twice last week, defeating non-conference foe Marietta, 74-63, before edging Wittenberg, 58-54, in the North Coast opener for both schools. Senior **Ellen O'Brien (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman)** averaged 13 points, 3.5 assists, 2.5 steals and shot 57 percent from the field in the two games ... **EARLHAM** opened the 2008-09 conference season with a pair of losses. Freshman **Nikki Darrett (Evansville, IN/Bosse)** scored 17 points in a 97-44 loss to Ohio Wesleyan, then threw in another 23 with 12 rebounds in a 52-50 loss to Oberlin ... Junior guard **Brittany Mayle (Mantua, OH/Crestwood)** totaled 20 points and seven rebounds to go with nine assists in **HIRAM'S** 1-1 week. The Terriers opened North Coast action with a 68-62 home victory over Allegheny, then fell at Ohio Wesleyan, 78-50, three days later ... **KENYON** led for all but the final three minutes in its conference opener against Allegheny, only to fall, 51-47. The Ladies also lost a non-conference matchup with Case, 60-46. Sophomore guard **Kat Powers (Chagrin Falls, OH/Chagrin Falls)** totaled 23 points and 11 rebounds for the week ... **OBERLIN** picked up its first victory of 2008-09 in thrilling fashion by topping Earlham, 52-50. Senior **Alyssa Clark (Cleveland Hts, OH/Regina)** notched her first double-double of the season with 17 points and 10 boards against the Quakers. With 9:41 left to play, Oberlin trailed 43-39, but Clark scored five straight points to put her team back on top and the Yeowomen never trailed again. Senior **January Baker (Pittsburgh, PA/Mount Alvernia)** posted her first career double-double in a 74-57 loss to Wooster last Saturday. Baker scored 10 points and pulled down 10 rebounds against the Fighting Scots ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** got off to a 2-0 start in NCAC play with victories over Earlham, 97-44, and Hiram, 78-50. Sophomore post **Kayla Gordon (St. Louis, MO/Mehville)** posted a double double against the Quakers with 11 points and a career-high 13 rebounds, then led the Battling Bishops with 17 points and nine rebounds against the Terriers ... **Stephanie Boardman (Cincinnati, OH/McAuley)** led **WITTENBERG** in a pair of losses, including the Tigers' conference opener. She posted her second double-double of the season with 22 points and 13 boards in a 58-54 loss to Denison. Wittenberg also dropped a 77-57 decision to Baldwin-Wallace ... **WOOSTER** won its conference opener as the Fighting Scots knocked off Oberlin, 75-57, and also lost a non-conference decision to Case, 89-73. Junior guard **Kym Wenz (North Ridgeville, OH/Avon Lake)** combined for 53 points, highlighted by a career-high 33 points against the Yeowomen. It was the fourth-highest single-game total in Fighting Scot history. In that game, Wenz shot 9 of 15 from the field, including 6-of-11 from three-point range, and was 9-of-10 from the line. For the week, she totaled eight rebounds, five assists and seven steals.

WENZ AND KNIGHT NAMED NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Wooster's **Kym Wenz (North Ridgeville, OH/Avon Lake)** and Kenyon's **J.T. Knight (Ann Arbor, MI/Pioneer)** have been named women's and men's basketball "Players of the Week" in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

Wenz, a 5-7, junior guard, totaled 53 points in the Fighting Scots' 1-1 week, which included a conference-opening victory over Oberlin, 74-57. Her week was highlighted by a career-high 33-point performance against the Yeowomen. It was the fourth-highest single-game point total in school history. In that game, she shot 9-of-15 (.600) from the field, 6-of-11 (.545) from the three-point arc, and 9-of-10 from the line. Wenz totaled eight rebounds, five assists and seven steals. Wooster also lost to Case last week, 89-73.

