**NORTH COAST ANNOUNCES POST-SEASON AWARDS;  
KENYON'S DONOVAN, ALLEGHENY'S HUBER TOP PLAYERS**

CLEVELAND -- Kenyon senior **Chris Donovan (Cincinnati, OH/St. Xavier)** and Allegheny senior **Kim Huber (Canfield, OH/Canfield)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference men's and women's basketball Players of the Year through balloting by the NCAC coaches. Case Western Reserve's **Bill Sudeck** and Wittenberg's **Pam Evans** have earned Coach of the Year honors, while Earlham's **Jason Johnson** and Wittenberg's **Sarah Jurewicz** are the Newcomers of the Year.

**Donovan**, a 6-8 forward, averages 19.5 points and 12.5 rebounds per game for Kenyon. The 18-8 Lords placed third in the NCAC during the regular season and have received their second straight NCAA Tournament bid. Donovan leads the conference in rebounding and ranks third in scoring, third in blocked shots (1.6 bpg) and sixth in field goal percentage (50.8). He is the North Coast's career leader in rebounds with 916 and needs 17 more to break the conference's single-season record of 342. He reached double figures in points and rebounds 20 times during the regular season, highlighted by a 26-point, 20-rebound performance in a win at CWRU on Jan. 25. Donovan, a two-time, first-team All-NCAC performer, stands fifth on the conference's career scoring list with 1666 points.

**Huber**, a 5-9 forward, averaged 18.8 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in leading Allegheny to an 18-8 record and a third-place finish in the NCAC. She leads the conference in field goal percentage (50.4) and ranks third in scoring, fourth in free throw percentage (72.1), fourth in blocked shots (1.0 bpg) and fifth in rebounding. She scored 30 or more points three times this season, highlighted by 32-point efforts in wins over Kenyon on Dec. 10 and Earlham on Feb. 3. Huber is a two-time, first-team All-NCAC pick and stands sixth on the North Coast's all-time scoring list with 1460 points. She missed the entire 1991-92 season due to injury and has one year of eligibility remaining.

**Sudeck** is the men's Coach of the Year for the first time after leading CWRU to a 13-12 record and a share of fourth place in the NCAC. The Spartans were 9-16 last season and have not posted a better record since going 17-9 in 1984-85. Sudeck, a 1948 graduate of Kent State and a member of the school's athletic Hall of Fame, has a 267-419 record in 32 years at CWRU and Case Institute of Technology. He was head coach at Case for eight years prior to its federation with the Western Reserve program in 1971.

**Evans** is the women's Coach of the Year after guiding Wittenberg to its second consecutive NCAC championship and fourth in five years. The Tigers take a 25-2 record and a 24-game winning streak into the upcoming NCAA Tournament. Evans, a 1982 Wittenberg graduate, has a 168-75 record in nine seasons with the school, winning 20 or more games in each of the past six years. She also earned Coach of the Year honors in 1989-90 and 1990-91.

**Johnson** and **Jurewicz** are the first players to receive the NCAC's newly instituted Newcomer of the Year award. Johnson, a freshman guard, averaged 12.1 points and a team-high 5.2 assists per game for a 6-19 Earlham squad. He started 22 of 25 contests and ranks second in the conference in steals (2.2 spg), third in assists, eighth in field goal percentage (50.0) and 15th in scoring. Jurewicz, a freshman center, averages 11.7 points and 8.1 rebounds per game for Wittenberg. She has started 26 of 27 games and ranks second in the NCAC in field goal percentage (49.3), fourth in rebounding and ninth in scoring. She is the fourth woman in conference history to earn first-team All-NCAC honors as a freshman.