Knight, a 6-1, sophomore guard, helped the Lords to a 70-55 conference-opening win over Wabash. He turned in a balanced performance with 20 points and 10 rebounds, both career highs. He also recorded a team-best five assists, was 7-of-12 from the field (.583) and 6-of-8 (.750) from the charity stripe.

THREE NCAC GAMES SET FOR COMING WEEK; HIRAM AND WITTENBERG OPEN LEAGUE PLAY

CLEVELAND -- North Coast games continue with three games this week, two of which involve Wittenberg (0-0, 1-4). The Tigers open NCAC play on Wednesday at home against Denison (0-1, 1-5), then travel to Hiram (0-0, 3-2) on Saturday, for the Terrier's conference opener. Also on Wednesday, Kenyon (1-0, 5-1) travels to Ohio Wesleyan (0-1, 3-3).

There are games slated for every day this week, starting tomorrow when Allegheny (1-0, 3-4) hosts Thiel. On Wednesday, Oberlin (0-2, 2-5) is at Kalamazoo and Hiram plays at Grove City. Thursday, the Gators travel to Penn St.-Kensington. The next day, the Yeomen host Alma, while Wabash (0-1, 2-3) tips off its own Pete Thorn Invitational. The Little Giants face St. Joseph Calumet, while Marian and IU Southeast square off in the event's first game. The Invitational concludes with a pair of games the next day. On Saturday, Denison travels to Washington & Jefferson and Kenyon travels to nearby Mt. Vernon Nazarene. Wooster (2-0, 4-3) hosts Albion.

Notes: Donte Briscoe (Temple Hills, MD/Fairmont Hts.) converted a free throw with 1.2 seconds left to lift **ALLEGHENY** to a 64-63 win over Denison in its NCAC opener. **George Raftis (Pittsburgh, PA/Sewickley Academy)** paced the Gator effort with 25 points and eight rebounds. Allegheny opened last week with an 82-55 loss to NCAA Division II Gannon. Raftis and **Charlie Jaicks (Gibsonia, PA/Mars)** each tallied 13 points; Raftis added three assists and three steals. For the week Raftis made 14-of-20 field goals (.700) and was 10-of-16 (.625) from the free throw line with 38 points, 13 boards, five assists and four steals in two games ... Junior guard **Chris Luther (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** averaged 16.5 points per game for **DENISON** last week, including a season-high 24 points in an 84-71 loss to Marietta. Freshman **Josh Leuchtag (Houston, TX/Lamar)** scored 10 points in the Big Red's narrow, 64-63, conference opening loss to Allegheny ... **EARLHAM** split a pair of games last week. Freshman **Ryan Taylor (Martinsville, IN/Martinsville)** scored a team-high 14 points in a 75-48 loss to Wilmington. Senior **Tristian Gregory (Evansville, IN/Harrison)** tossed in 10 points to move into 19th place on the Quaker all-time scoring list. He then paced the Quakers with 24 points in a 68-64 win over Oberlin. Junior **Tarrell Berry (Indianapolis, IN/Northwest)** added 16 points and led Earlham with nine rebounds. He also chipped in three assists and two blocks ... **HIRAM** senior **Ian Pfouts (Green, OH/Green)** helped the Terriers to a 1-1 week with 40 points in the two games. Hiram topped Case, 84-80, and fell to Franciscan, 88-80. Pfouts was 15-of-25 (.600) from the floor and made 7 of 8 free throw attempts. He snagged 16 rebounds and also had three assists and a steal ... **KENYON** won its conference-opening game against Wabash, 70-55, and is off to the program's best start since the 1994-95 team also won five of its first six games. Against the Little Giants, sophomore **J.T. Knight (Ann Arbor, MI/Pioneer)** turned in a balanced performance with 20 points and 10 rebounds, both career highs. He also recorded a team-best five assists, was 7-of-12 from the field (.583) and 6-of-8 (.750) from the charity stripe ... **OBERLIN** suffered a pair of NCAC setbacks last week, falling to Wooster, 104-54, and to Earlham, 68-64. Senior **Omari Hall (Detroit, MI/Cranbrook-Kingswood)** scored a season-high 10 points against the Fighting Scots. **Jordan Beard (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)** paced the Yeomen with 19 points against the Quakers ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** whittled a 10-point second-half deficit down to four points, but 12th-ranked Capital answered with a rally of their own and went on to defeat the Battling Bishops, 82-70. Senior wing **Kyle Miller (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** led OWU with 17 points in the loss. The Bishops then trimmed a 12-point deficit to four points against Wooster, but it wasn't enough as the Fighting Scots took an 82-65 decision. Senior wing **Kyle Holliday (Van Wert, OH/Van Wert)** led the Bishop effort with 15 points and eight rebounds ... **WABASH** junior guard **Chase Haltom (Quincy, IN/Cloverdale)** equaled his career-best scoring effort with 23 points in a 70-55 loss to Kenyon. He went 4-of-8 from behind the arc and was 9-of-10 from the free throw line to lead the Little Giants in scoring. Wabash also dropped a 67-57 decision to DePauw. Junior **Aaron Brock (Bremen, IN/Bremen)** paced Wabash in that game with 13 points and 11 boards – his second double-double of the young season ... **David Nowicki (Carmel, IN/Westfield)** combined for 24 points in a pair of **WITTENBERG** losses. The Tigers fell to Ohio Northern, 78-62, and to Cedarville, 80-53. Nowicki was 4-for-9 (.444) from three-point range. Freshman **Clayton Black (Lancaster, OH/Lancaster)** hit double digit scoring for the first time this season, registering 10 points against ONU ... Defending champion **WOOSTER** is off to a 2-0 start in conference play after topping Oberlin, 104-54, and Ohio Wesleyan, 82-65. Forward **Marty Bidwell (Middletown, OH/Bishop Fenwick)**, the only active senior on the squad, is an integral reason behind the fast NCAC start. He combined for 29 points on 12-of-16 (.750) field goals and was 3-of-5 (.600) from long range. Bidwell added five rebounds, five assists and five steals as part of a Wooster defense that forced 11 first-half turnovers and limited defending North Coast tournament champion Ohio Wesleyan to a .318 shooting percentage.

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING REPORT -- KENYON WINS NIKE OPEN, WITTENBERG CLAIMS DEPAUW INVITE

North Coast swim squads have completed the first half of the regular season. The next action for most teams will be winter break trips. The only dual match on the schedule before winter break is a dual match in Delaware between Ohio Wesleyan and Wilmington on Saturday.

Notes: The only individual victory claimed by an **ALLEGHENY** swimmer at the Wooster Invitational was by freshman **Ryan Inwood (Roswell, GA/Centennial)**. He won the 100 free with a time of 47.25 to lead the Gators to an eighth-of-11 team finish ... At the six-team Miami (OH) Invitational, **DENISON** placed second. Senior **John Geissinger (Darien, CT/The Lawrenceville School)** won the 200 free. His time of 1:38.92 met the NCAA's automatic qualifying mark ... One event winner paced **HIRAM** to a fourth-of-seven team finish at the Grove City Invitational. Sophomore **Santiago Morales (Mexico City, Mexico/Colegio Bilboa)** touched first in the 200 butterfly with a time of 1:58.58. Morales also took third place in the 500 free with a time of 4:53.44 ... **KENYON** won the Nike Invitational as the Lords claimed 12 of 18 events. In all, Kenyon piled up 23 automatic qualifying times, 10 pool records and a school mark. Junior **David Lazarus (Moens, France/Foundation of International)** set a pool and Kenyon record en route to winning the 100 breaststroke in 55.55. The time was nearly a second below the three-year old school record set by **Davis Zarins**. Sophomore **Michael Mpitsos (Newport, OR/Newport)** won the 100 back (49.79), 200 back (1:48.58) and 50 free (20.48) and swam a leg on four winning relay teams ... Senior **Scott McInerney (Randolph, NJ/Randolph)** recorded lifetime best swims to lead **OBERLIN** to a sixth-place finish at the Wooster Invitational. He posted career bests in the 100 butterfly (51.85) and the 50 free (21.47) ... **OHIO WESLEYAN** wound up second in the five-team Carroll Classic. Junior **David Gatz (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** won the 100 breast (58.57) and 200 breast (2:09.21) and was second in the 200 butterfly. Junior **Kevin Fahey (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** took the 200 individual medley (2:04.40) and 400 IM (4:32.11) and was second in the 100 breast ... At the TYR Invitational hosted by Carthage, **WABASH** placed fourth of seven teams. The 200 butterfly was the top point-scoring event for the Little Giants. Sophomore **David Birrer (Indianapolis, IN/Brownsburg)** was third in 1:58.45, while sophomore **Adam Current (Veedersburg, IN/Fountain Central)** was fourth (1:58:49). Freshman **Logan Falley (Lafayette, IN/Jefferson)** took ninth (2:01.71) and junior **Robert Fozkos (Valparaiso, IN/Chesterton)** followed in 10th (2:02.45) ... **WITTENBERG** won the DePauw Invitational, led by **Neil Anderson (Lakewood, OH/Lakewood)**, who won two events. Anderson took first in the 500 free and the 200 free ... Four team records fell as **WOOSTER** won its own invitational. **Logan LaBerge (Towson, MD/Towson)** won the 100 back in school-record time (52.45), and met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard. He also touched first in the 200 back (1:54.34), setting a school record and meeting the "B" qualifying mark in that event as well. LaBerge was also part of school-record setting 200 medley and 400 medley relays.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING REPORT -- OWU WOMEN WIN CARROLL CLASSIC, FIGHTING SCOT WOMEN TAKE OWN INVITATIONAL

North Coast swim squads have completed the first half of the regular season. The next action for most teams will be winter break trips. The only dual match on the schedule before winter break is a dual match in Delaware between Ohio Wesleyan and Wilmington on Saturday.

Notes: **Erin Ham (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)** swam a pair of NCAA provisional qualifying times to lead **ALLEGHENY** at the Wooster Invitational. Ham won the 200 breaststroke in 2:24.97, and was second in the 100 breast (1:06.88) to meet the standard in both events. **Ashley Whitehead (Conneaut Lake, PA/Meadville Area)** won the 50 free (24.95) as the Gators placed fourth in the 11-team meet ... **DENISON** finished sixth of nine teams at the Miami (OH) Invitational. Senior **Kristen Hohl (Winfield, IL/Wheaton North)** qualified automatically for the NCAA Div. III Championships in the 100 freestyle (51.37) and the 50 freestyle (23.67). She placed third in the 100 free and fifth in the 50. Junior **Olivia Zaleski (Corry, PA/Corry Area)** met the automatic qualifying standard in three events: the 100 butterfly (55.55), 100 backstroke (57.15) and 50 free (23.63). Zaleski was fourth in the 100 fly, fifth in the 100 back and 10th in the 50 free ... At the Grove City Invitational, **HIRAM** was fourth of eight teams. Junior **Katie Pierdomenico (Stow, OH/Twinsburg)** posted the top individual finish of the meet for the Terriers when she placed second in the 200 freestyle with a time of 2:03.63 ... The Nike Invitational hosted by **KENYON** was won by the University of Kansas, but the Ladies came in second. The host team broke an impressive five school records during the meet, including the 800 free relay (7:25.96) and 400 medley relay (3:46.87). Individually, senior **Tracy Menzel (Greencastle, IN/Greencastle)** set a mark in the 100 breast (1:02.94), freshman **Alisa Vereshchagin (Solon, OH/Solon)** broke the record in the 200 breast (2:16.86) and sophomore **Kaitlyn Meirs (Cream Ridge, NJ/Peddie)** set a new standard in the 500 free (4:55.21) ... **OBERLIN** wound up eighth of 11 teams at the Wooster Invitational. Freshman **Jane McIntyre (Tenafly, NJ/Tenafly)** and sophomore **Sara Kadi (Oakland, CA/Piedmont)** won the 200 butterfly (2:11.96) and 100 butterfly (59.40), re-

spectively ... Sophomore **Marisa Obuchowski (Baltimore, MD/Pikesville)** and freshman **Marina Metzler (Columbia, MD/Hammond)** each posted a third- and a fifth-place finish to lead **OHIO WESLEYAN** at the Carroll Classic. Obuchowski was third in the 200 breaststroke and fifth in the 100 breast, while Metzler placed third in the 200 fly and tied for fifth in the 100 fly ... **WITTENBERG** took third at the DePauw Invitational. Three swimmers claimed second-place finishes to lead the Tigers. **Adeline Brym (Mansfield, OH/Lexington)** was runner-up in the 100 back, **Megan Tassone (Cincinnati, OH/Ursuline)** was second in the 200 breaststroke and **Keaton Hannon (Peachtree City, GA/McIntosh)** took second in the 100 fly. Diver **Megan Shubitowski (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** won the one-meter competition ... For the third straight year, **WOOSTER** won its own Invitational. The result was not determined until the final event – the 400 freestyle relay – was complete. The Fighting Scots' second-place finish in the event was enough to edge Edinboro by 1.5 points and take the team title. Senior **Molly Bittner (Westfield Center, OH/Cloverleaf)** was a high point scorer for Wooster. In addition to being part of the 400 free relay, Bittner took third in the 50 free (25.21), and fourth in both the 100 free (54.41) and 200 free (1:59.59).

TRACK & FIELD REPORT-- 2008-09 TRACK & FIELD SEASONS OPEN AT CAPITAL AND KENT STATE

The track & field season opened last week when Allegheny and Oberlin traveled to compete at the Kent State Gala and Ohio Wesleyan joined the field at Capital's Purple & White Invitational.

ALLEGHENY'S Ben Eyer (Lititz, PA/Manheim Central) was the top performer for the Gator men as he ran for two top-eight finishes on day two of Kent State's Golden Flash Gala. He placed seventh in the one-mile race (4:27.47). He was also eighth in the 3,000-meter run with a time of 8:58.63. **Mia Symoniak (Snyder, N.Y./Amherst)** placed sixth in the 5,000-meter race, clocking in at 17:57.75.

Leading the **OBERLIN** women was **Amanda Miller (Toledo, OH/Cardinal Stritch)**. She finished 14th in the 400 meter dash with a time of 1:00.47. **Hillary Tipton (Loveland, OH/Cincinnati Country Day)** was eighth of 29 runners in the mile with a time of 5:32.03. In the men's meet, sophomore **Josh Gallagher (West Harrison, NY/Harrison)** broke a school record in the weight throw with a toss of 39 feet, 11.5 inches. **Albert Davila (Upland, CA/Upland)** finished 12th in the 800 meter run with a 2:00.79 clocking.

OHIO WESLEYAN'S men's squad won the six-team meet at Capital. Junior **Bryce Mathias (Centerburg, OH/Centerburg)** won three events to lead the Battling Bishops. He crossed first in the 60-meter hurdles (8.98), the 200 meters (23.41) and 400 meters (53.43). Junior **Kyle Faris (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** won the shot put (47 feet, 2.25) and was second in the weight throw. Senior **Jon Smith (Clyde, OH/Bellevue)** took first in the pole vault when he cleared 13 feet, 6.25 inches. On the women's side, OWU was second of six in the team standings. Freshman **Hanna Phlipot (Van Wert, OH/Van Wert)** won the shot put with a throw of 37 feet, 0.25 inches. Senior **Jessica Merrill (Columbia Station, OH/Columbia)** was second in the 60-meter hurdles, third in the high jump and fifth in the 200 meters.
